DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a lower perspective view of a shoe sole showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

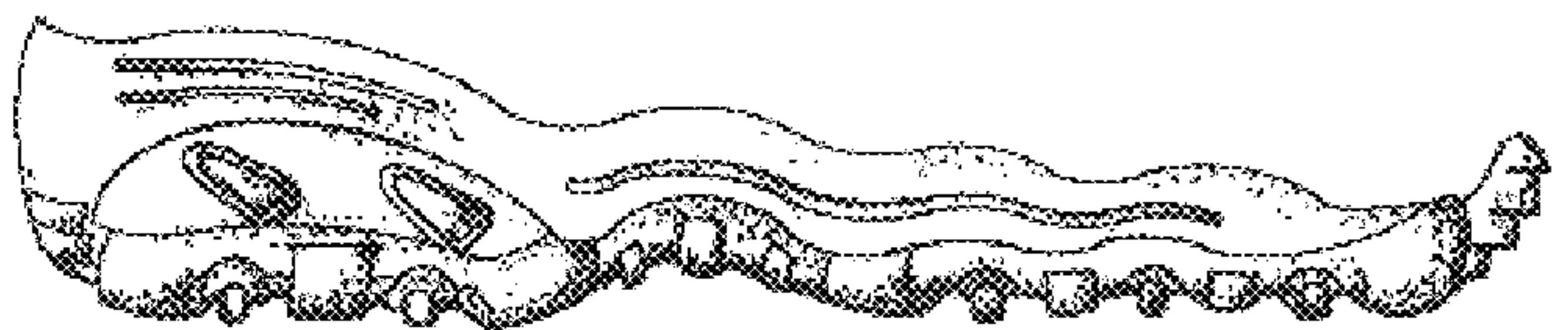
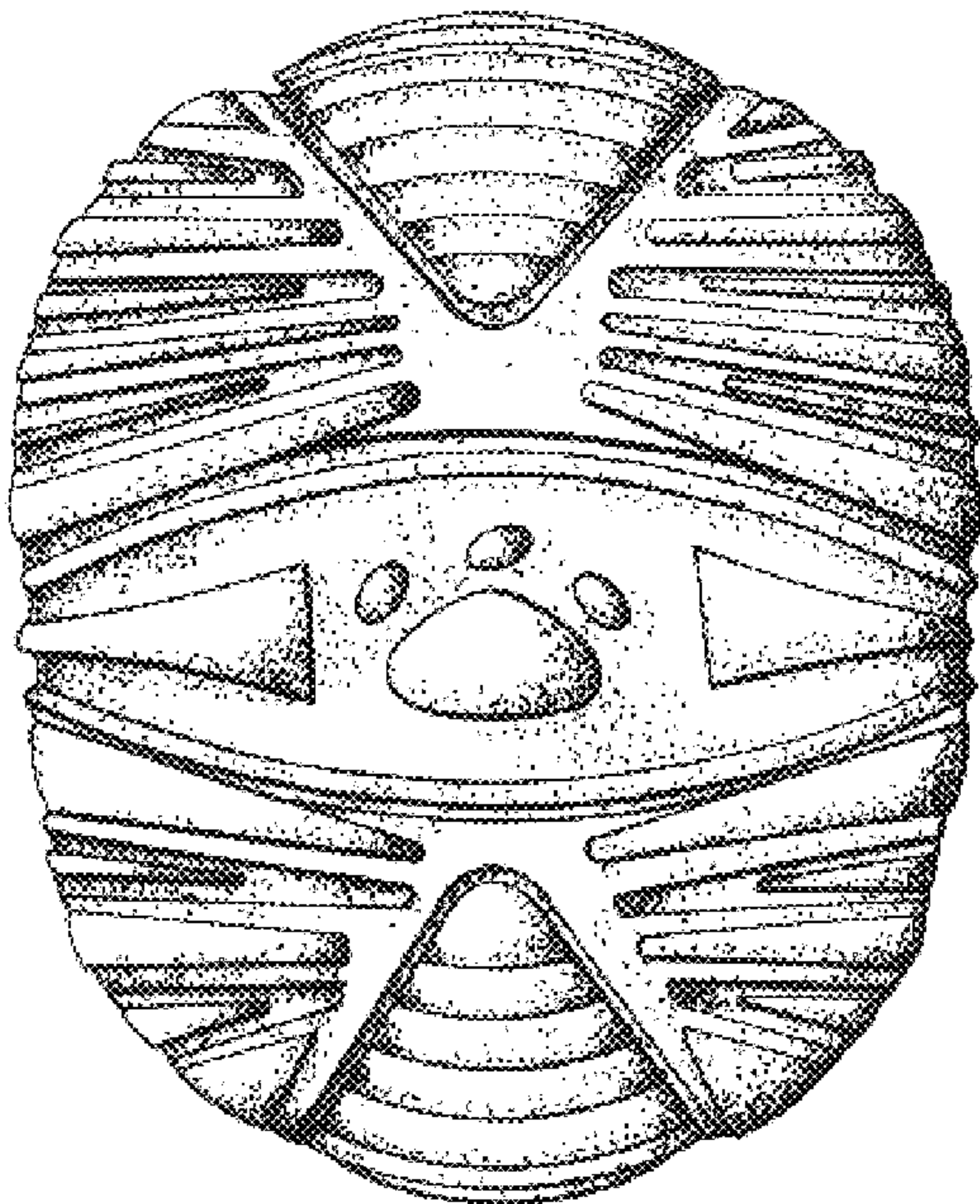
FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof; and,

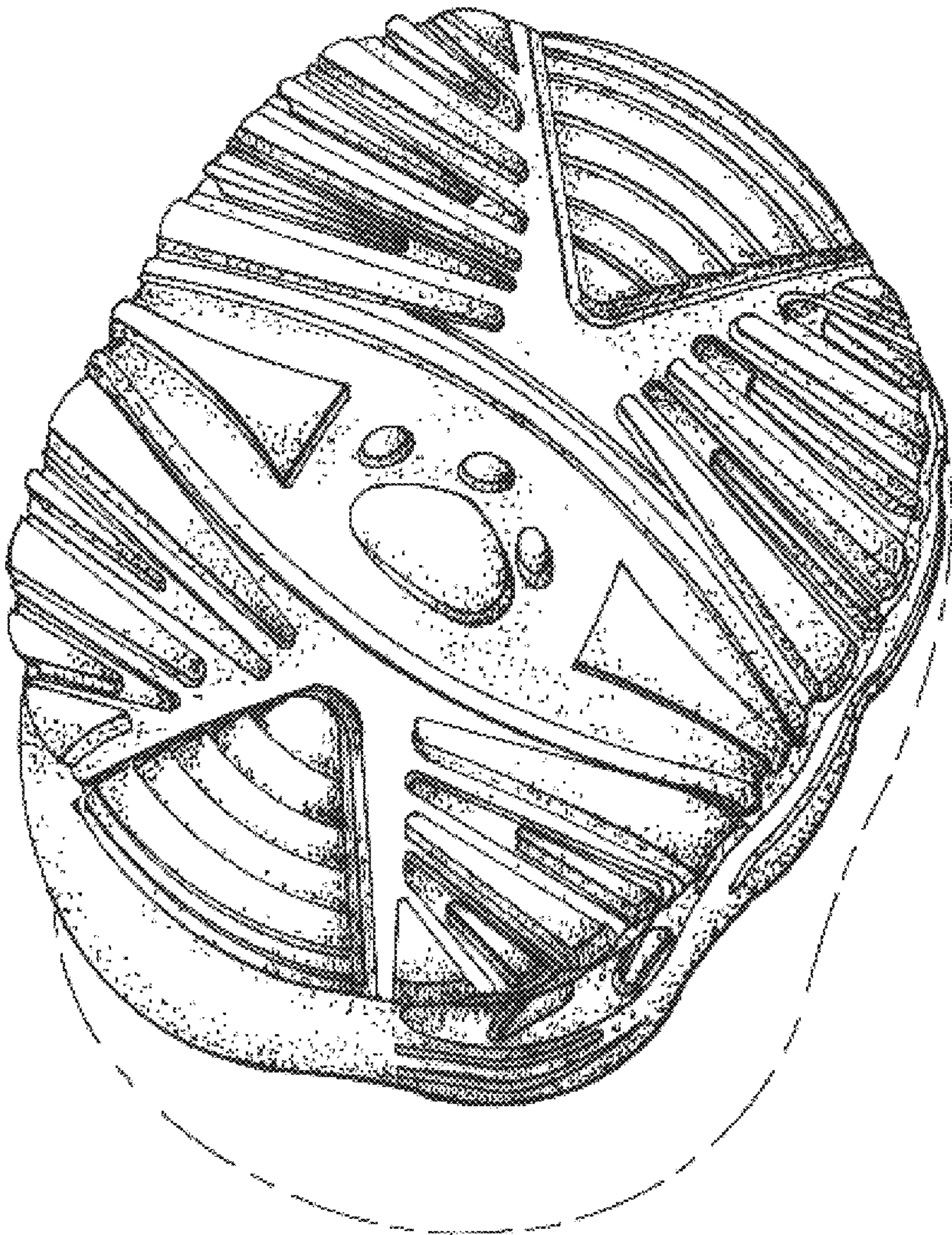

