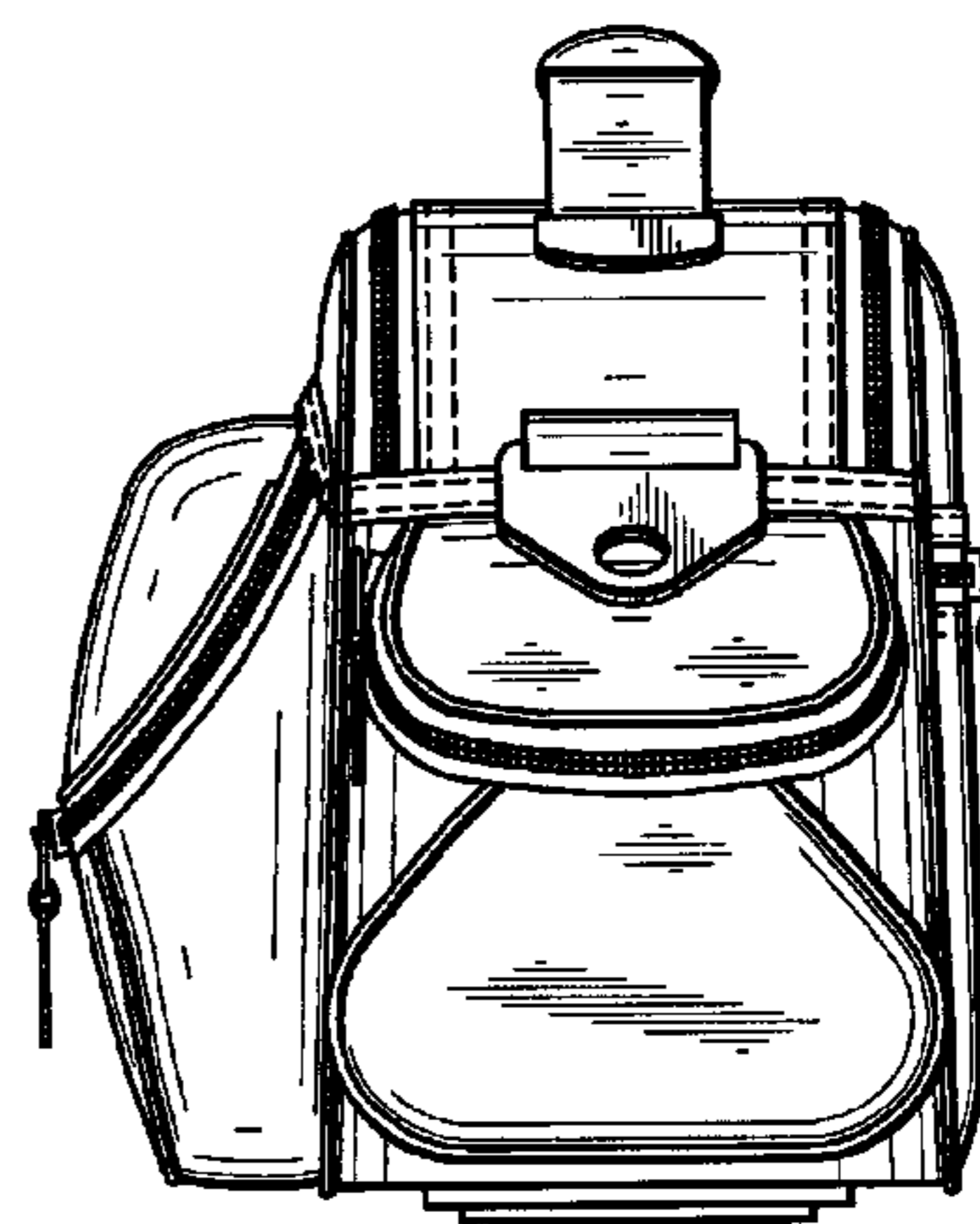
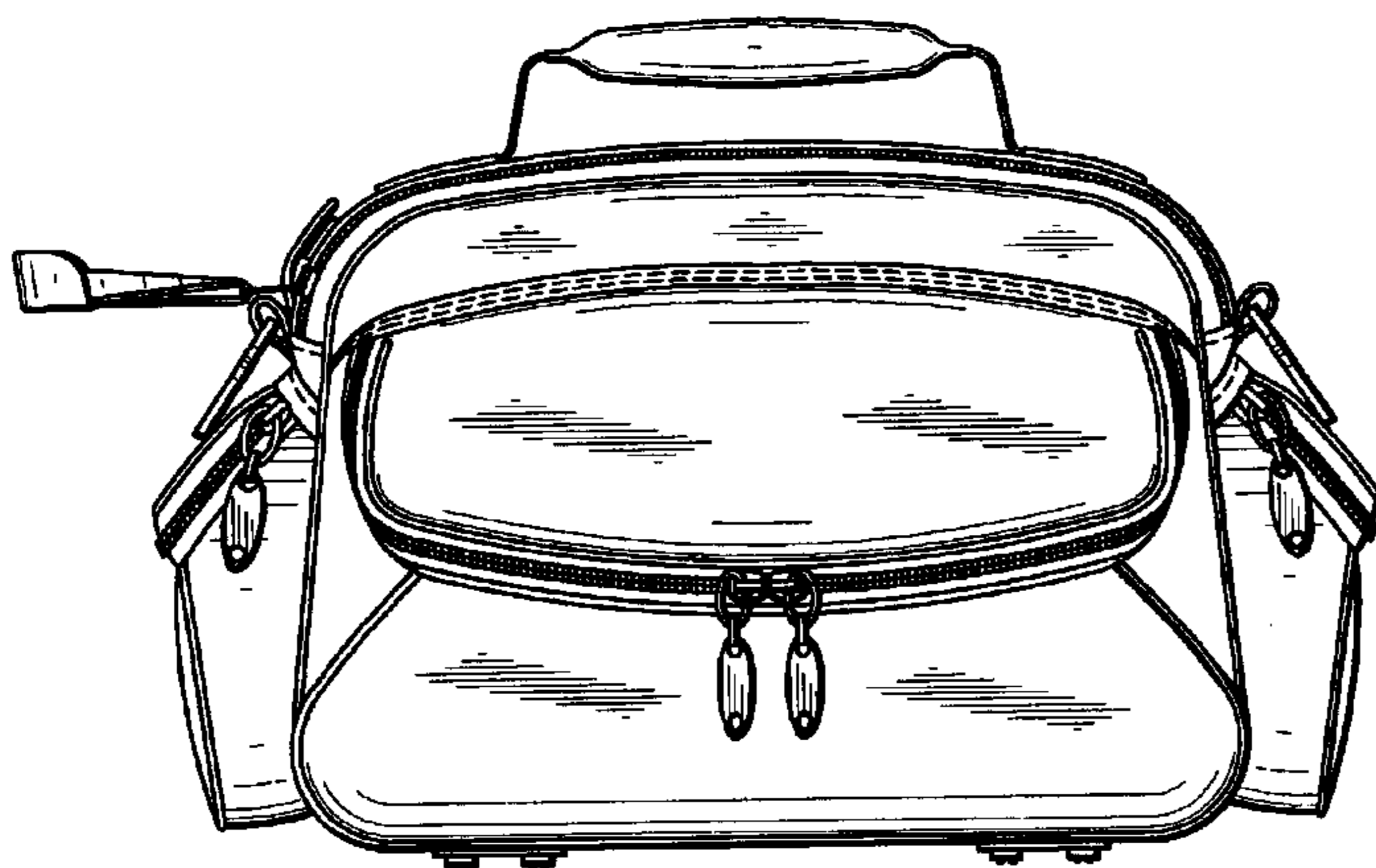

