(57) CLAIM

I claim the ornamental design for a plastic bottle shoulder and lower portion, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the front side of a plastic bottle including our design for a shoulder portion and a lower portion in accordance with the present invention, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design.

FIG. 2 is a side elevation of the front side of the plastic bottle shown in FIG. 1, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design.

FIG. 3 is a side elevation of the right side of the plastic bottle shown in FIGS. 1 and 2, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design.


FIG. 4 is a side elevation of the back side of the plastic bottle shown in FIGS. 1 and 2, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design..

FIG. 5 is a side elevation of the left side of the plastic bottle shown in FIGS. 1 and 2, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design..

FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the plastic bottle shown in FIGS. 1–5, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design; and,

FIG. 7 is a bottom view of the plastic bottle shown in the prior figures, the features shown in phantom being conventional and not forming a part of the ornamental design.












