FIG. 4 is a rear end view thereof;

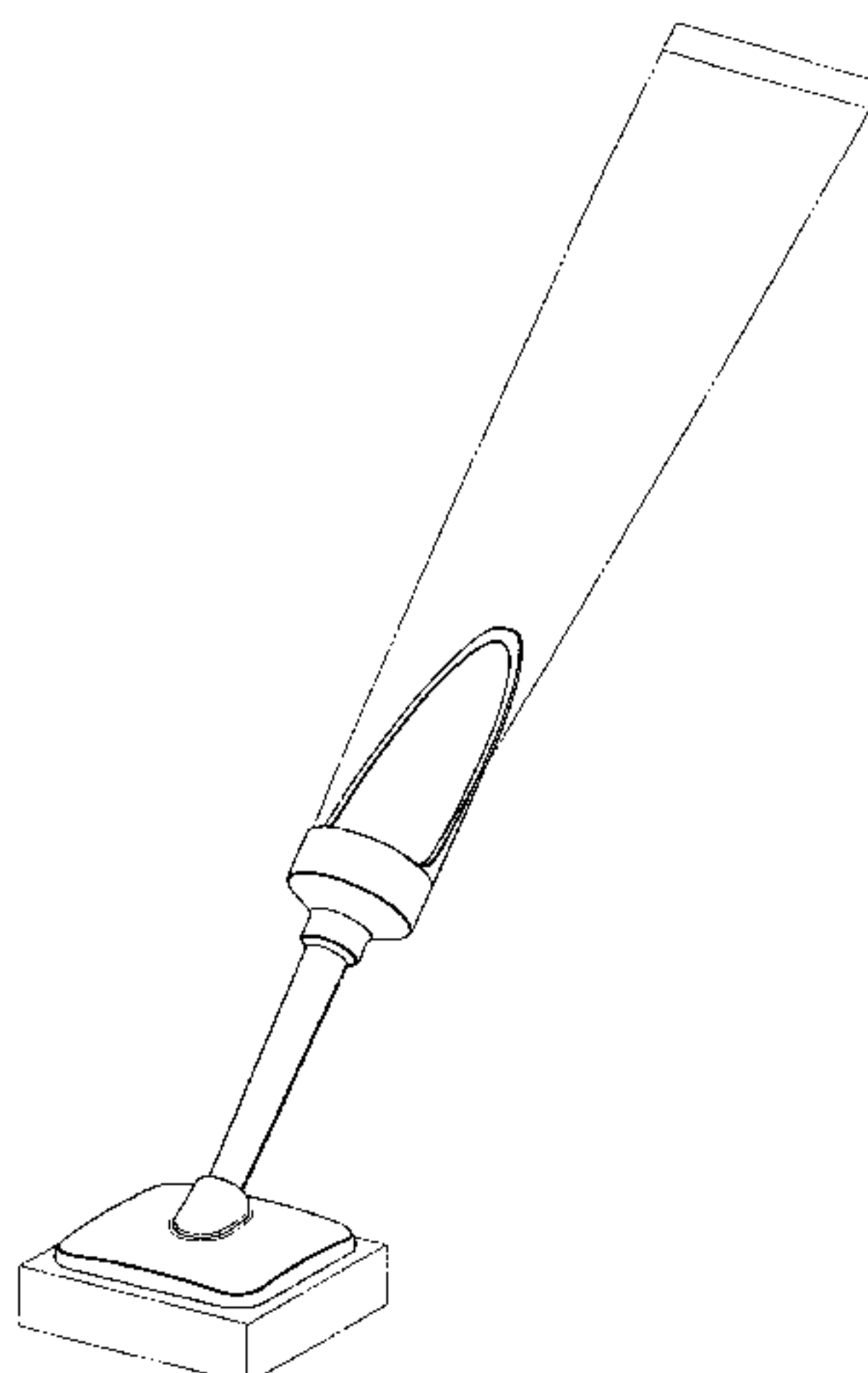
