DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the bird feeder according to the present invention.

FIG. 2 is a front view of the bird feeder according to the present invention with the access lid in a closed position.

The view into every other panel is identical to the front view.

FIG. 3 is a front view of the bird feeder according to the present invention with the access lid in an open position.

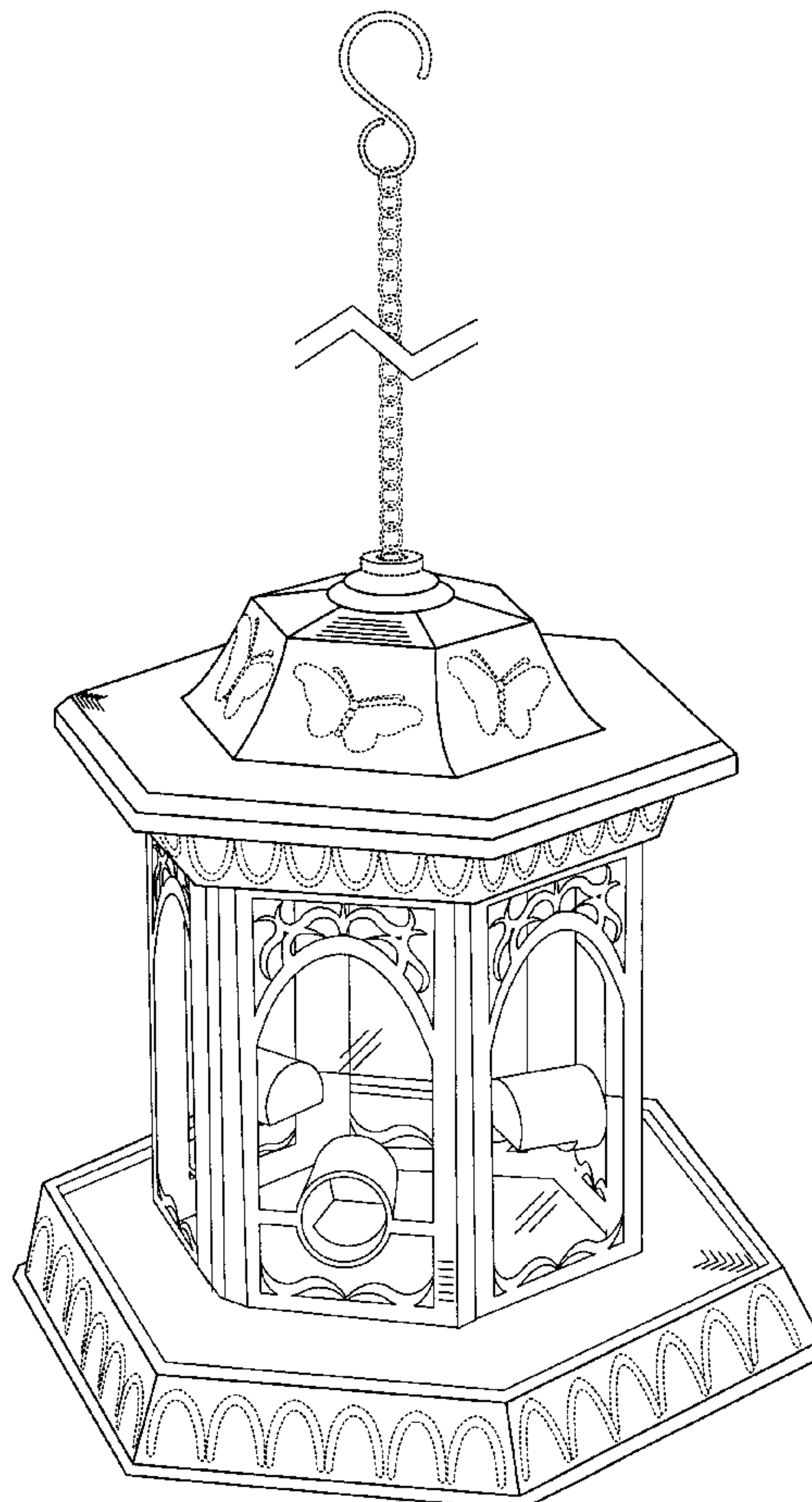
FIG. 4 is a top view of the bird feeder