The ornamental design for a golf shoe sole, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a golf shoe sole showing my new design;

FIG. 4 is a front elevational view thereof;

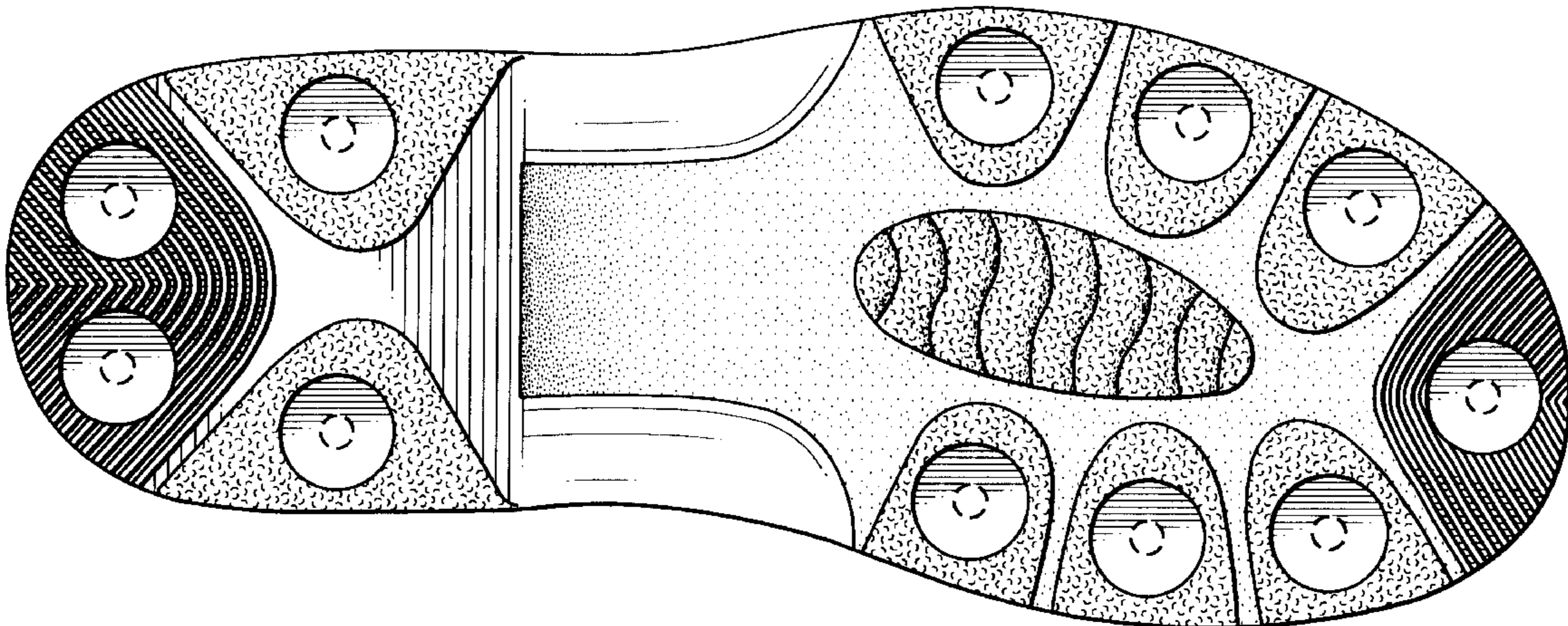
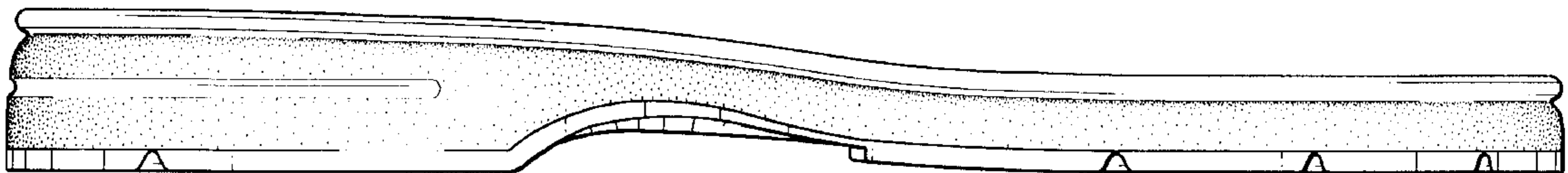
FIG. 5 is a rear elevational view thereof;

