FIG. 2 is a front elevation of the reversible adjustable hunting safety harness.

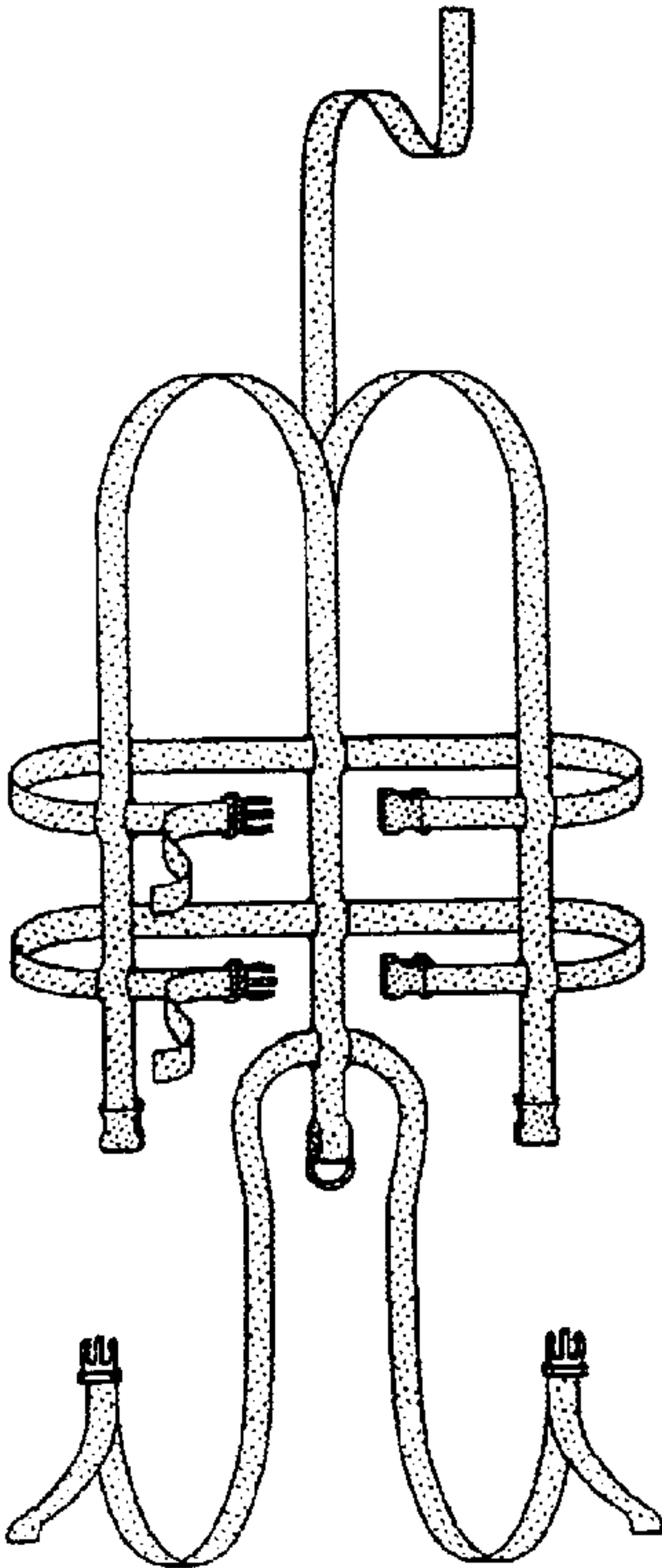
FIG. 3 is a side elevation of the reversible adjustable hunting safety harness shown shown with the buckles fastened.