FIG. 5 is a top plan view thereof; and,

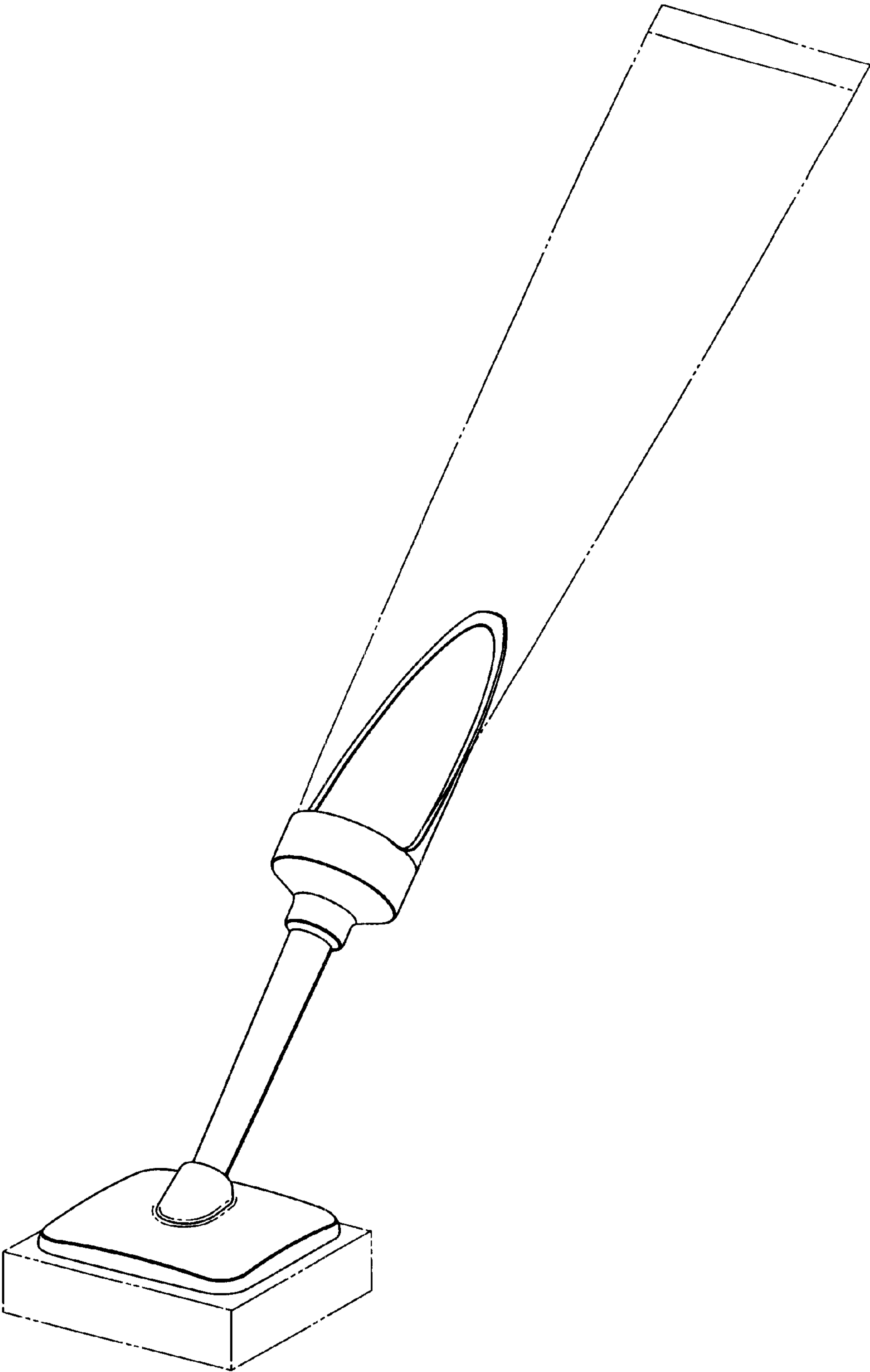

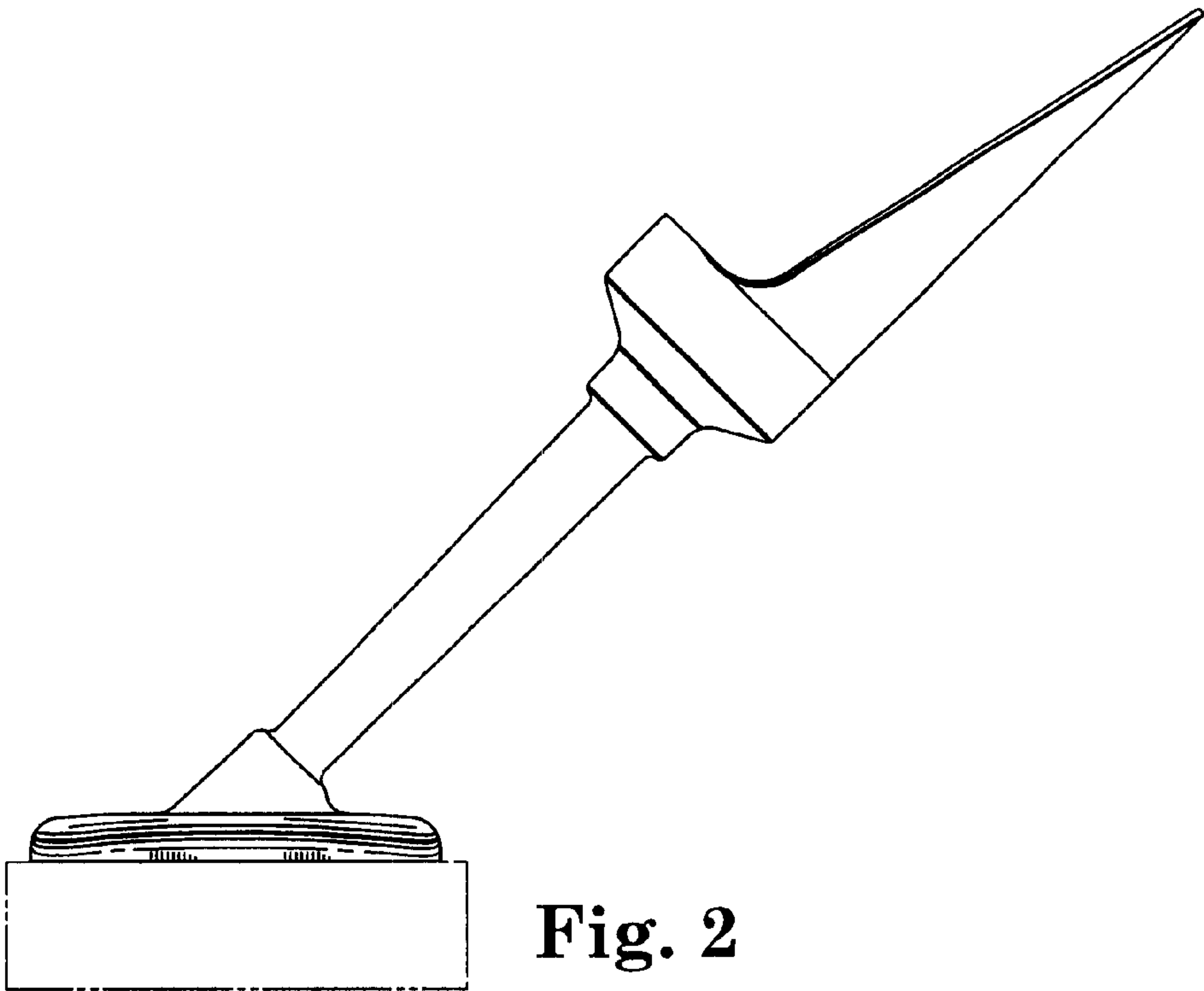

