FIG. 7 is a sectional view taken along line 7—7 of FIG. 2;

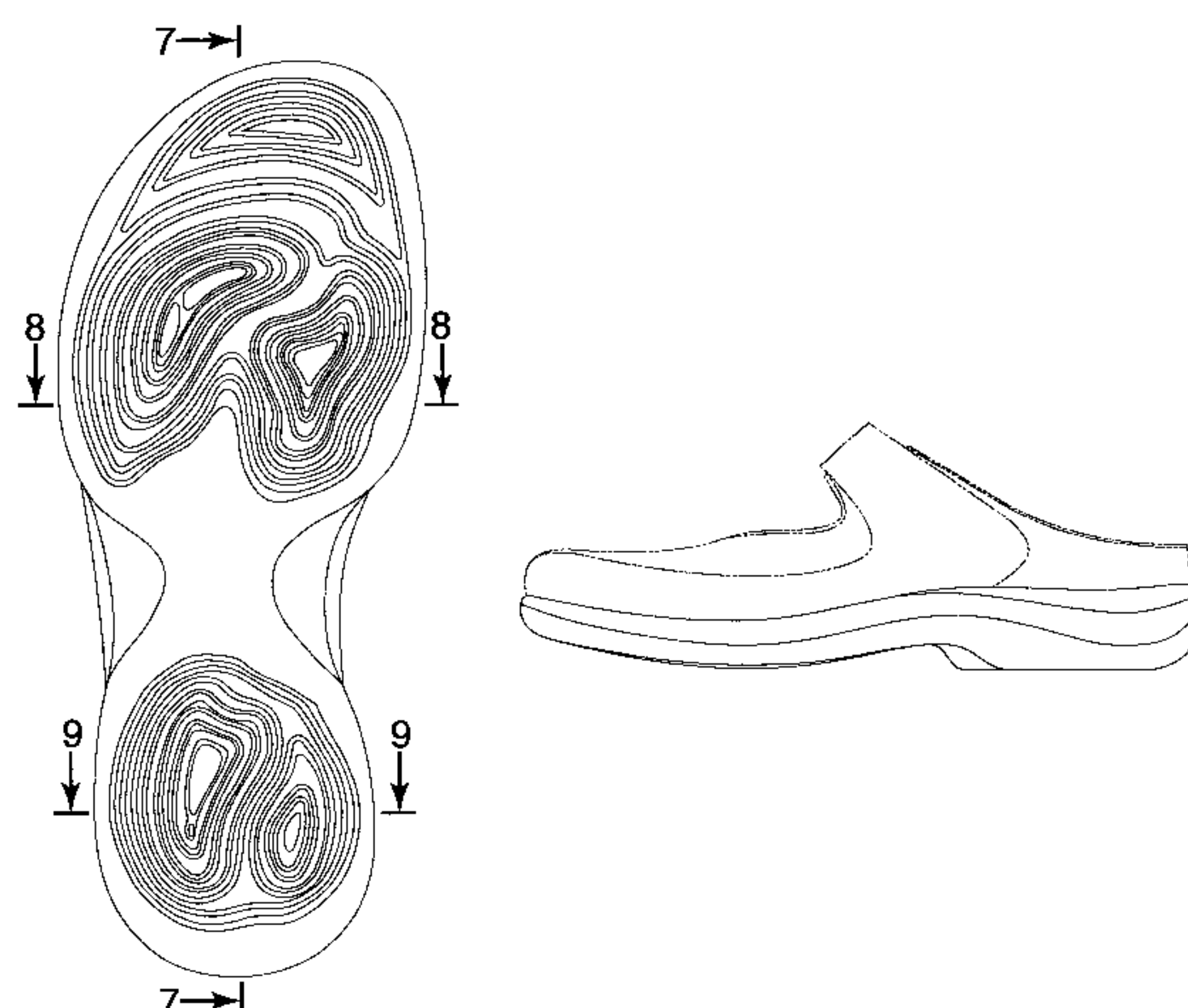
FIG. 8 is a sectional view taken along line 8—8 of FIG. 2;

