current invention.

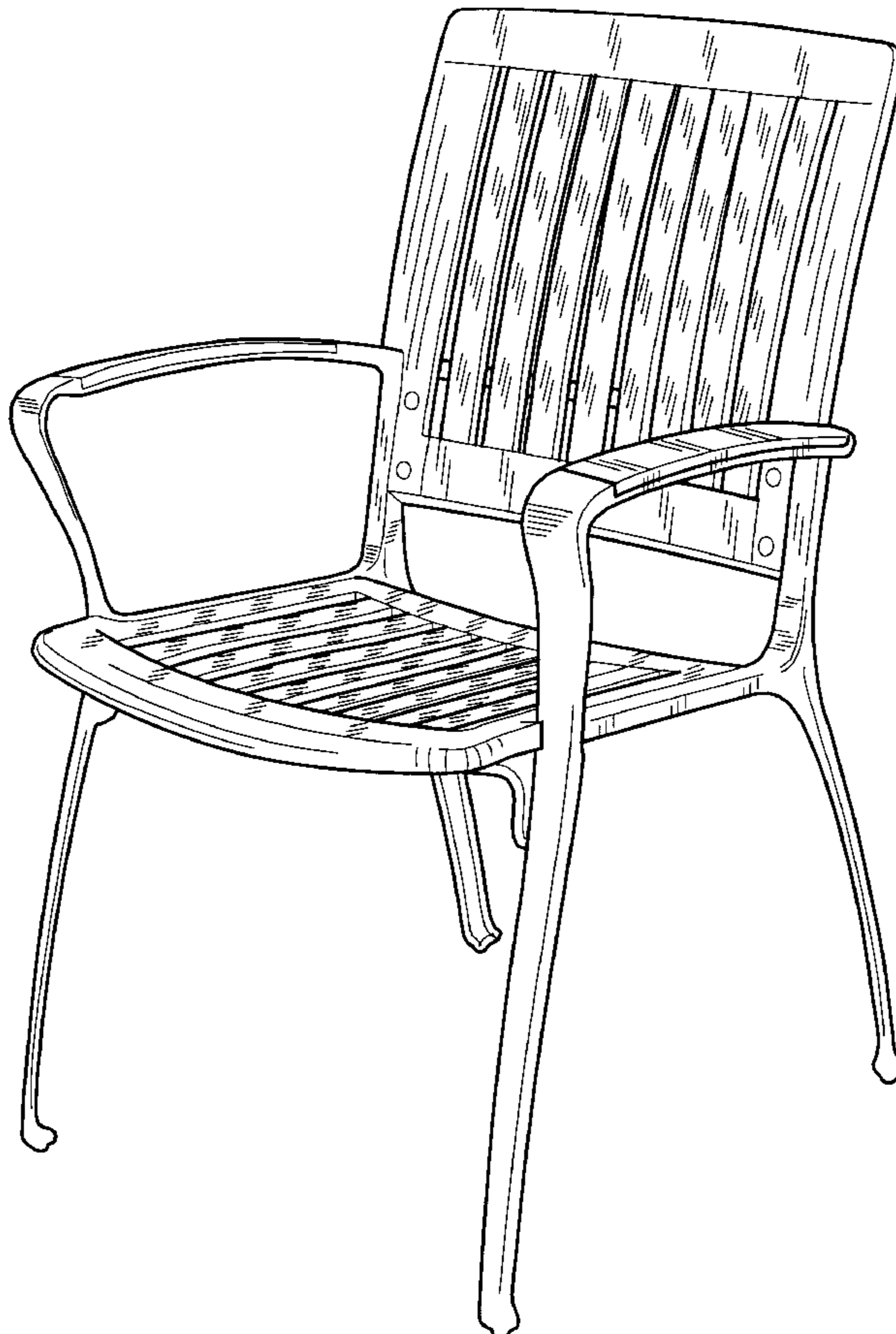

