(57) **CLAIM**

I claim the ornamental designs for a desk, as shown and
described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a first embodiment of
the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the first embodiment of
the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 3 is a right side elevational view of the first embodi-
ment of the desk showing portions of the desk in broken
lines. The left side elevational view (not shown) is a mirror
image of the right side elevational view.

FIG. 4 is a top elevational view of the first embodiment of
the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 5 is a rear perspective view of the first embodiment of
the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view of the first embodiment of
the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 7 is a bottom elevational view of the first embodiment
of the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

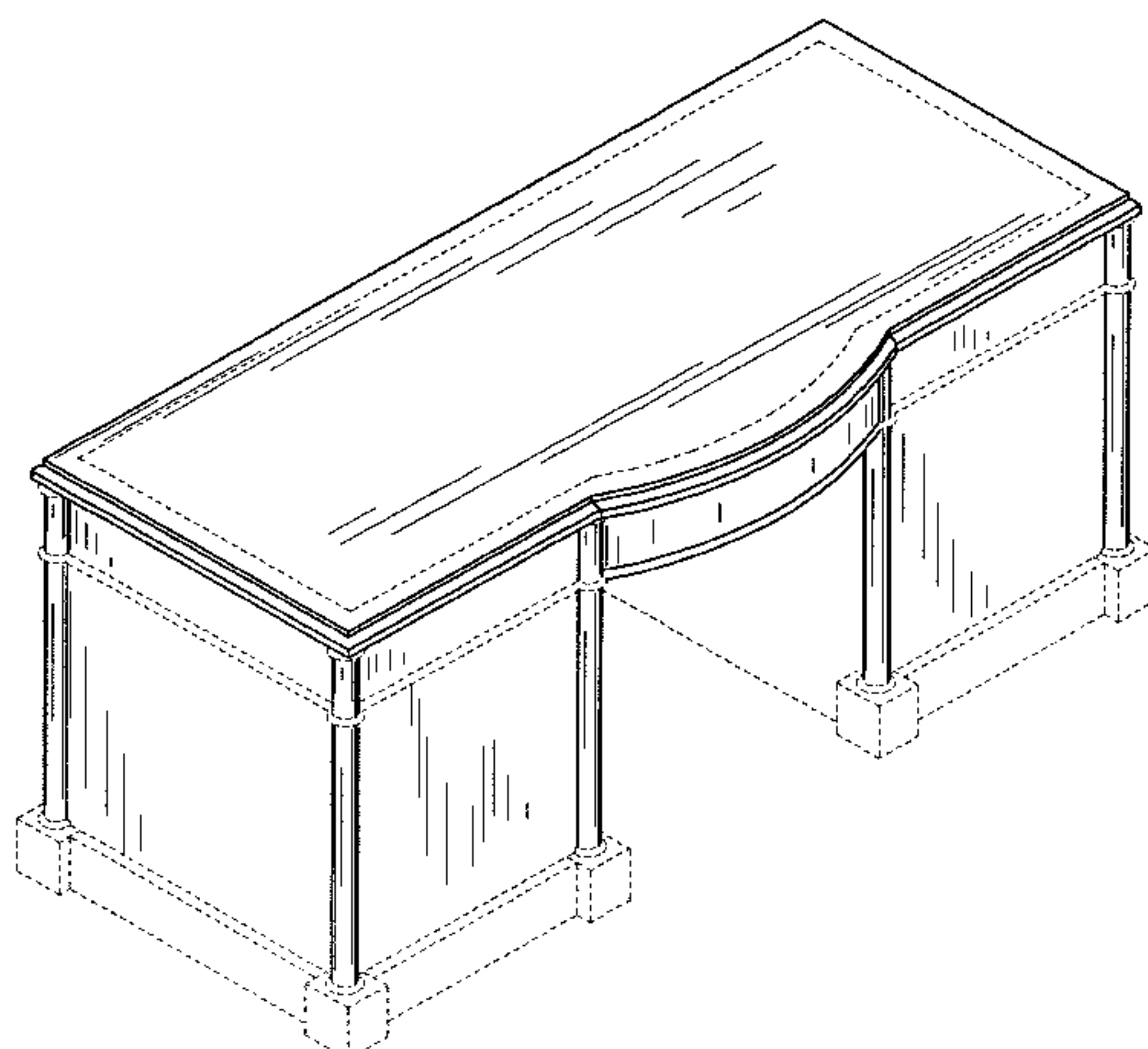
FIG. 8 is a front perspective view of a second embodiment
of the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines.

FIG. 9 is a front elevational view of the second embodiment
of the desk showing portions of the desk in broken lines. The
top elevational view (not shown) would be the same as the
first embodiment as shown in FIG. 4. The rear elevational
view (not shown) of this embodiment would be the same as
the first embodiment as shown in FIG. 6, except the rounded
front section of the desk (shown in FIGS. 8, 9, 10, and 11)
would be shown as in FIG. 9.

FIG. 10 is a right side elevational view of the second
embodiment of the desk showing portions of the desk in
broken lines. The left side elevational view (not shown) is a
mirror image of the right side elevational view; and,

FIG. 11 is a bottom elevational view of the second embodi-
ment of the desk showing portions of the desk in broken
lines.

