The ornamental design for a slat wall memorial display unit, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a frontal view of a slat wall memorial display unit, showing exemplary items which might be displayed together with the design and other features in broken lines for purposes of illustration only and forming no part of the claimed design;

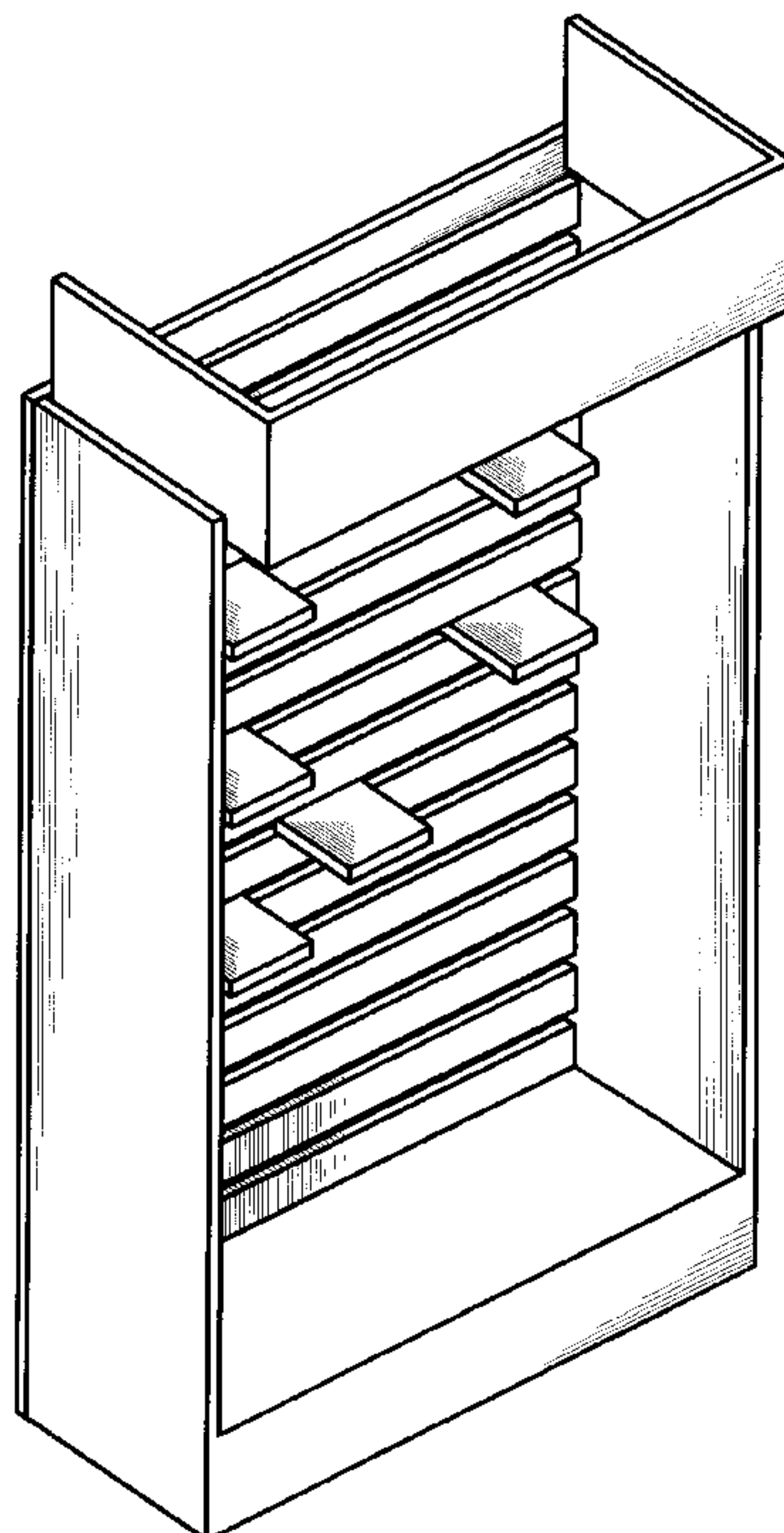
