DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is right side elevation view of a slipper according to the invention.

FIG. 2 is a left side elevation view of the slipper of FIG. 1.

FIG. 3 is a front end elevation view of the slipper of FIG. 1.

FIG. 4 is a rear end elevation view of the slipper of FIG. 1.

FIG. 5 is a top plan view of the slipper of FIG. 1.

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view of the slipper of FIG. 1; and,

FIG. 7 is a perspective view of the slipper of FIG. 1 as seen

from the right and to the front showing the slipper in use on

a person's foot, the leg of the person rising upward from the

slipper being shown in dashed lines.

The broken lines are shown in the view of FIG. 7 for

illustrative purposes only and form no part of the claimed

design.

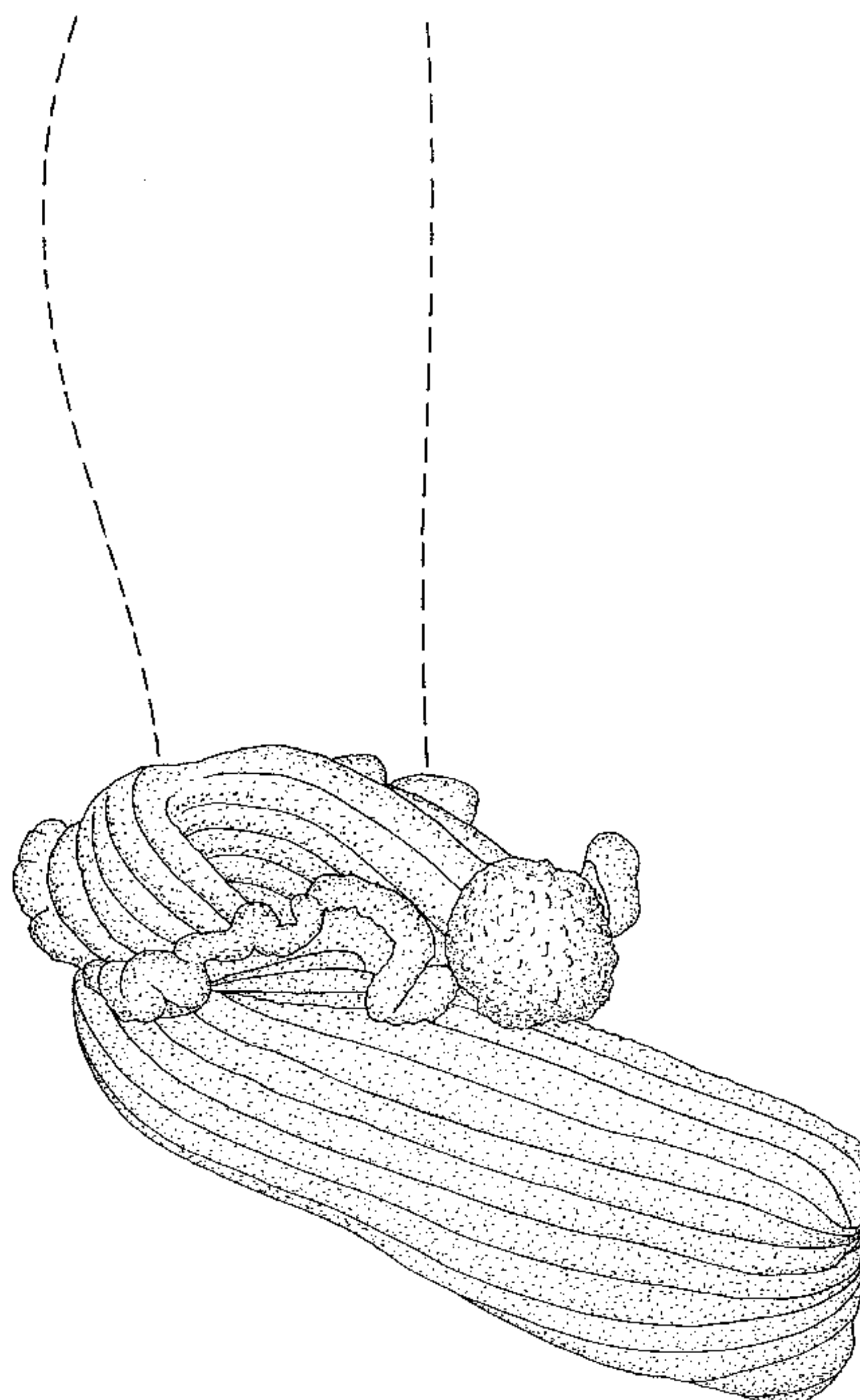
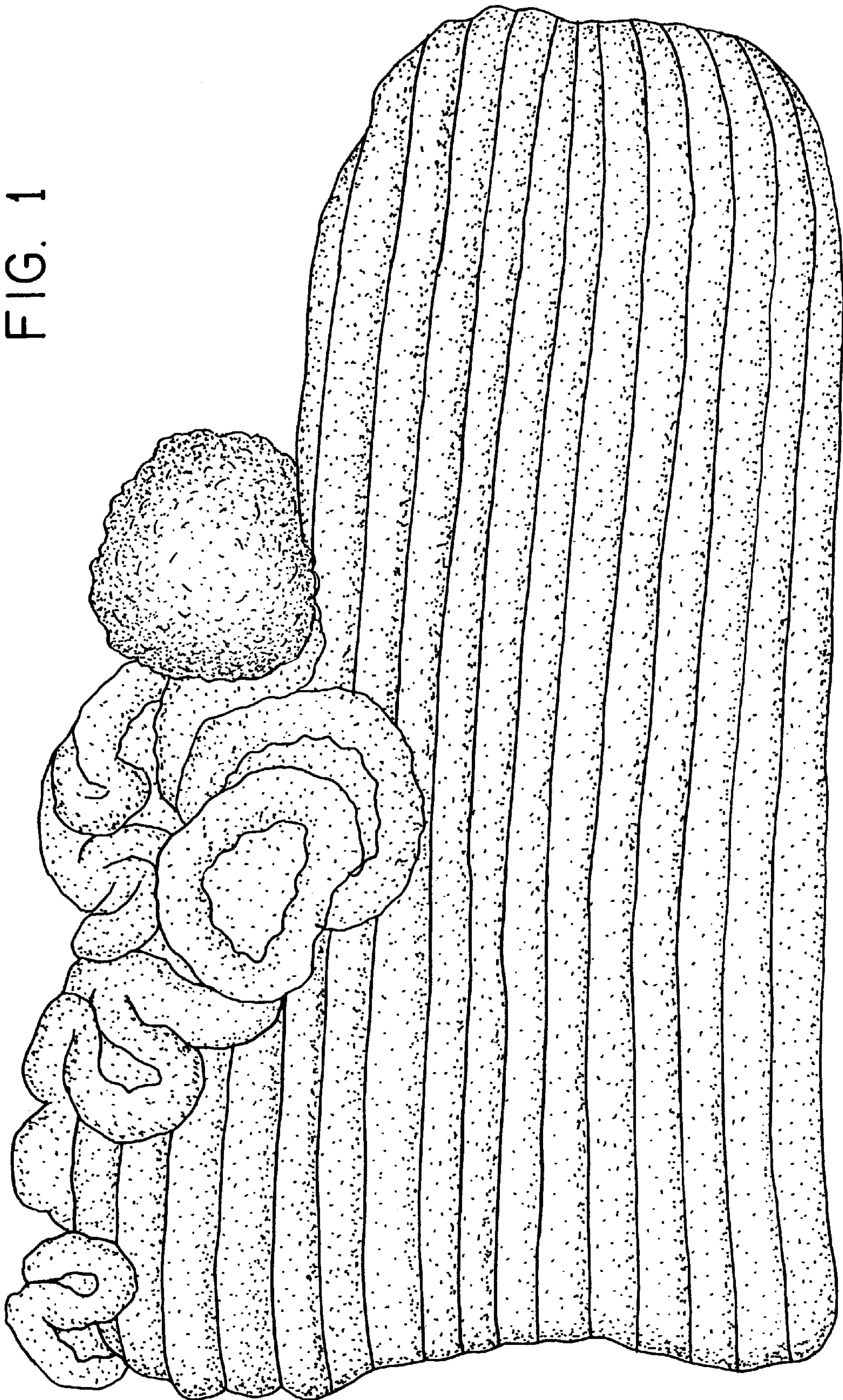