according to the present invention; and,

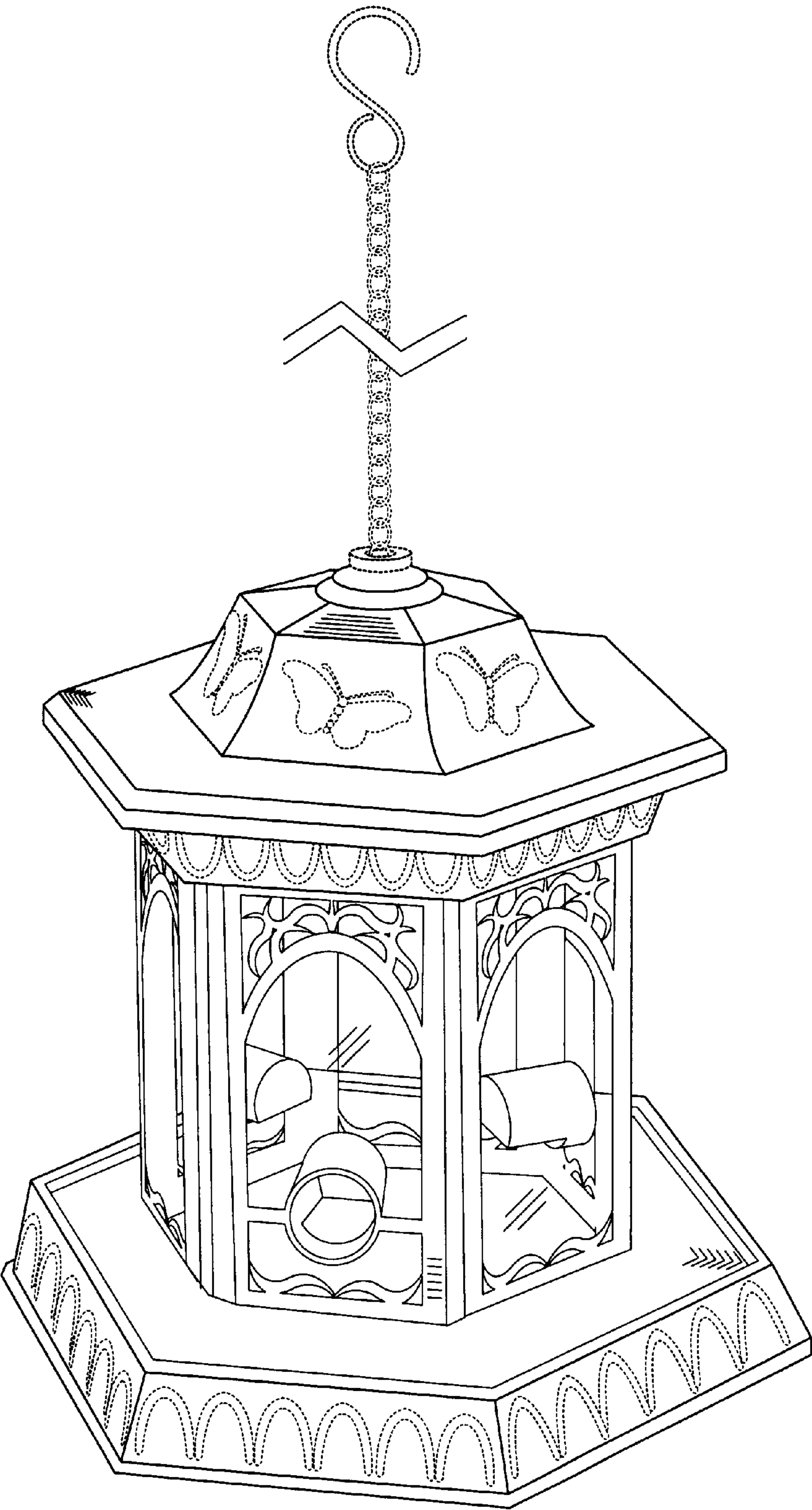

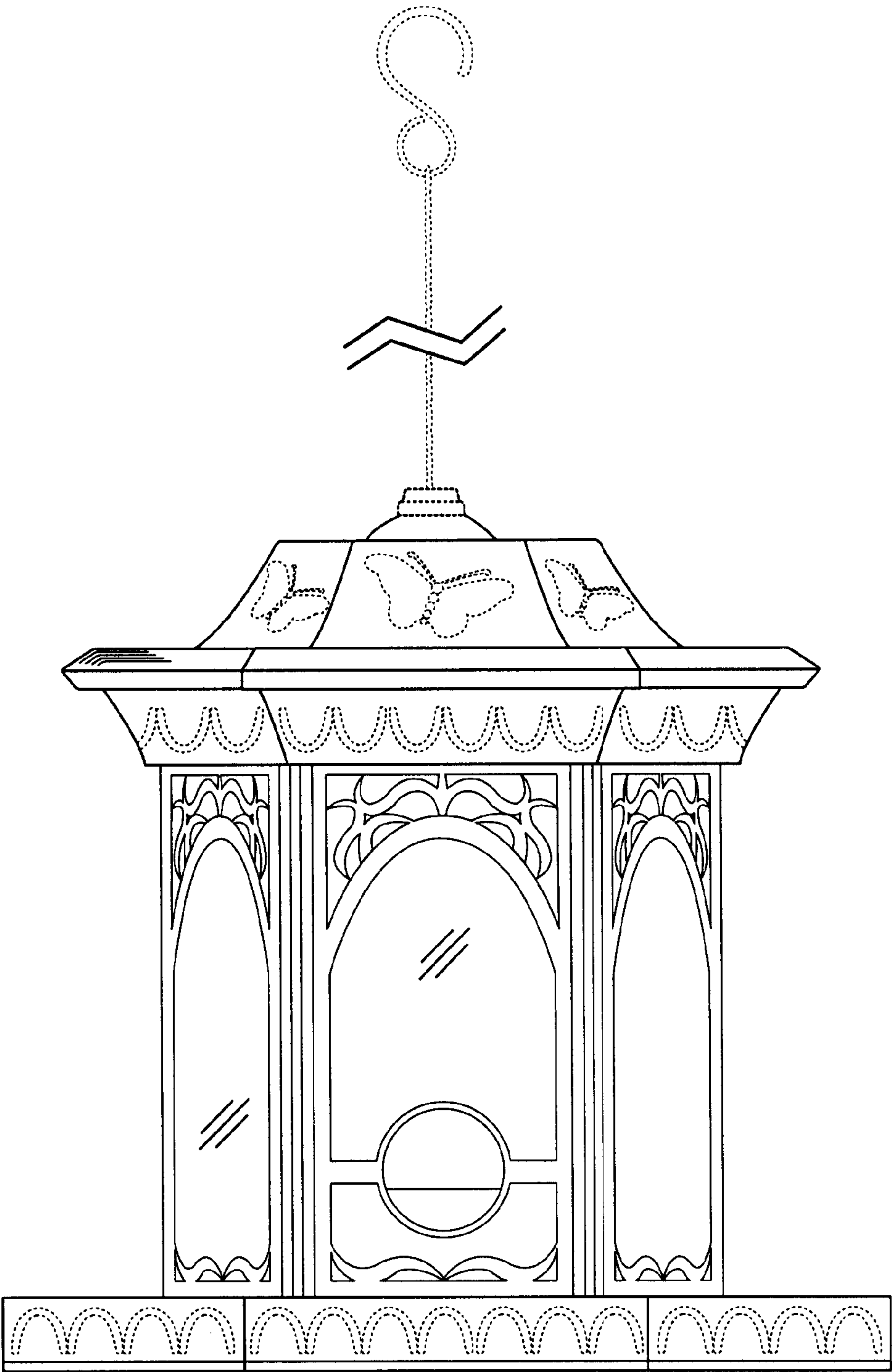

