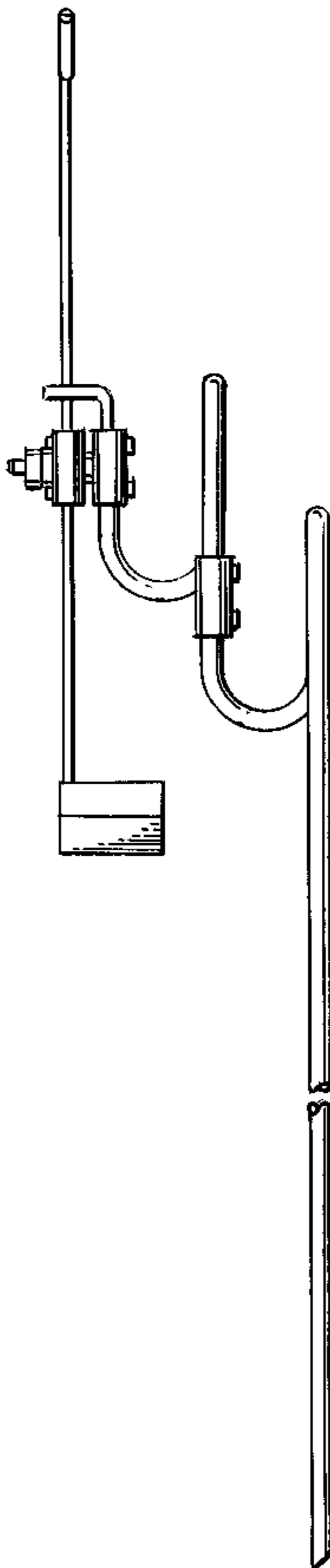
FIG. 5 is a side elevational view as seen from the left of FIG. 1;

