The ornamental design for a fan blade and holder, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front plan view of the fan blade and holder showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a back plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a side elevation view thereof viewed from the right of FIG. 1;

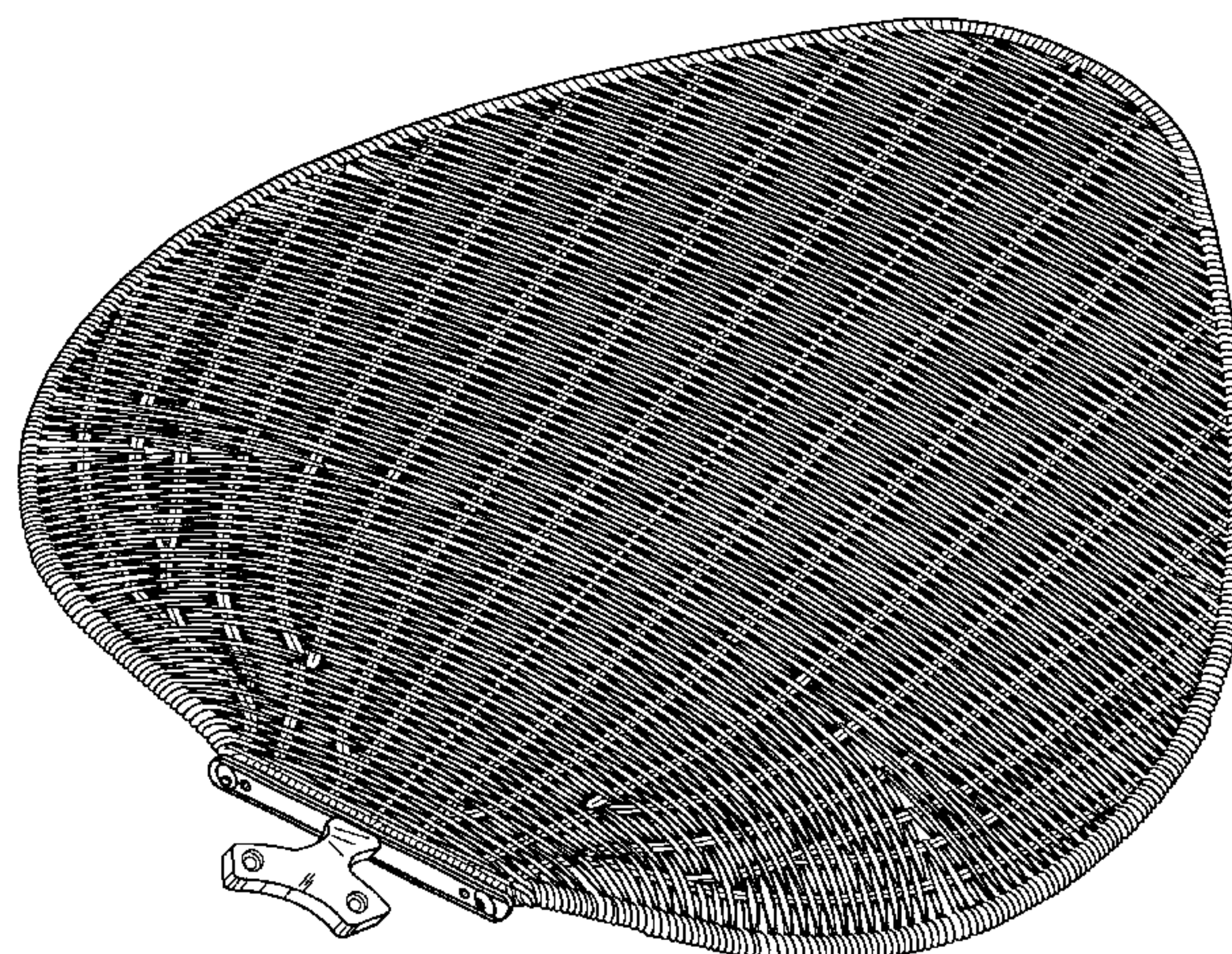
FIG. 4 is a side elevation view thereof viewed from the left of FIG. 1;

