## (57) CLAIM

I claim the ornamental design for a cane handle, as shown and described.

### **DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a cane handle according

to the first embodiment thereof, with the broken line shown for illustrative purposes only and forming no part of the claimed design;

FIG. 2 is a left side elevational view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 5 is a back elevational view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 6 is a top plan view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 7 is a bottom plan view according to the first embodiment thereof;

FIG. 8 is a front perspective view of the cane handle according to the second embodiment thereof, with the broken line shown for illustrative purposes only and forming no part of the claimed design;

FIG. 9 is a left side elevational view according to the second embodiment thereof;

FIG. 10 is a right side elevational view according to the second embodiment thereof;

FIG. 11 is a front elevational view according to the second embodiment thereof;


FIG. 12 is a back elevational view according to the second embodiment thereof;

FIG. 13 is a top plan view according to the second embodiment thereof; and,


FIG. 14 is a bottom plan view according to the second embodiment thereof.