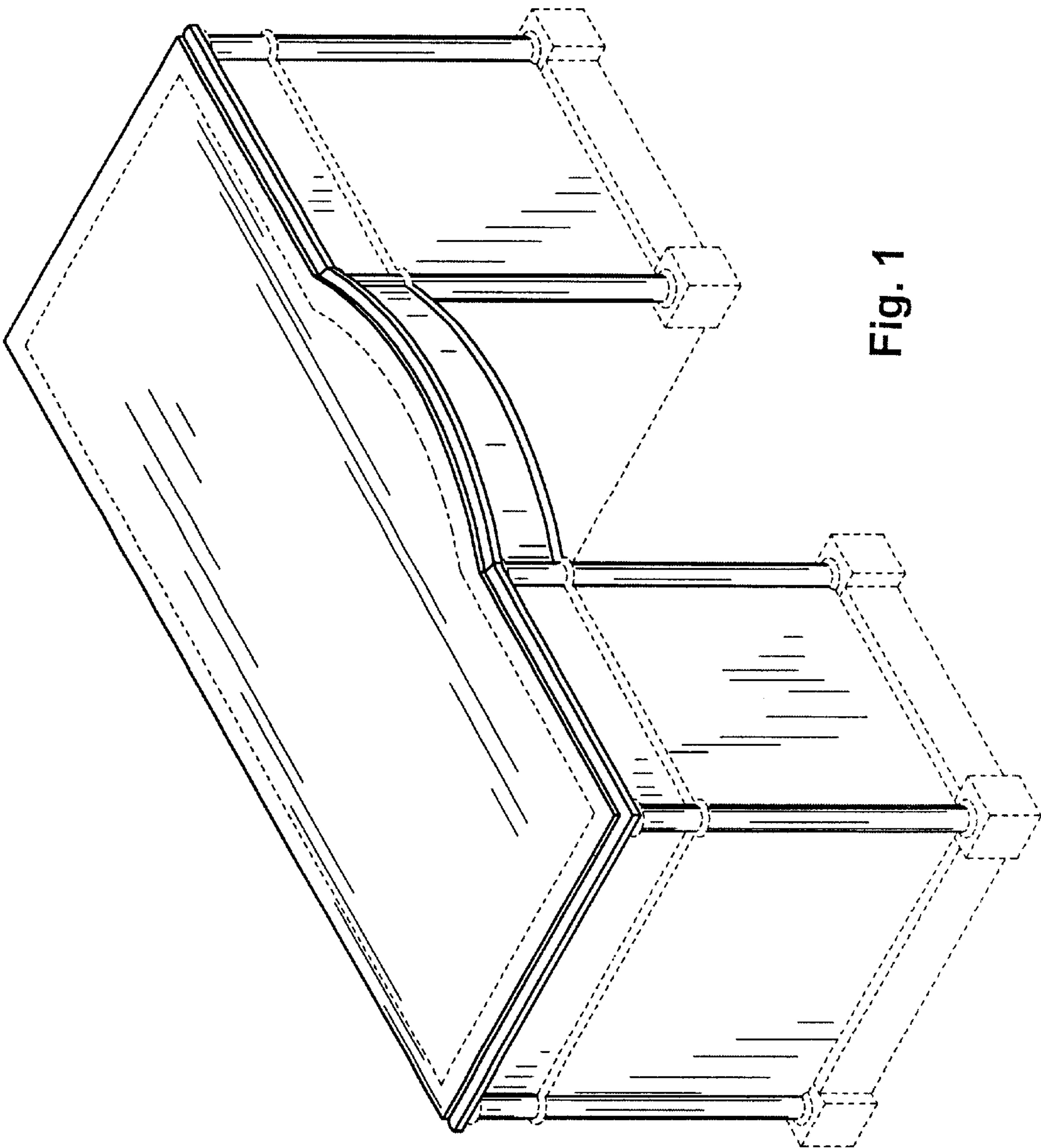