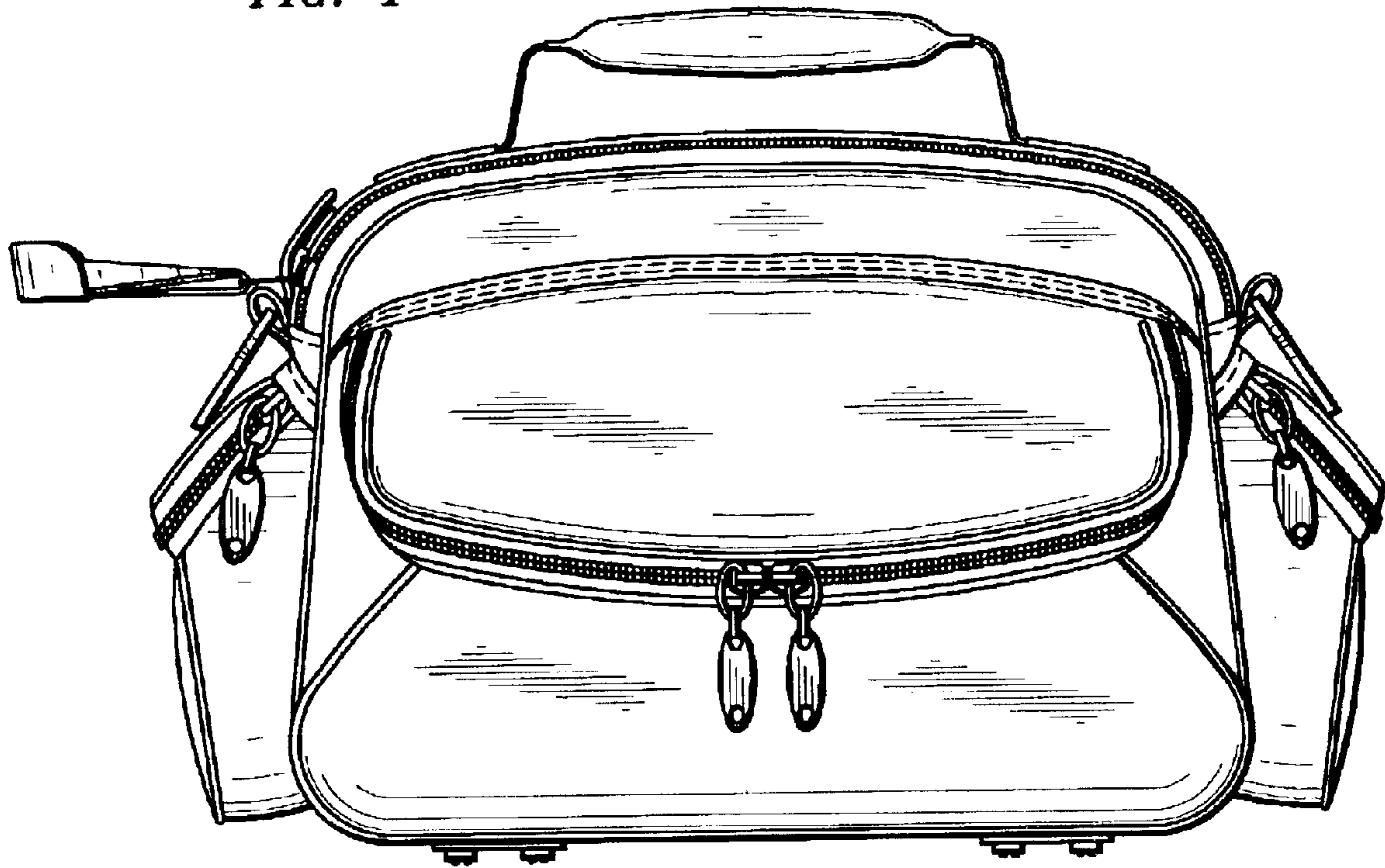

The broken lines shown in FIGS. 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6 are understood to represent stitching.

