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(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a shoe sole, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

The new design is for a toy shoe sole that is to be used on toy stuffed animals, such as teddy bears.

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a shoe sole showing our new design;

FIG. 2 is a bottom plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a side elevational view thereof, the opposite side being a mirror image.

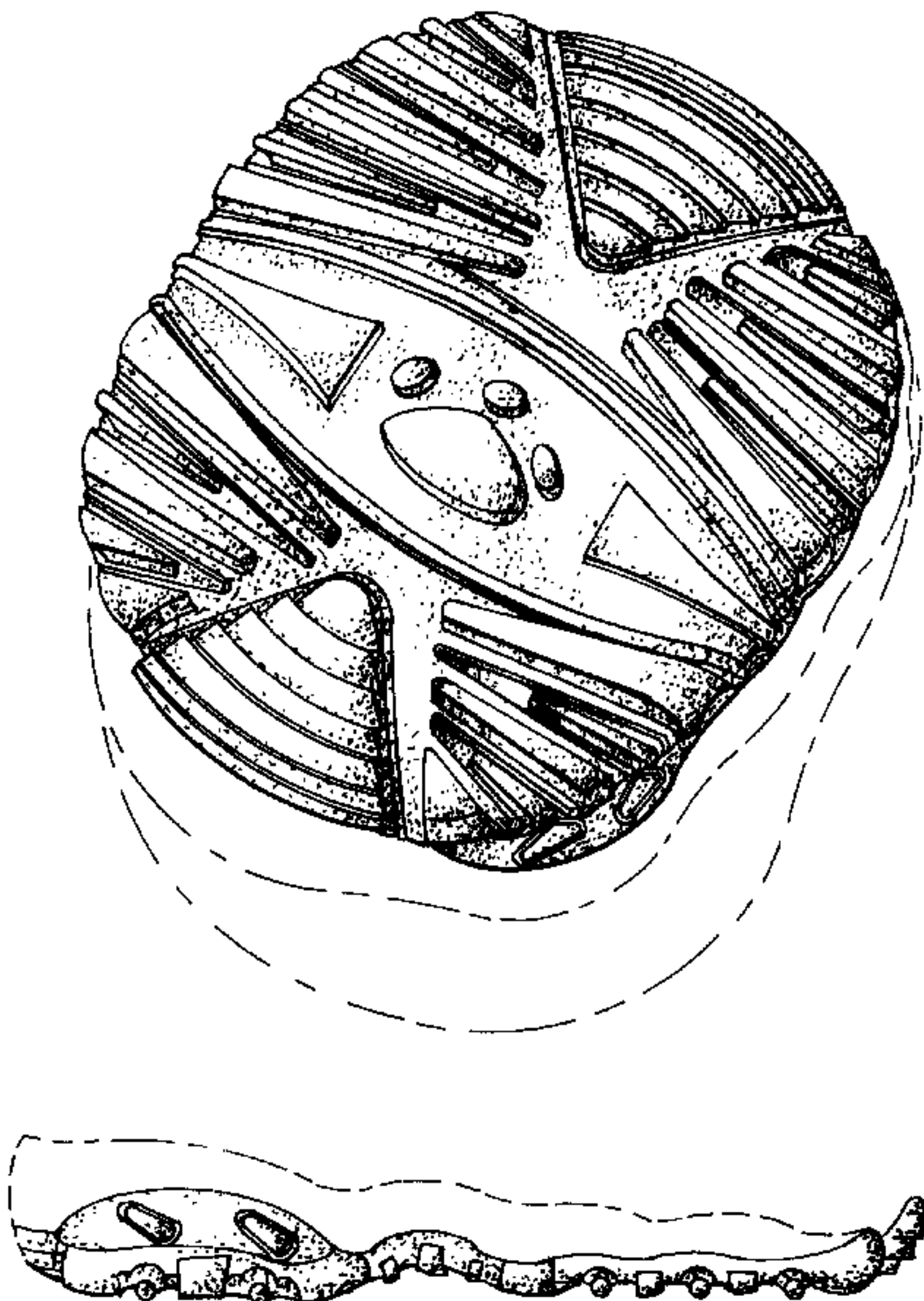

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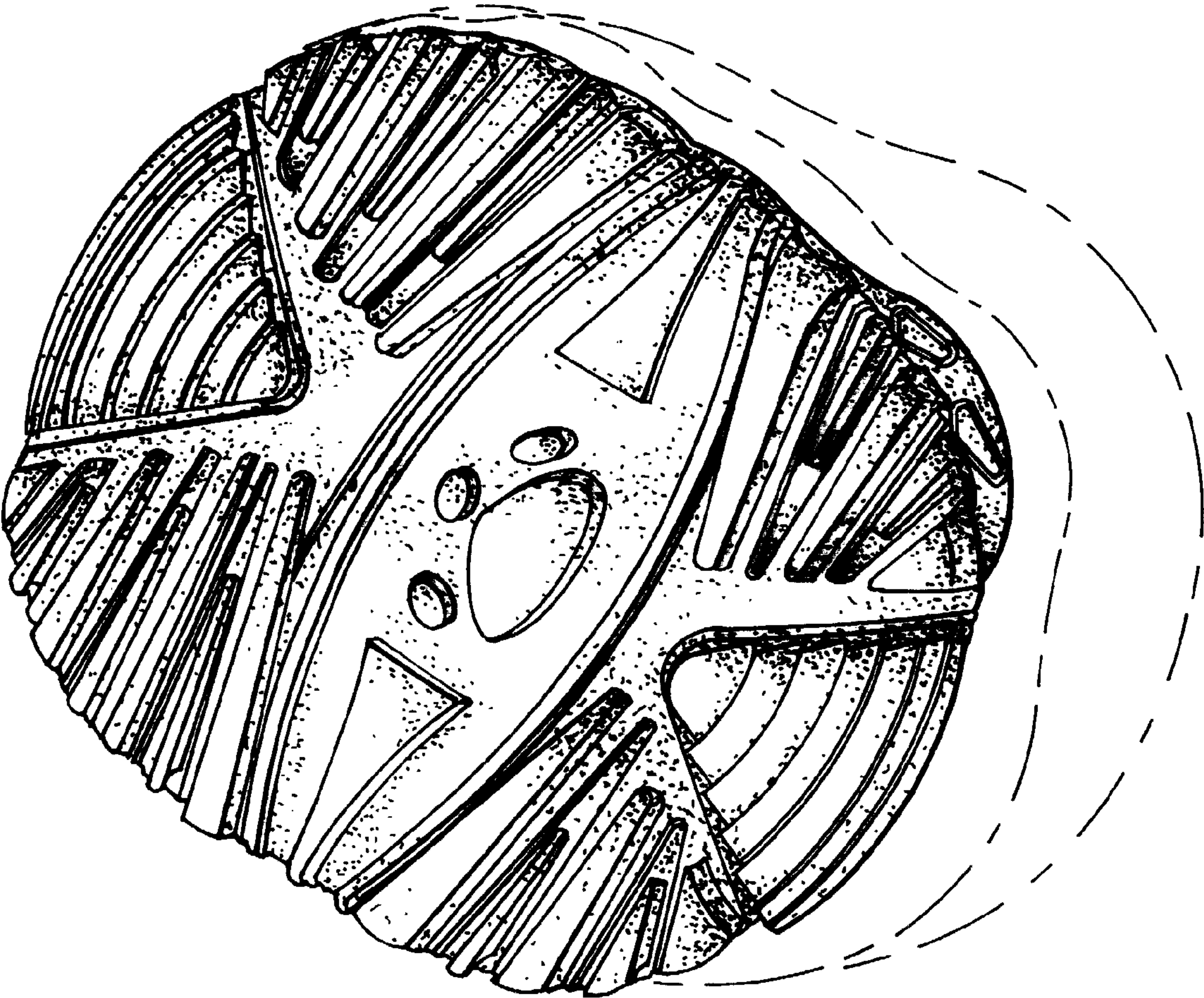