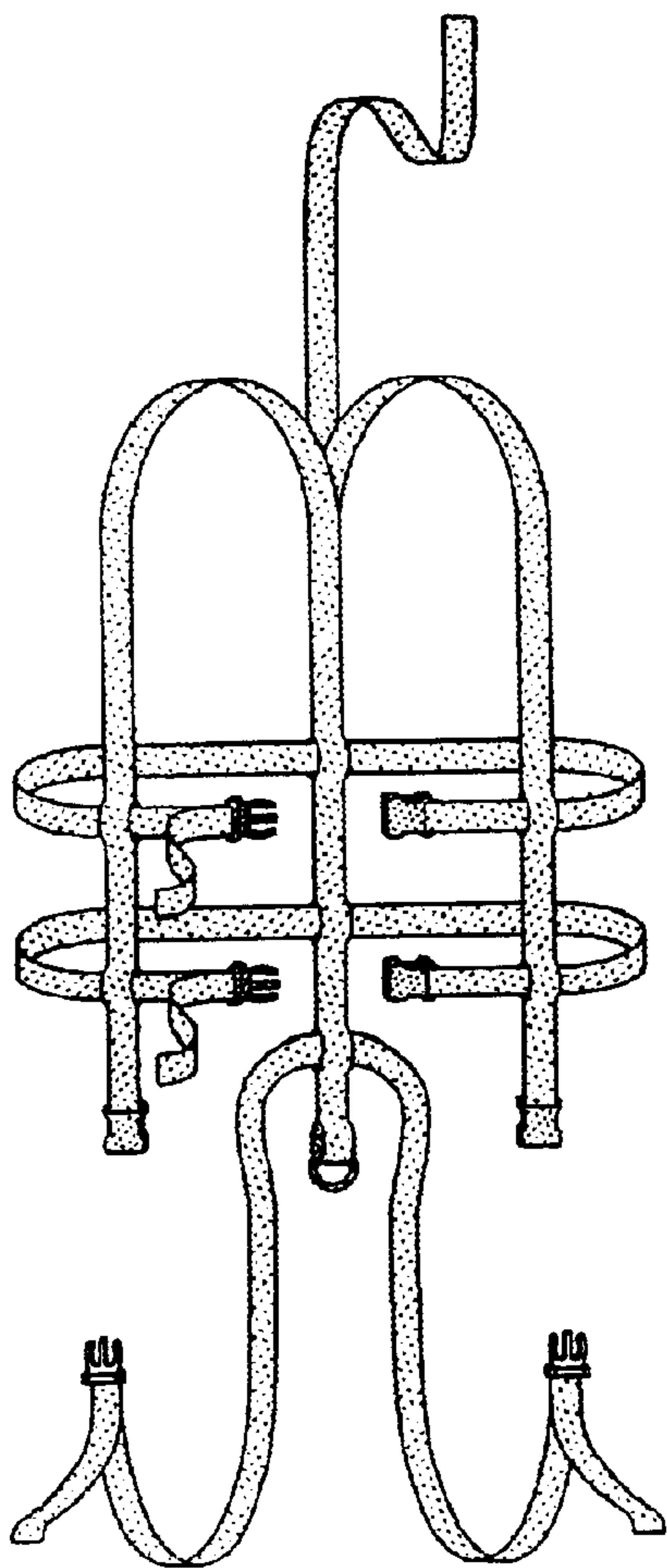

