DESCRIPTION

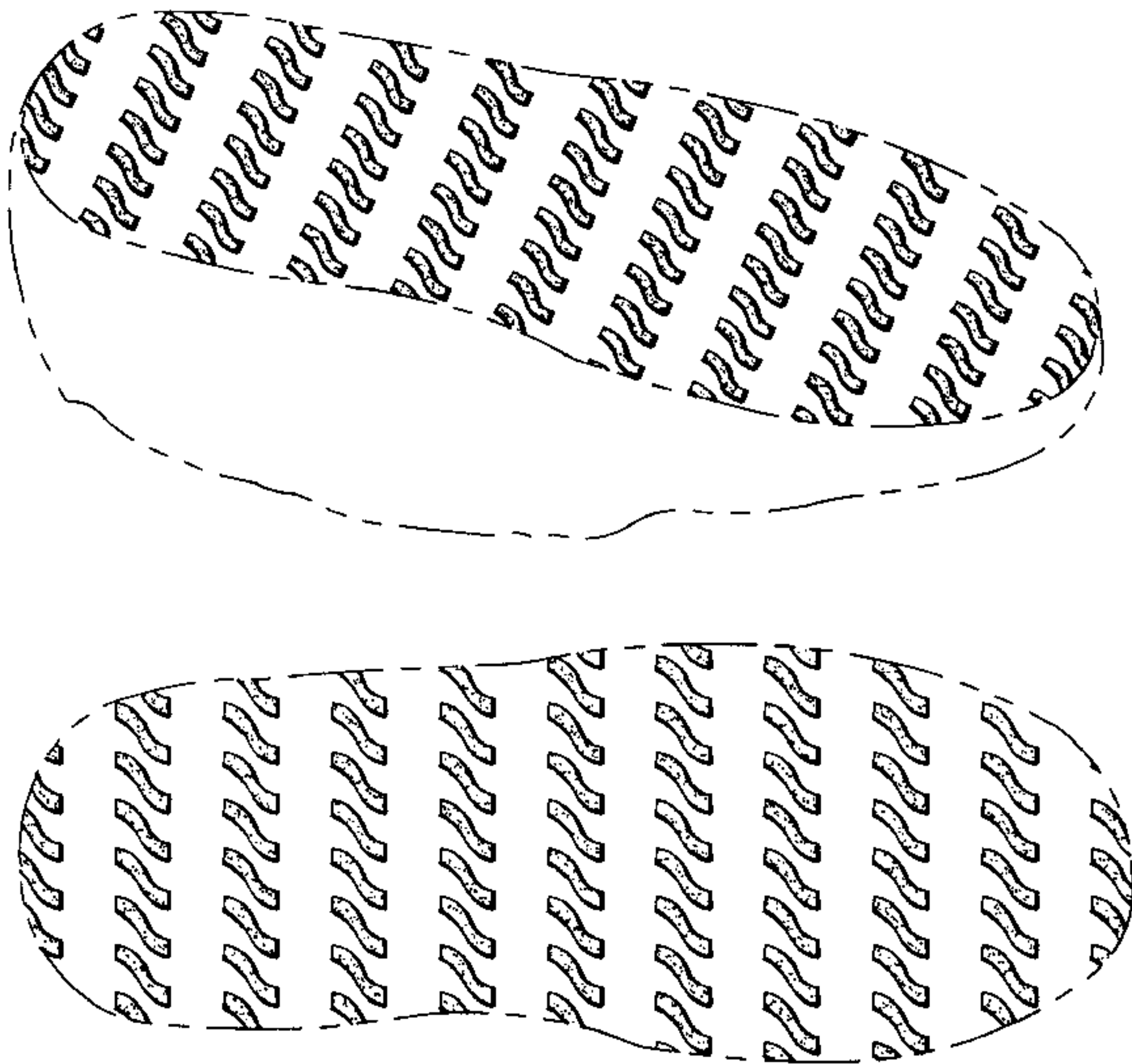
FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a shoe