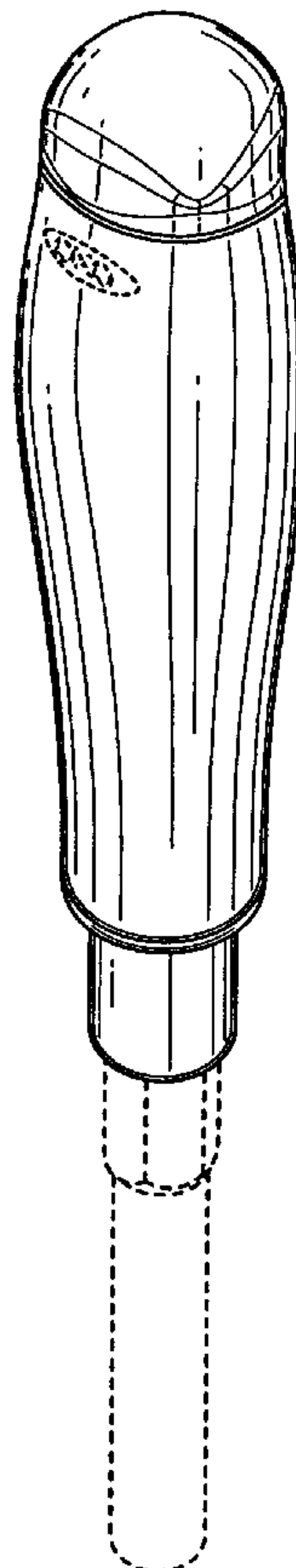
(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a combination tool handle, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a combination tool handle according to the present invention, the broken lines at the bottom and on the upper portion of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design; FIG. 2 is a front elevational view, the broken lines at the bottom and on the upper portion of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design; FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view, the broken lines at the bottom of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design; FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view, the broken lines at the bottom of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design; FIG. 5 is a left side elevational view, the broken lines at the bottom of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design; FIG. 6 is a top elevational view; and, FIG. 7 is a bottom elevational view the broken lines at the bottom of this view are for environmental purposes only and form no part of the design.