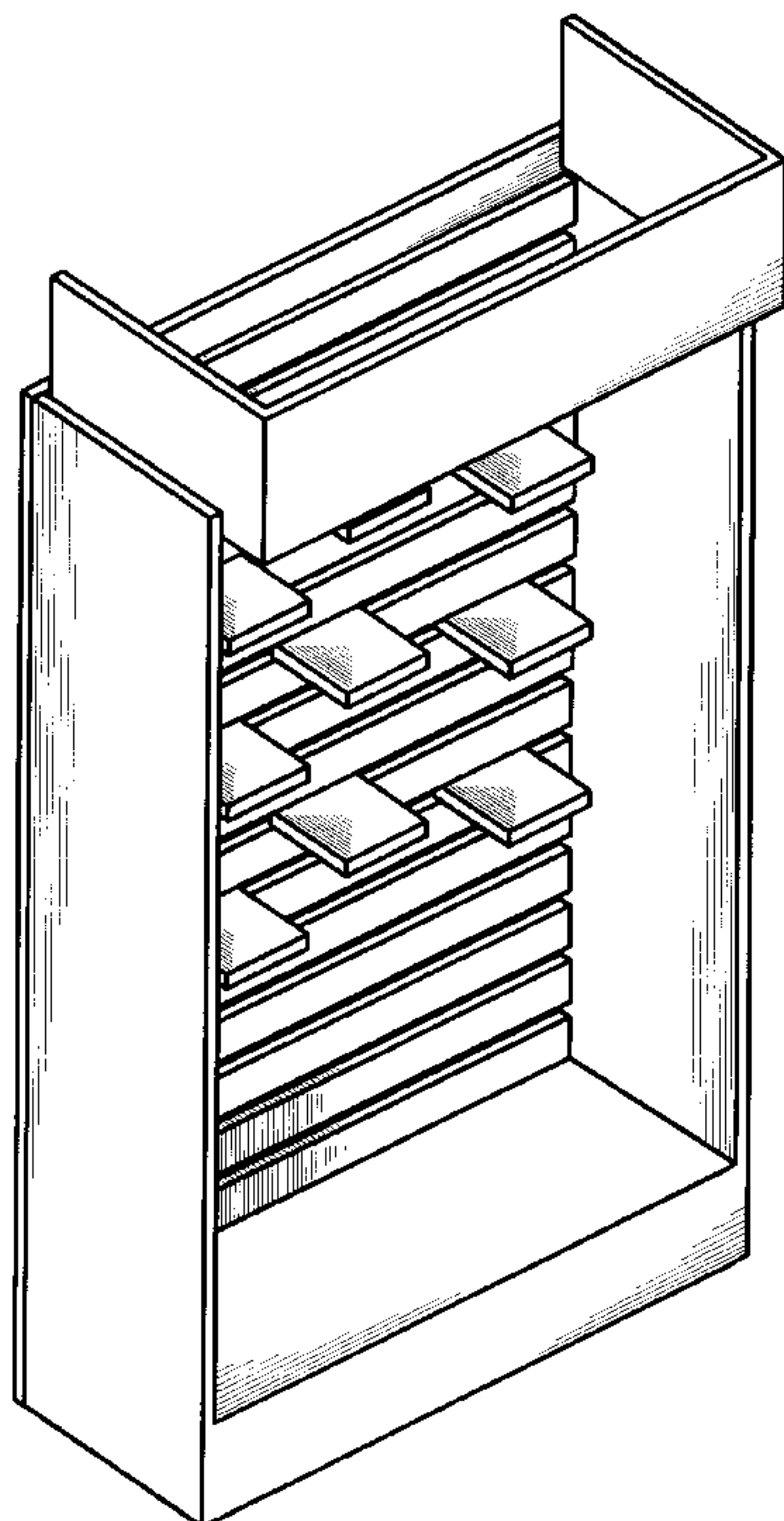
FIG. 2 is a side perspective view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a side perspective view of a third embodiment of FIG. 1, the only differences being the number and arrangement of the shelves, it being understood that the other surfaces are the same as the first embodiment shown in FIGS. 1-3.