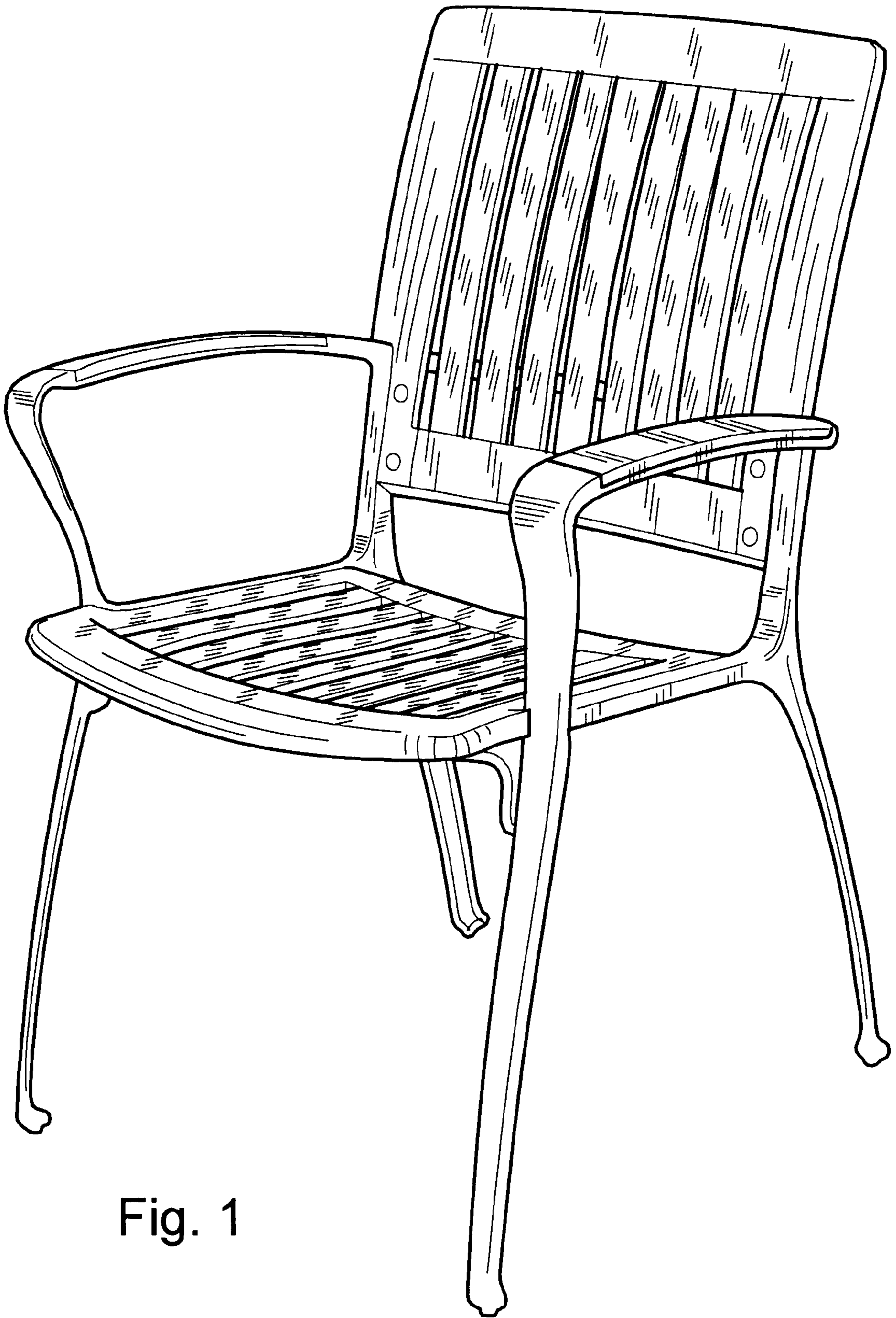

