(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a towing handle for a piece of baggage, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the towing handle for a piece of baggage

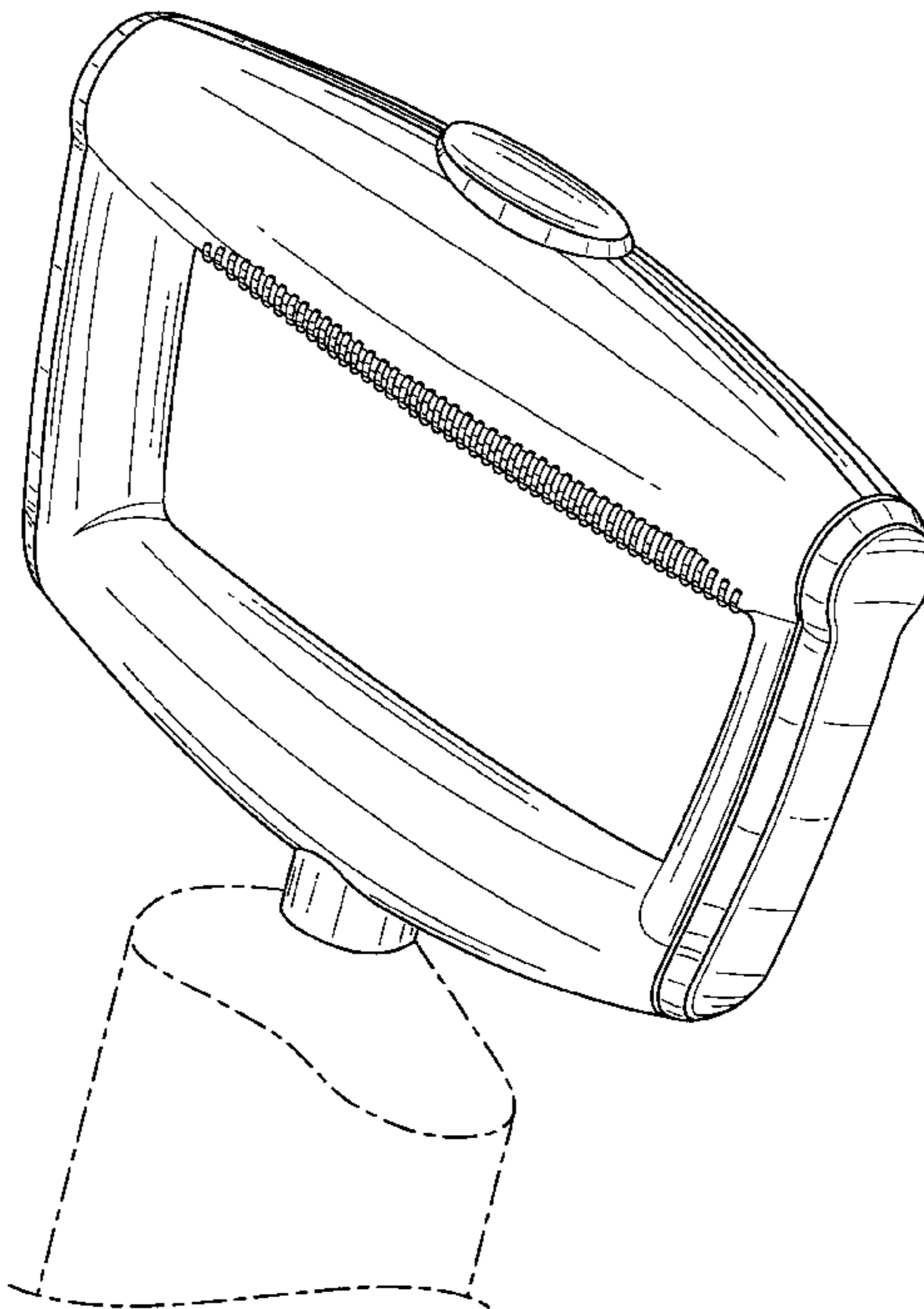
FIG. 2 is a front view of the towing handle for a piece of baggage, the rear view being a mirror image.