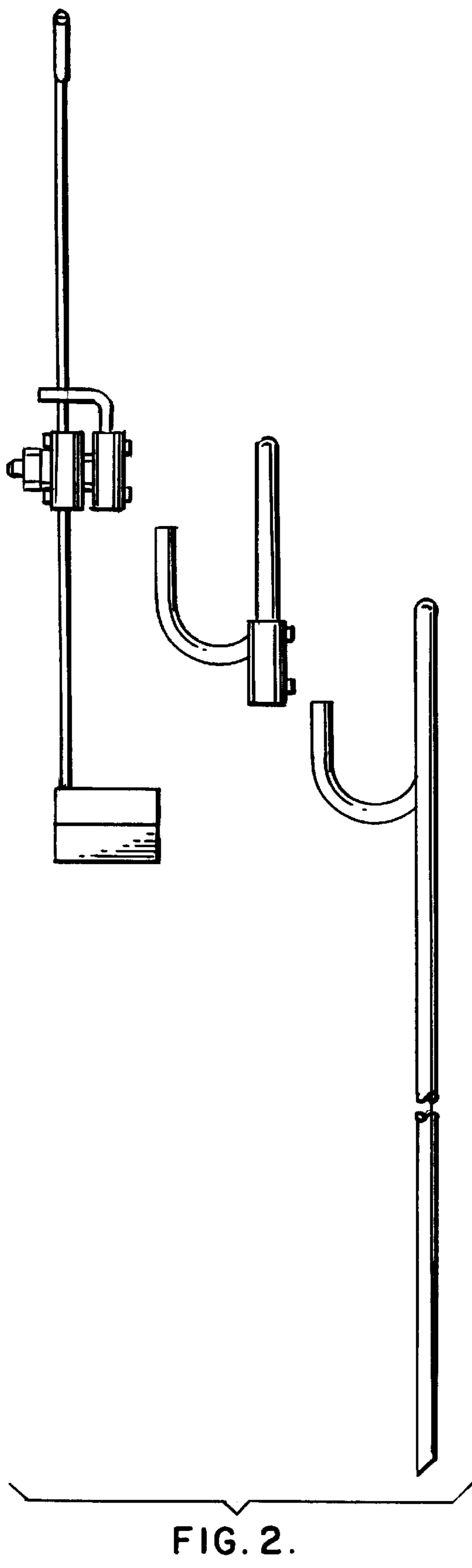
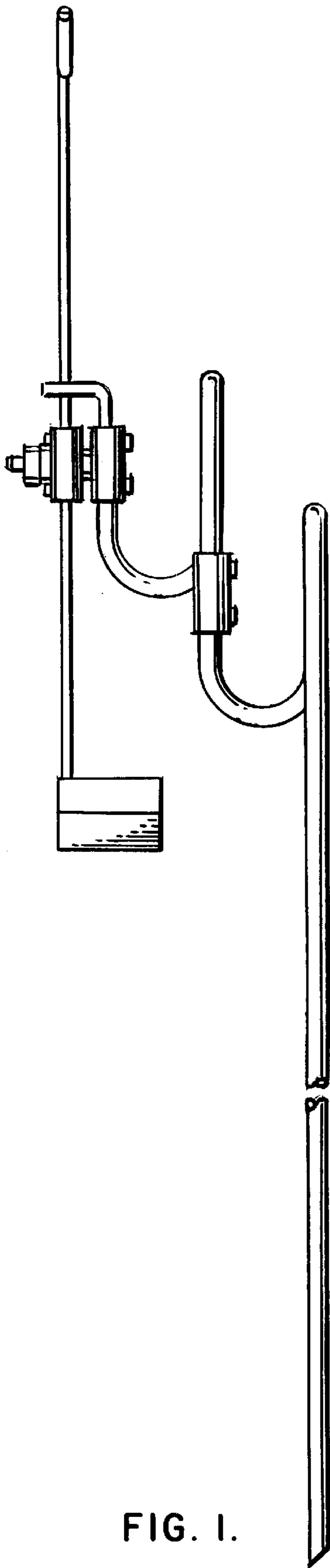
FIG. 6 is a side elevational view as seen from