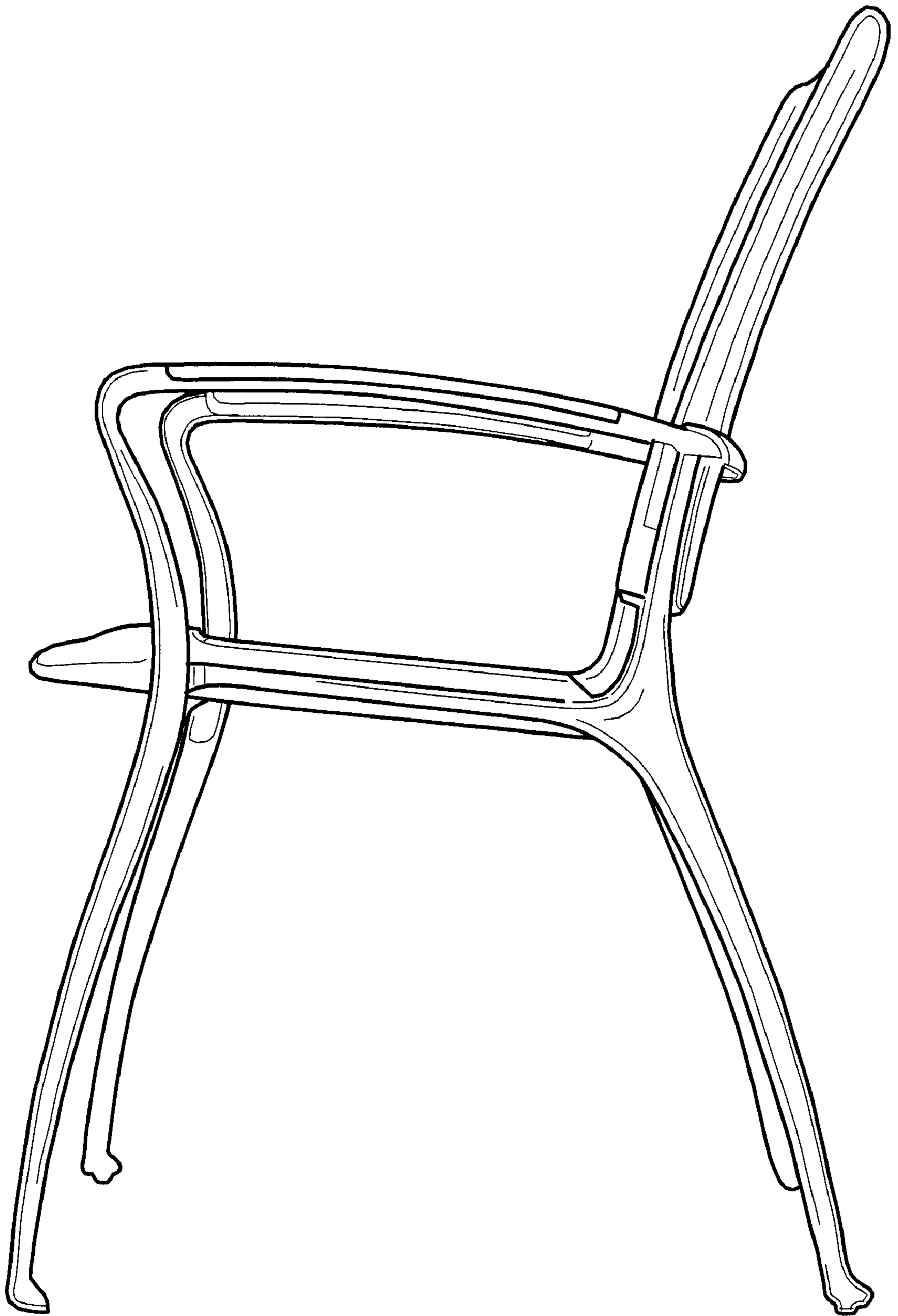

