DESCRIPTION


FIG. 1 is a perspective illustration of a deck post according to the invention.

FIG. 2 is a front view of a deck post of FIG. 1 (back, left and right views are identical to this front view).


FIG. 3 is detailed front view of a upper molded portion of the deck post of FIG. 1; and,

FIG. 4 is a detailed front view of a lower molded portion of the deck post of FIG. 1.








FIG. 2 FIG. 4