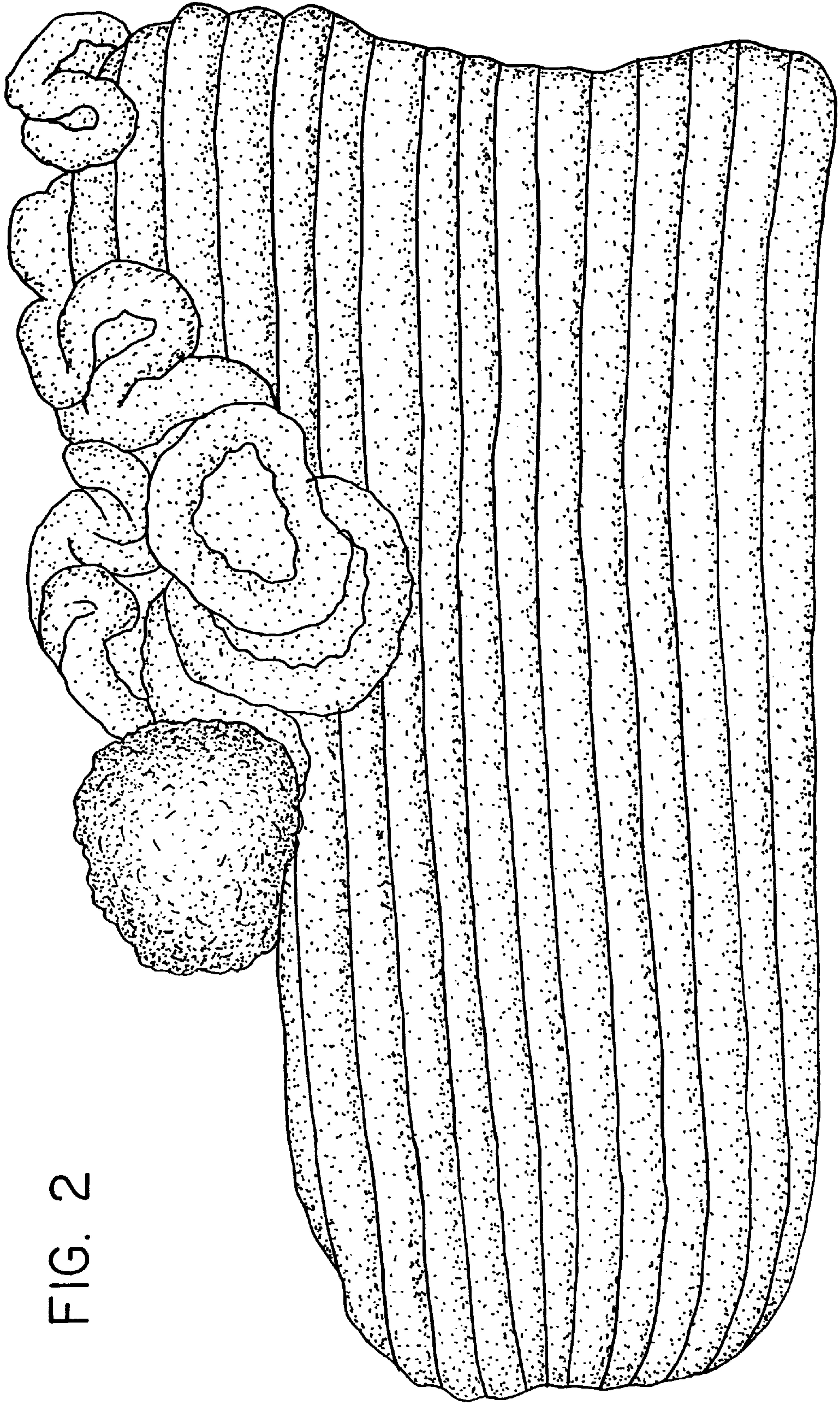

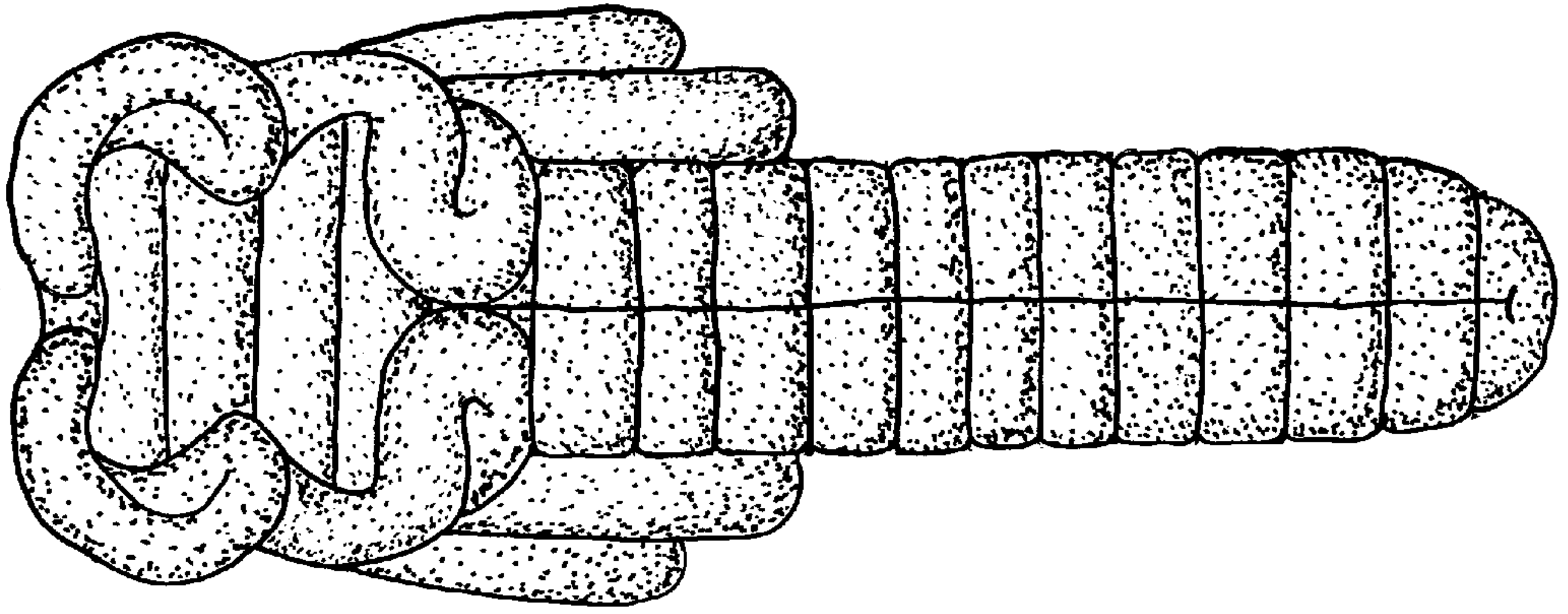

