DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a first embodiment of a shoe made from animal skin;

FIG. 2 is a front view of the shoe;

FIG. 3 is a back view of the shoe;

FIG. 4 is a side view of the shoe from an outside edge of the shoe;

FIG. 5 is a side view of the shoe from an inside edge of the shoe;

FIG. 6 is a top view of the shoe;

FIG. 7 is a perspective view of a second embodiment of a shoe;

FIG. 8 is a front view of the shoe;

FIG. 9 is a back view of the shoe;

FIG. 10 is a side view of the shoe from an outside edge of the shoe;

FIG. 11 is a side view of the shoe from an inside edge of the shoe; and,

FIG. 12 is a top view of the shoe.

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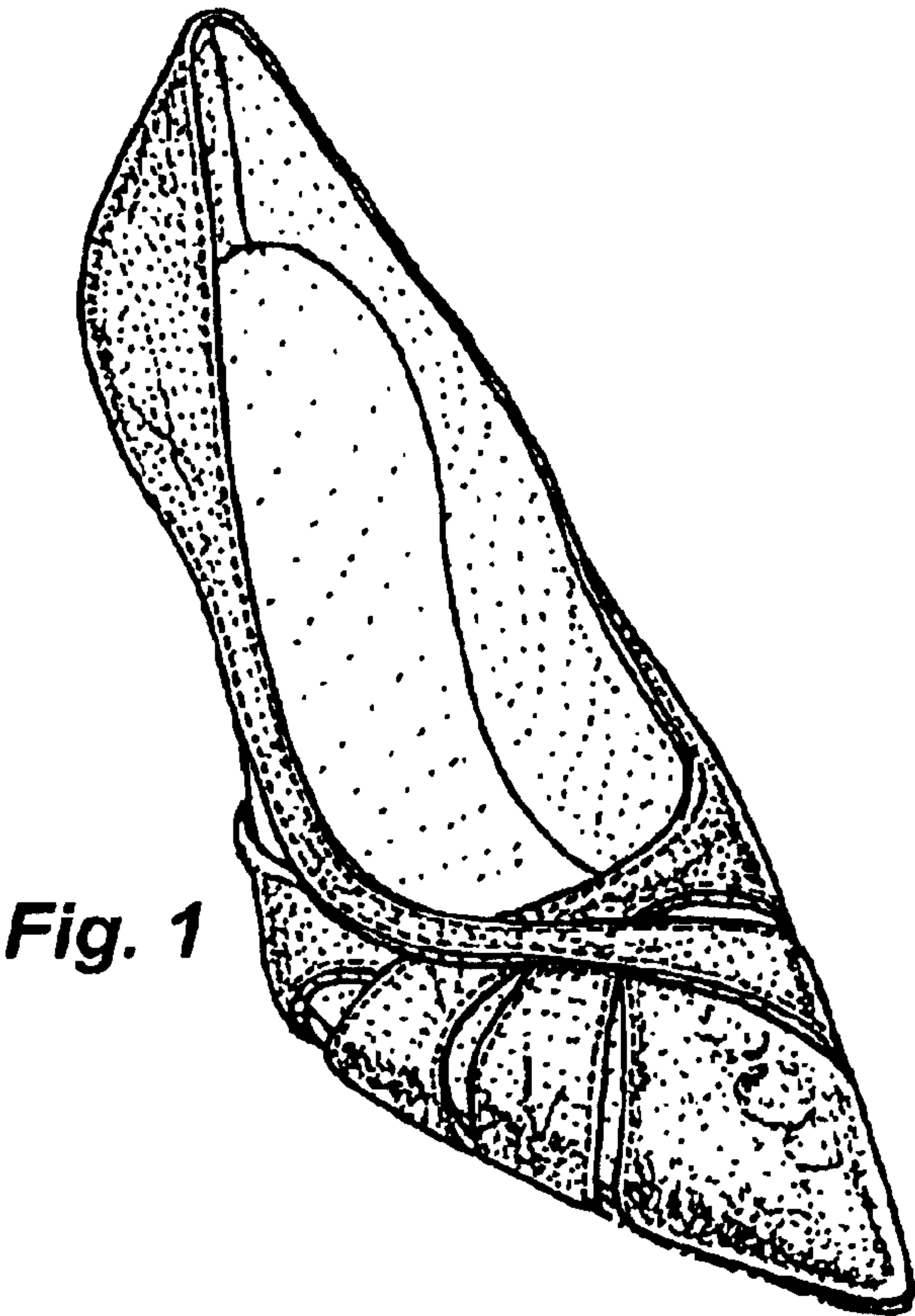