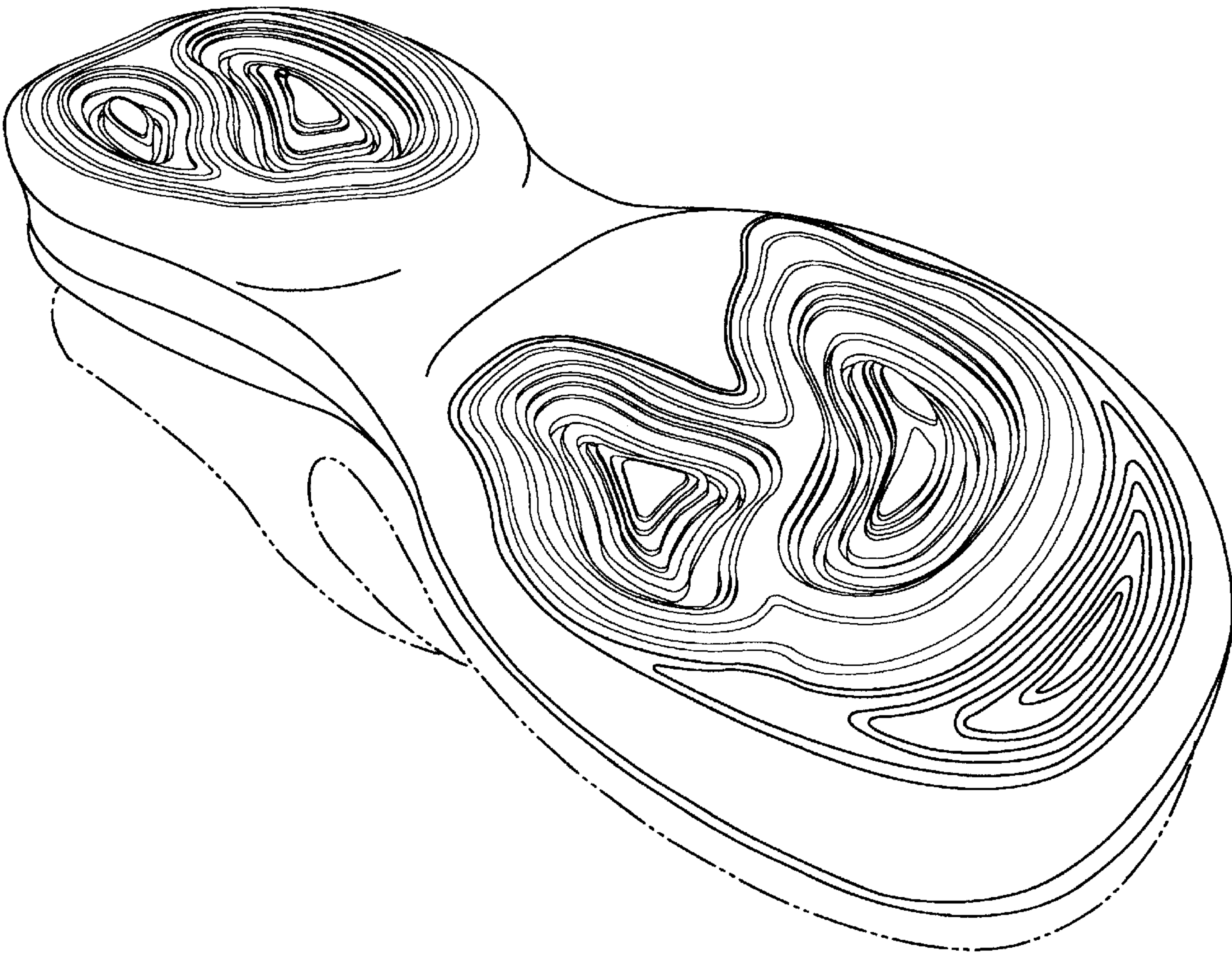

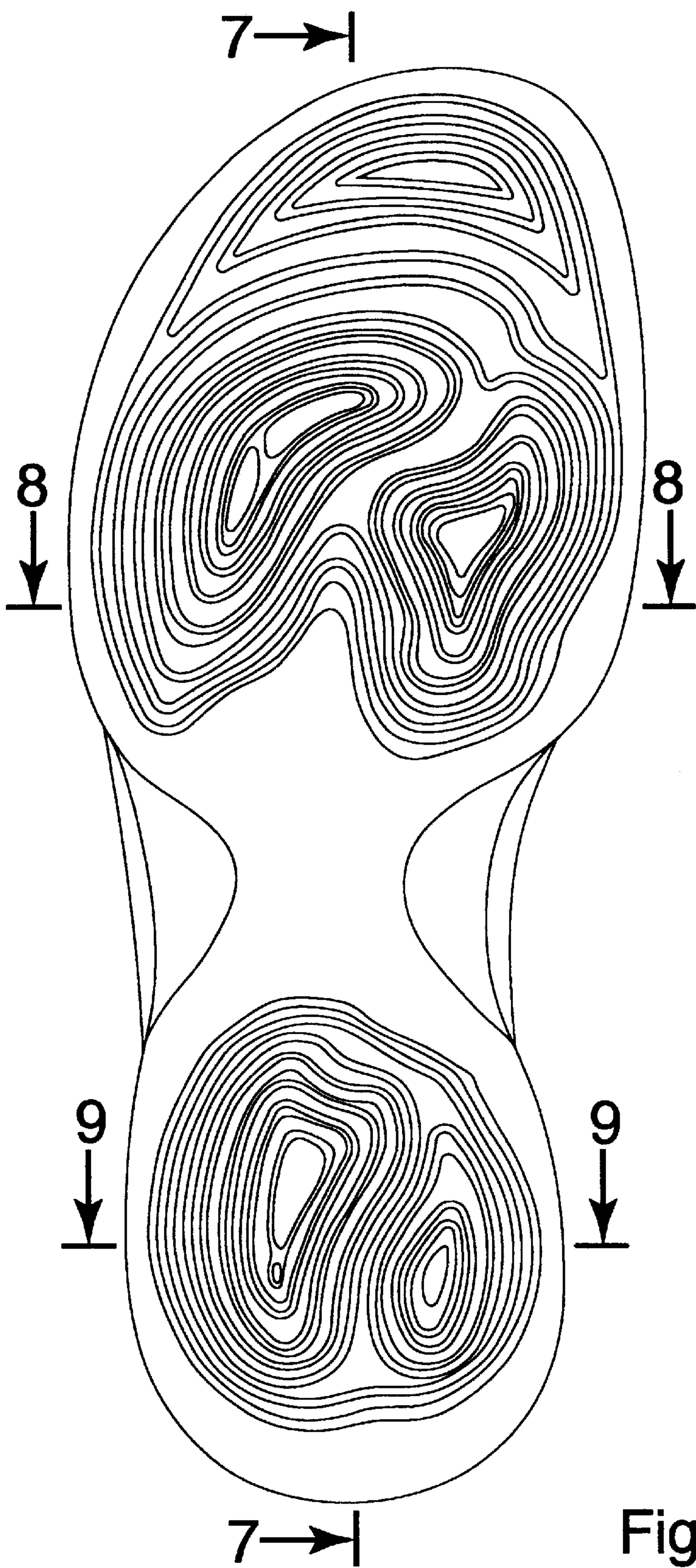