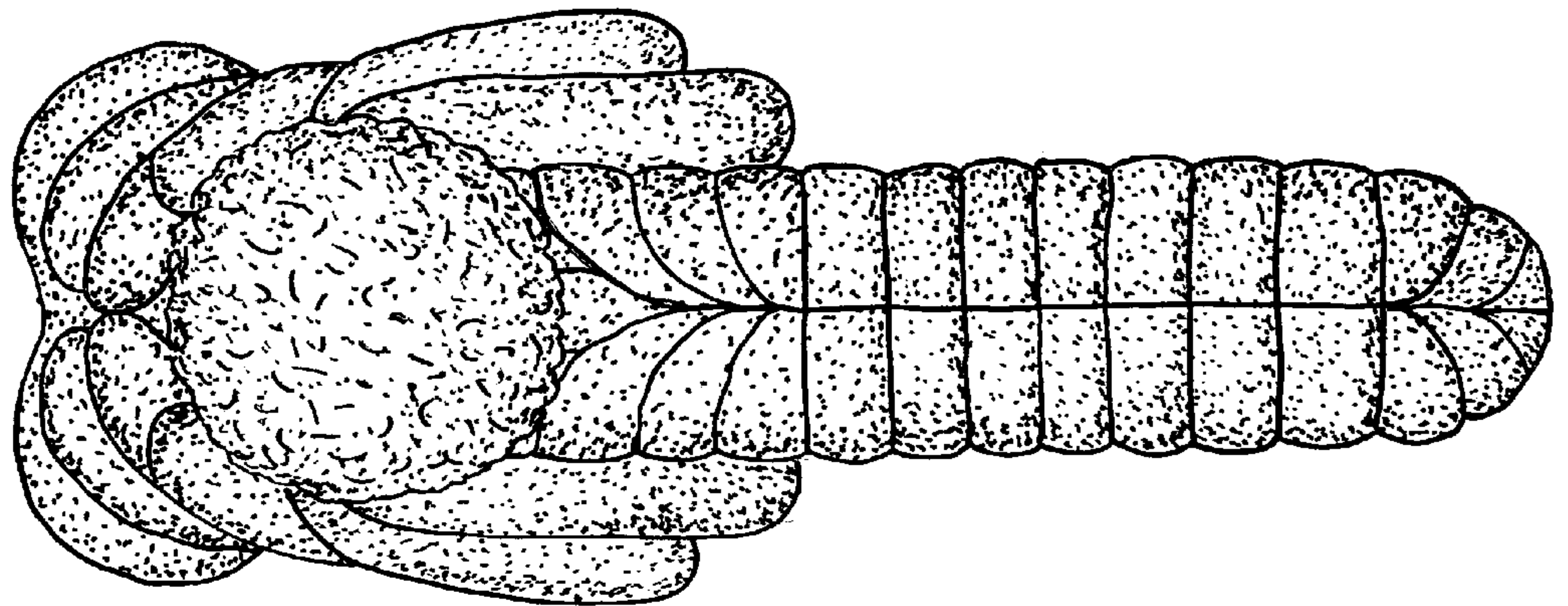

