**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a left front perspective view of a table showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a front perspective view thereof;

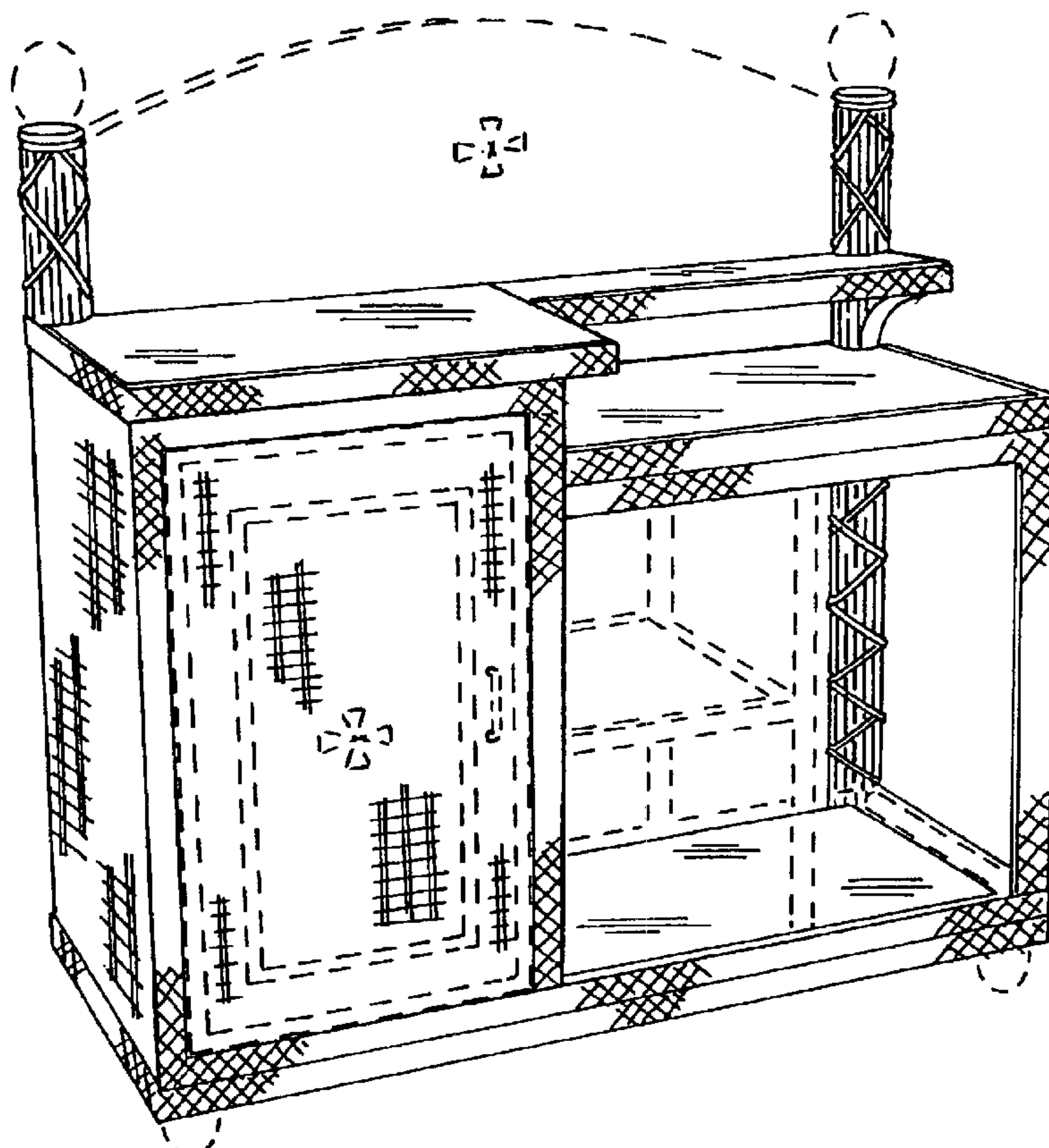
FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof