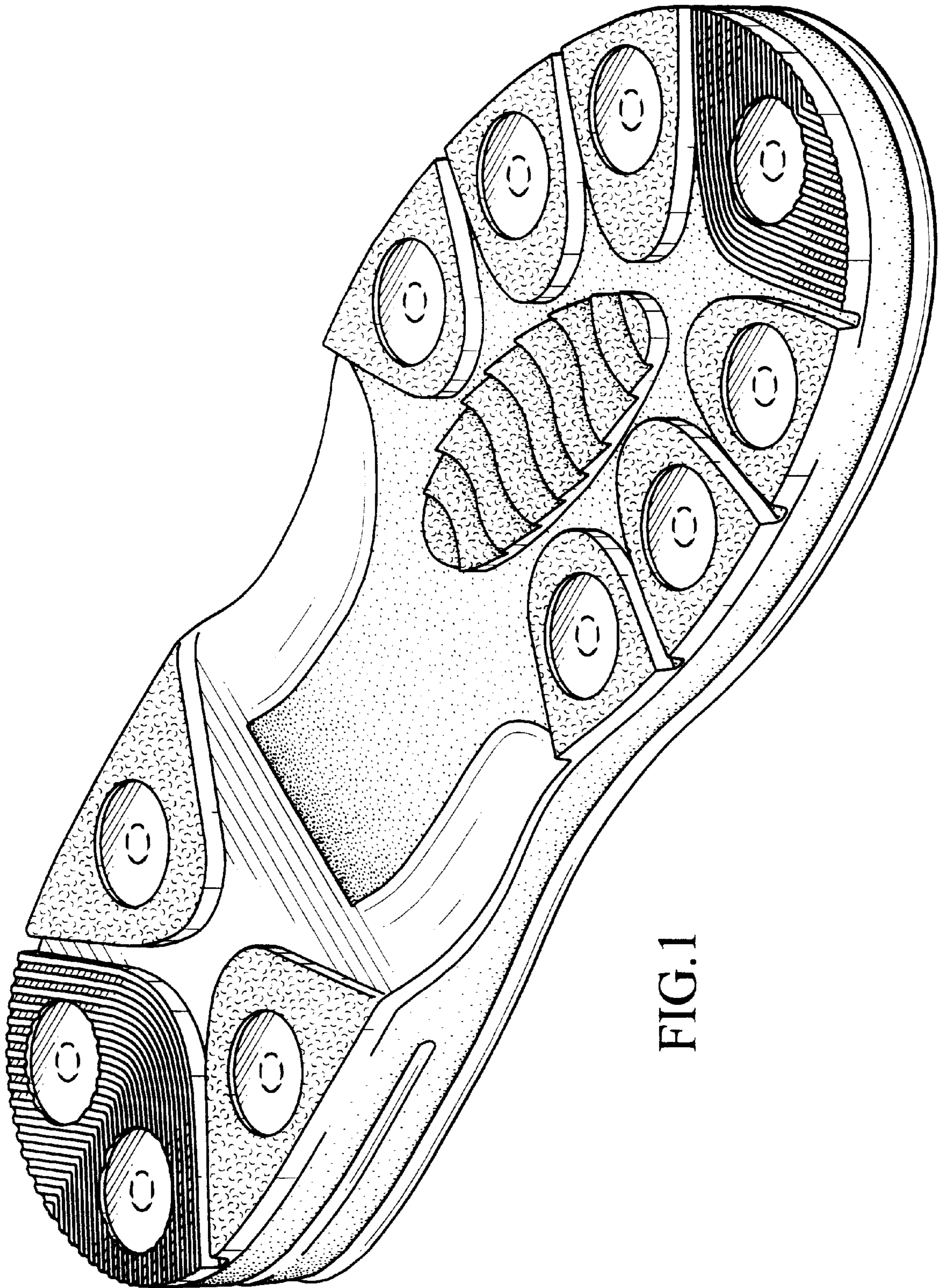

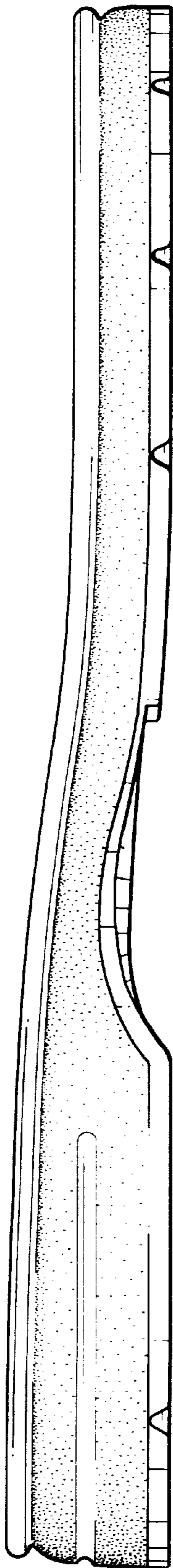

