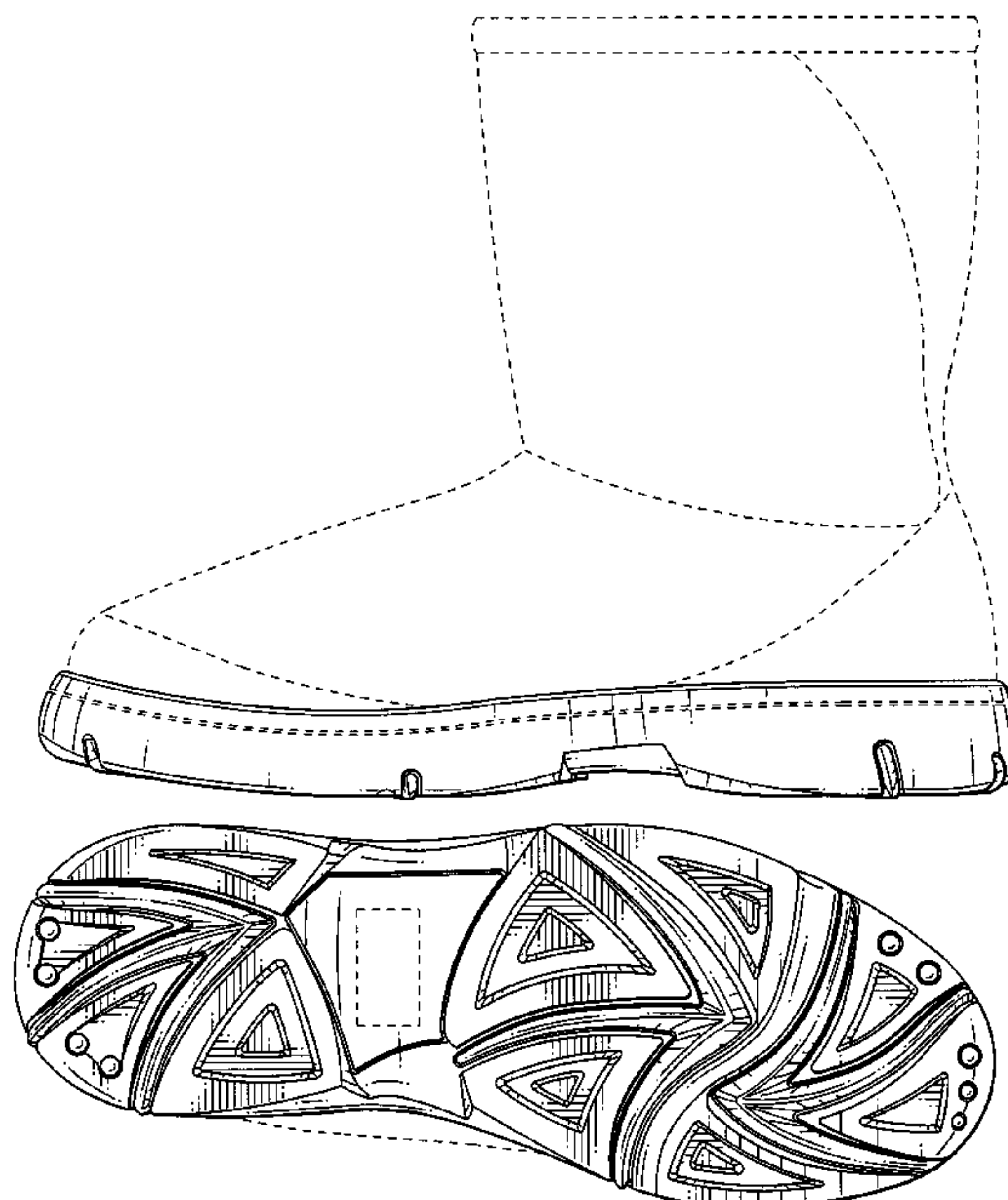
The ornamental design for a portion of a