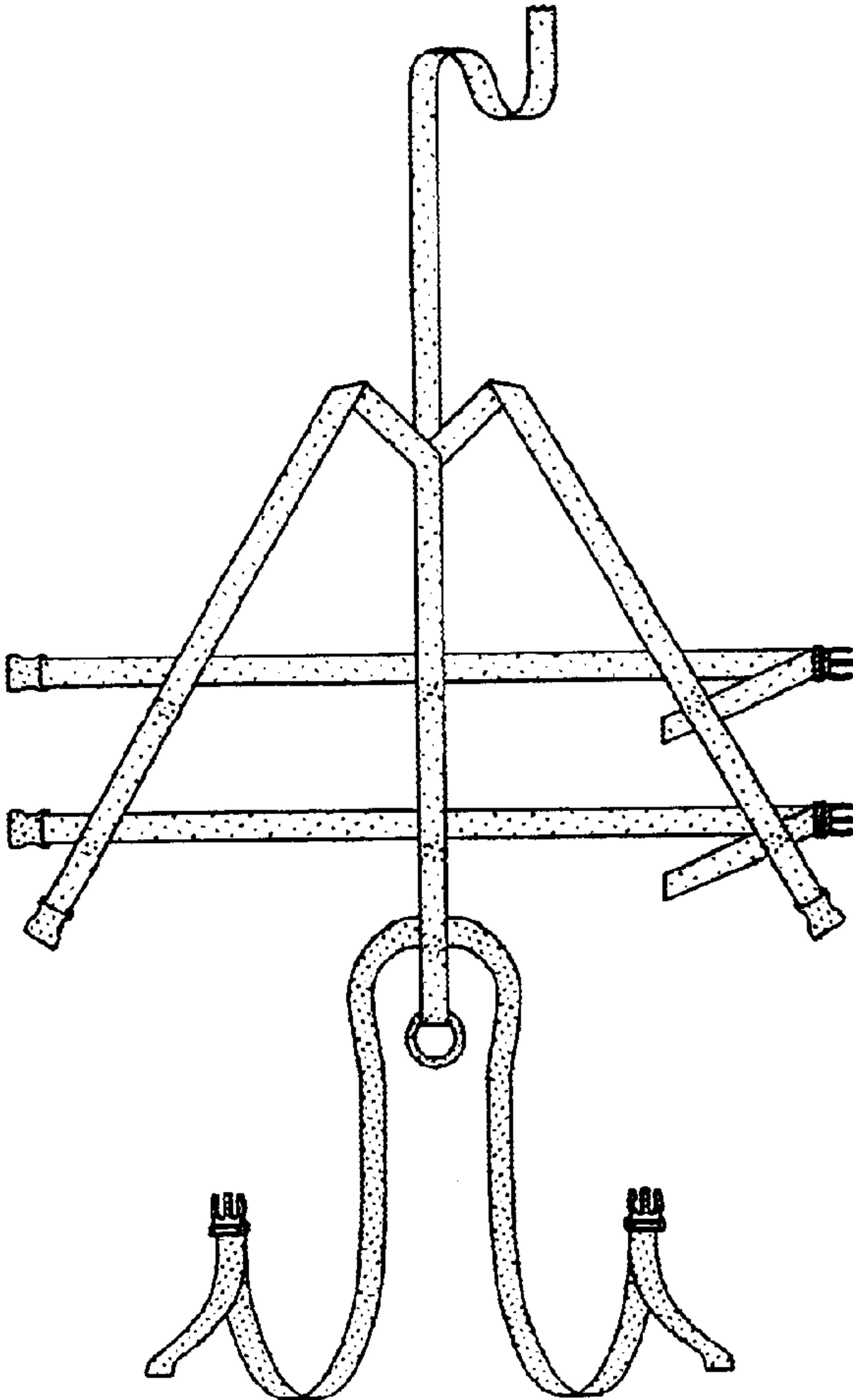