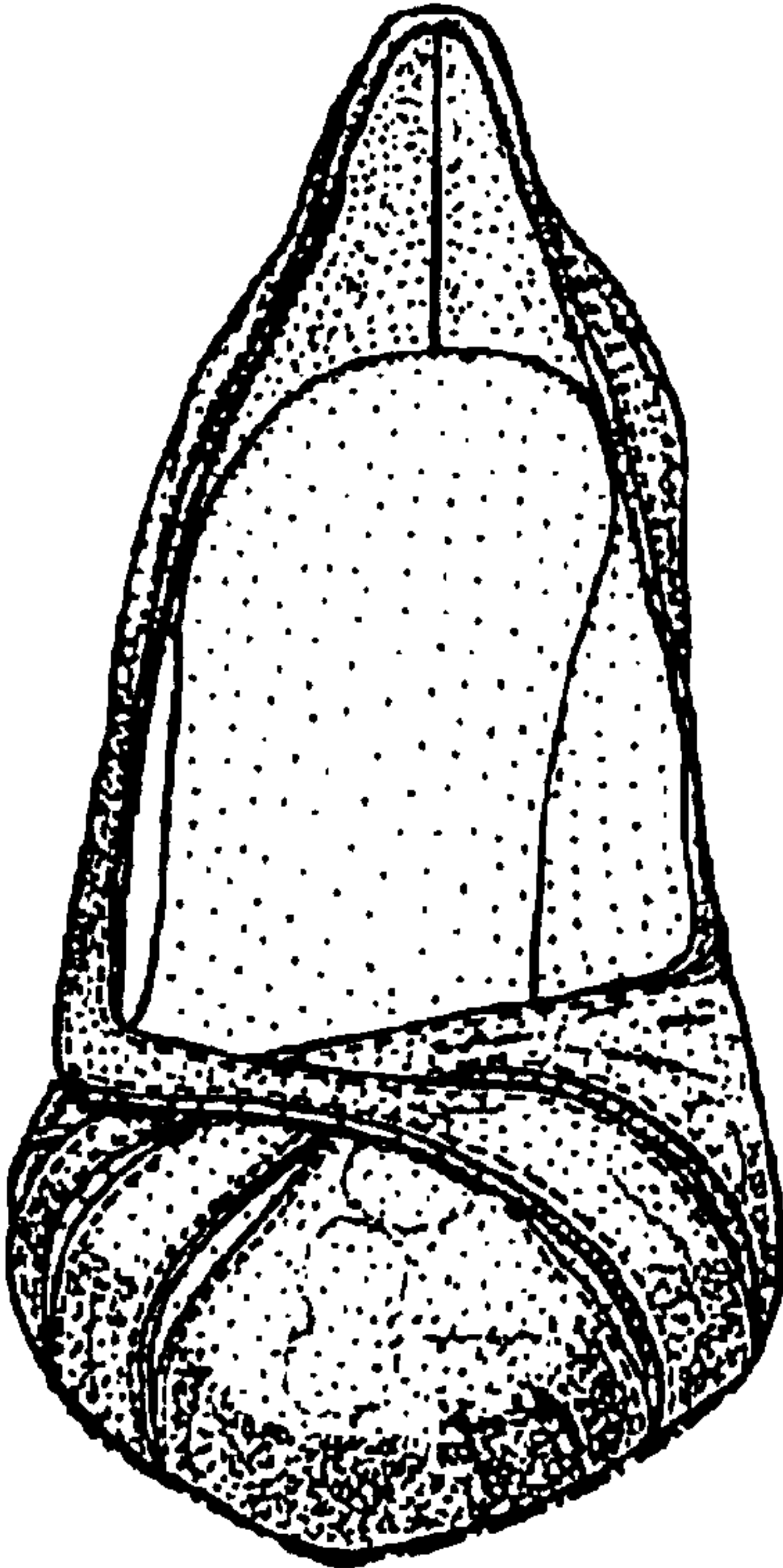