footwear sole, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a bottom perspective view of a portion of a footwear sole, showing my new design;
FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof;

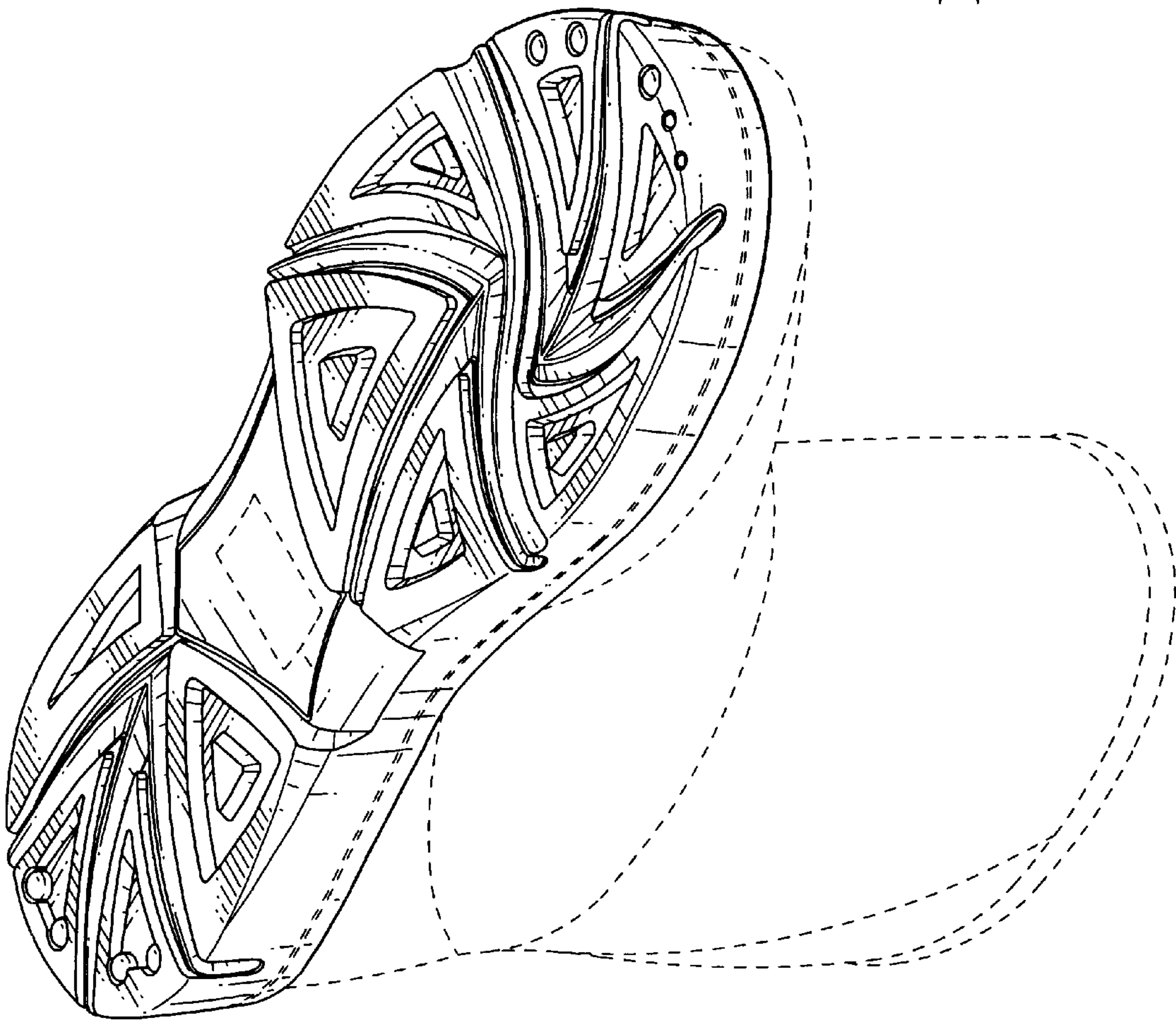