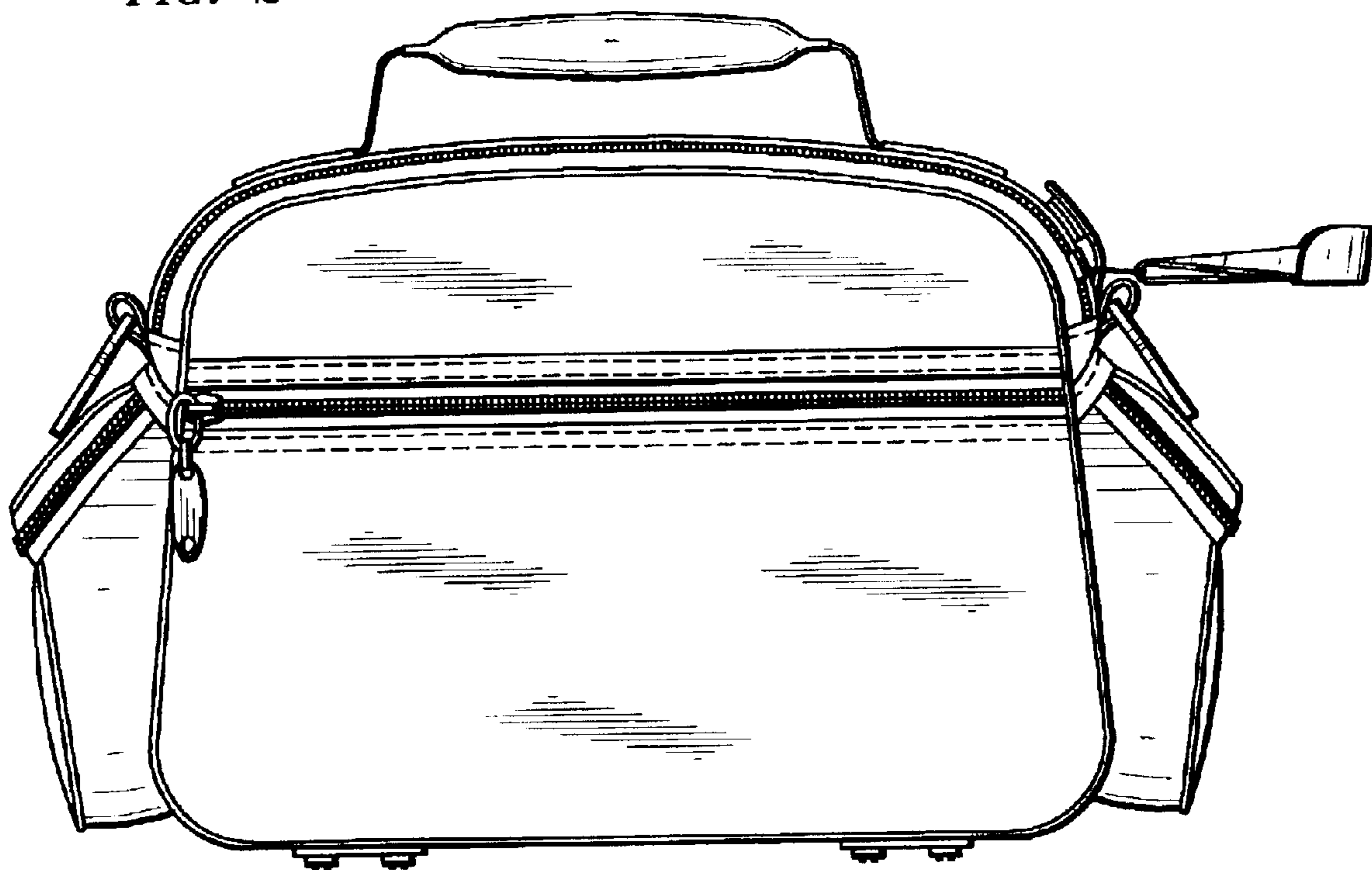