cover shown in use to depict the environment of my new design for a shoe cover traction pattern;

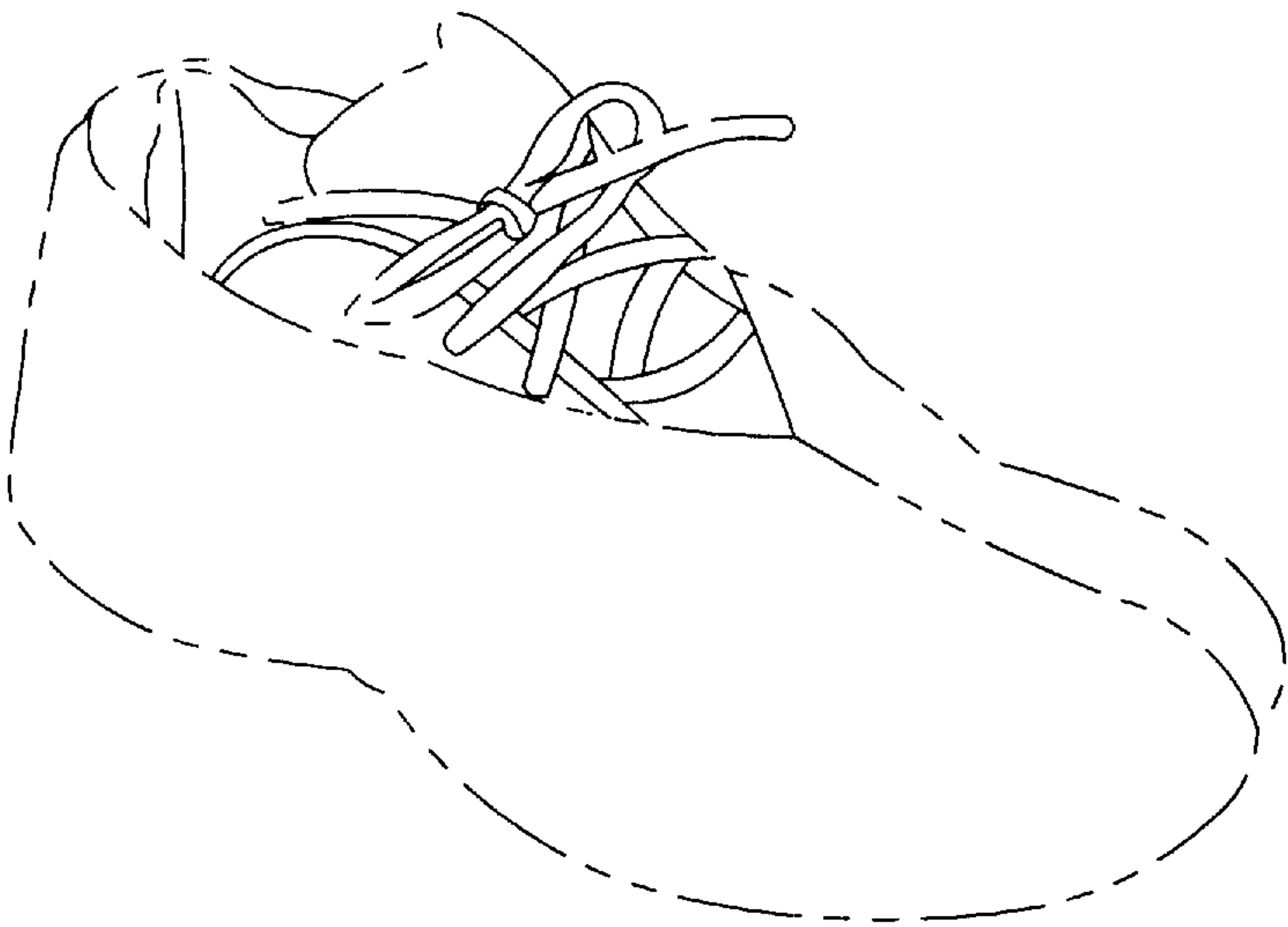

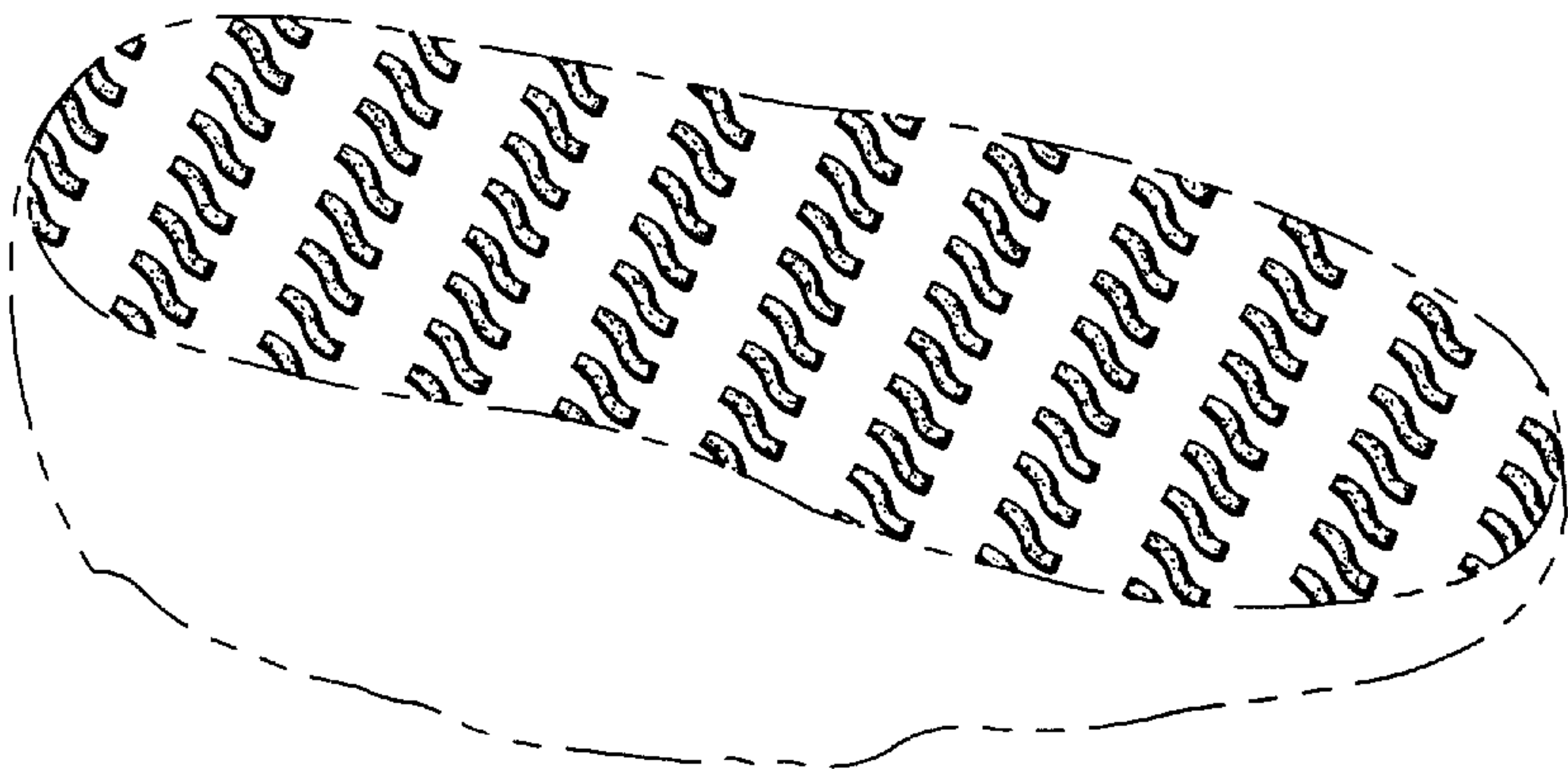

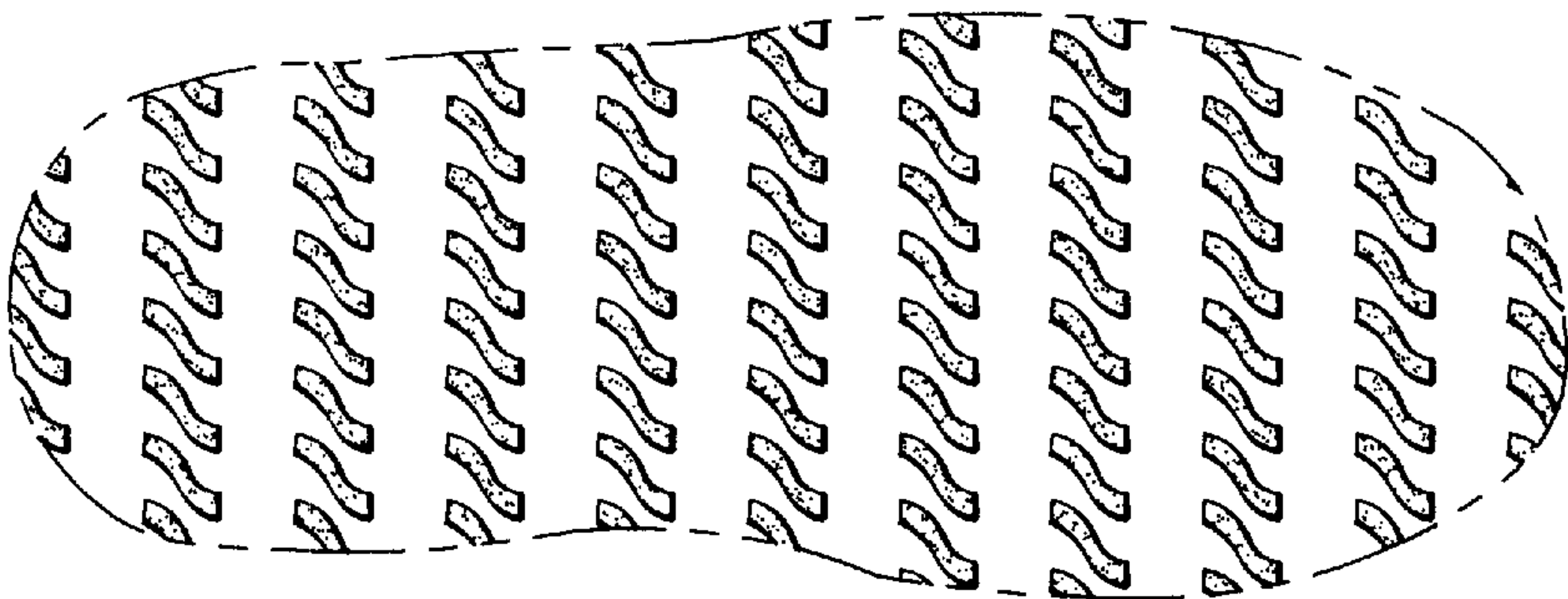