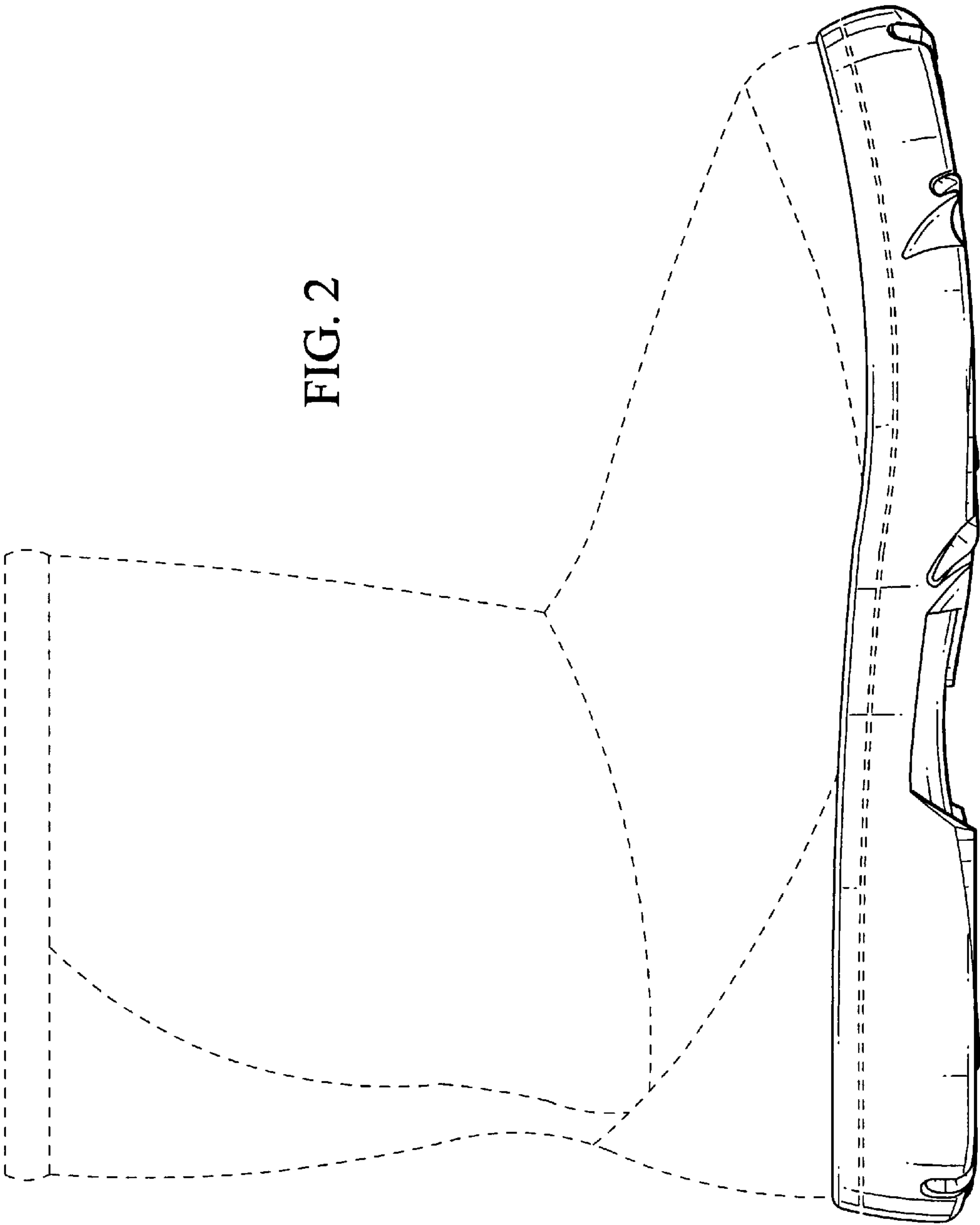

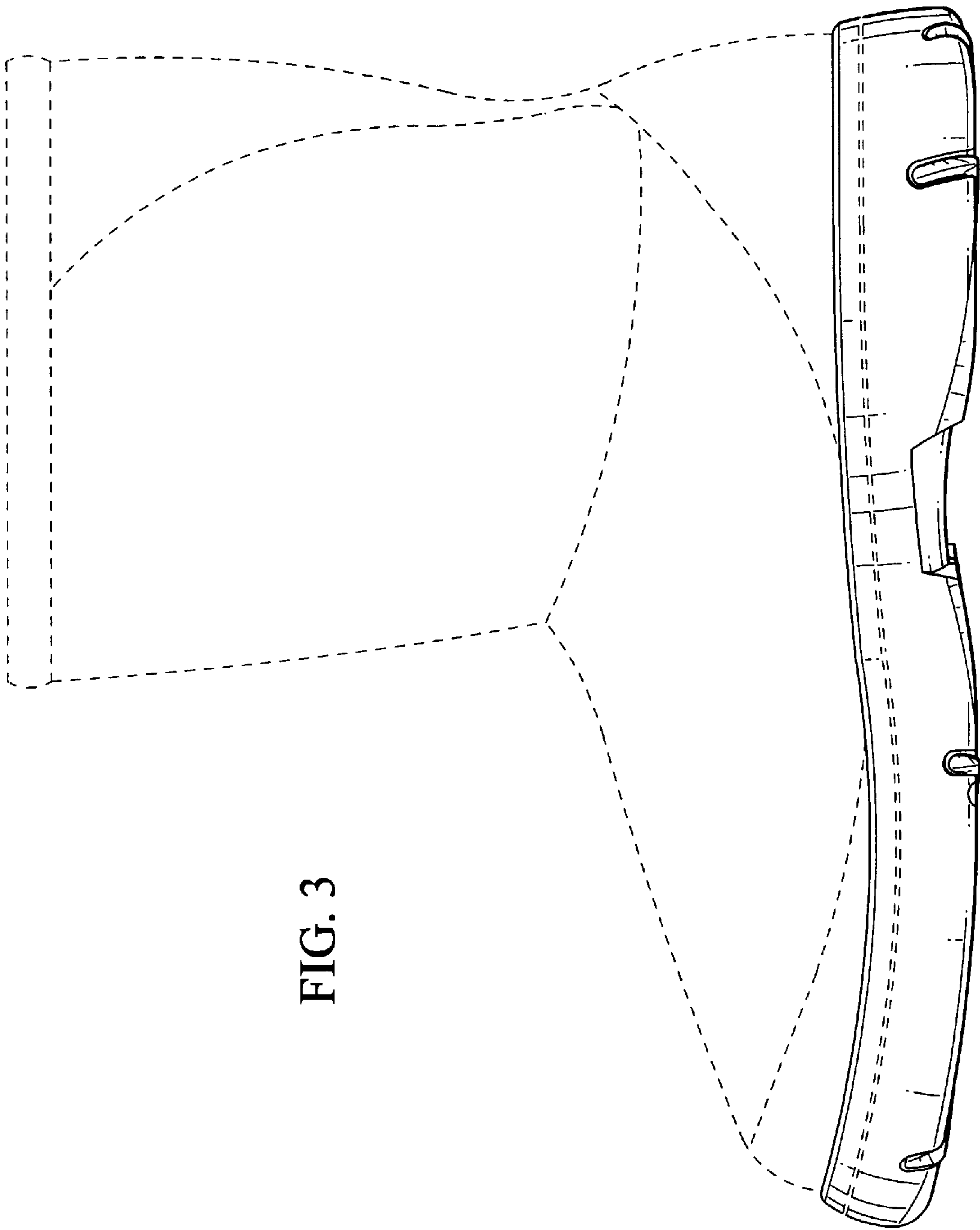