FIG. 3 is a side view of the towing handle for a piece of baggage, both sides being the same.

FIG. 4 is a top view of the towing handle for a piece of baggage; and,

FIG. 5 is a bottom view of the towing handle for a piece of baggage. The broken lines define a towing arm which can be attached thereto and form no part of the claimed design.

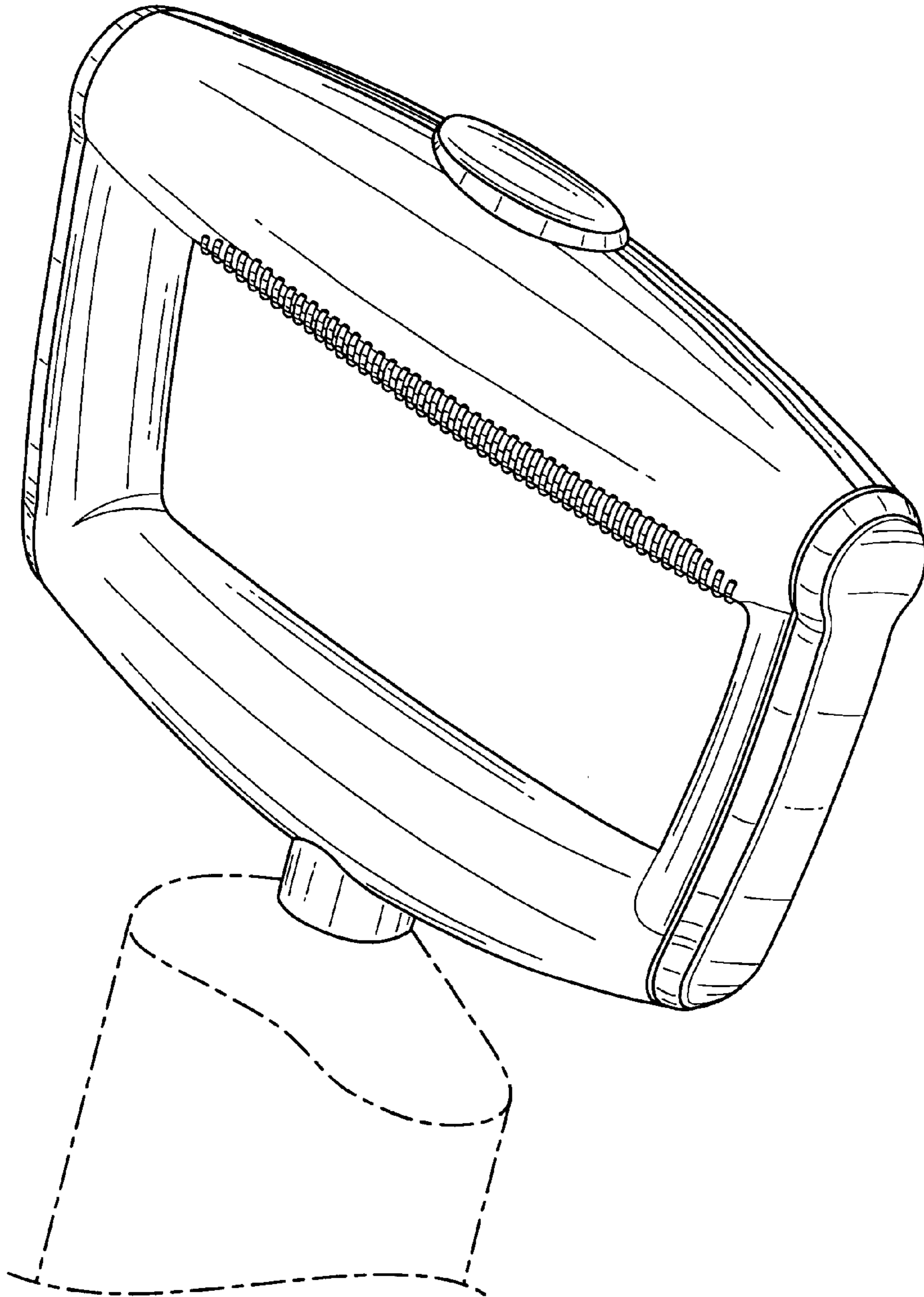