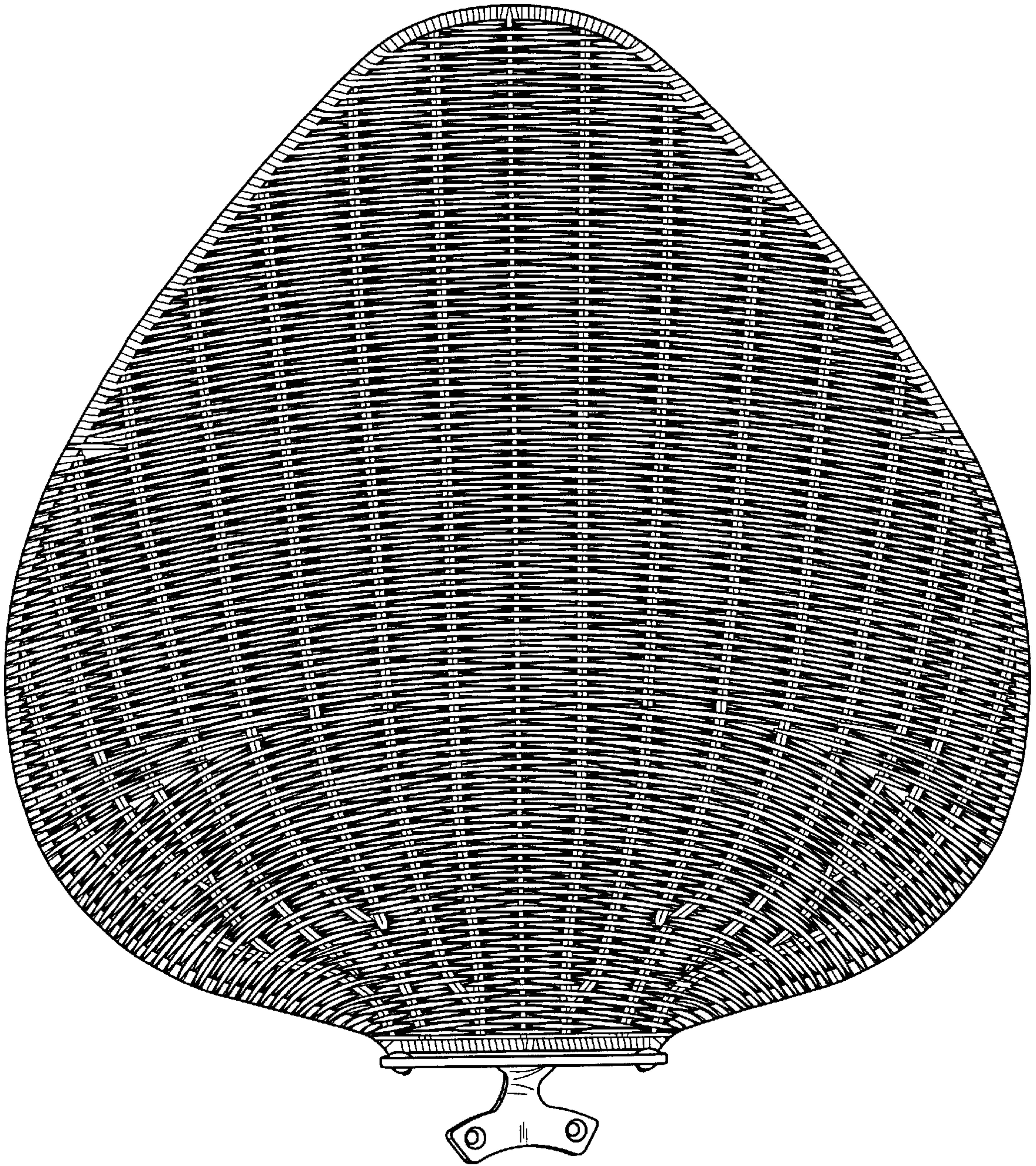

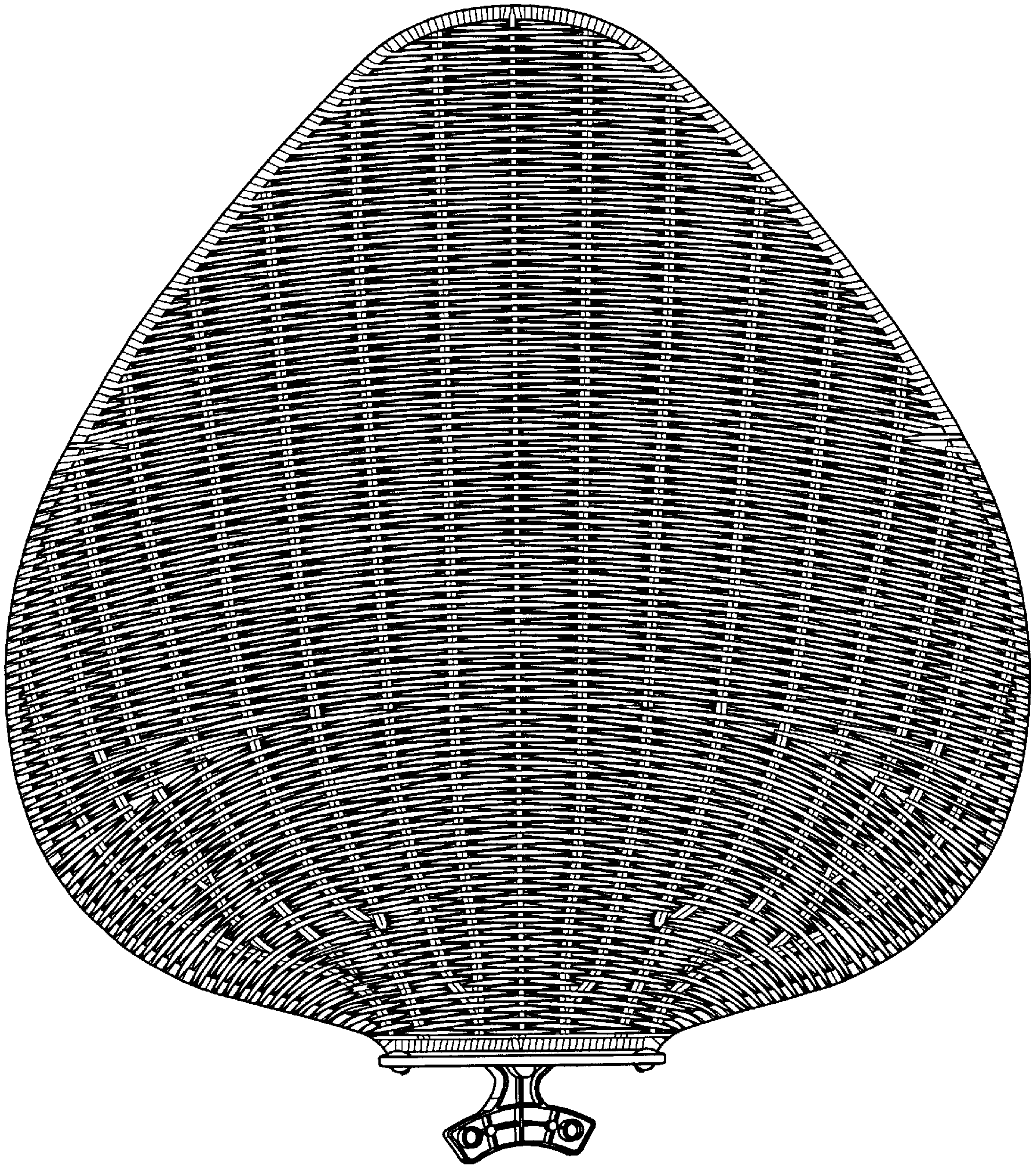