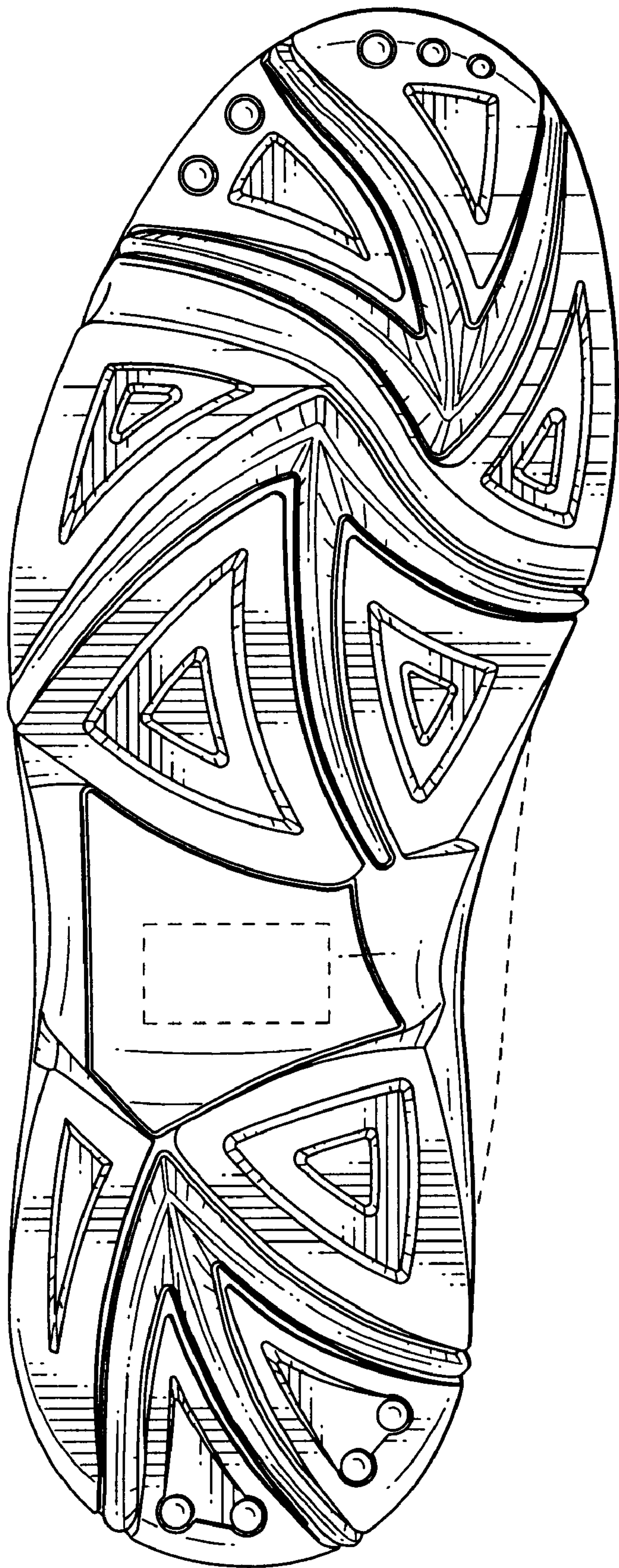

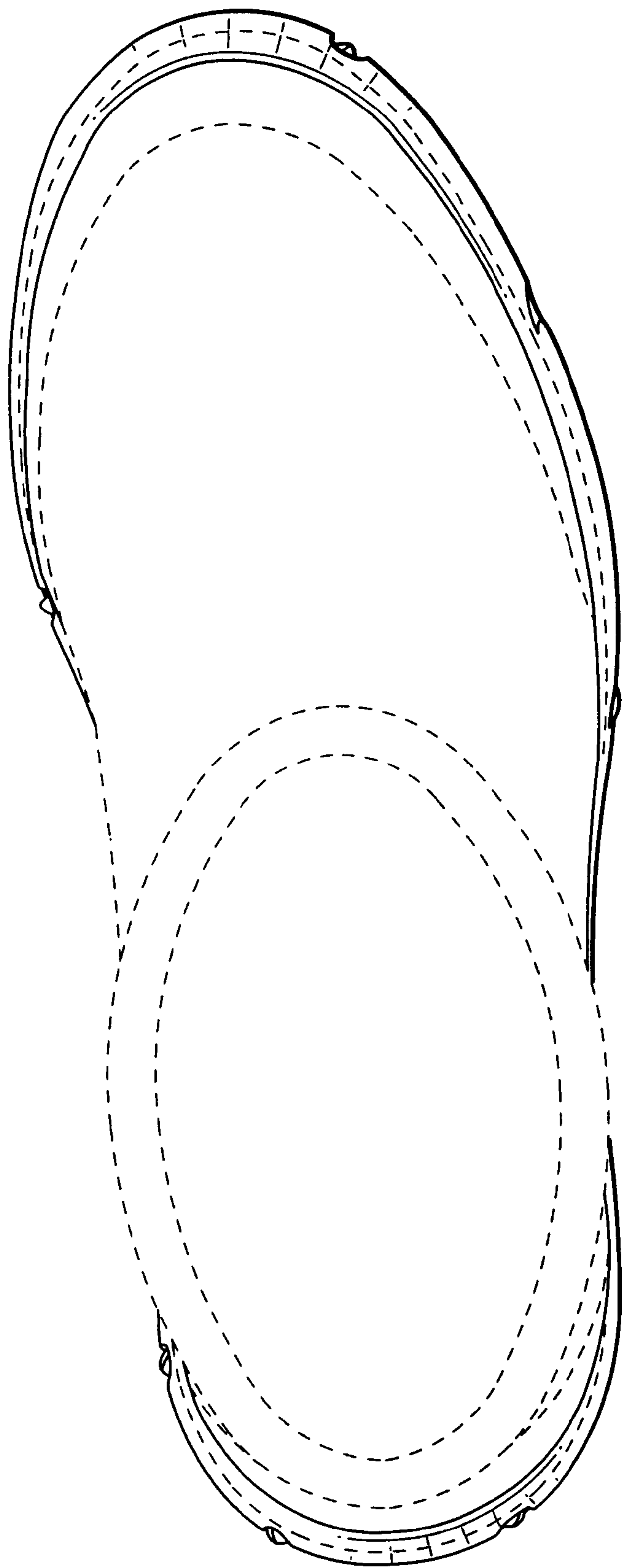