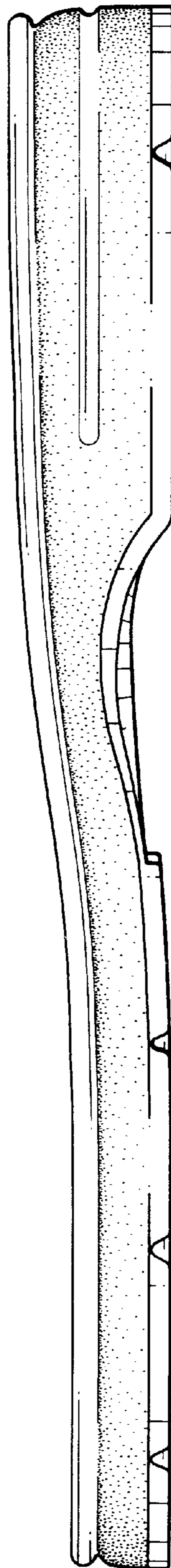

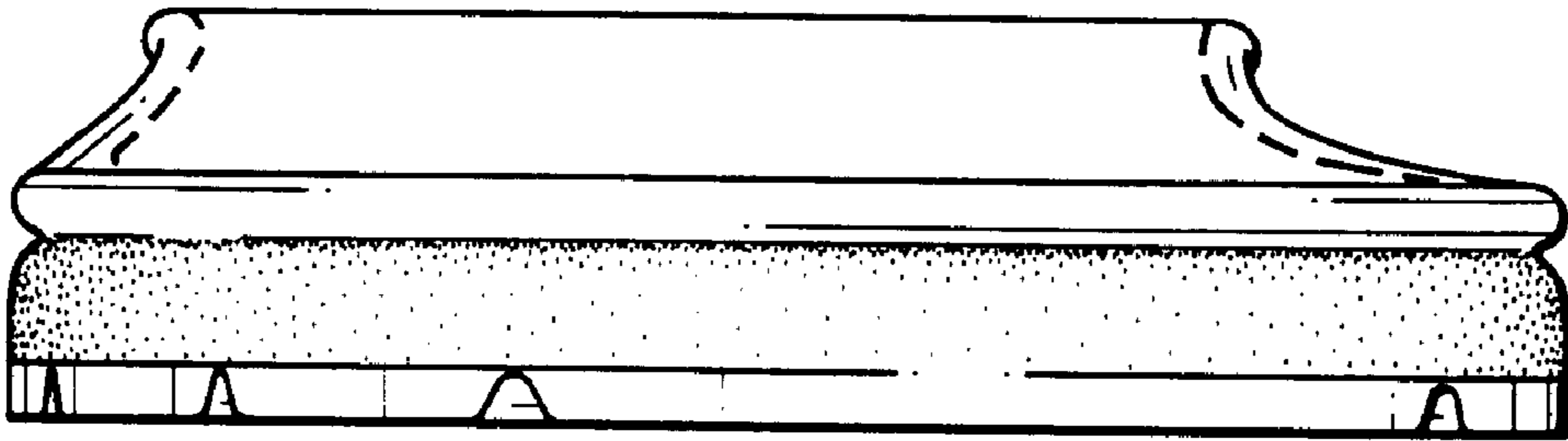

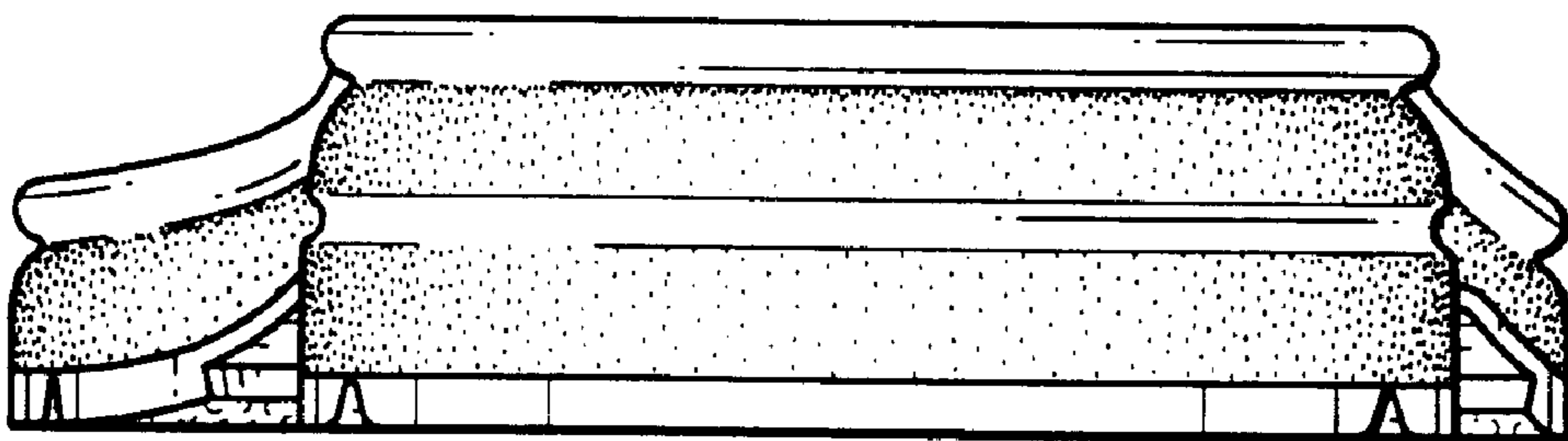