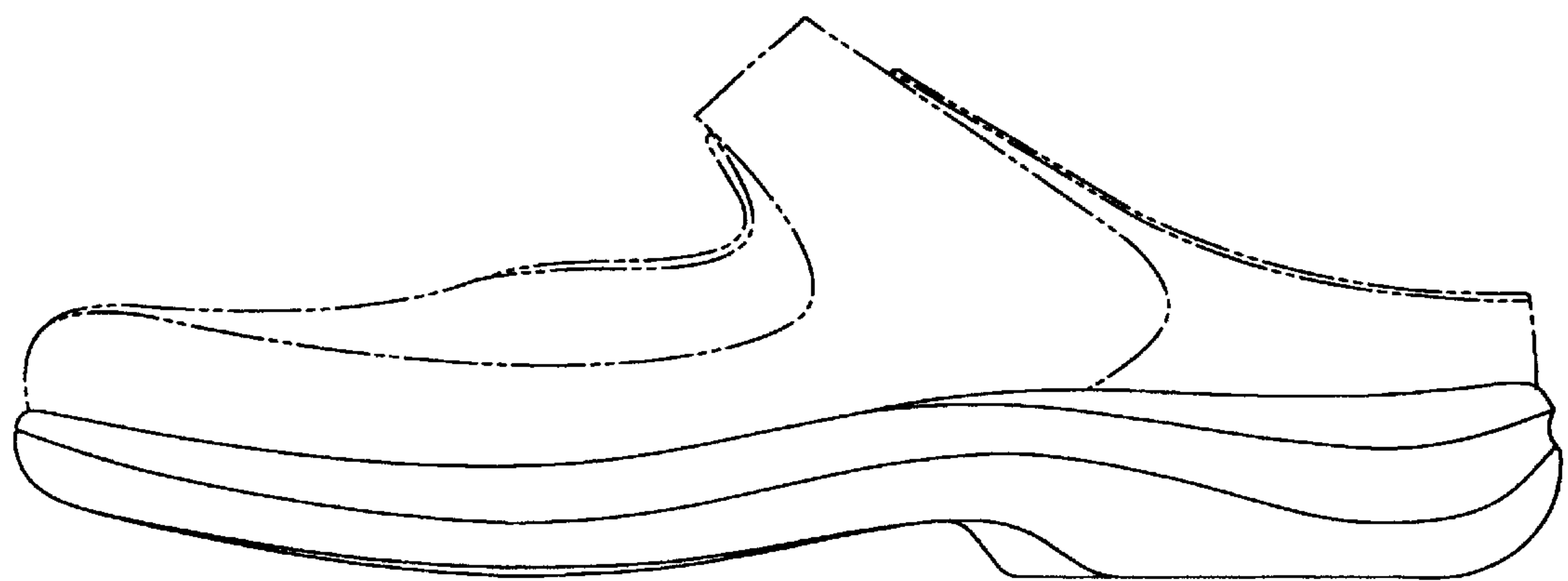