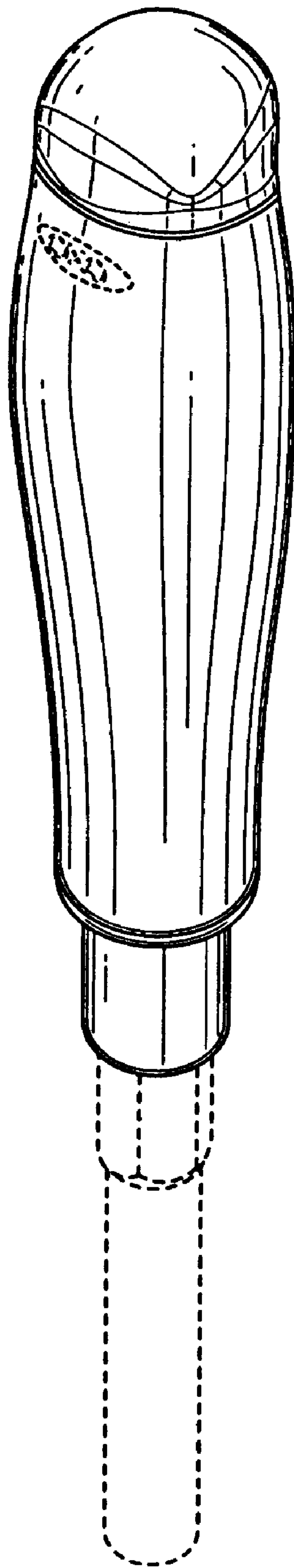

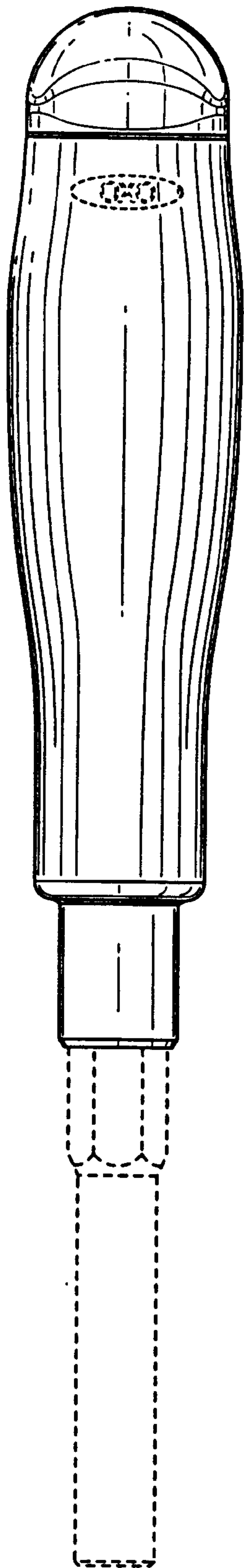