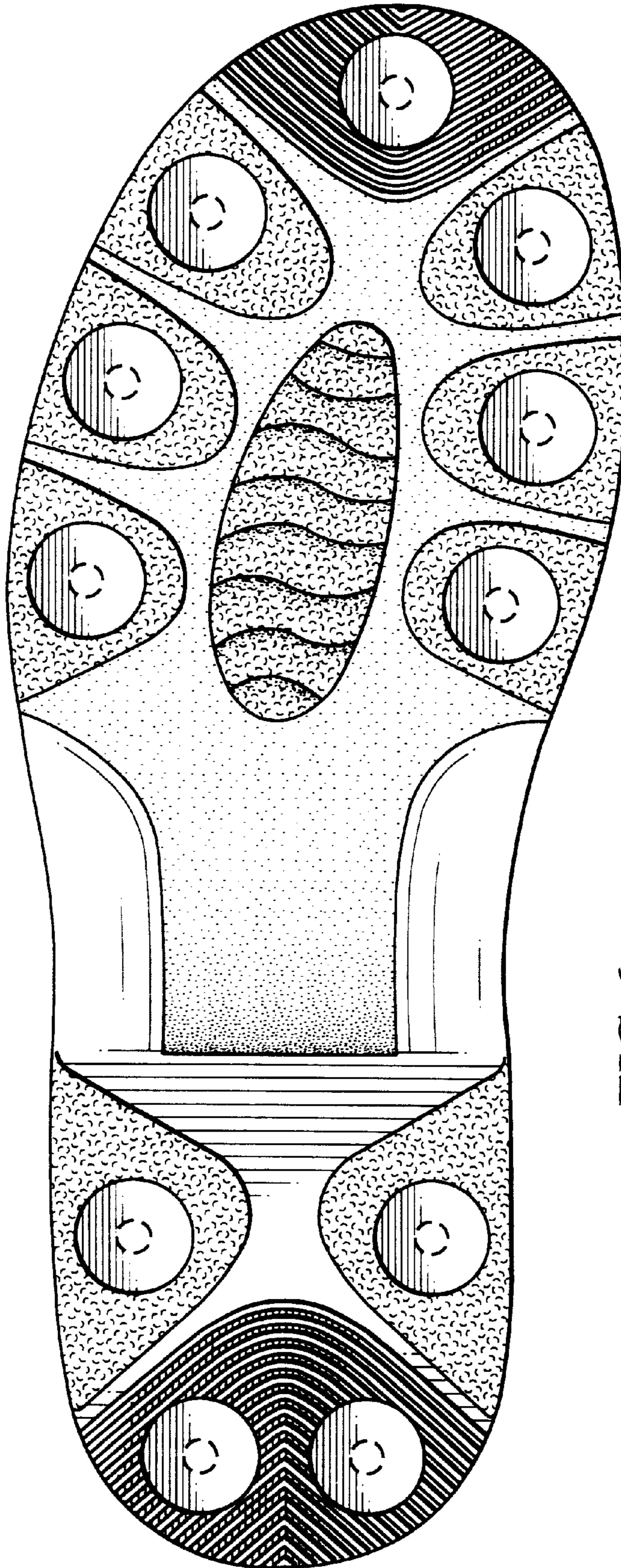

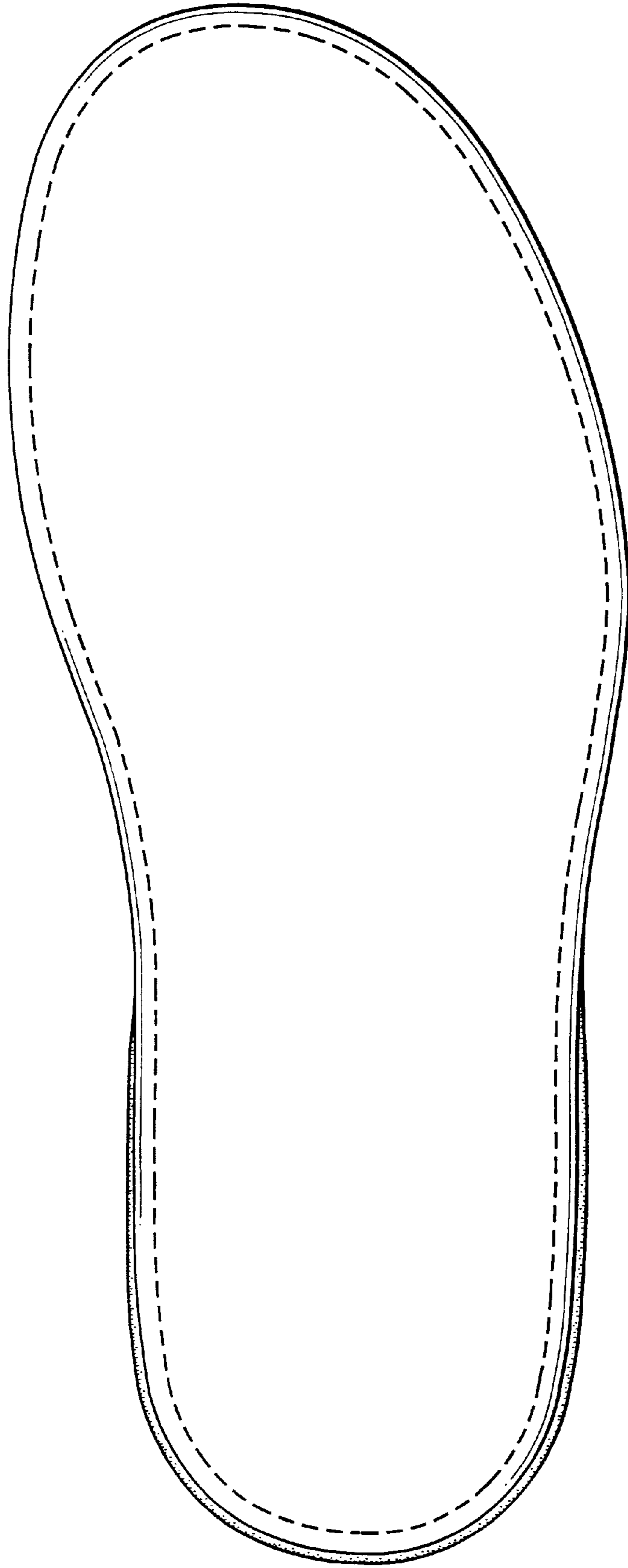
