How to use the Club Summary:

On each hole you play, record the position of the ball where it lands in the box for the club you used. Ball positions are: F-fairway, LR-left rough, RR-right rough, G-green, ST-sand trap and R-rough near the green.

By folding over the fairway diagram page, you will have a smaller card to work with. On each fairway diagram, mark where each shot landed by placing a 1, for the first shot, a 2 where the second shot landed and so on until you reach the green. Circle any shot that lands in a sand trap. Place a dot for the position of the pin placement that day. There is no need to record each putt on the fairway diagram, just keep track of the number of putts you take and record that number in the PT box for that hole.

After your round of golf, total up the number of shots taken with each club and record that number in the shots column. Then go back and for each club used, add up how many shots landed in the fairway, rough, in a trap or on the green and put each total in the appropriate column.

Now analyze your round of golf. How many drives landed in the rough? How many three putts did you take? How accurate was your seven iron? This analyzer provides you with an enormous amount of information about your golf game than just a score card. By using the fairway diagrams and marking each shot, you can then go back and record the distances that you hit each shot with a particular club.

If you need help figuring out where or how to improve your golf game, consult your local golf pro and show him this analyzer.

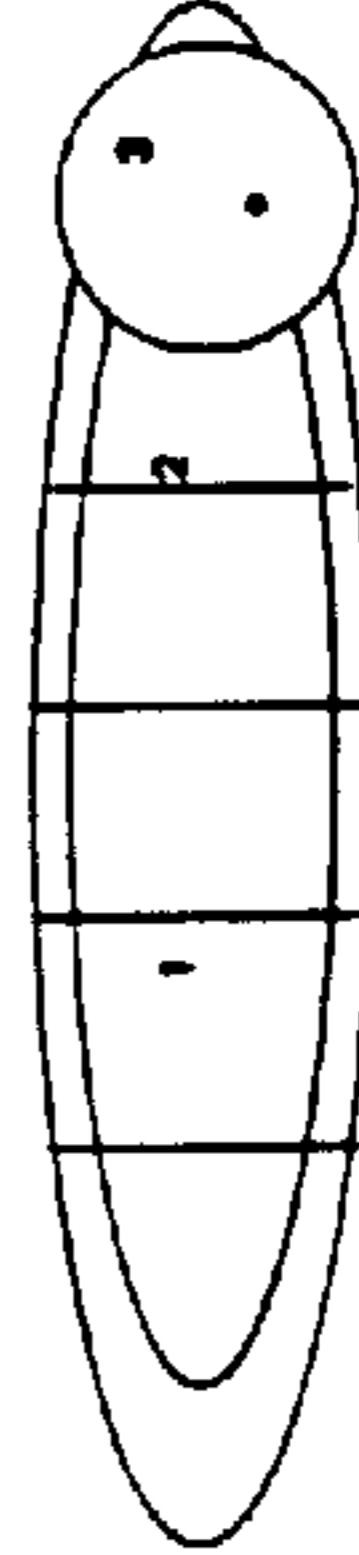