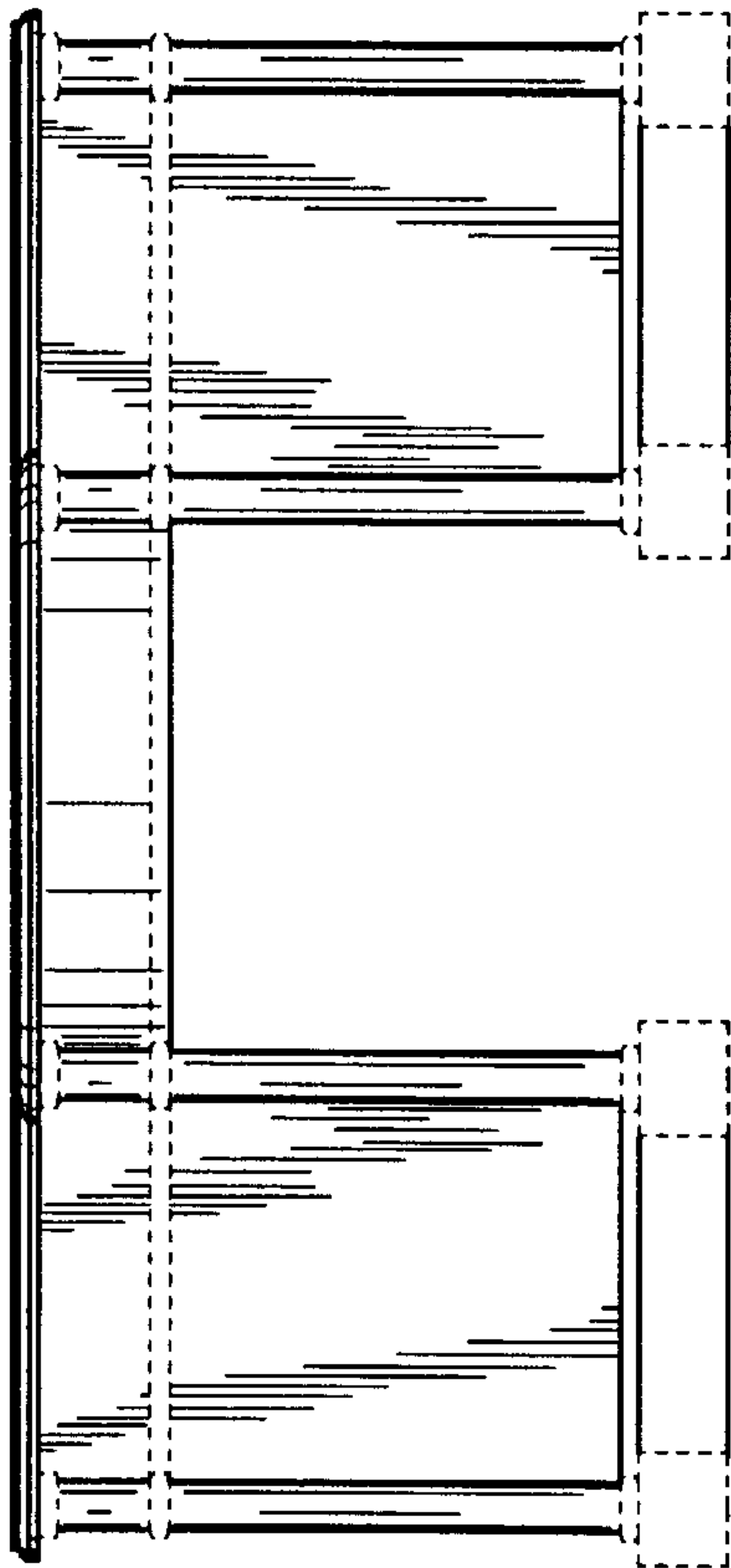

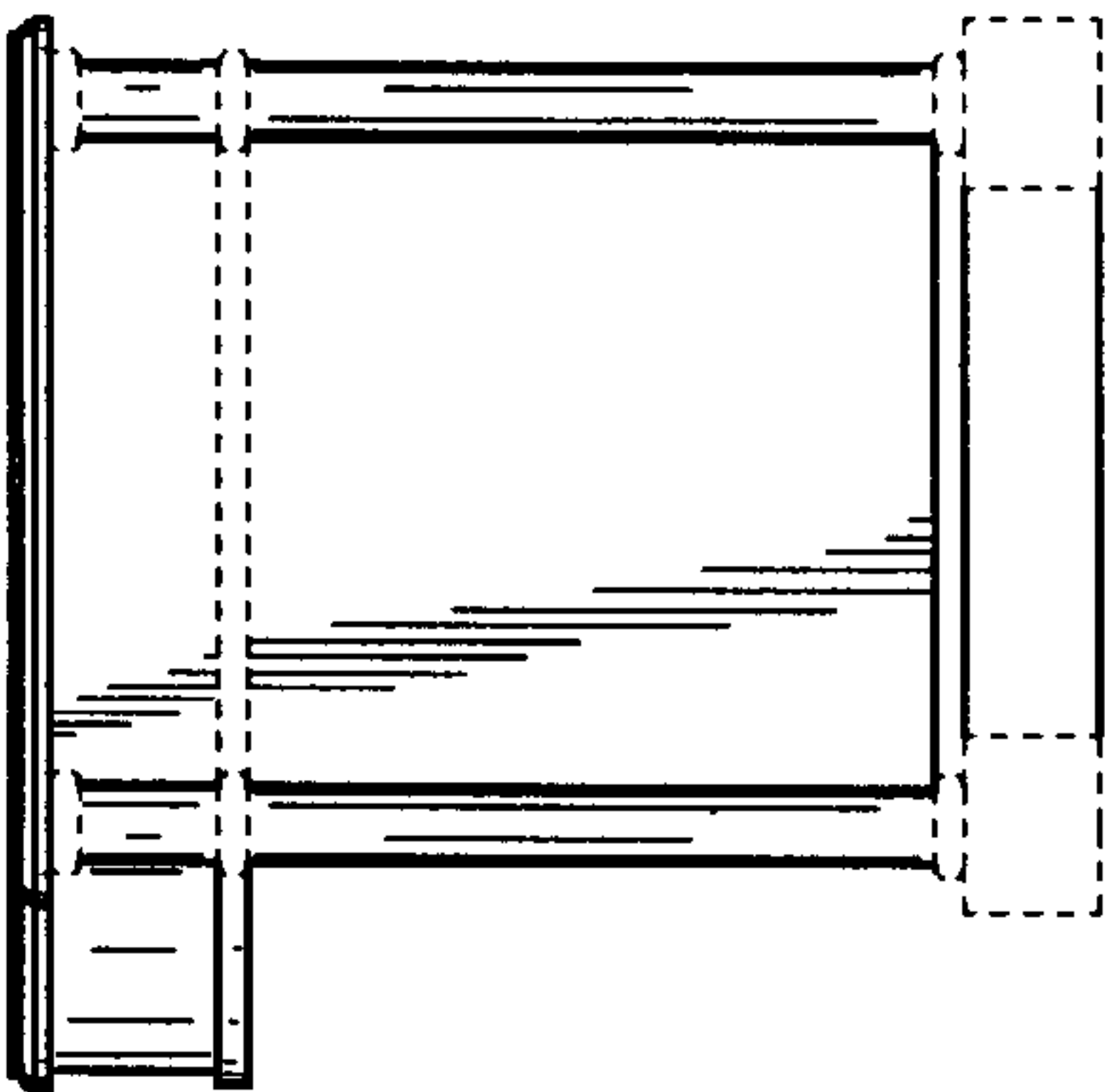