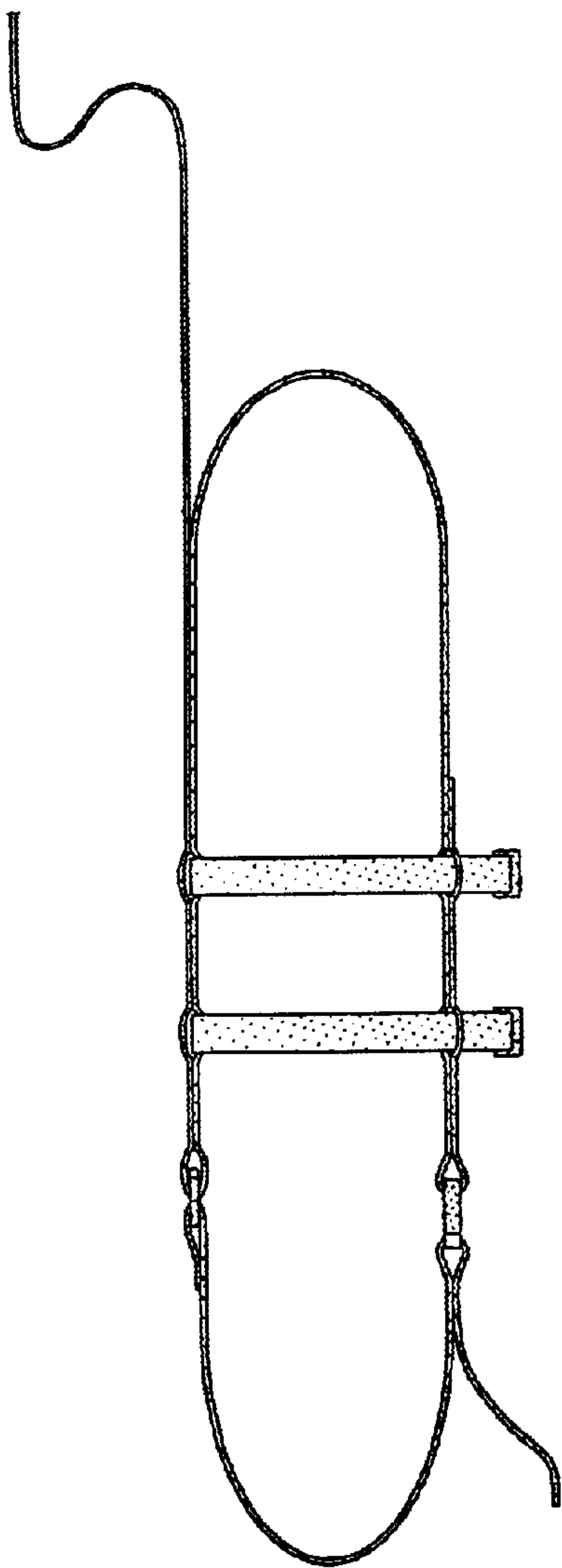

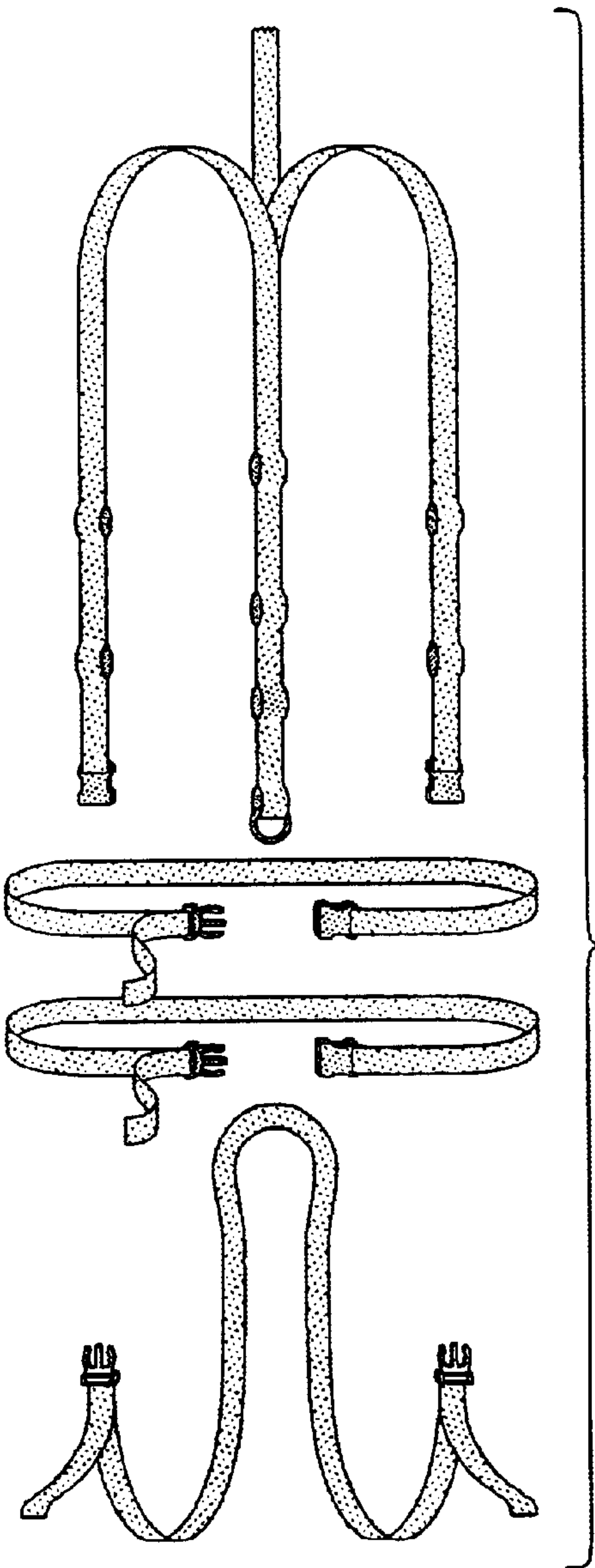