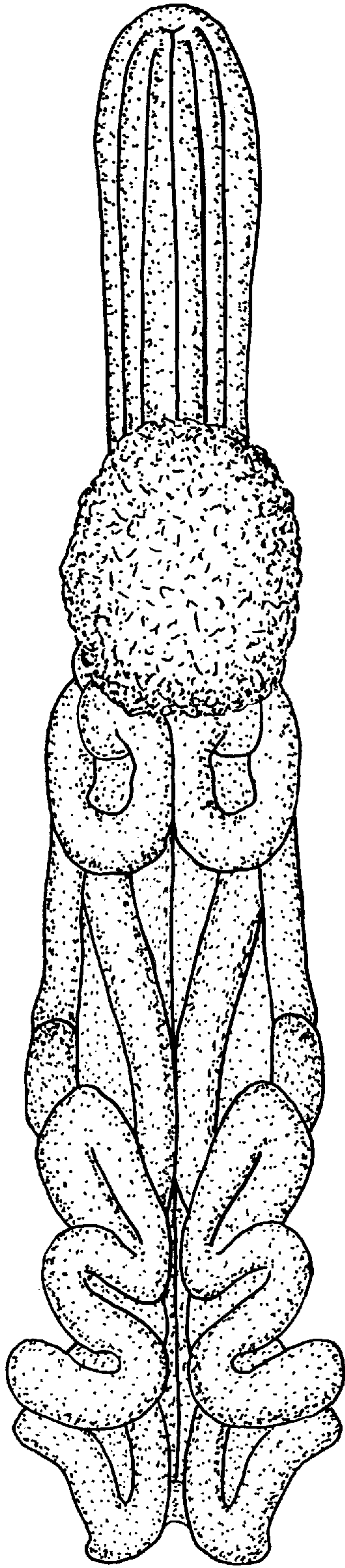

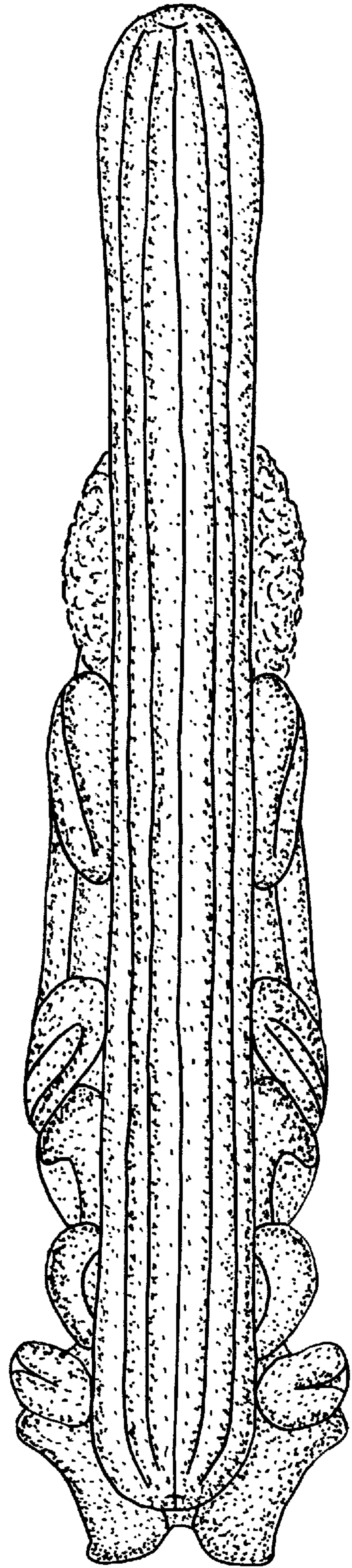