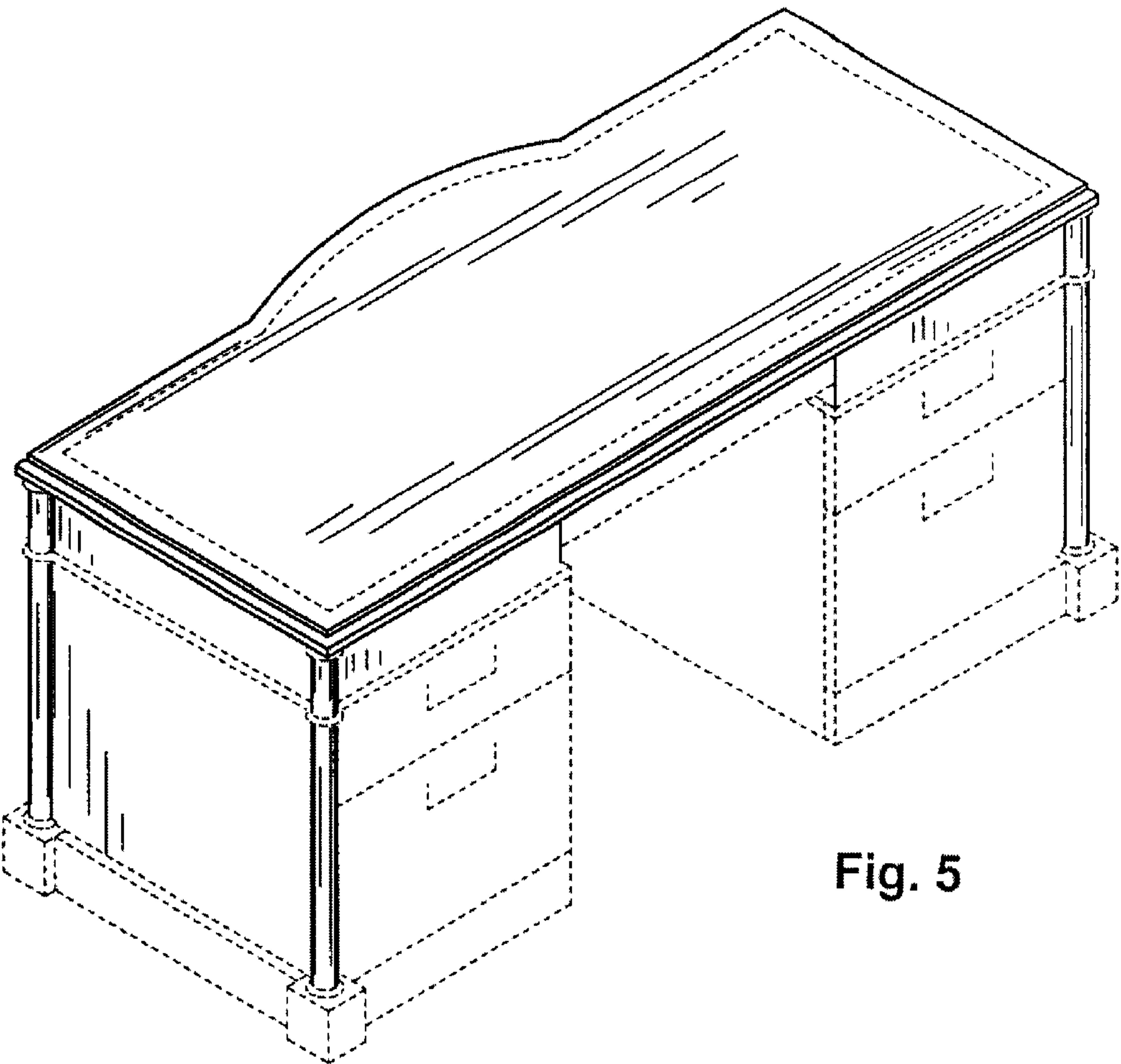