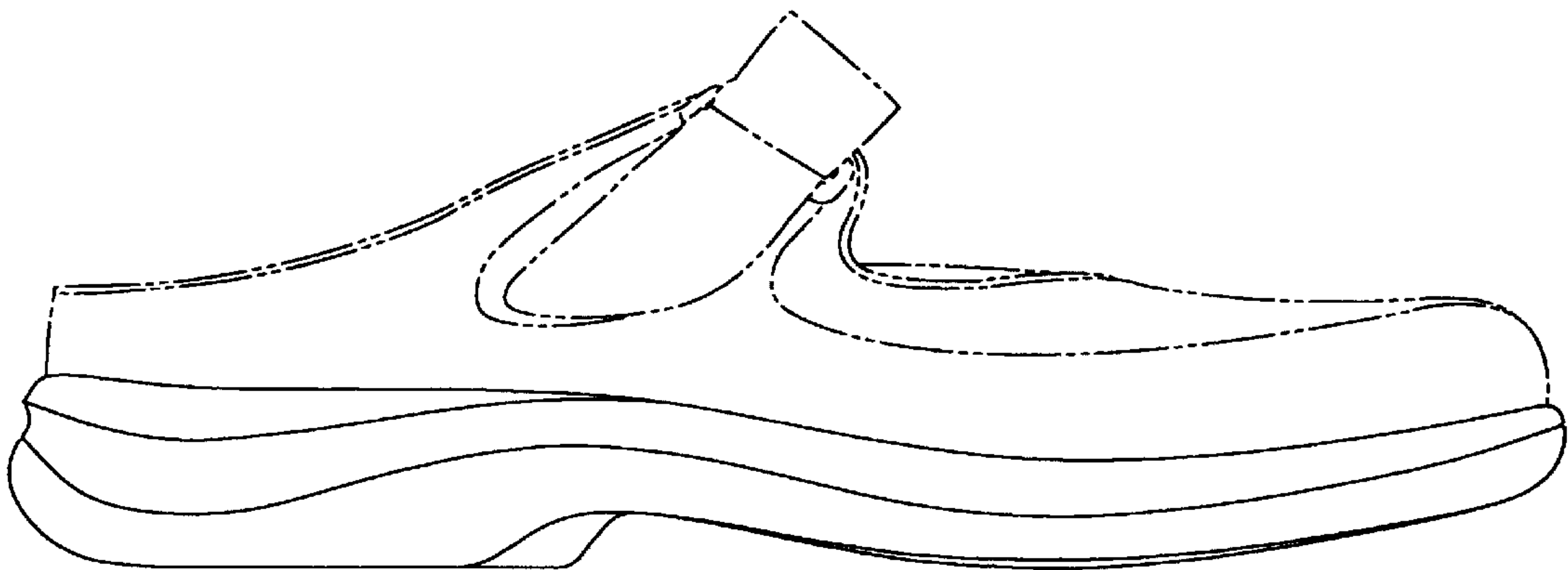

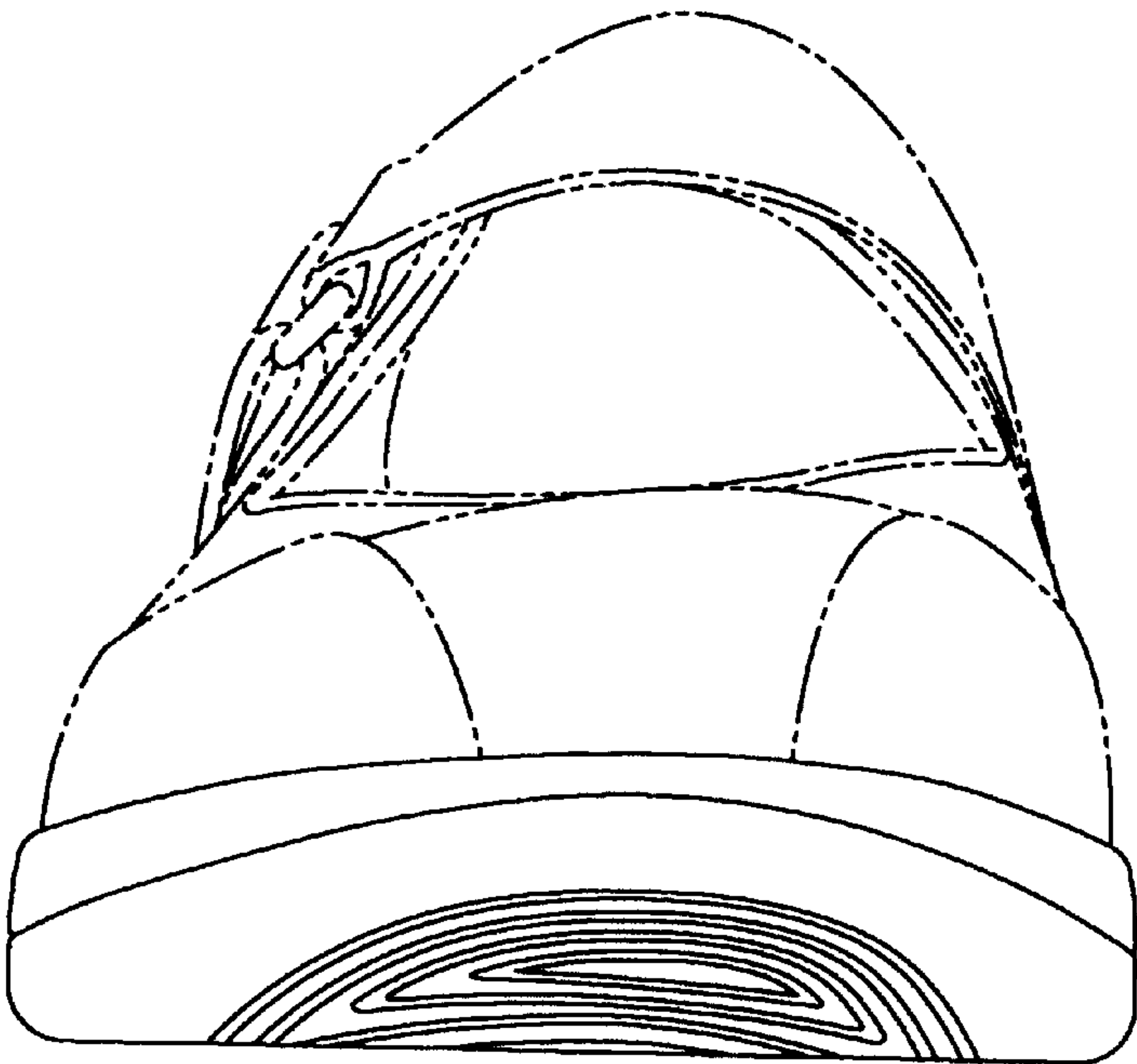