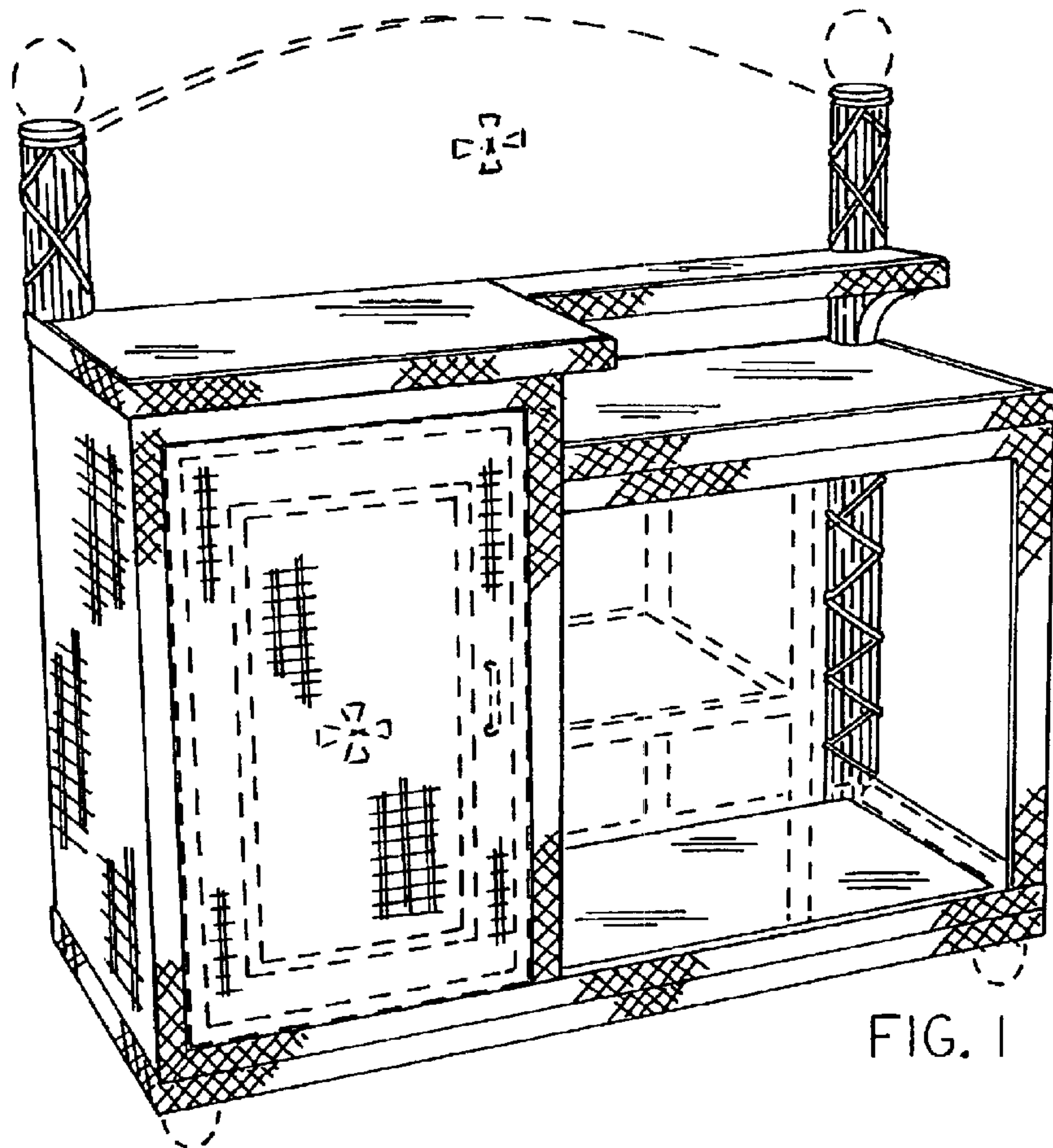

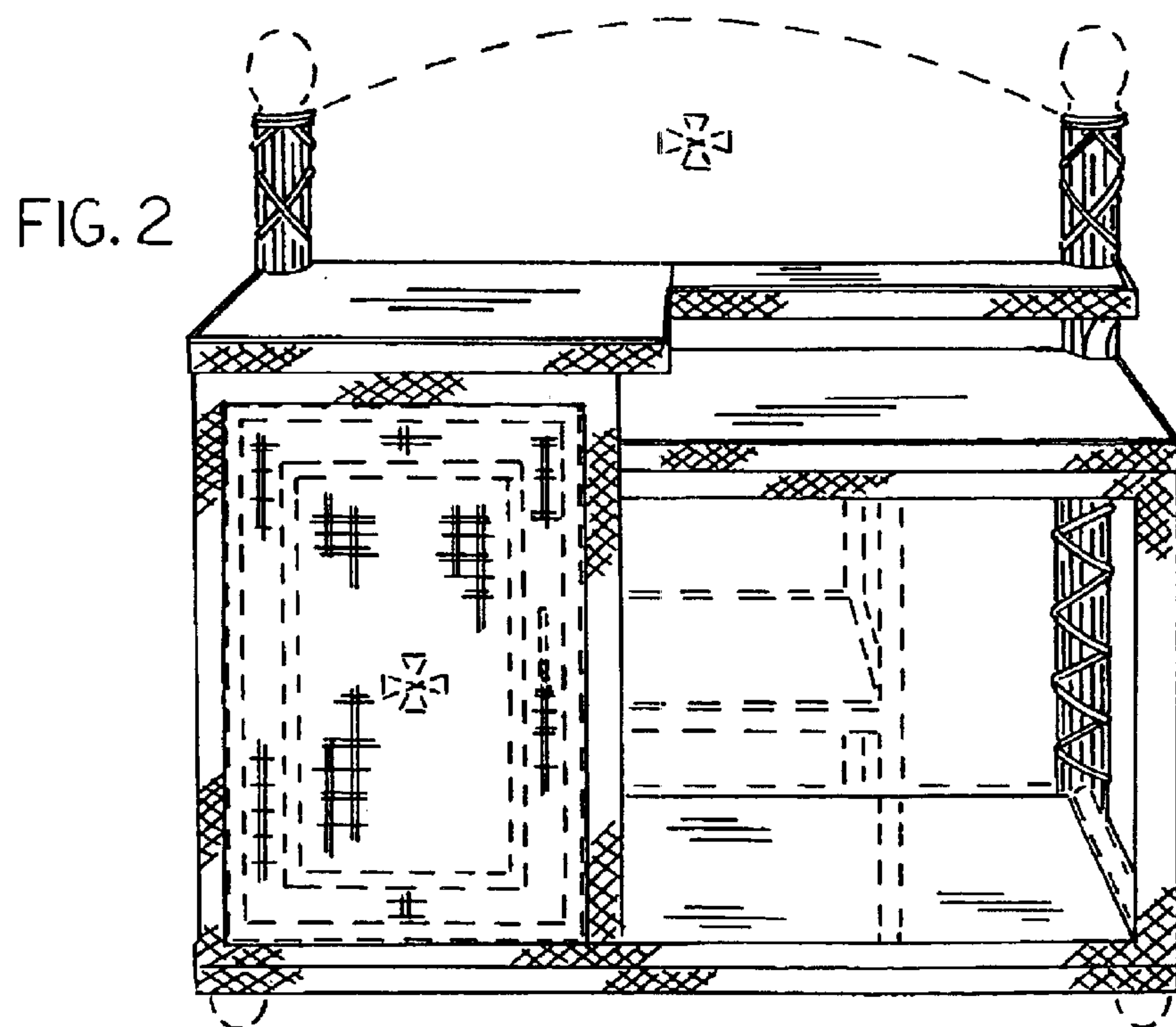

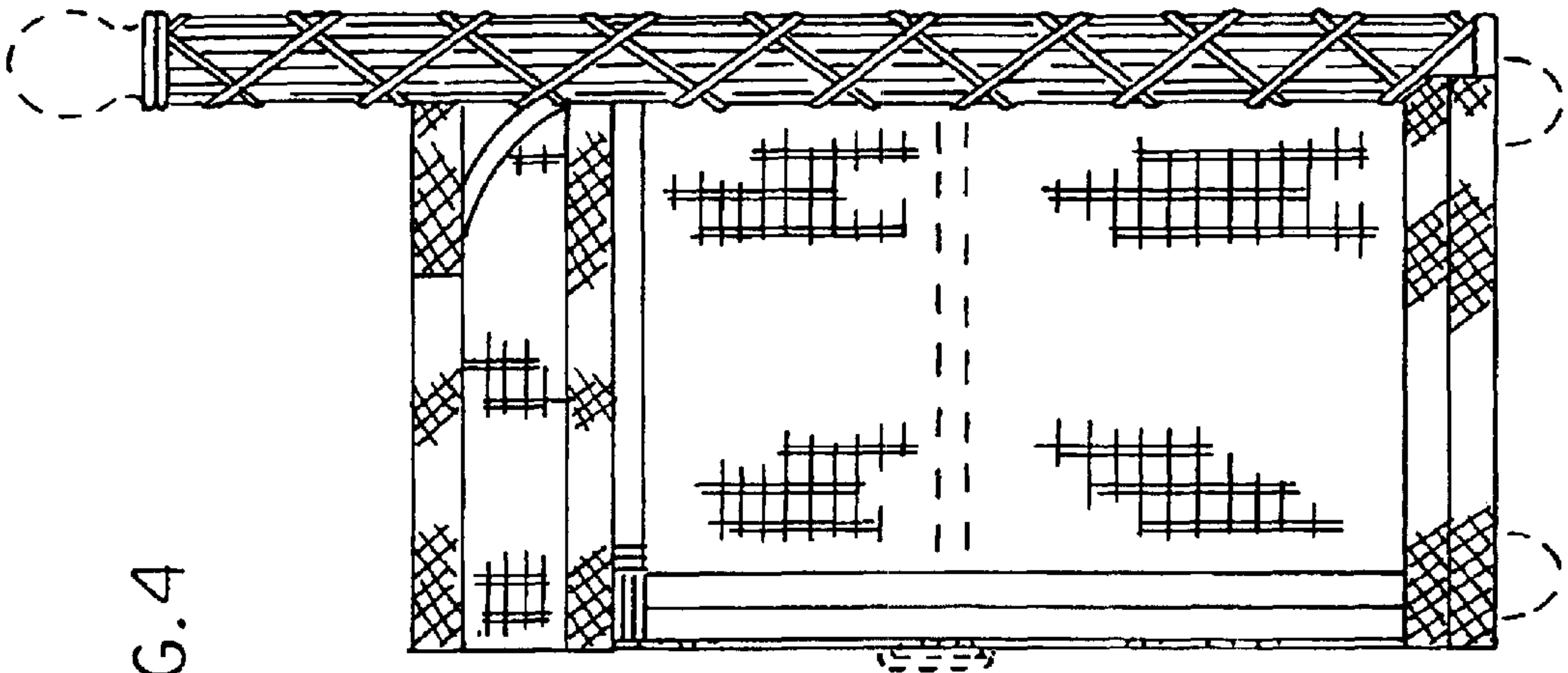