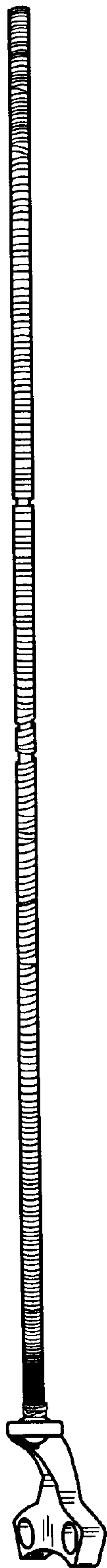

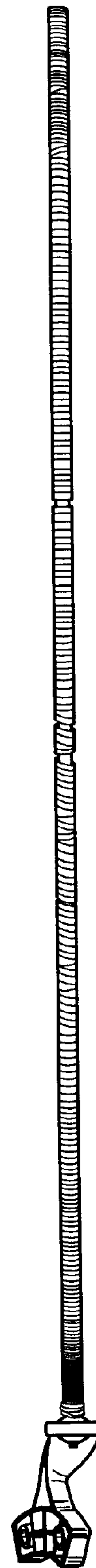

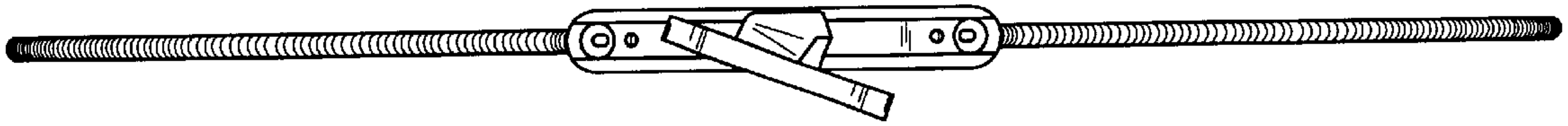