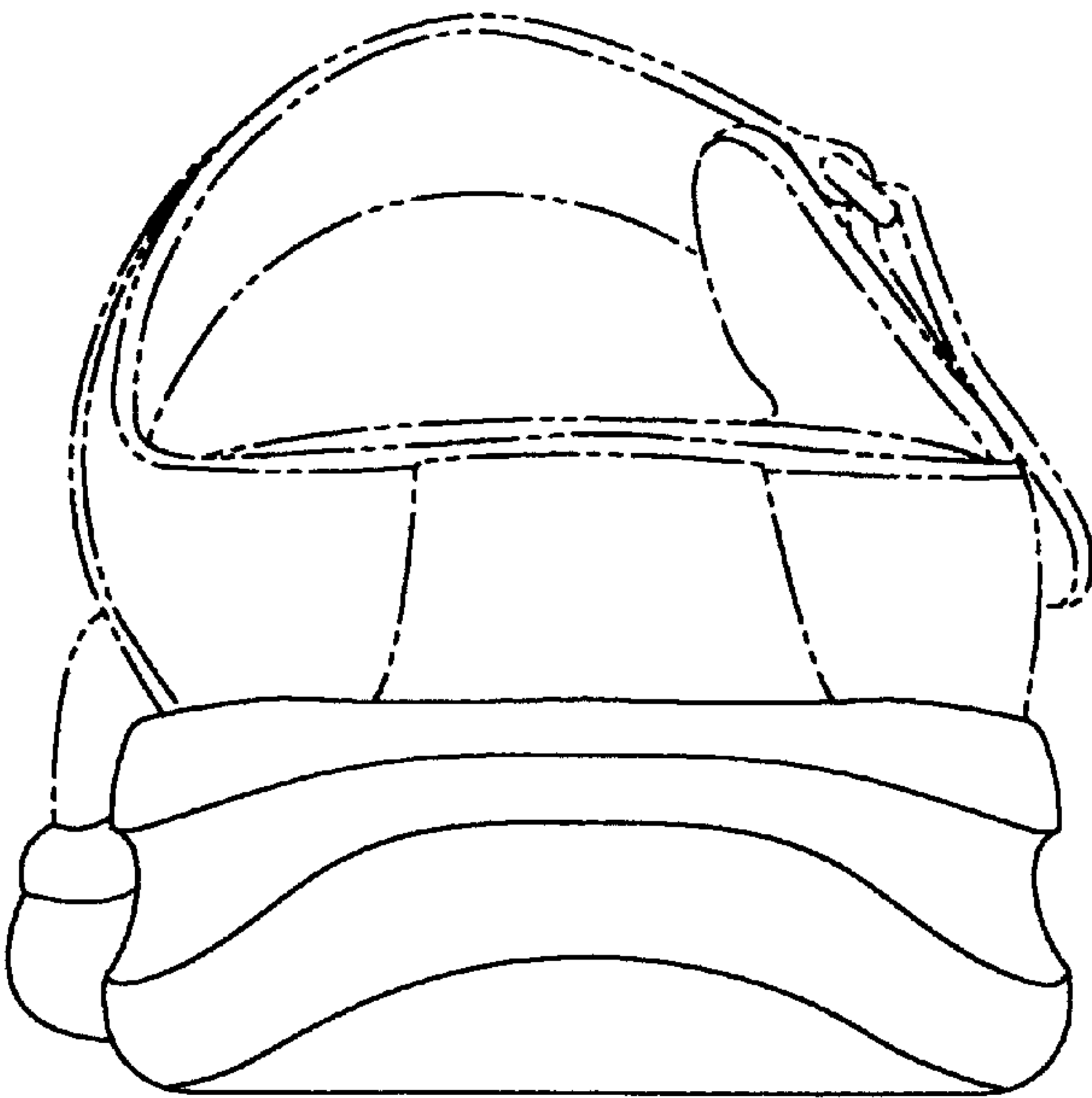

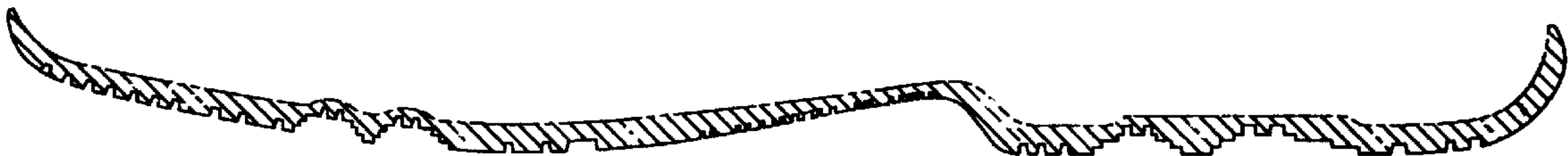