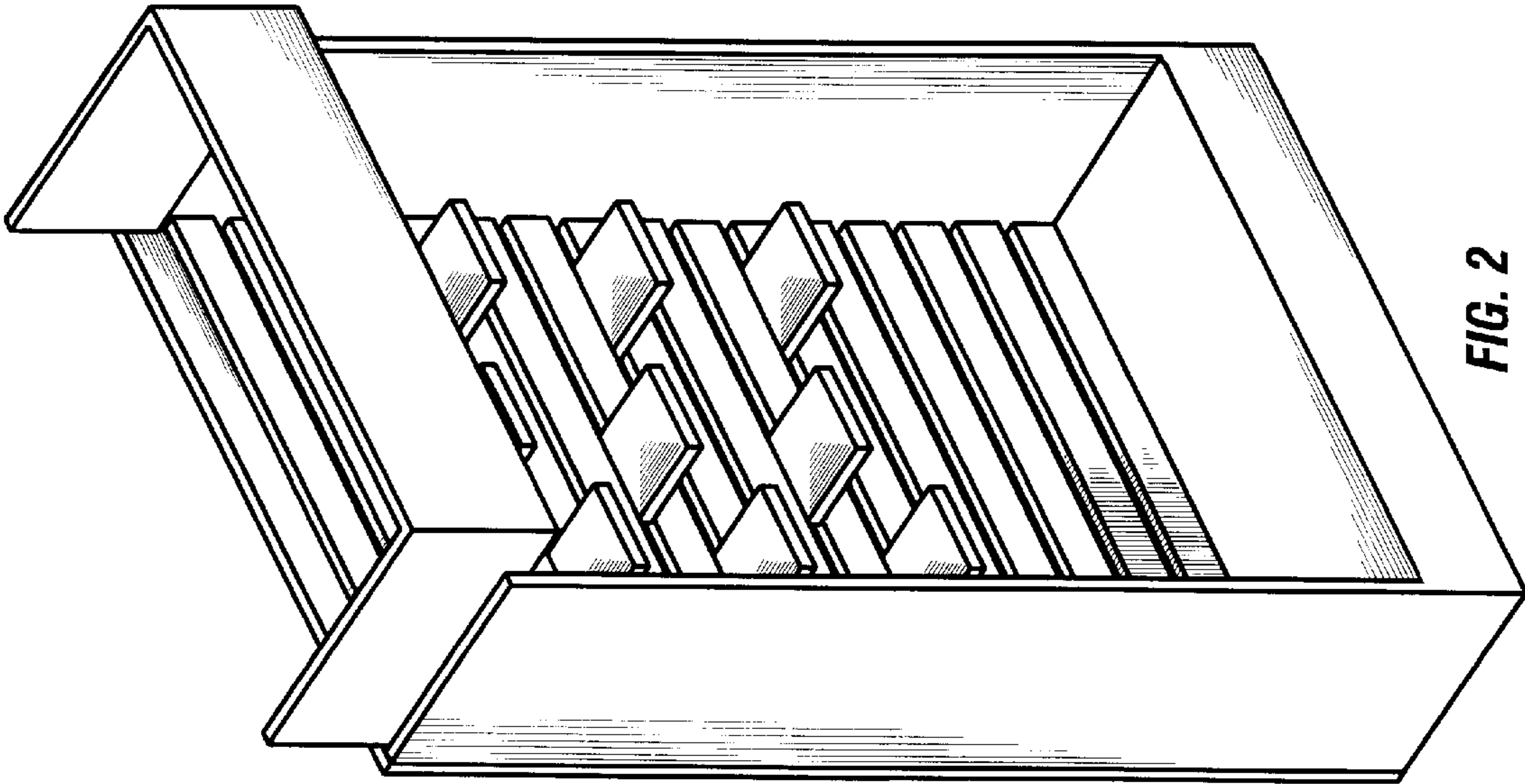