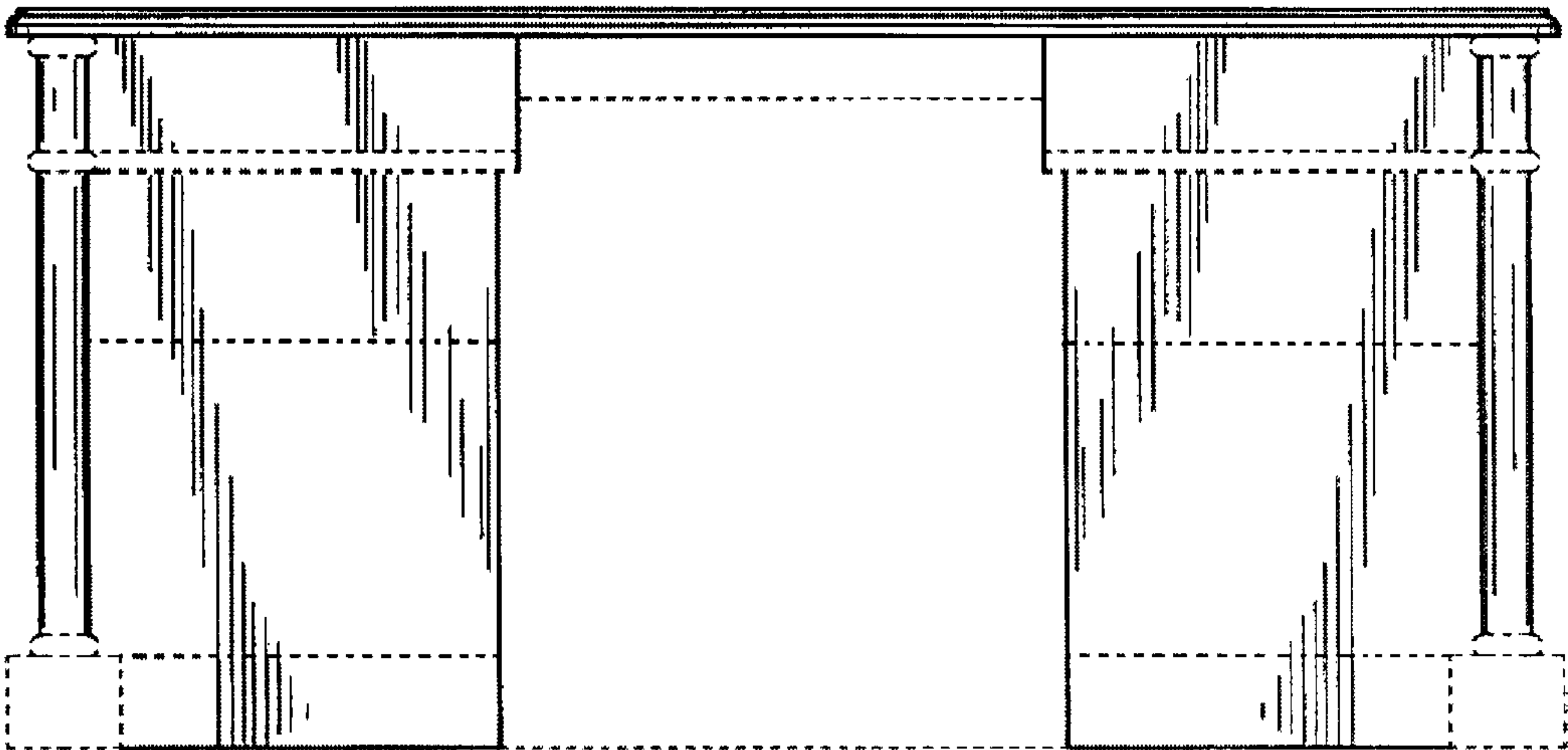

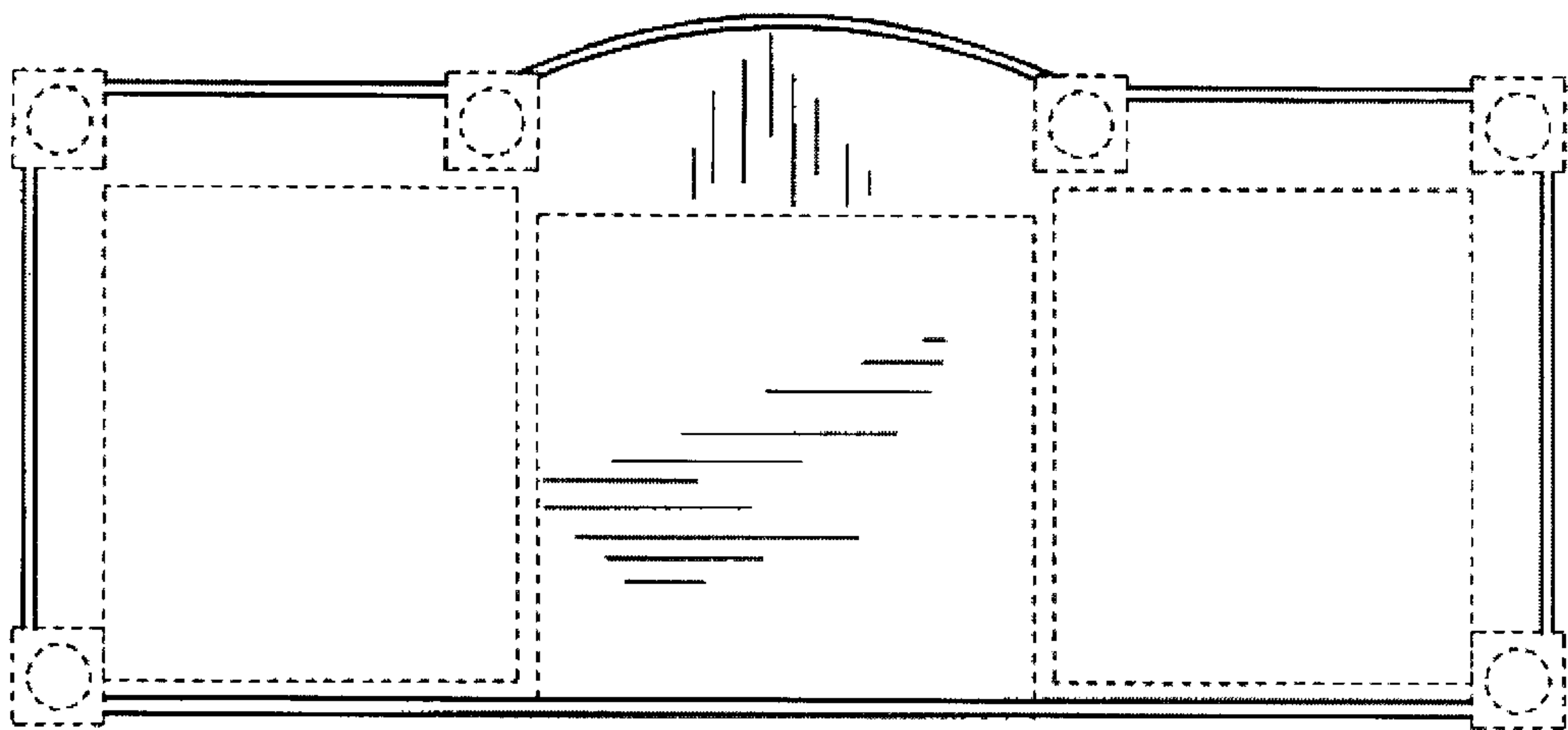