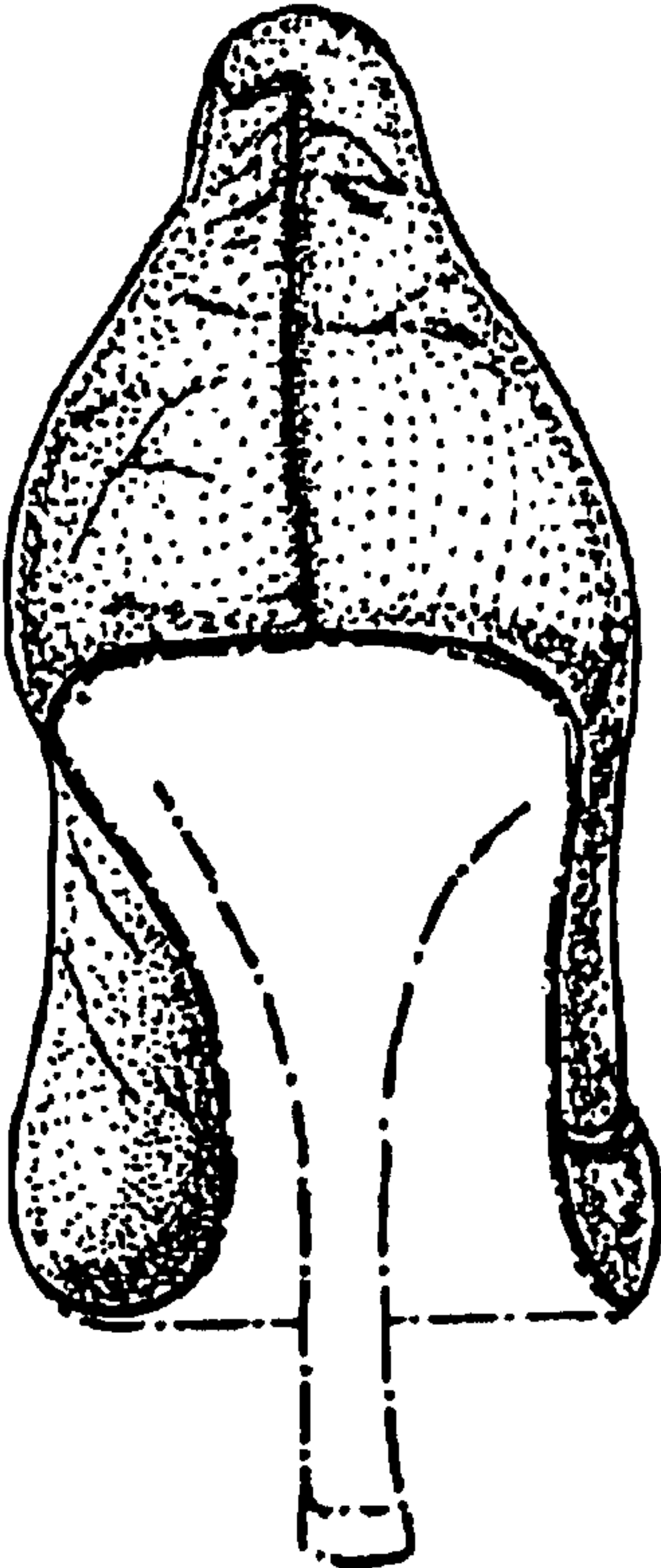