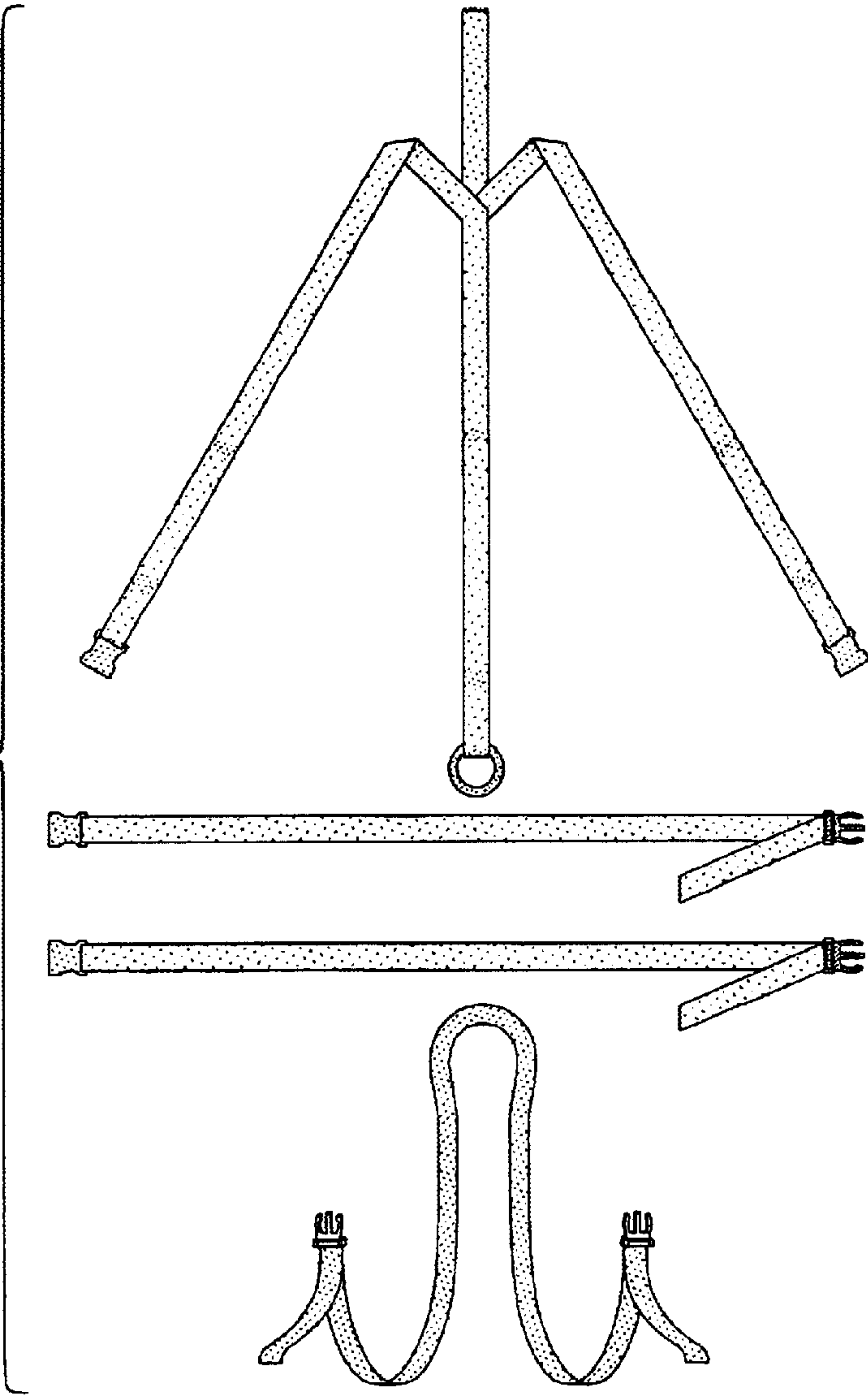