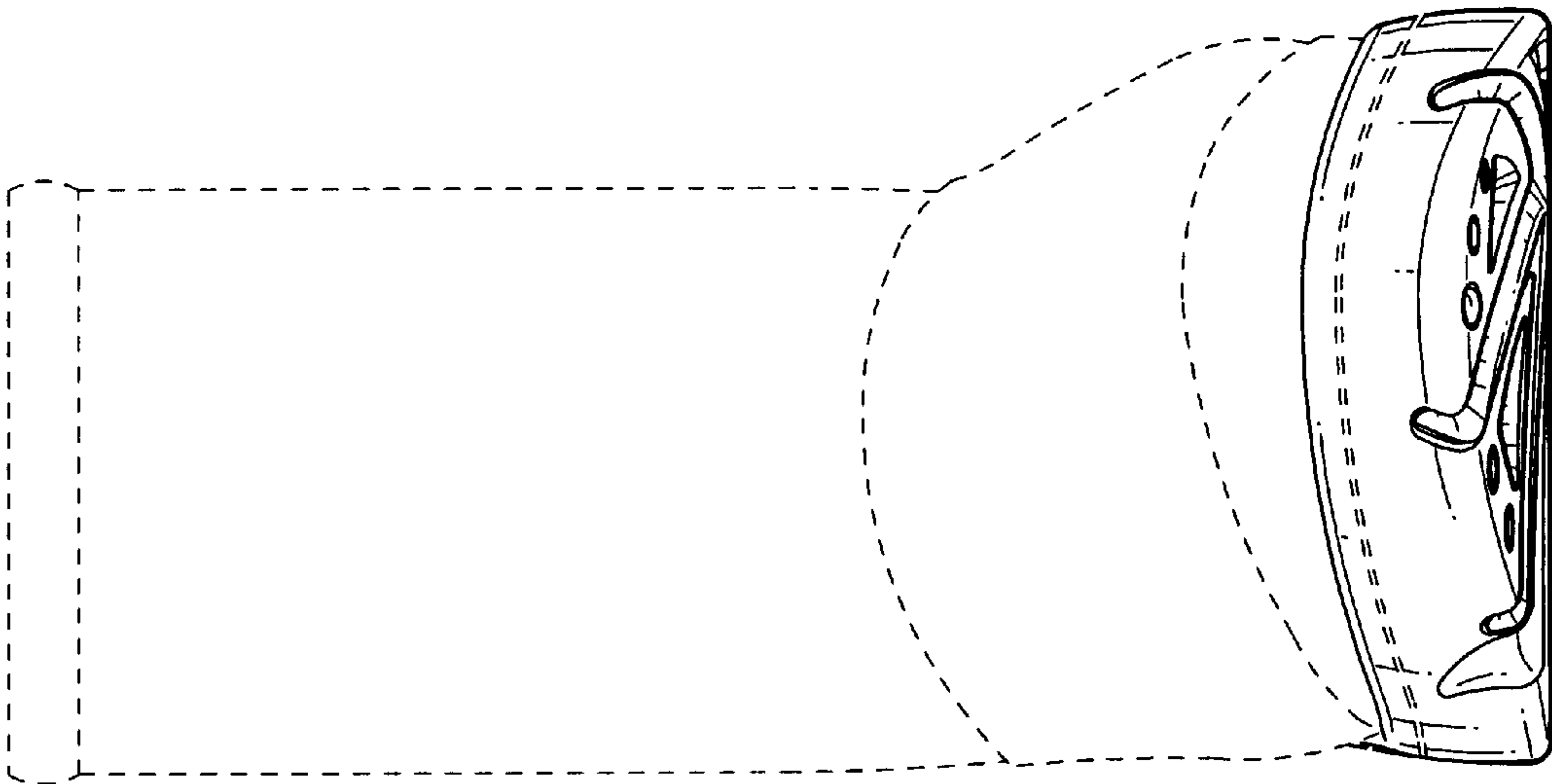

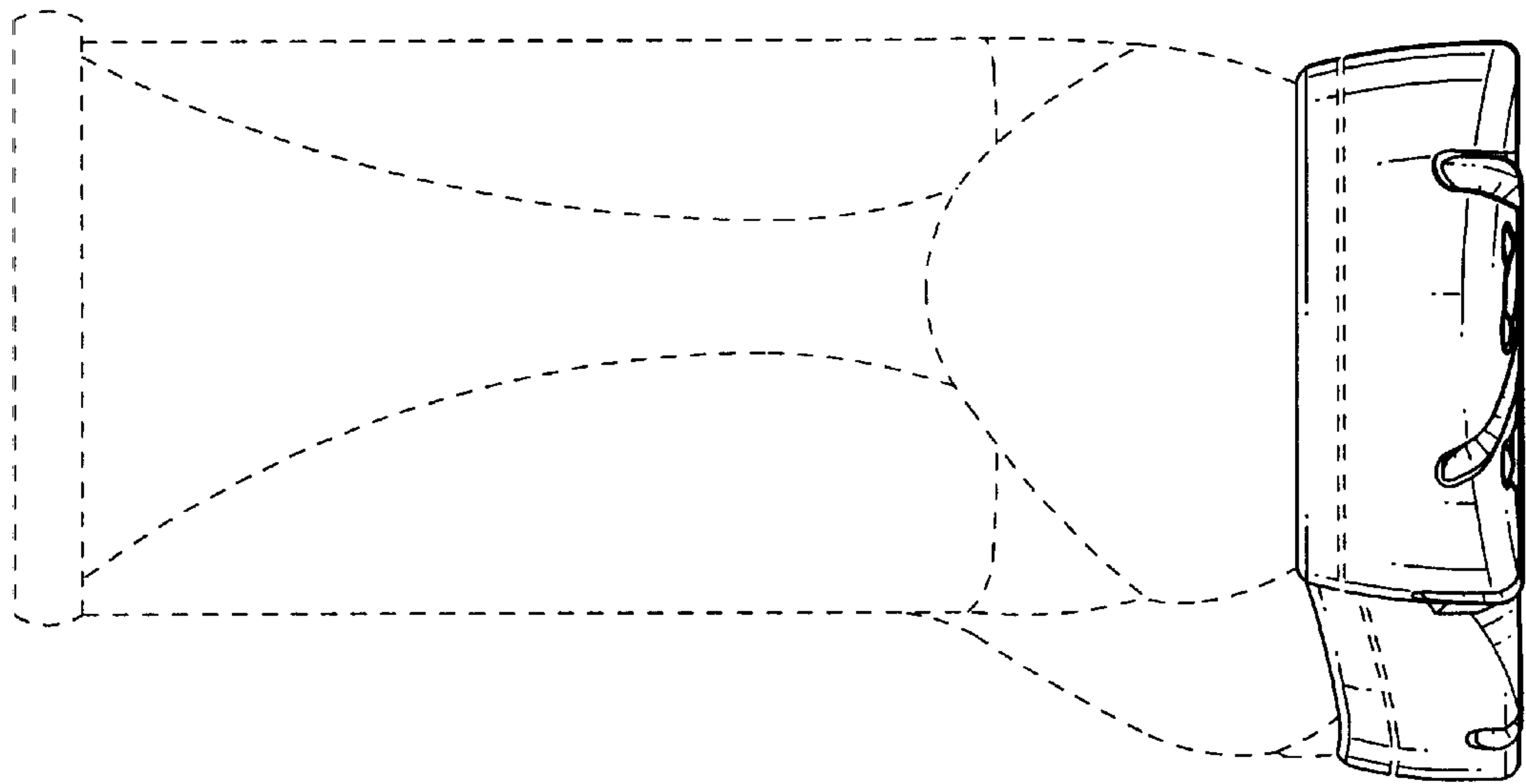