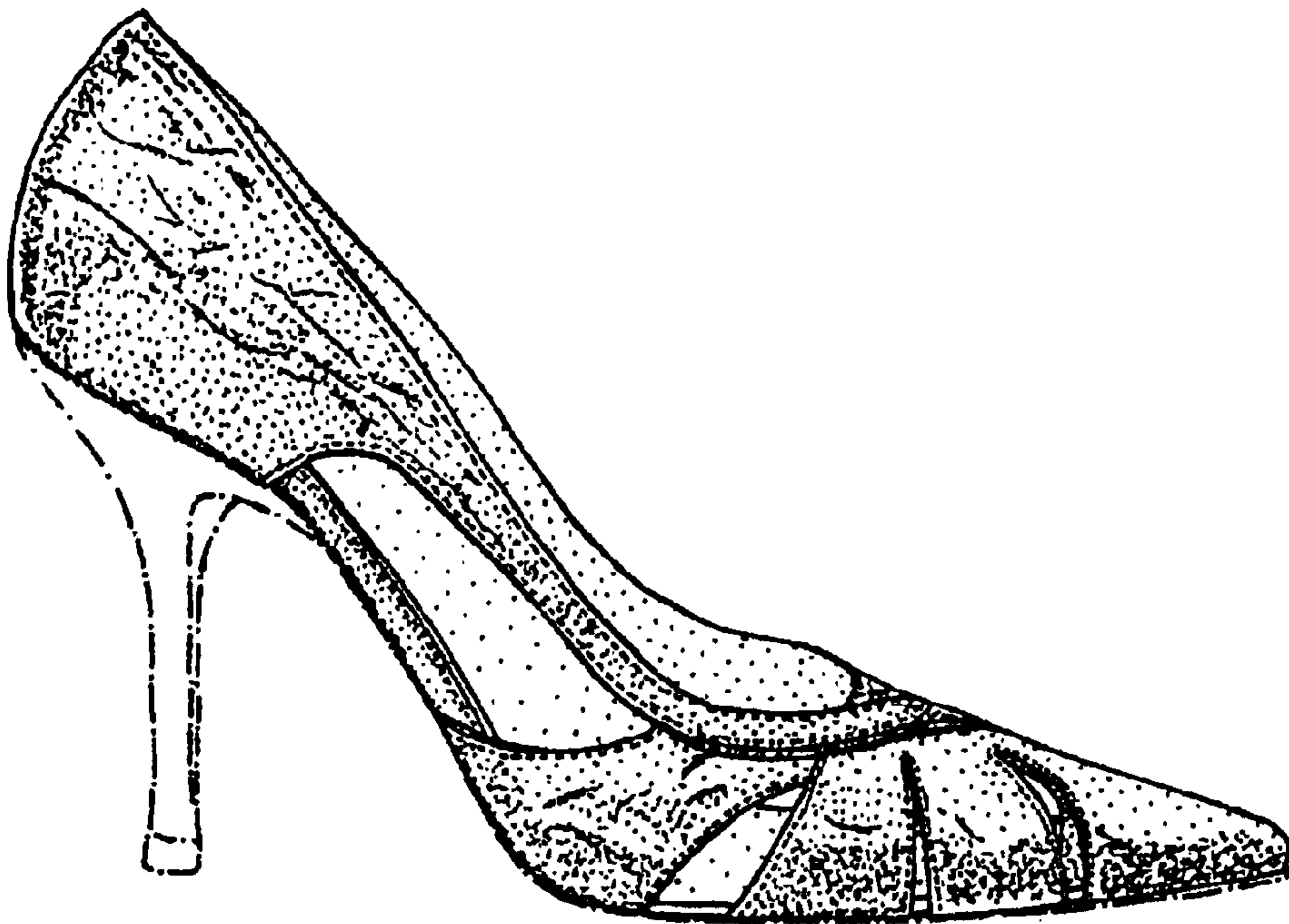

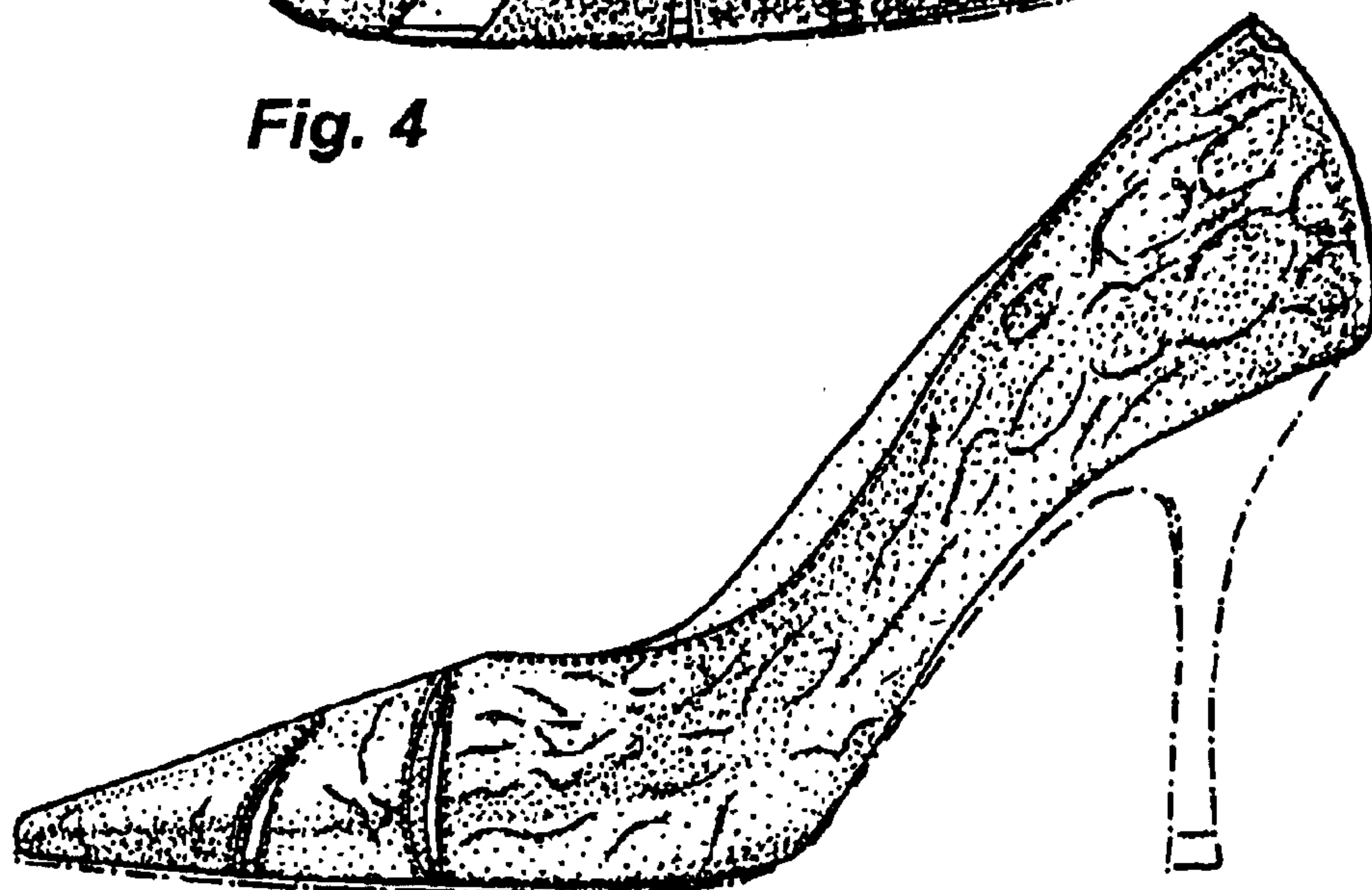

