(57)**CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a brake shoe for a bicycle, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a brake shoe for a bicycle showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a left side view of the brake shoe for a bicycle as depicted in FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a right side view of the brake shoe for a bicycle as depicted in FIG. 1;

FIG. 4 is a back view of the brake shoe for a bicycle as depicted in FIG. 1;


FIG. 5 is a front view of the brake shoe for a bicycle as depicted in FIG. 1;

FIG. 6 is a top view of the brake shoe for a bicycle as depicted in FIG. 1; and,