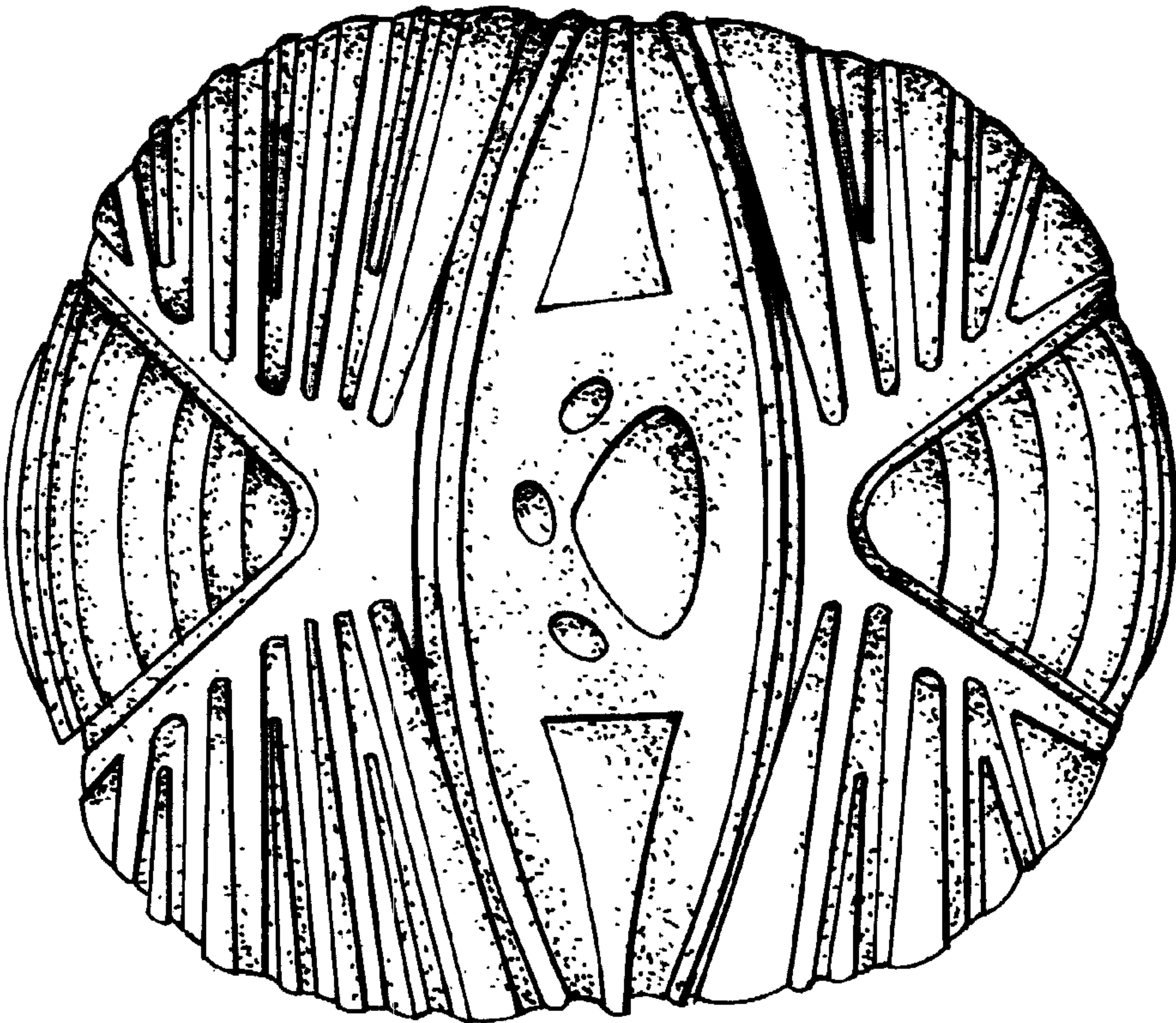

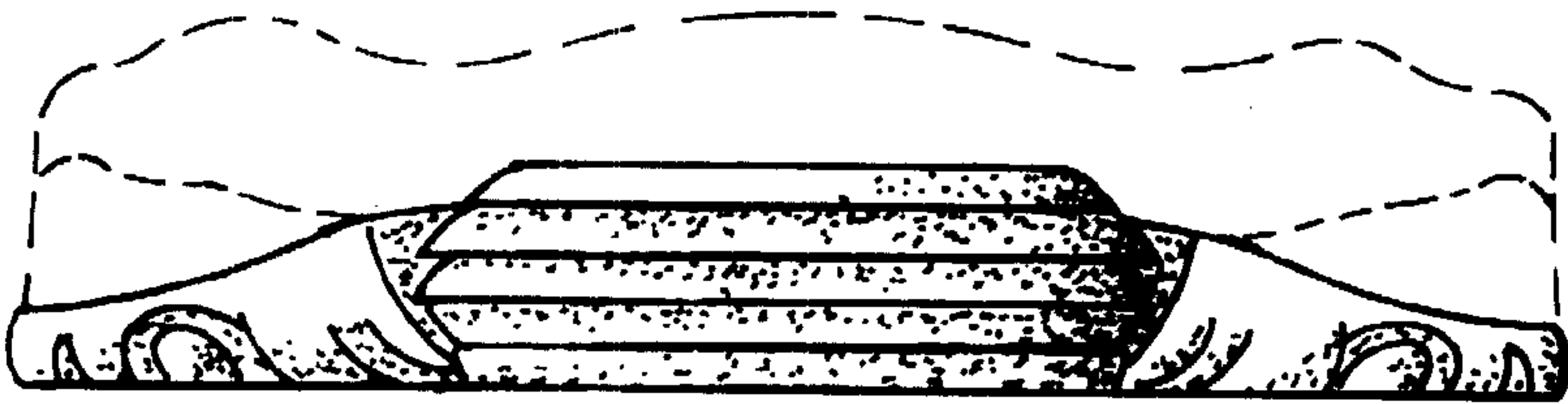