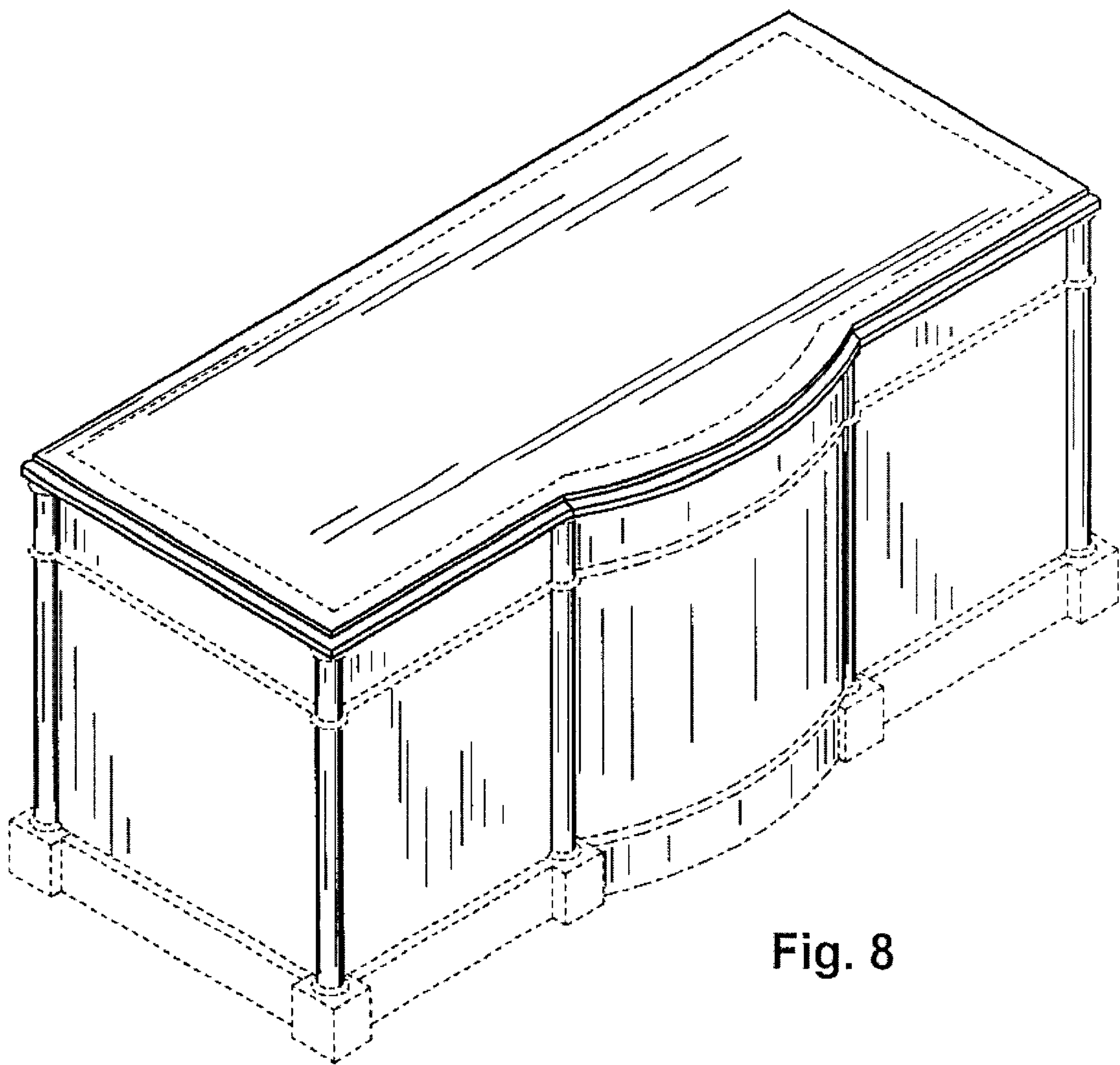

