# DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a first embodiment of a paint applicator showing our new design; FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof, the bottom plan view being identical thereto; FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof, the rear elevational view being identical thereto; FIG. 4 is a right end elevational view thereof; FIG. 5 is a left end elevational view thereof; FIG. 6 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of the paint applicator; FIG. 7 is a top plan view of FIG. 6, the bottom plan view being identical thereto; FIG. 8 is a front elevational view of FIG. 6, the rear elevational view being identical thereto; FIG. 9 is a right end elevational view of FIG. 6; FIG. 10 is a left end elevational view of FIG. 6; FIG. 11 is a perspective view of a third embodiment of the paint applicator;

FIG. 12 is a top plan view of FIG. 11, the bottom plan view