the right of FIG. 1; and,

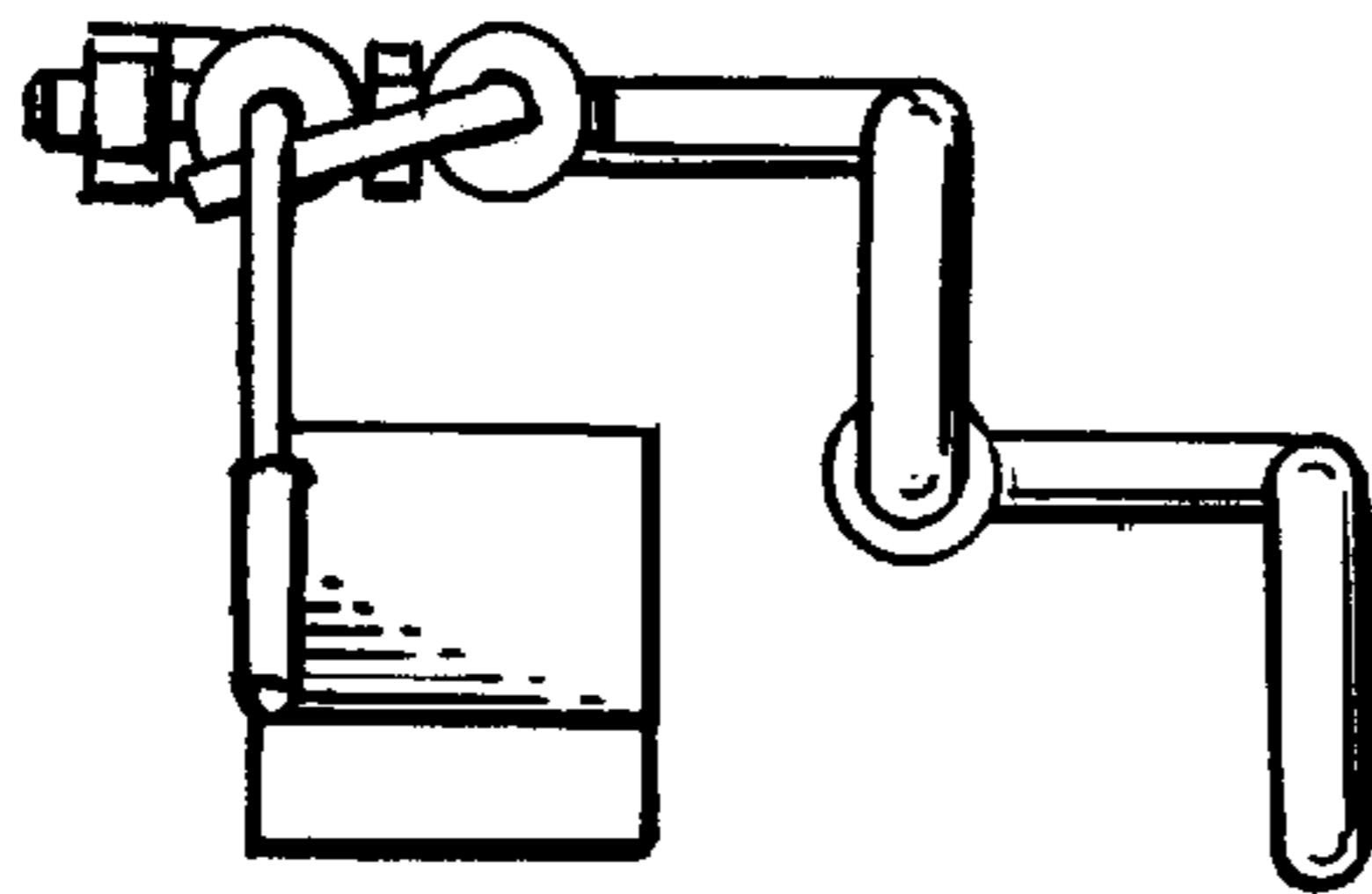
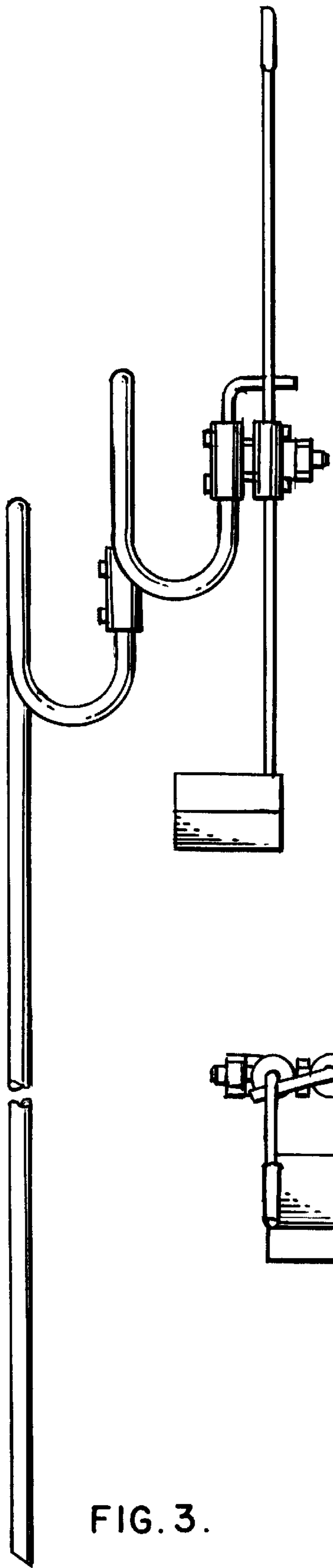