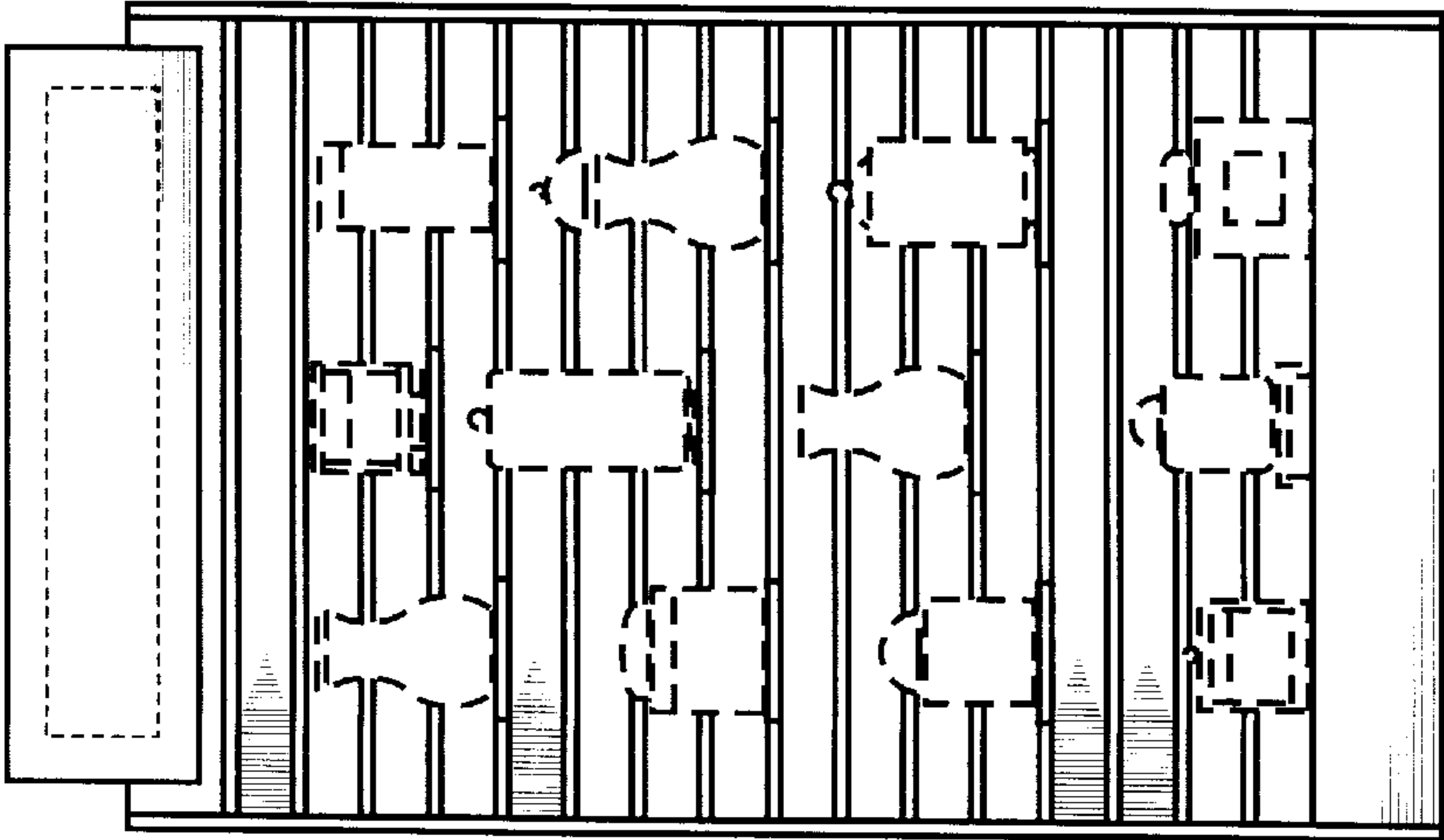