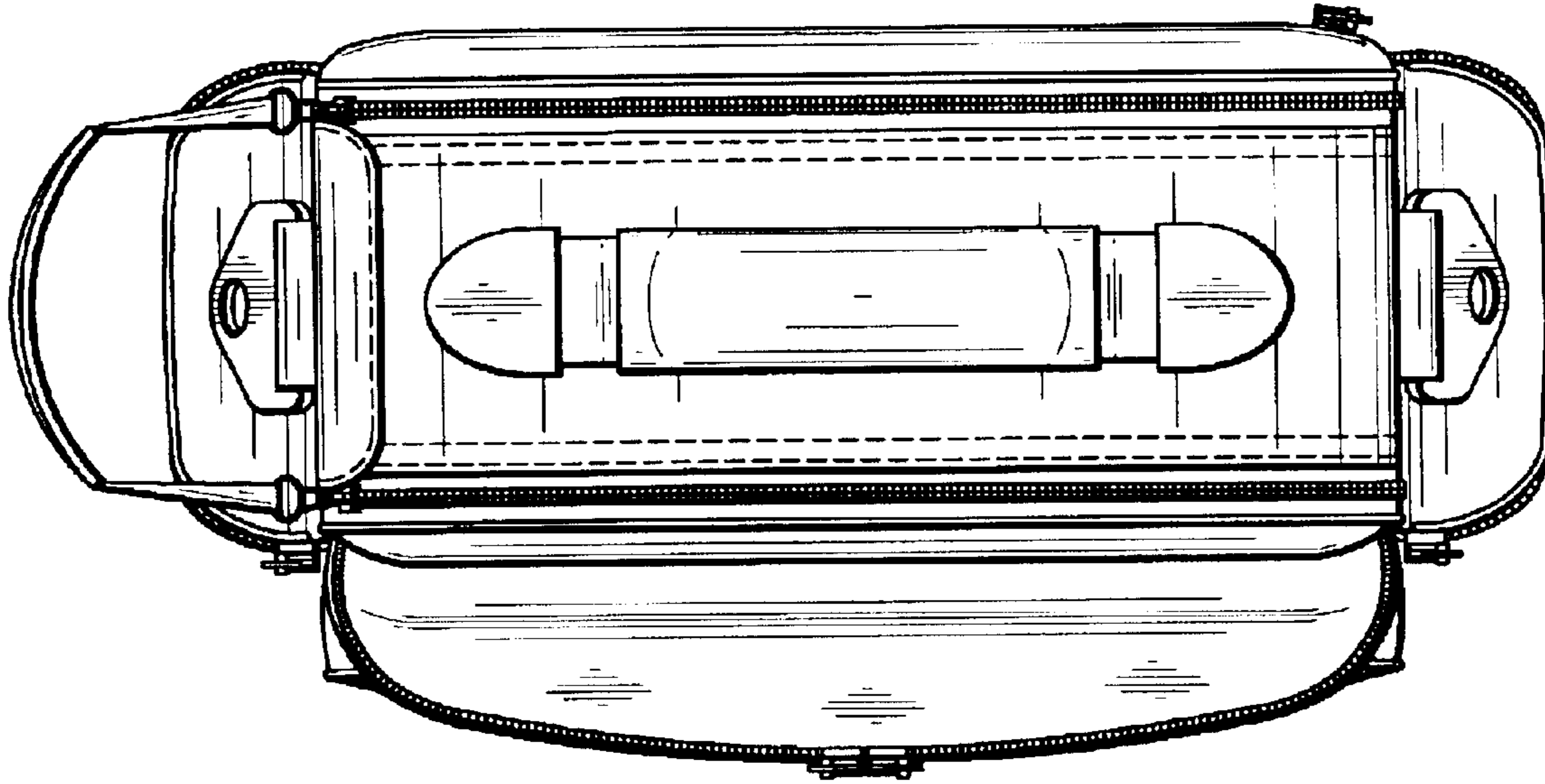