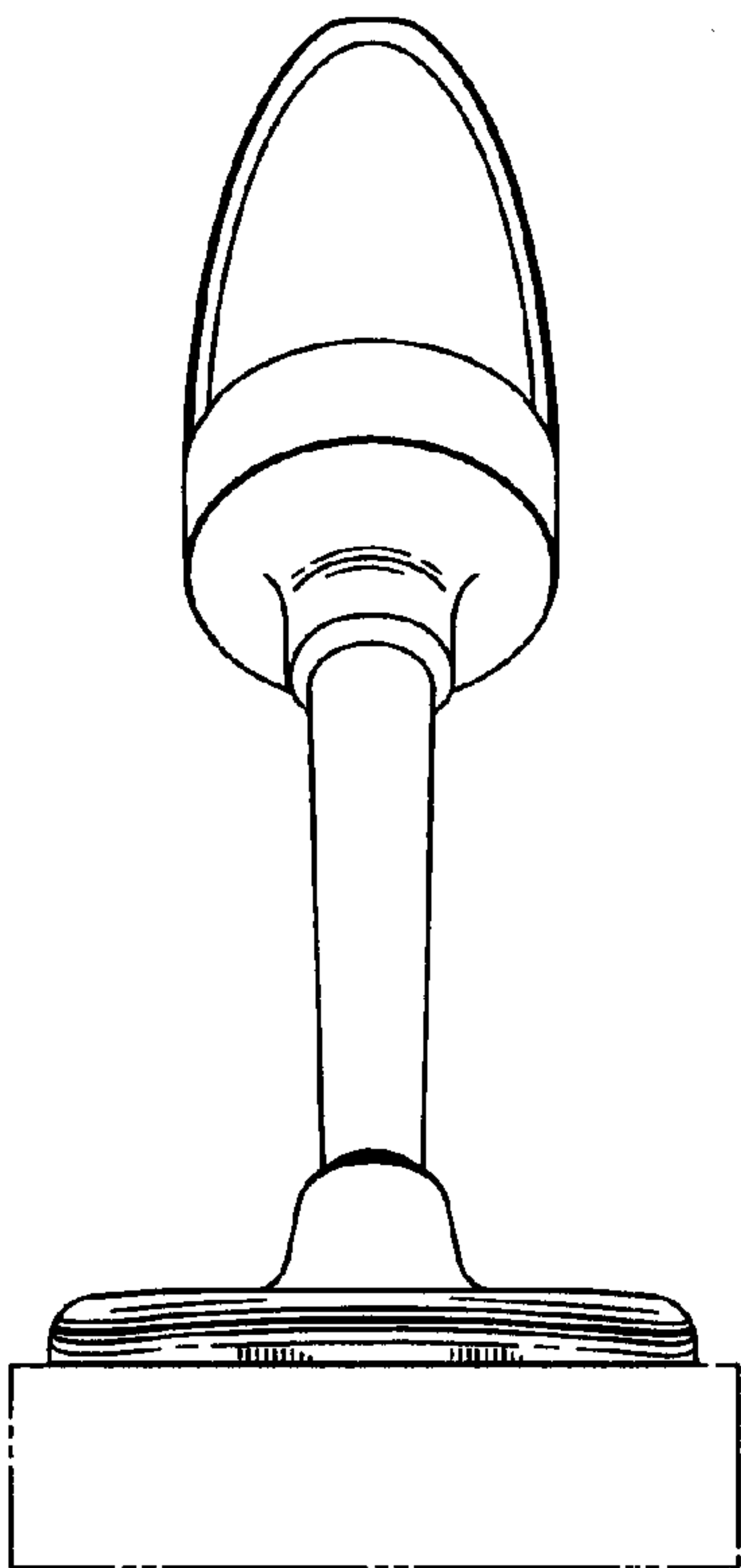

