CLAIM (57)

The ornamental design for beverage holder, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a beverage holder showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top perspective view of the steel frame show separately for clarity of illustration;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view of FIG. 2;

FIG. 4 is a side view of the fabric holder, which slides onto the steel frame, shown separately for clarity of illustration; FIG. 5 is a perspective view thereof; the ground is shown in broken lines for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design; and

FIG. 6 is a bottom plan view of FIG. 4.

The dashed lines in FIGS. 1, 4 and 5 are used to represent stitching.

This invention is a beverage holder. The holder accommodates cups, cans, bottles and glasses. It is comprised of a steel rod frame, which holds a fabric cylinder shaped pouch which securely holds the beverage. The steel frame is designed with a stake, which is inserted into grass, soft soil or dirt, or sand to hold the beverage level.