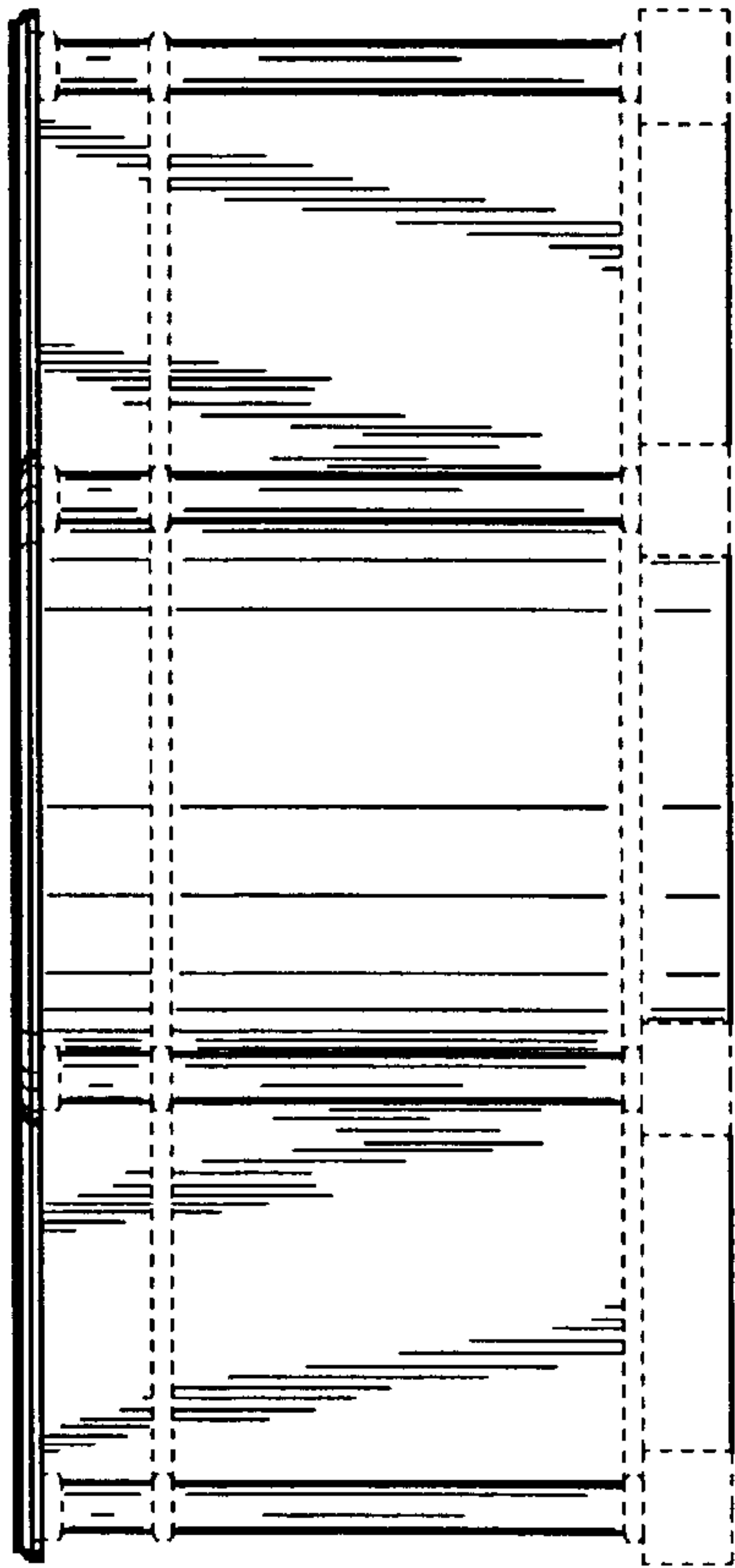

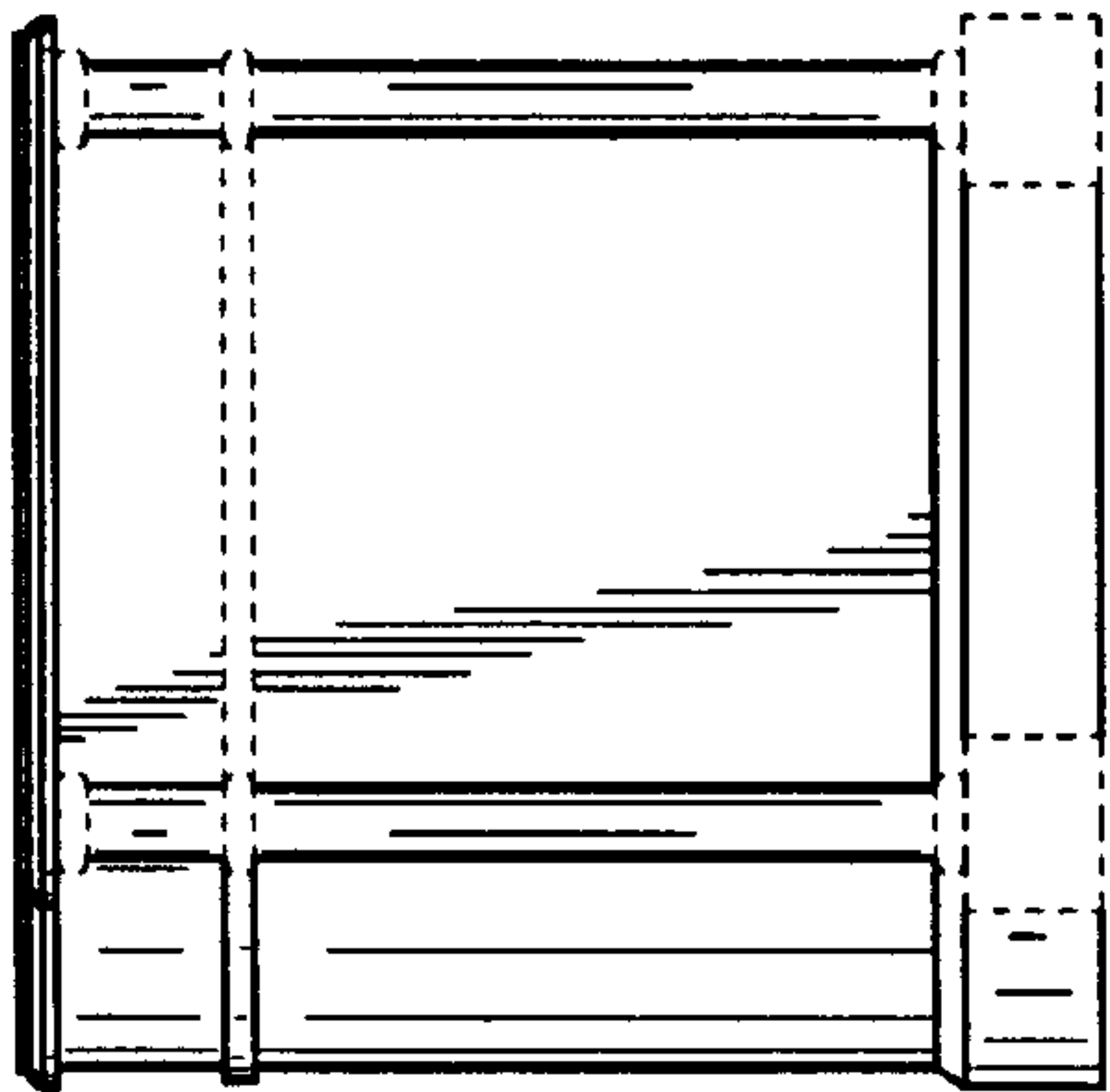