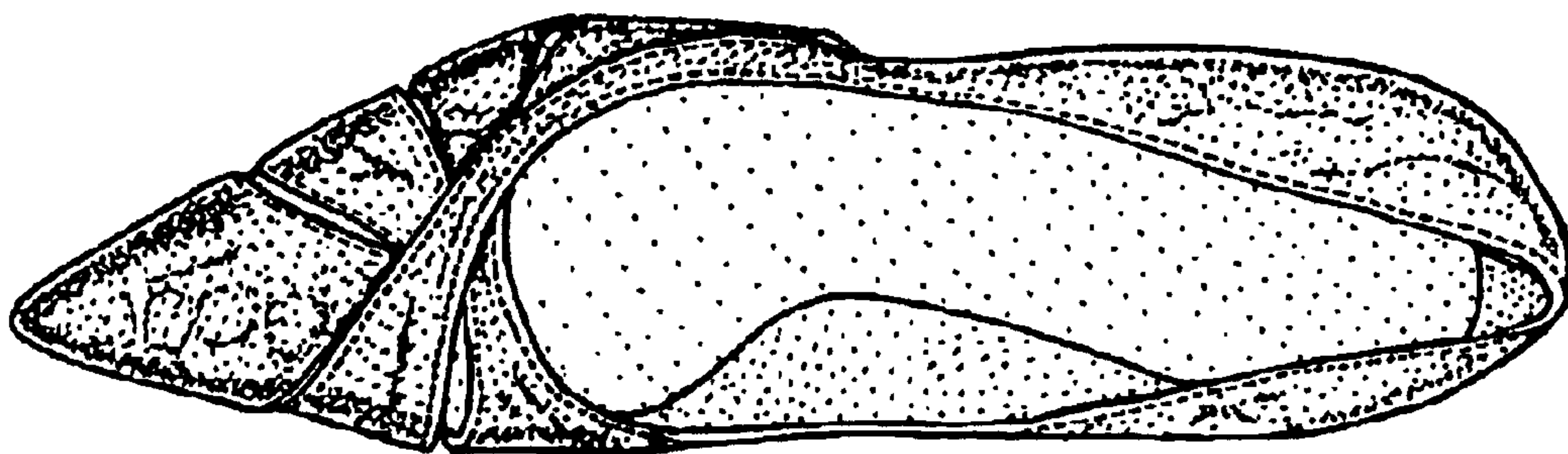