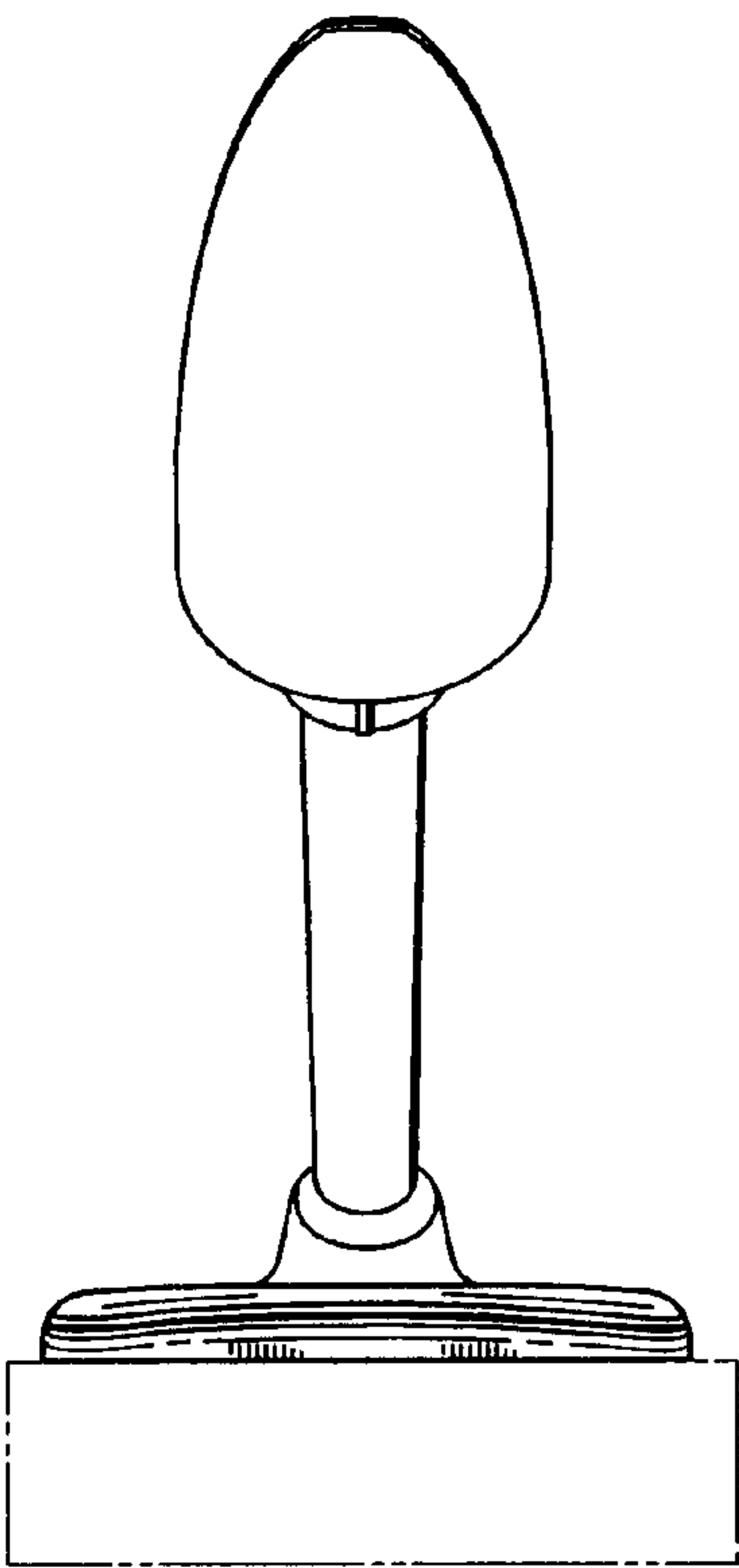

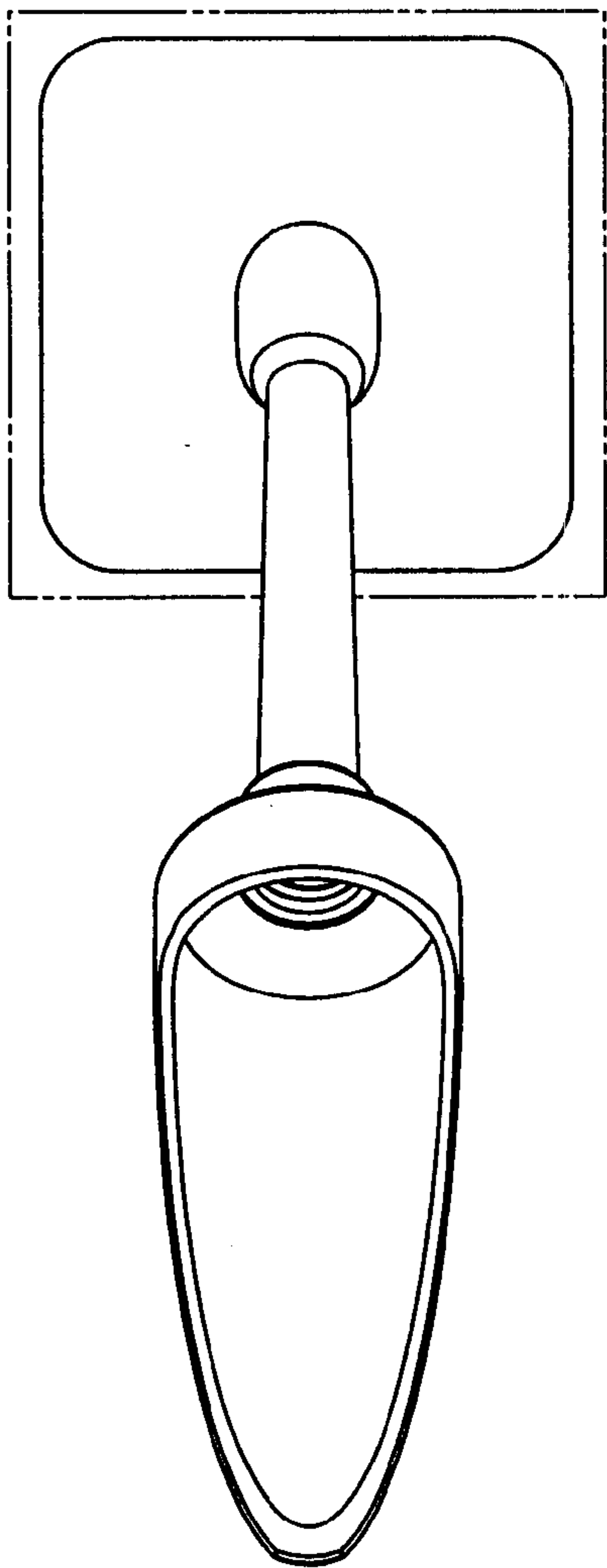