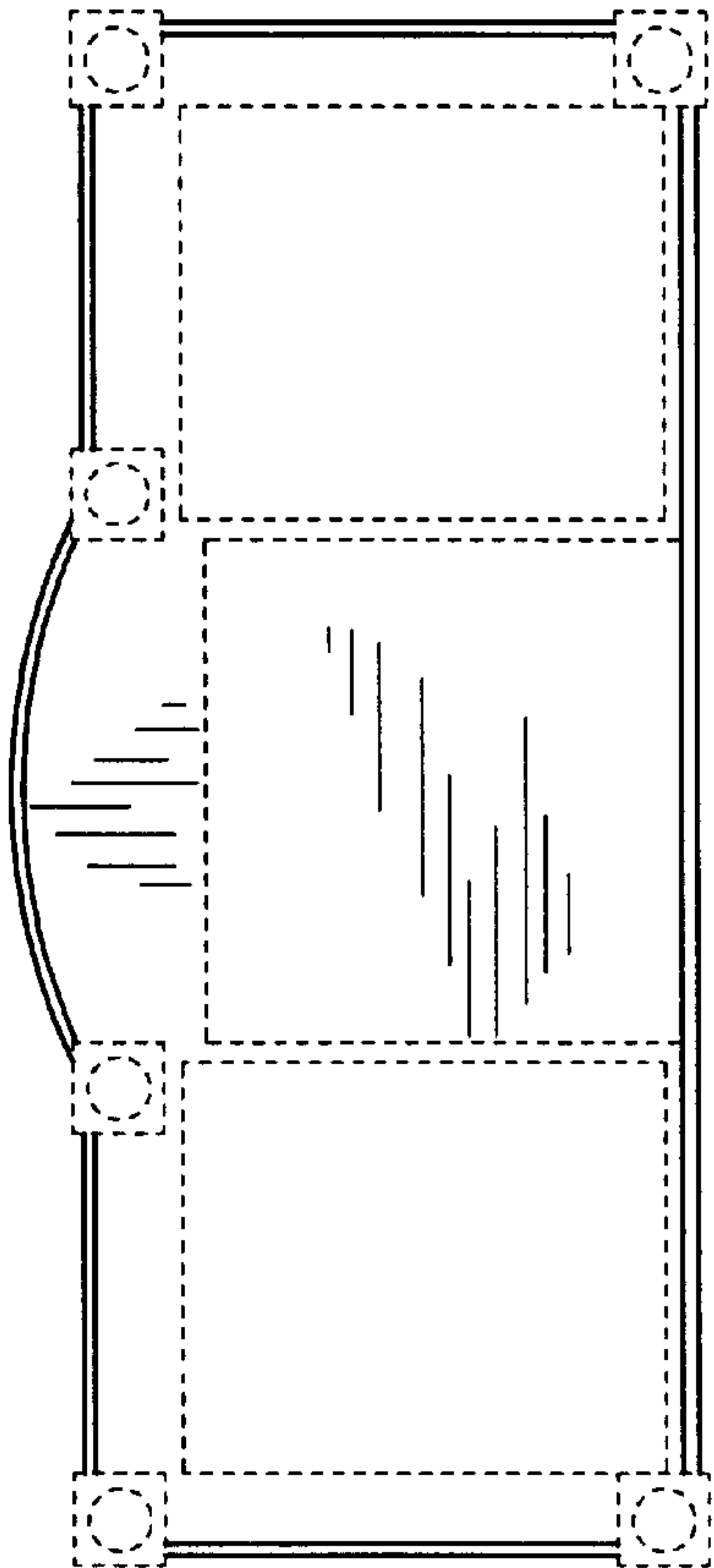