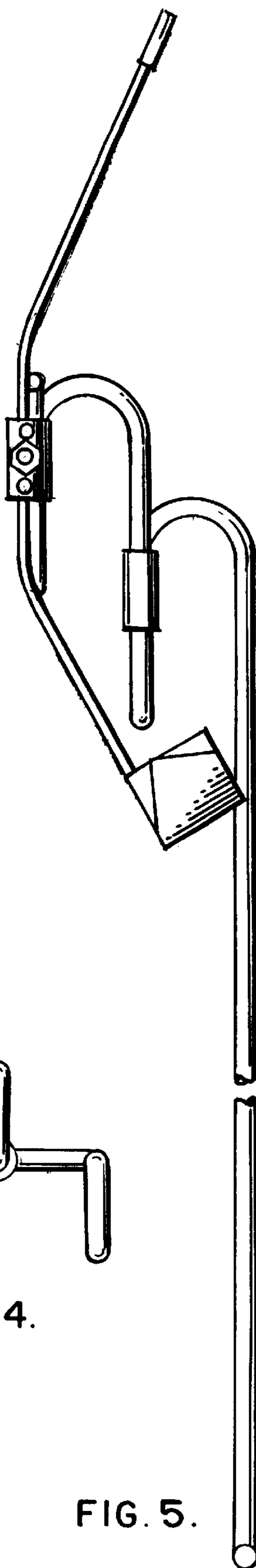

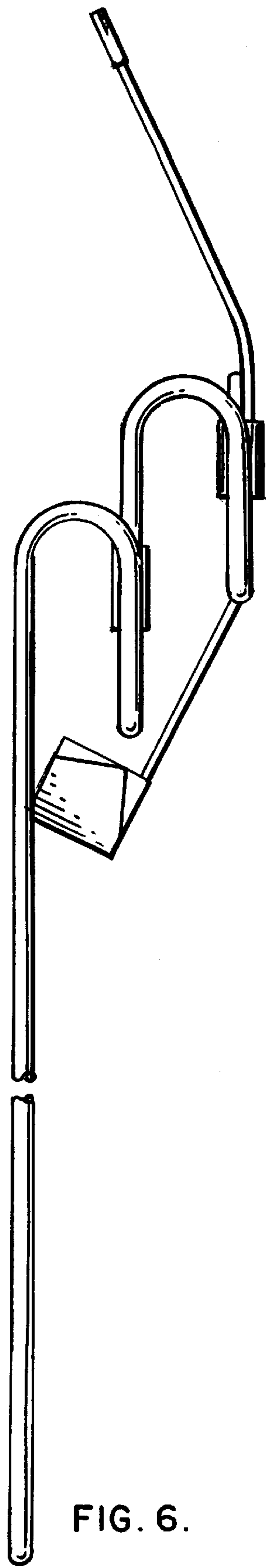

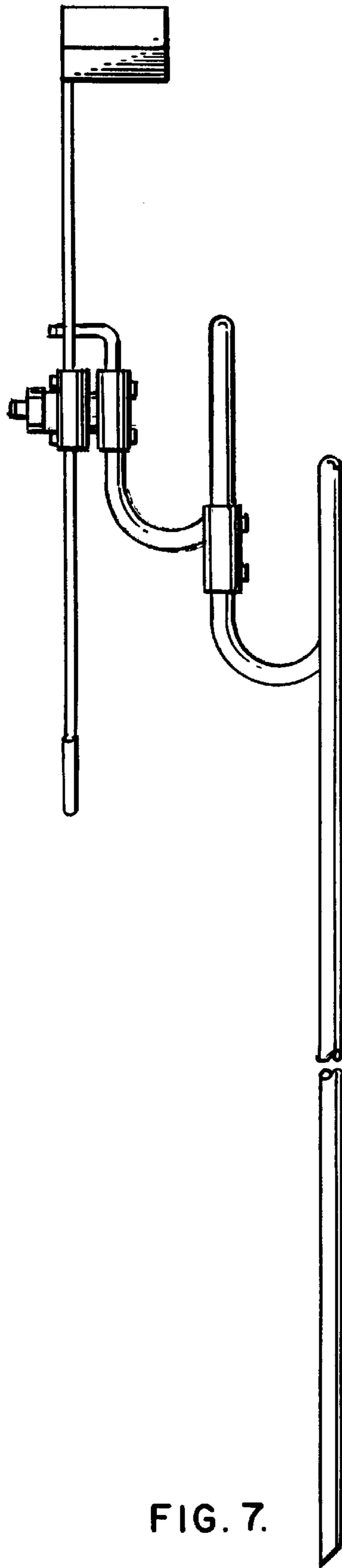