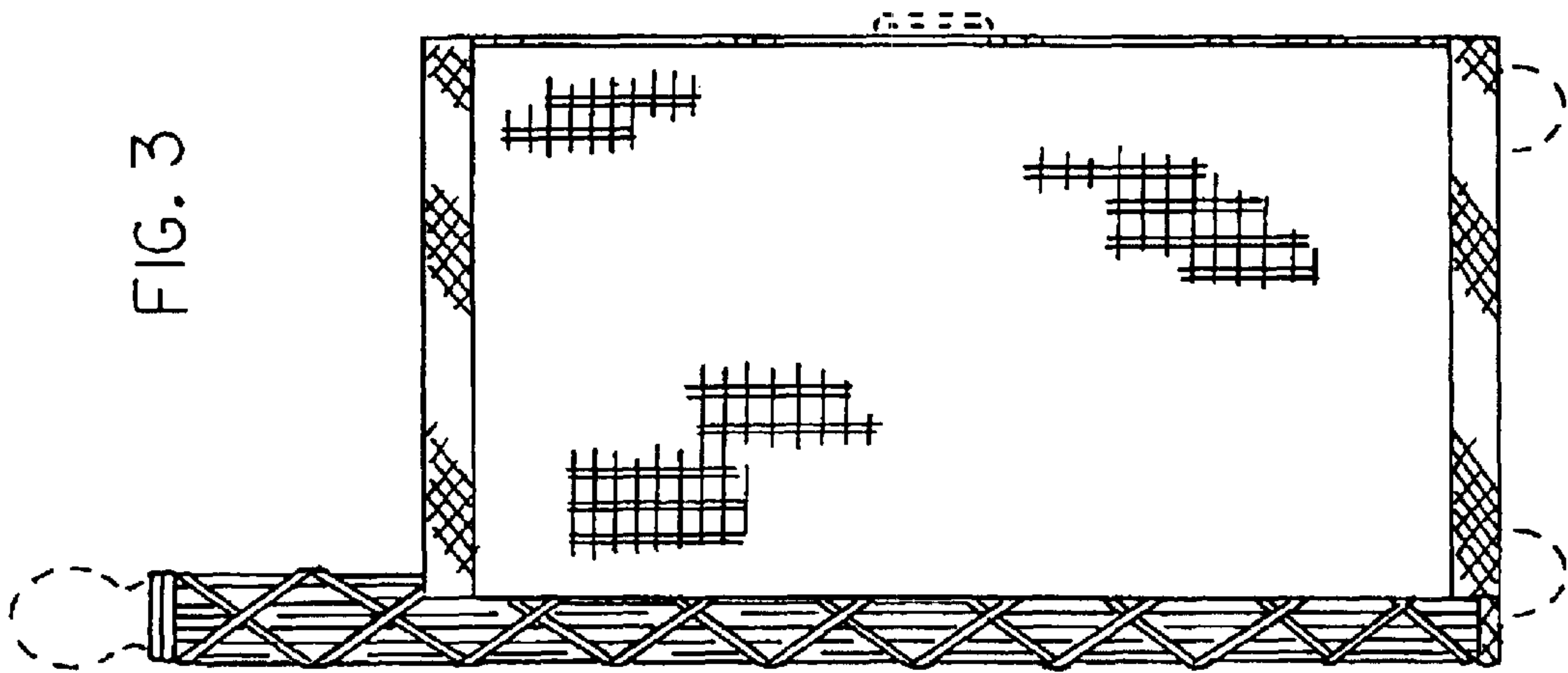

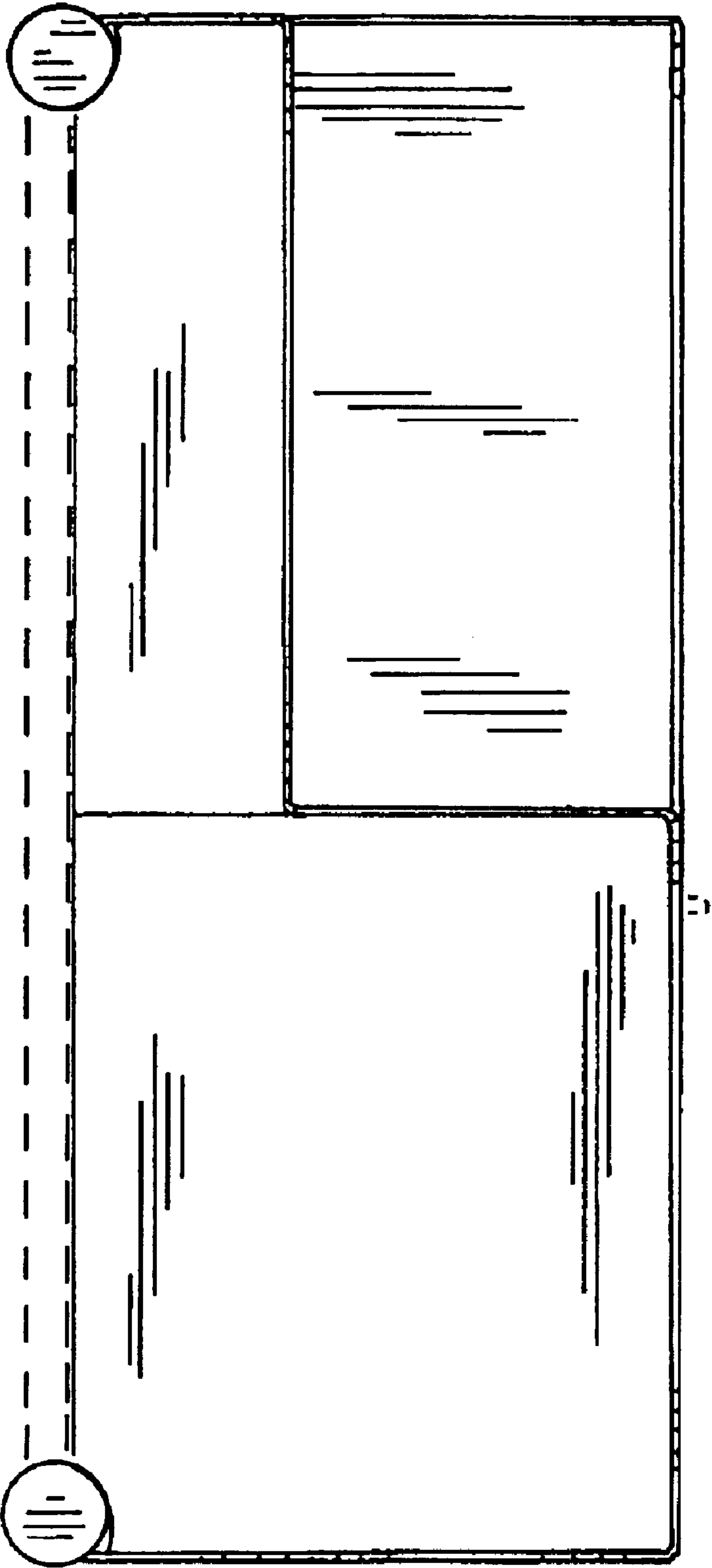