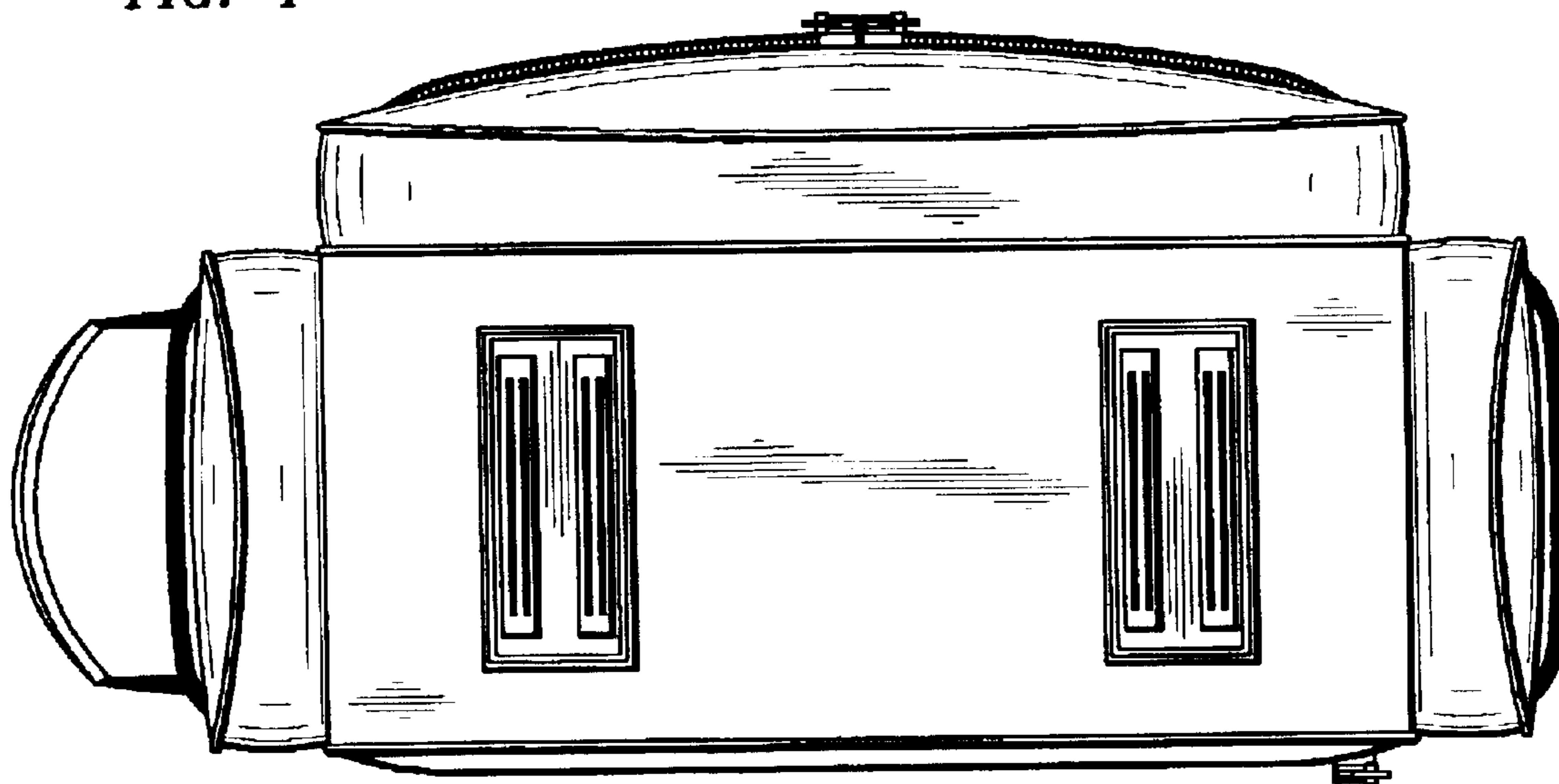