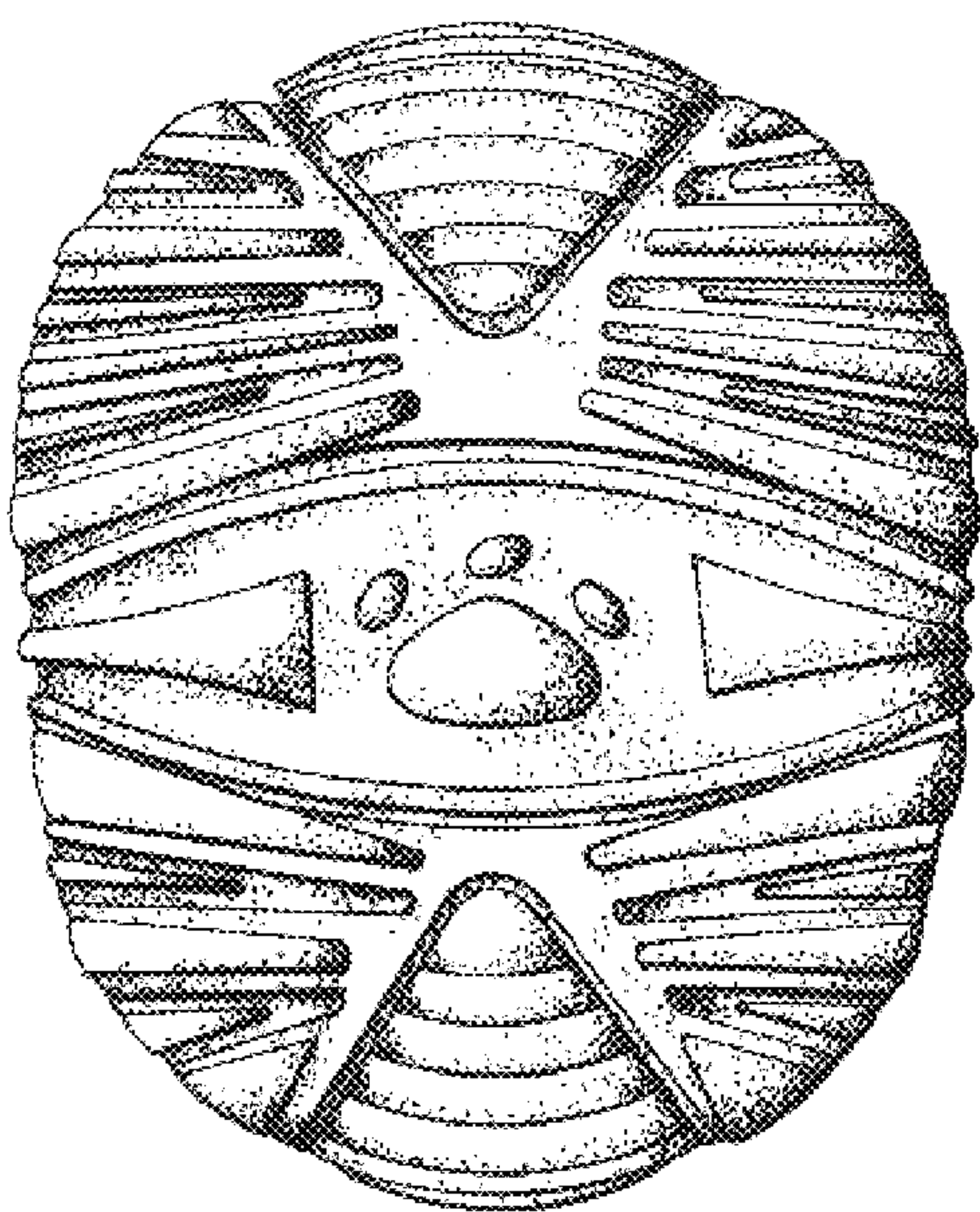

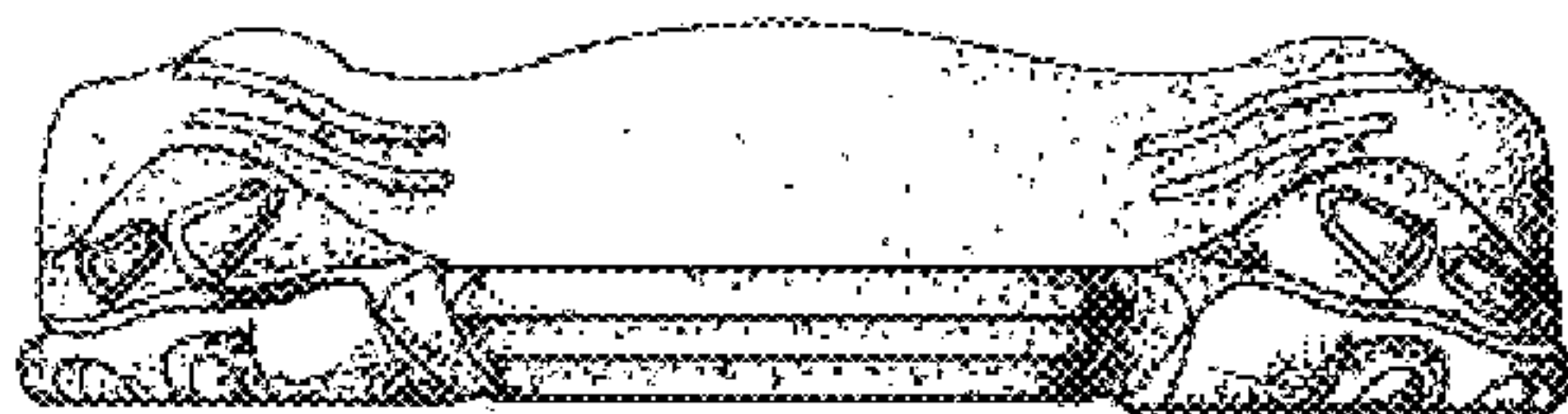

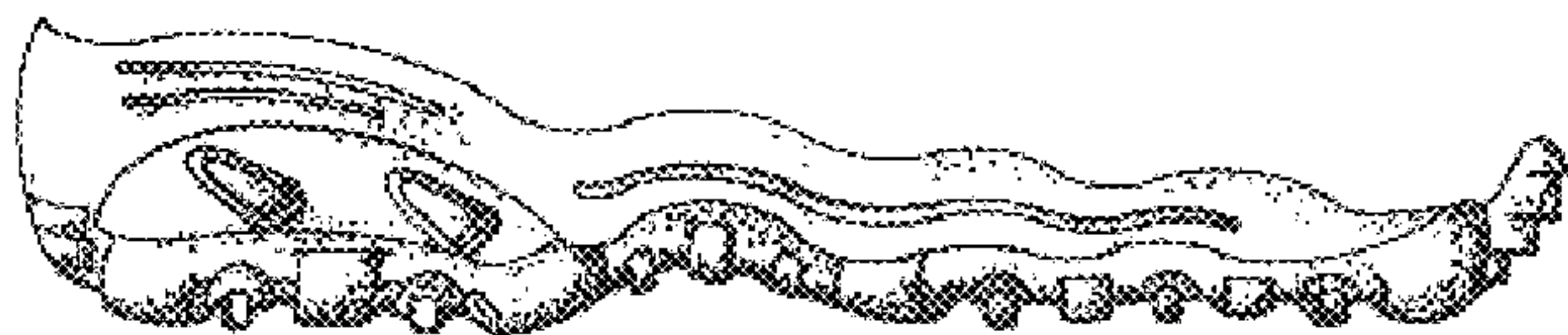