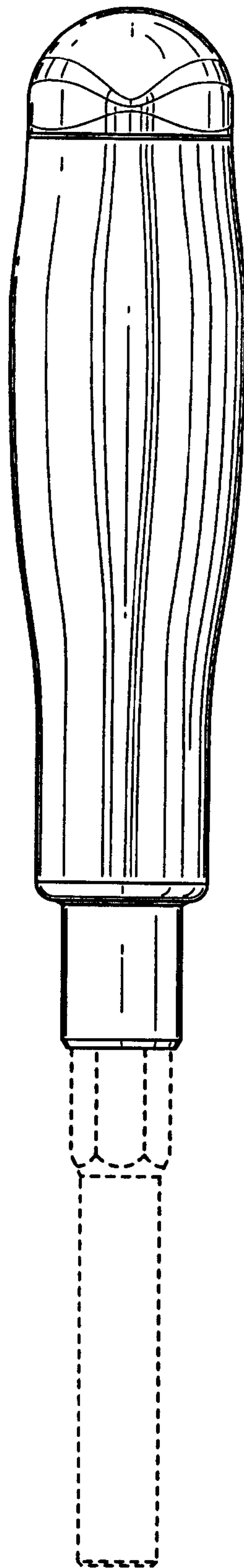

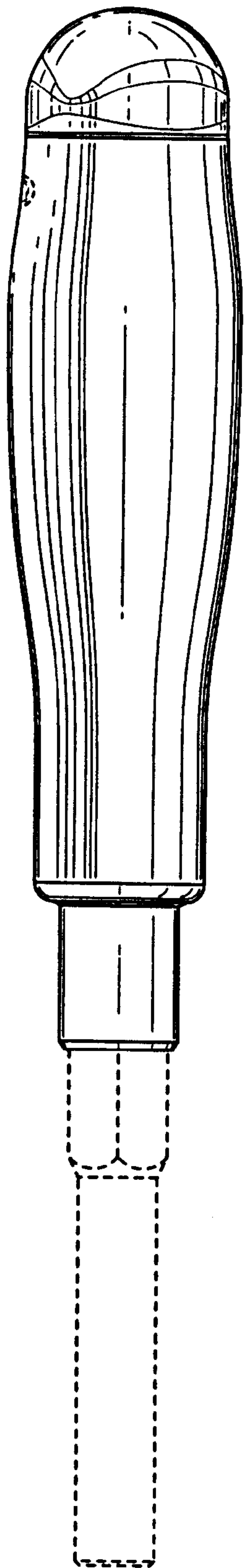

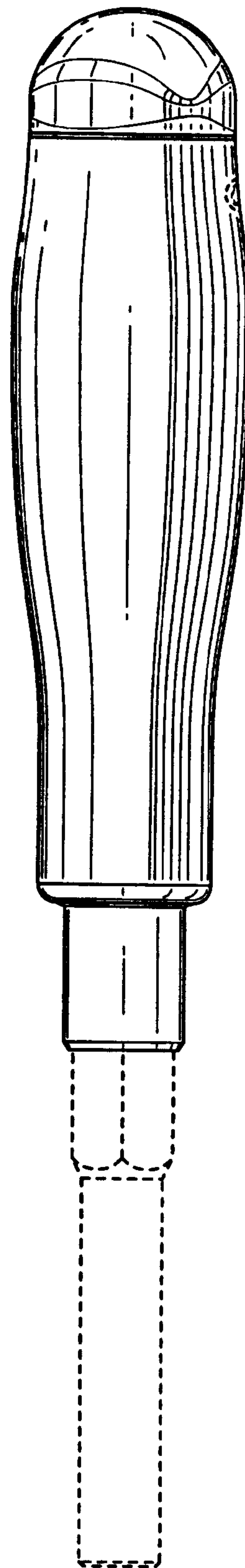