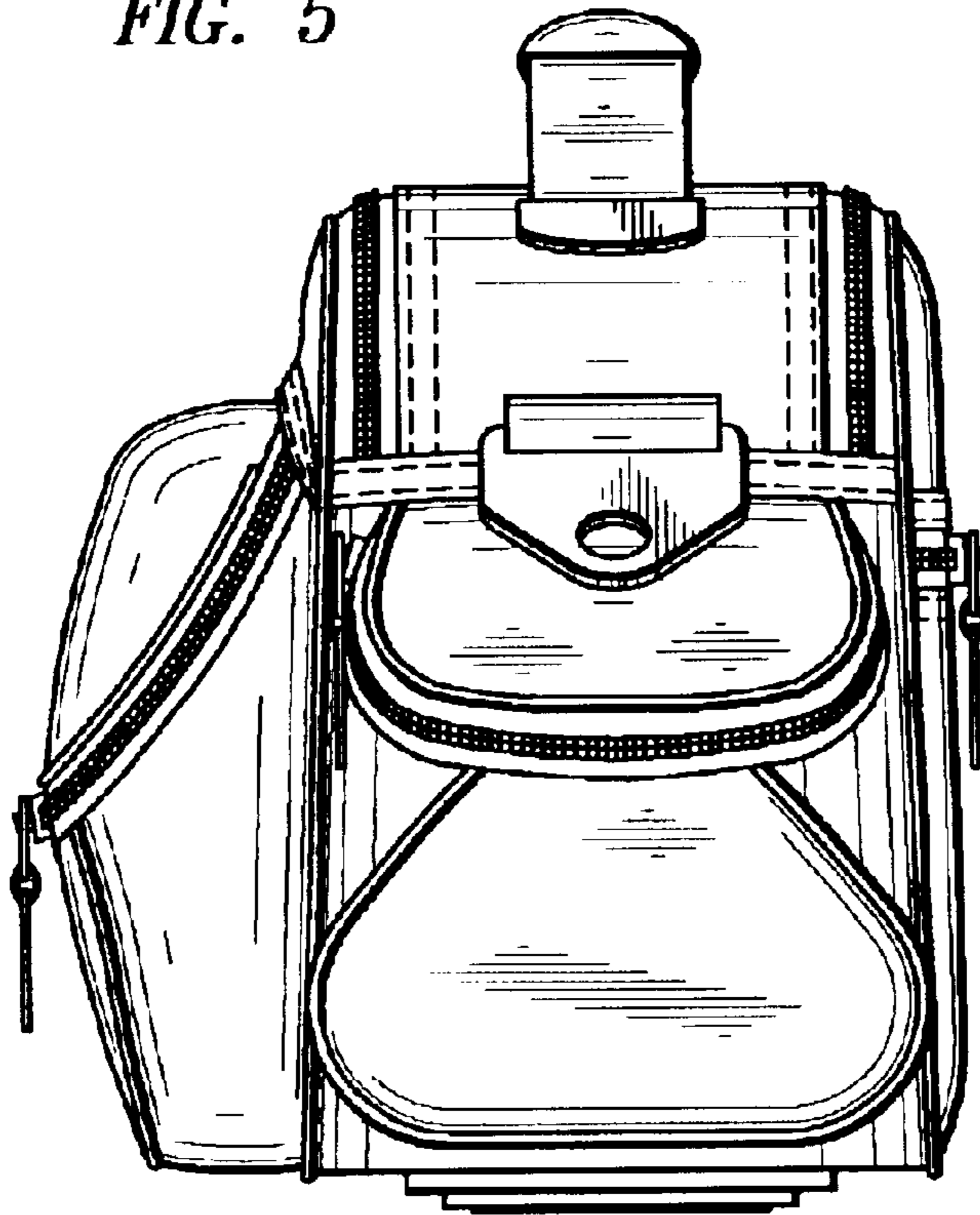