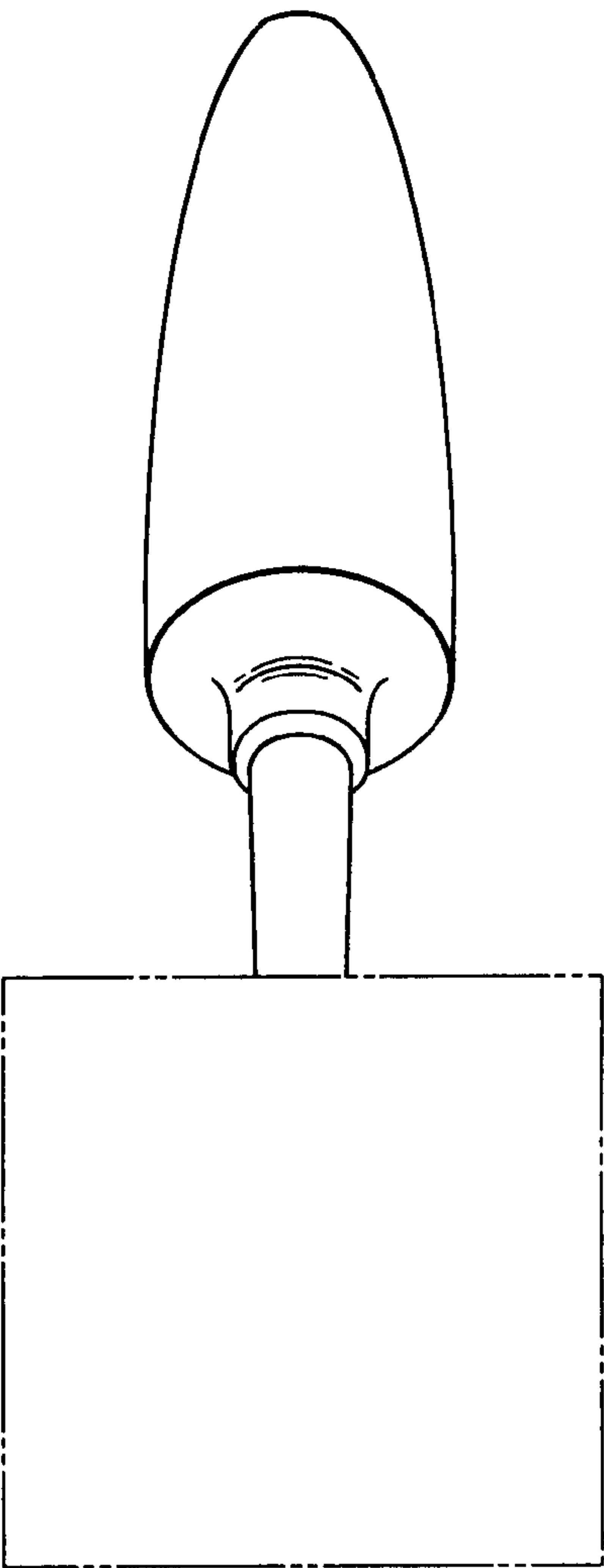
