(57)**CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a golf club, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the present invention;

FIG. 2 is a first side view of the present invention;

FIG. 3 is a second side view of the present invention;

FIG. 4 is front view of the present invention;

FIG. 5 is rear view of the present invention;

FIG. 6 is a top view of the present invention;

FIG. 7 is a bottom view of the present invention, showing the ball lift with standard tee set, tee removal slot, executive tee set aperture and approximate rectangular balancing cavity;

FIG. 8 is a perspective view of the present invention in conjunction with a golf ball, said golf ball being shown in phantom;


FIG. 9 is a perspective view of the present invention showing the slot used for setting a golf tee in conjunction with a standard wooden golf tee, said standard wooden golf tee being shown in phantom;


FIG. 10 is a perspective view of the present invention showing the slot used for removing a golf tee in conjunction with a standard wooden golf tee, said standard wooden golf tee being shown in phantom; and,

FIG. 11 is a perspective view of the present invention showing the slot used for removing an executive golf tee in conjunction with an executive golf tee, said executive golf tee being shown in phantom.

The broken line showing of environment is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.