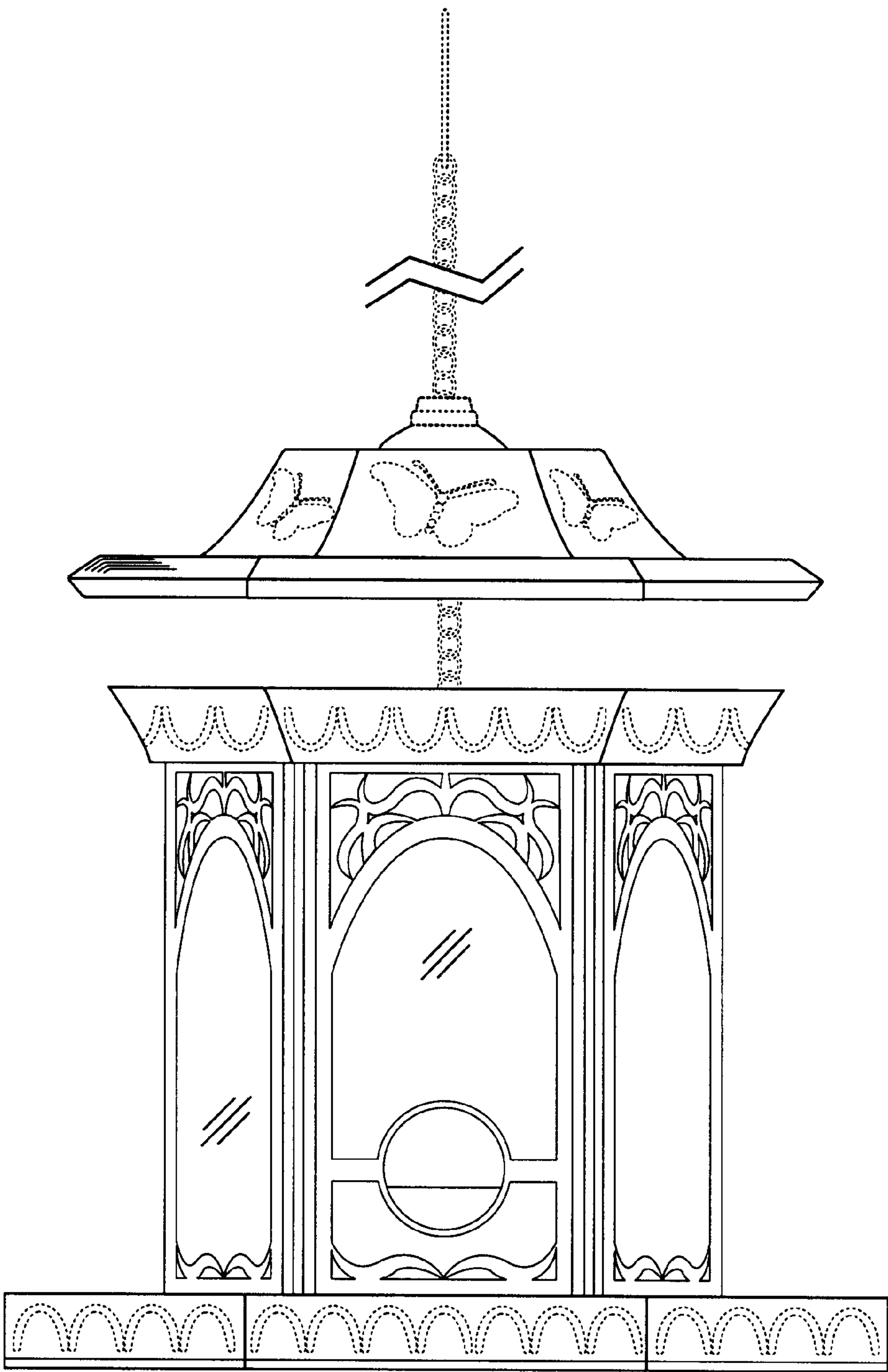

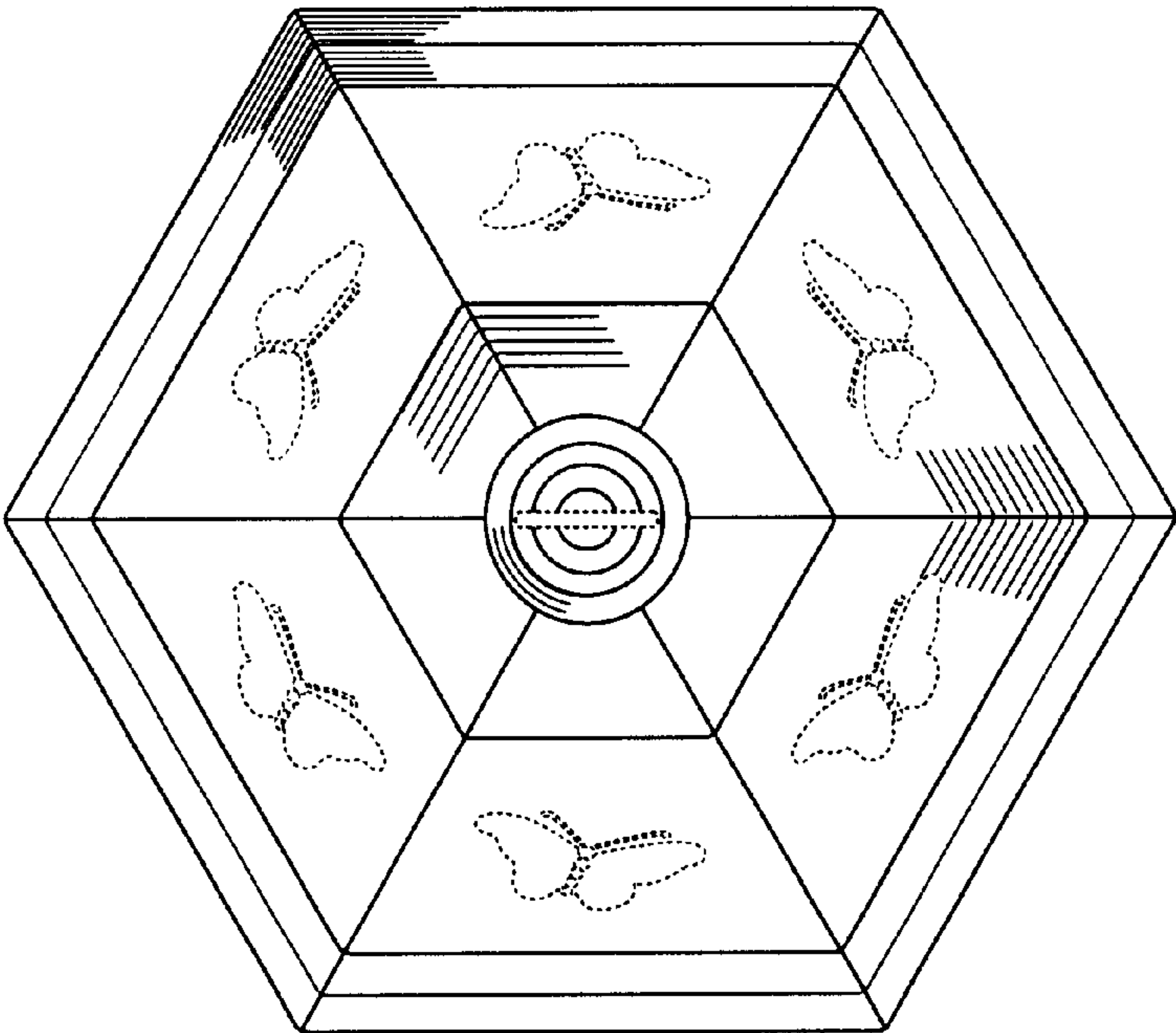

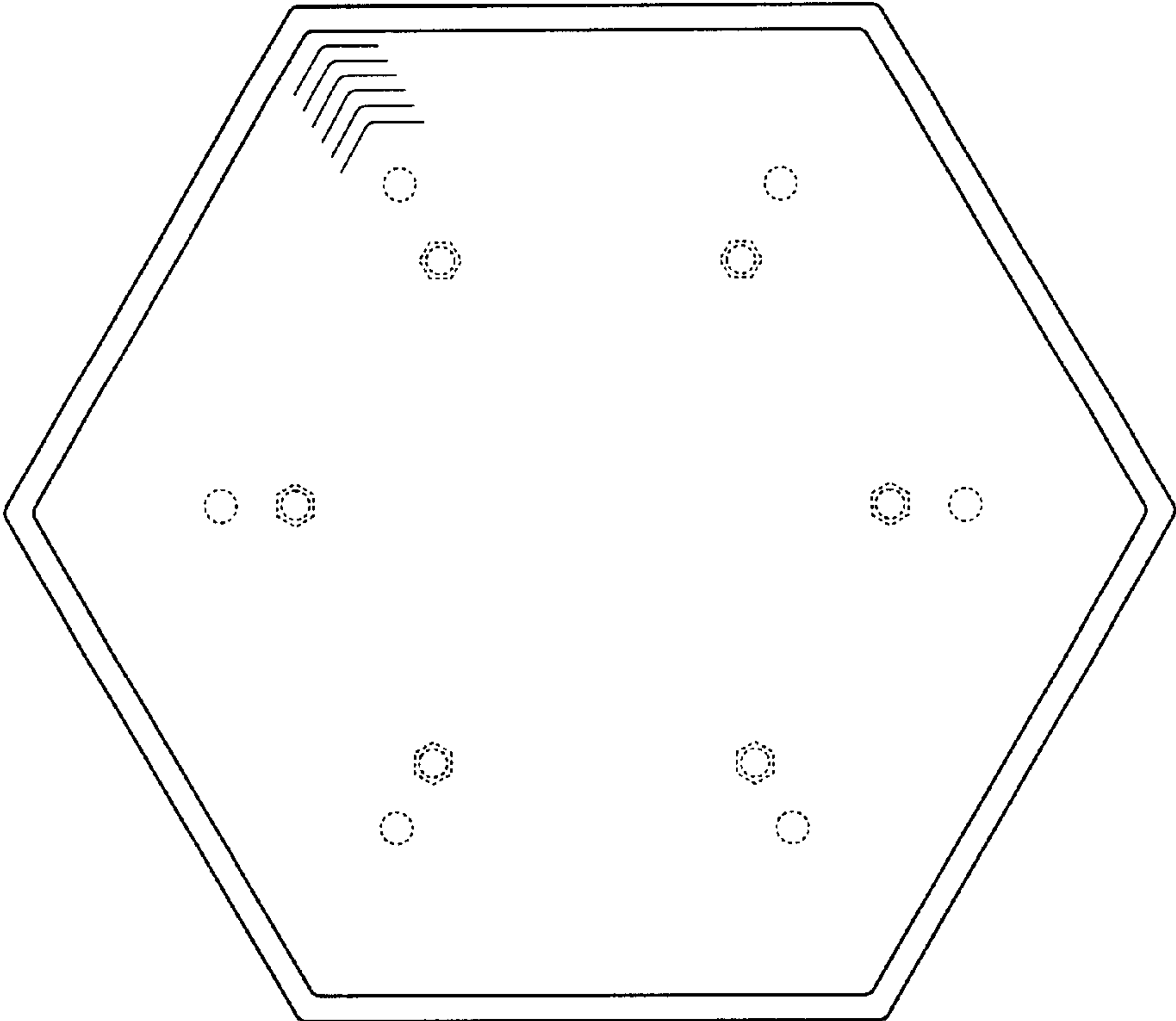