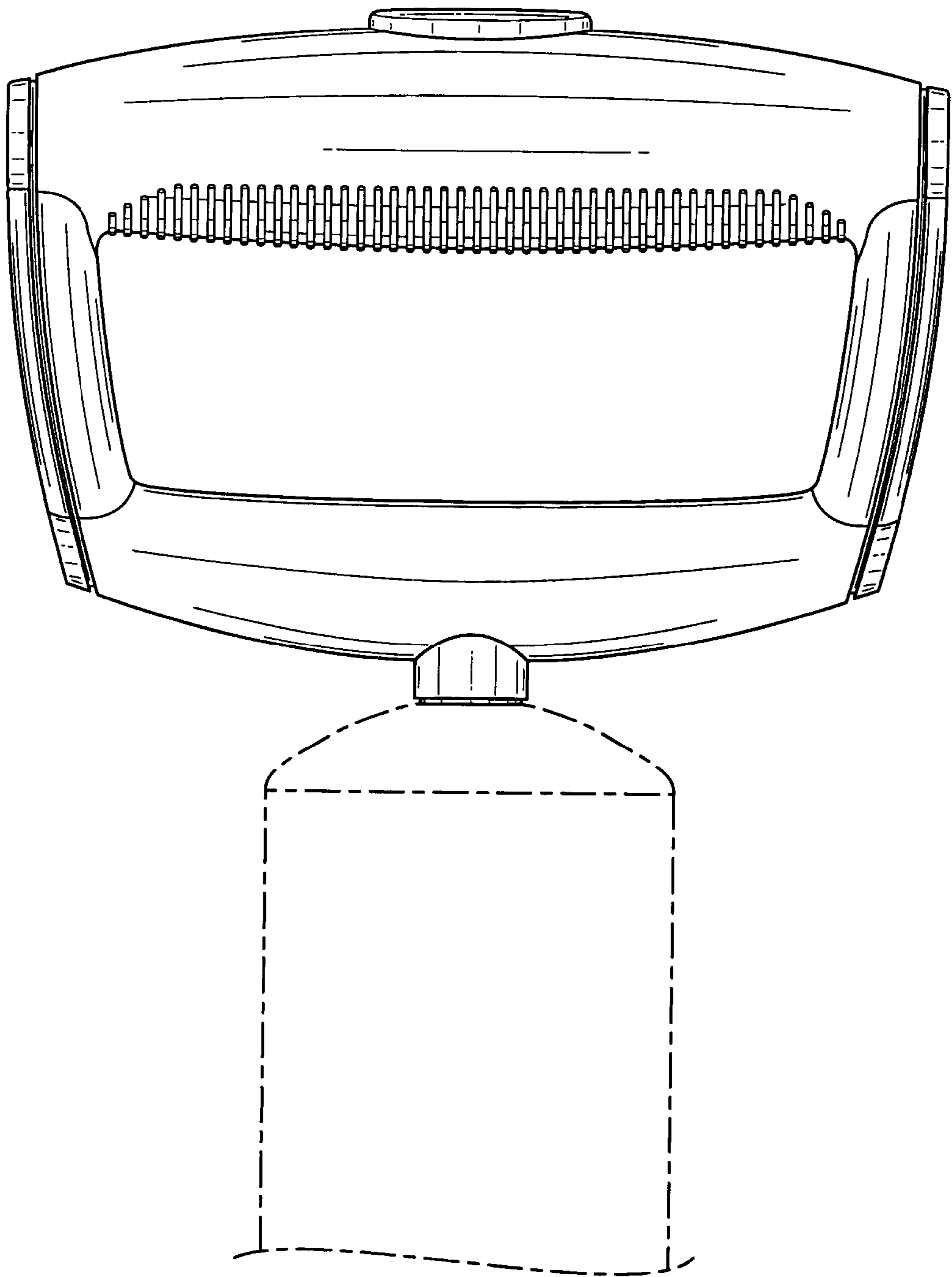

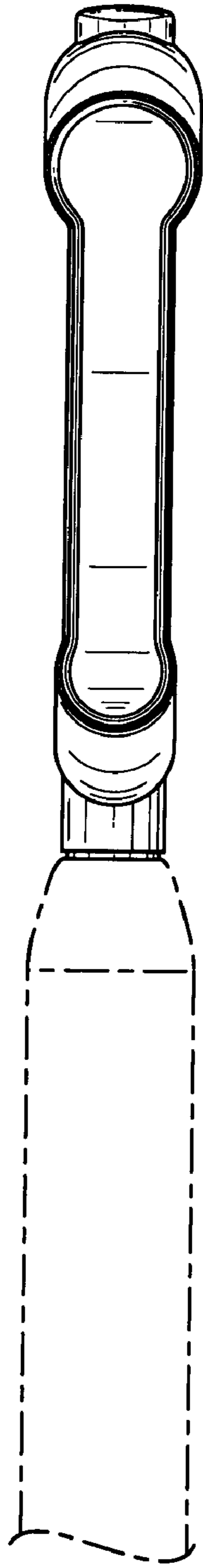

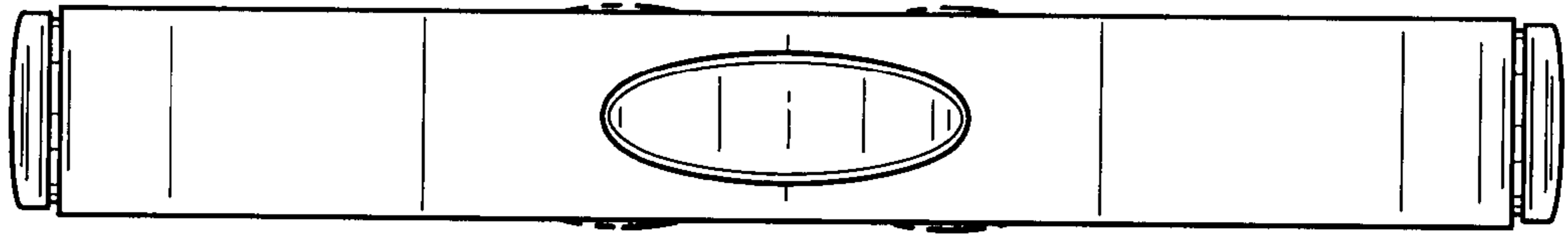

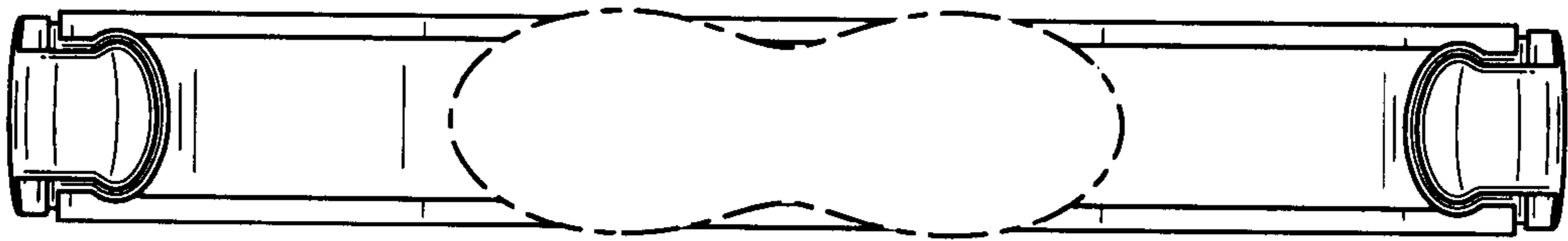