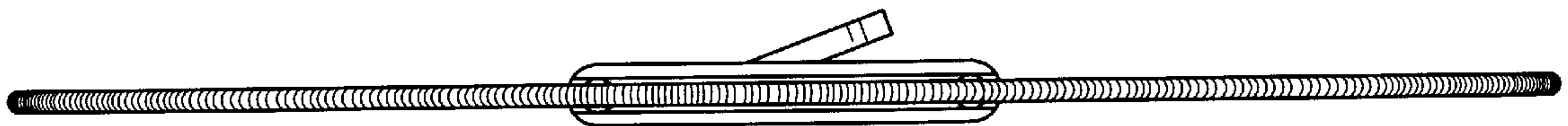

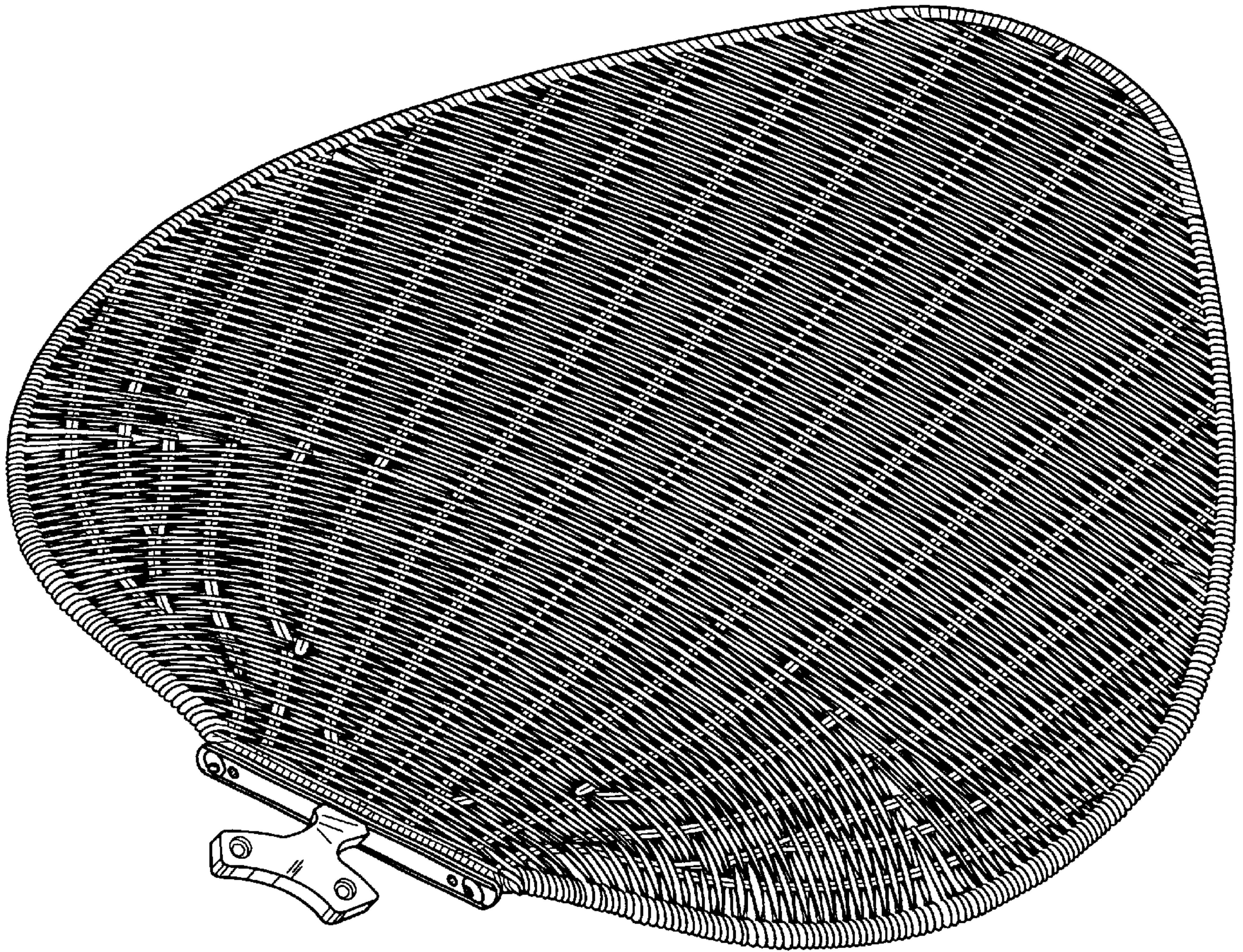