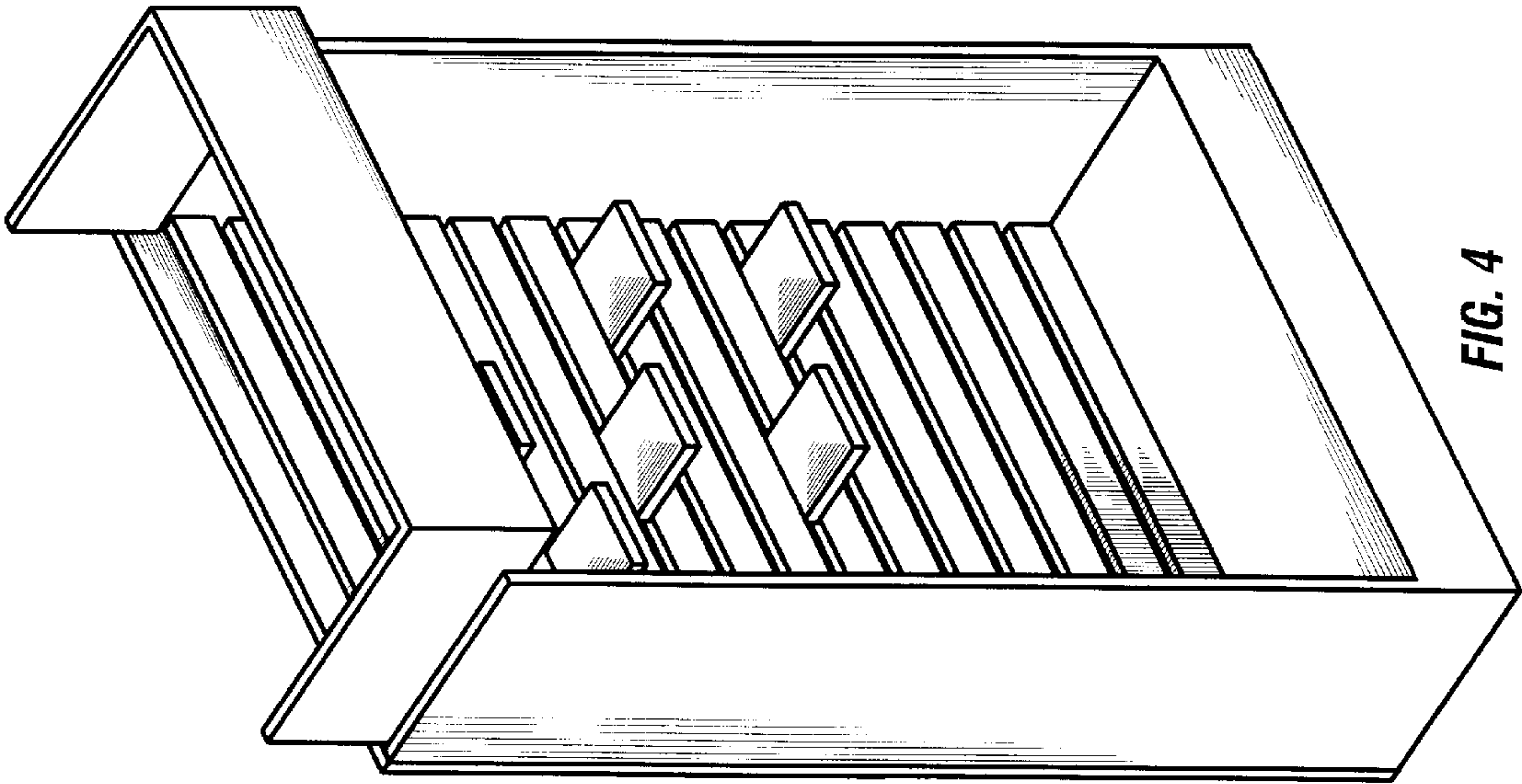