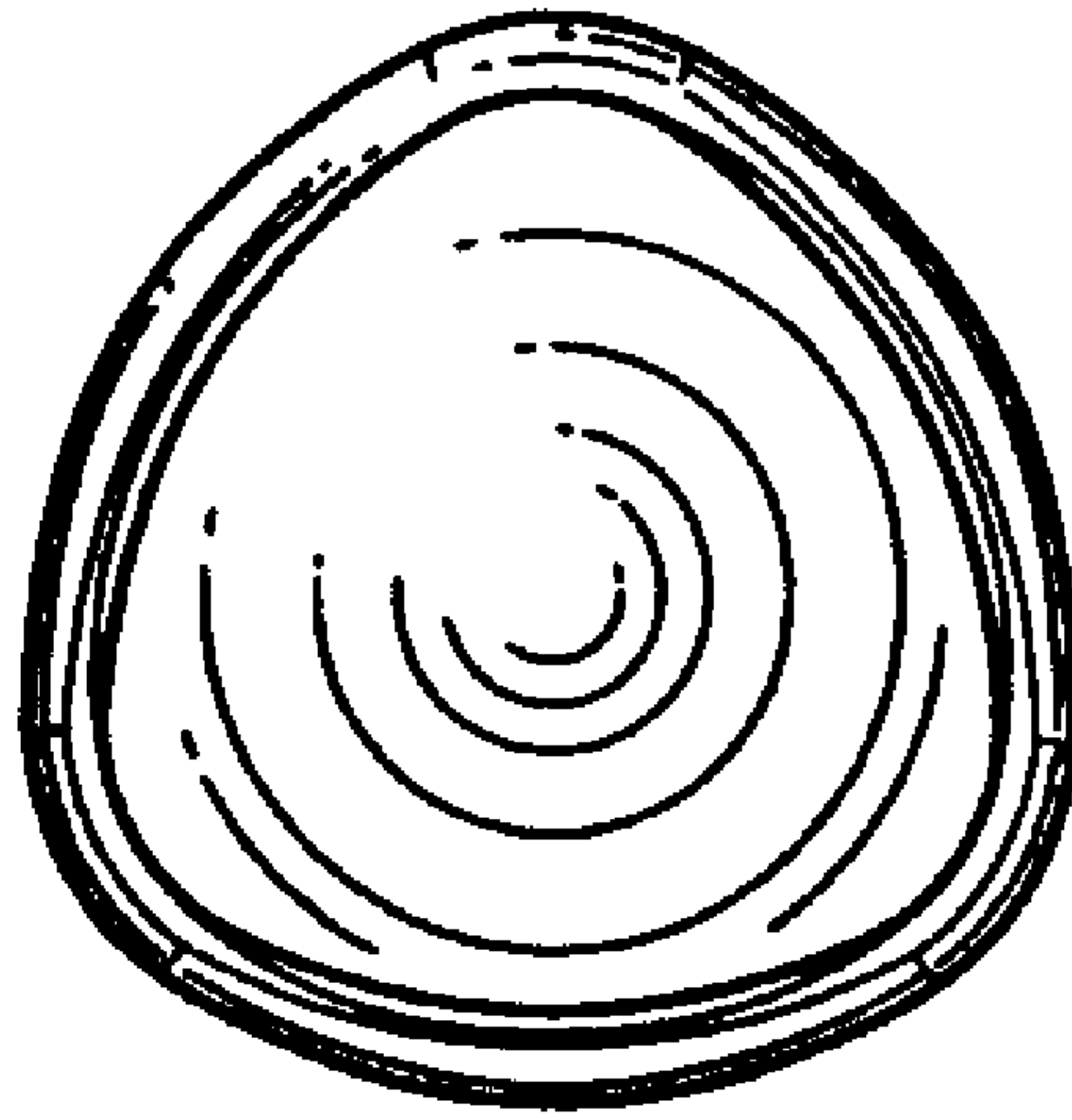

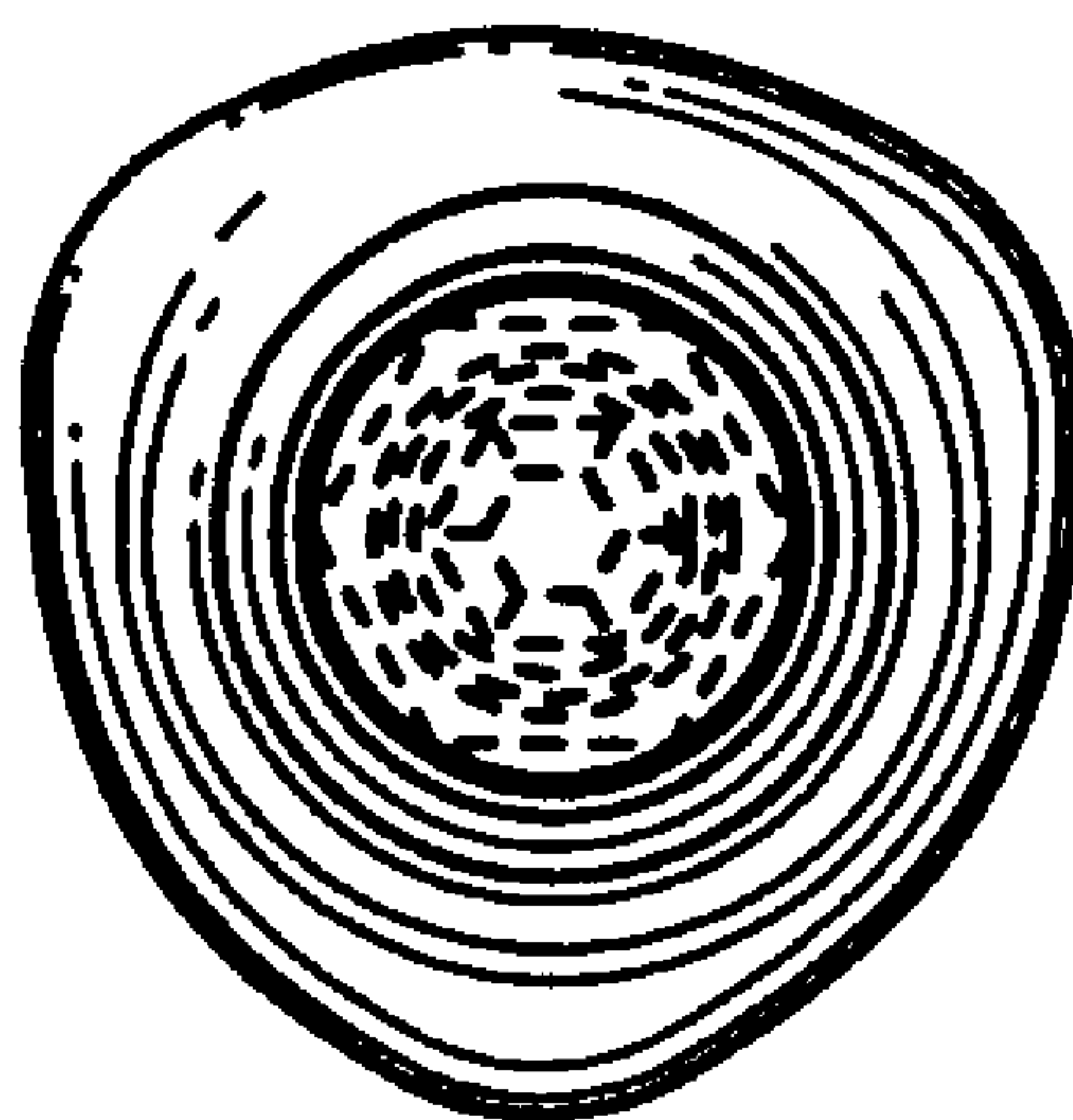