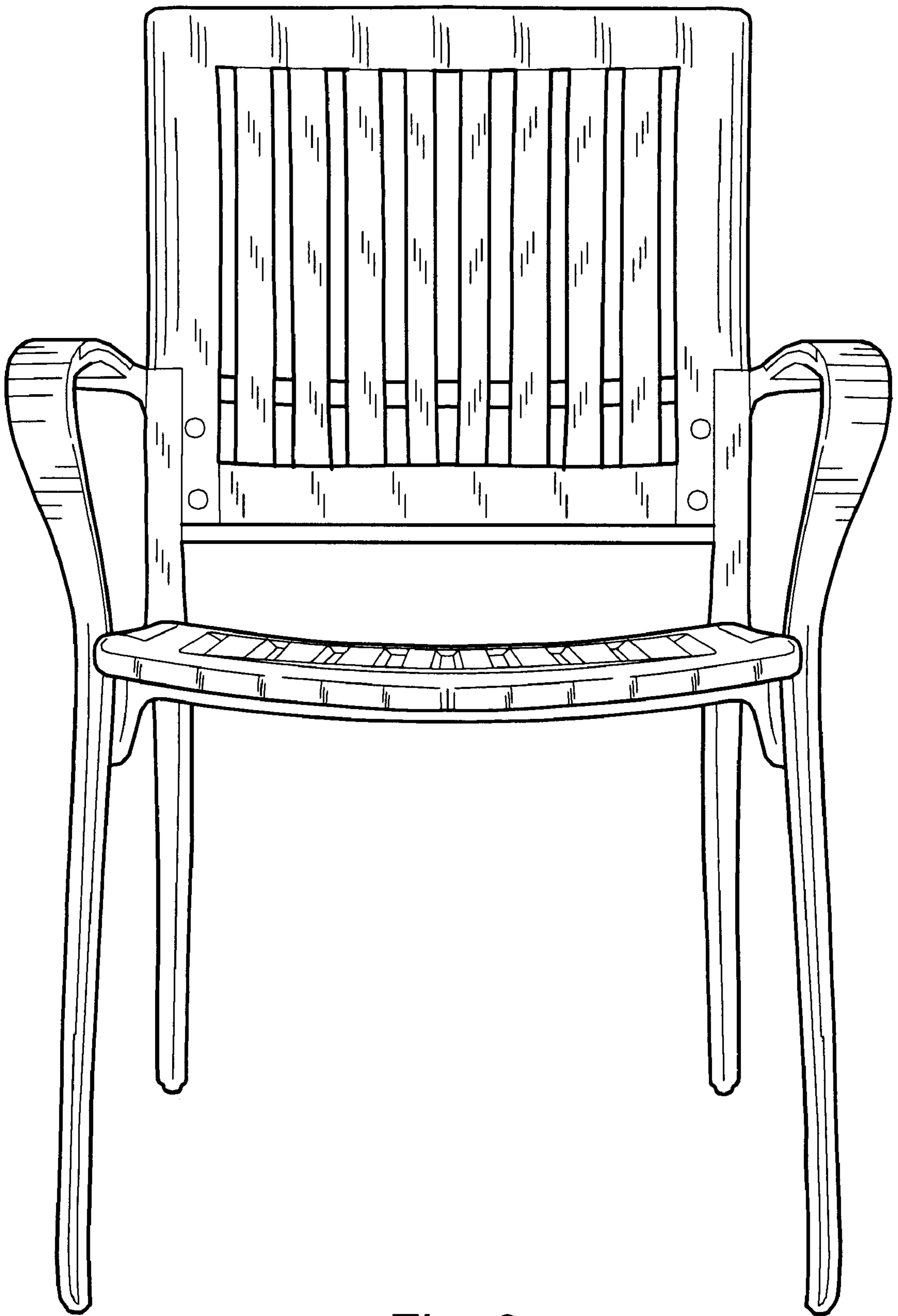