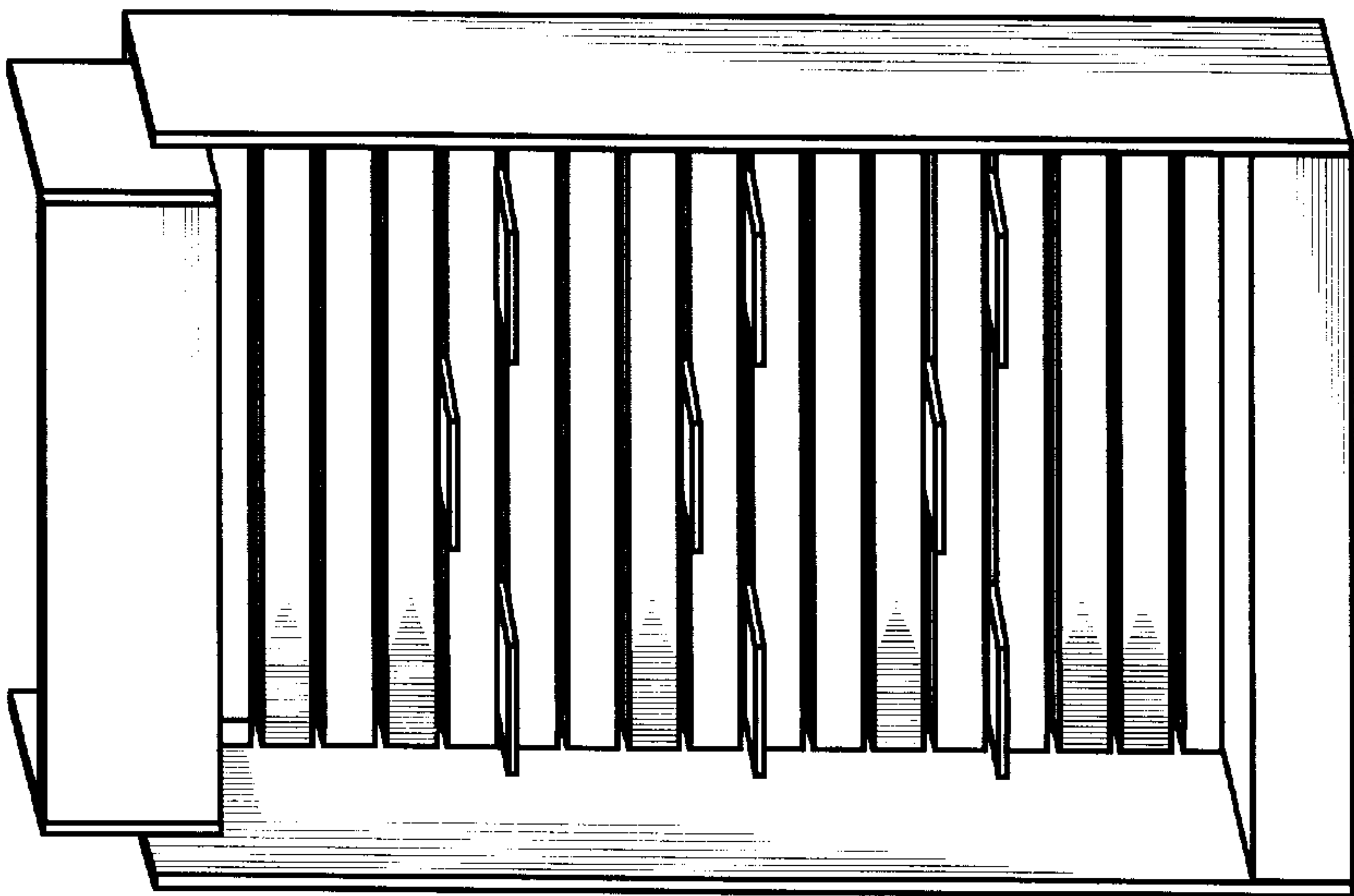
