## **DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a chair in accordance with the invention disclosed and claimed herein;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the present invention; FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the present invention, the opposite side view being a mirror image thereof (with or without the pocket shown in broken line in FIG. 1);

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view of the present invention; and,

FIG. 5 is a top plan view of the present invention.