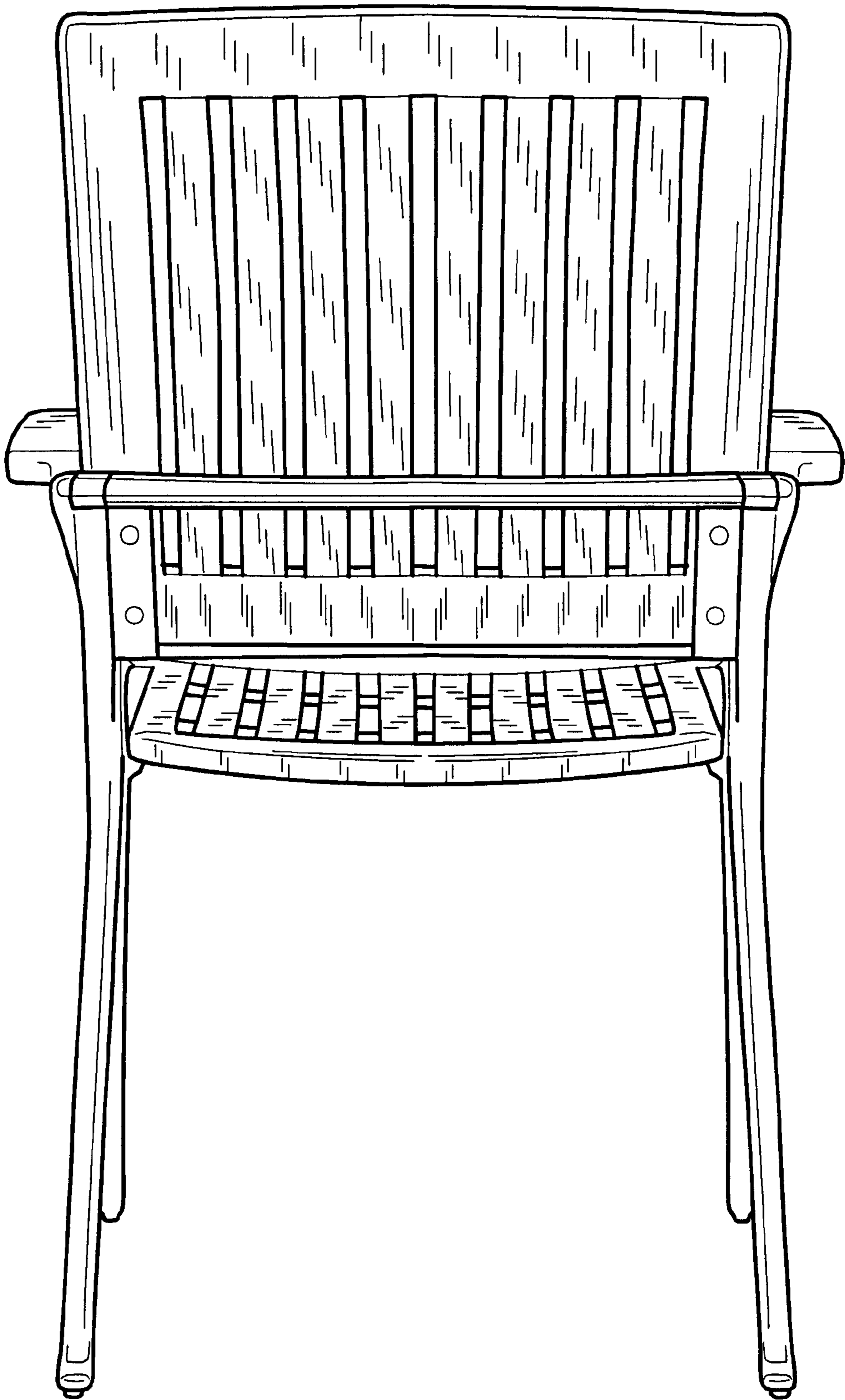