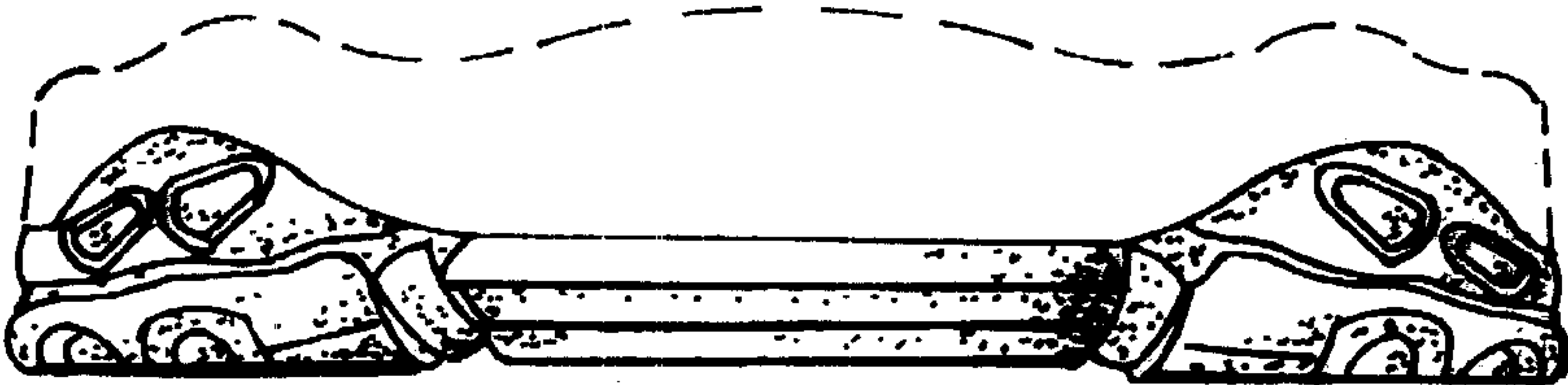

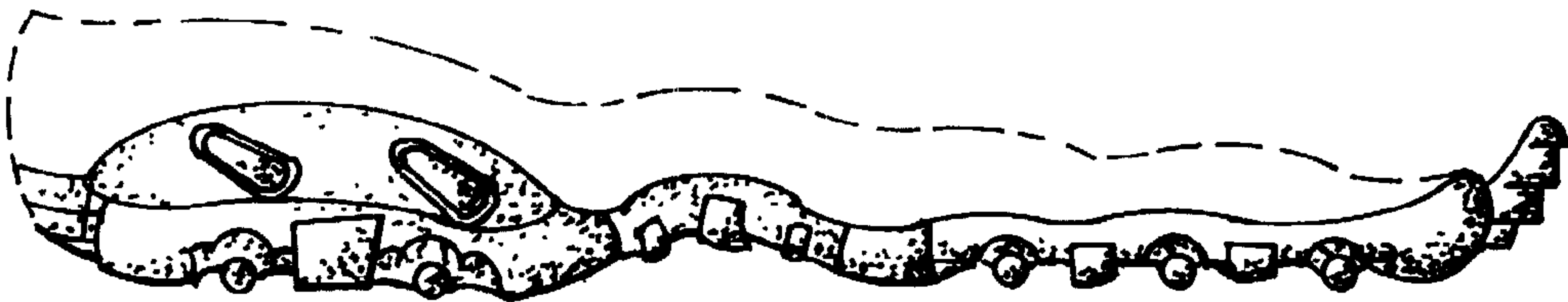