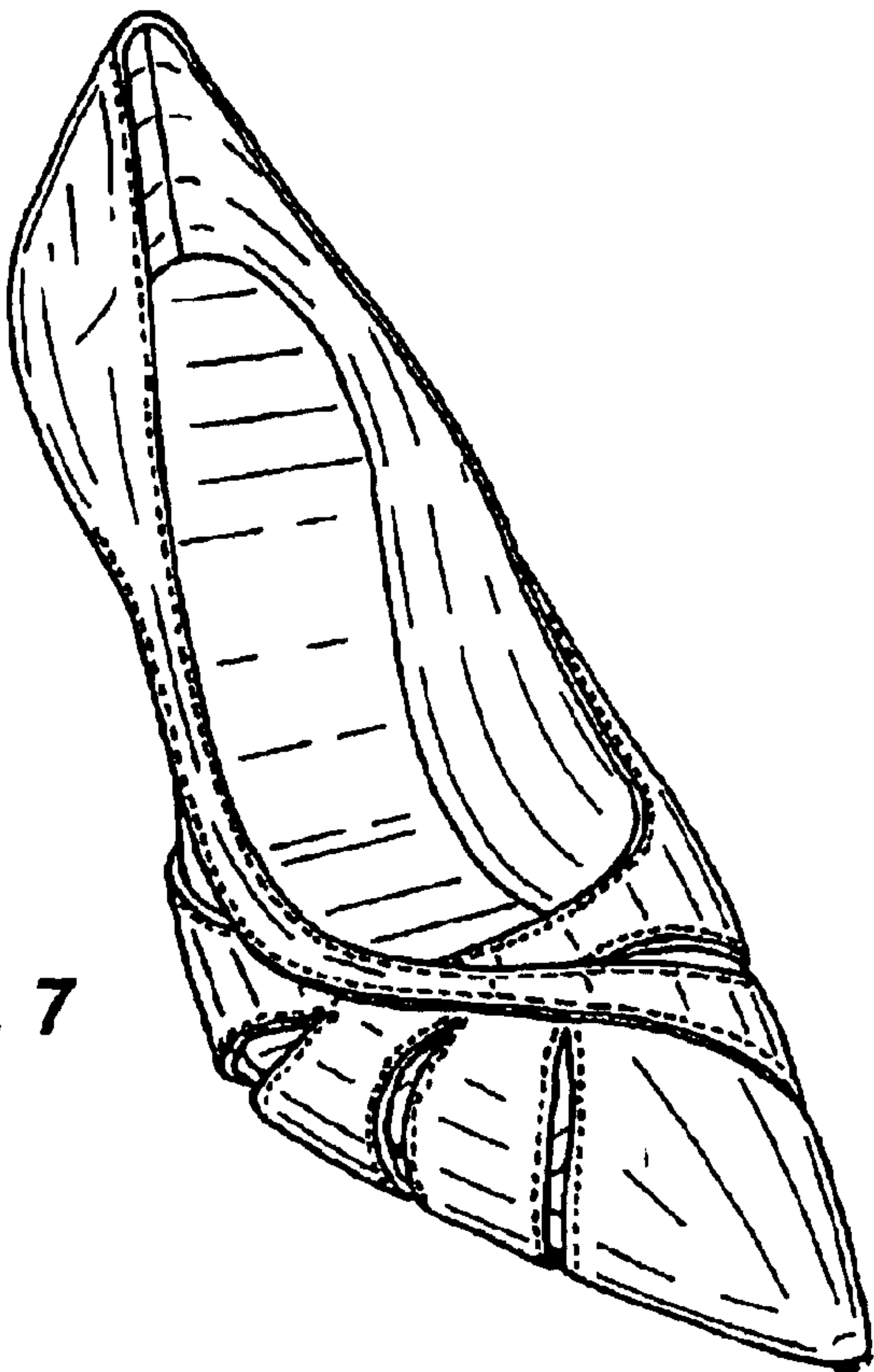

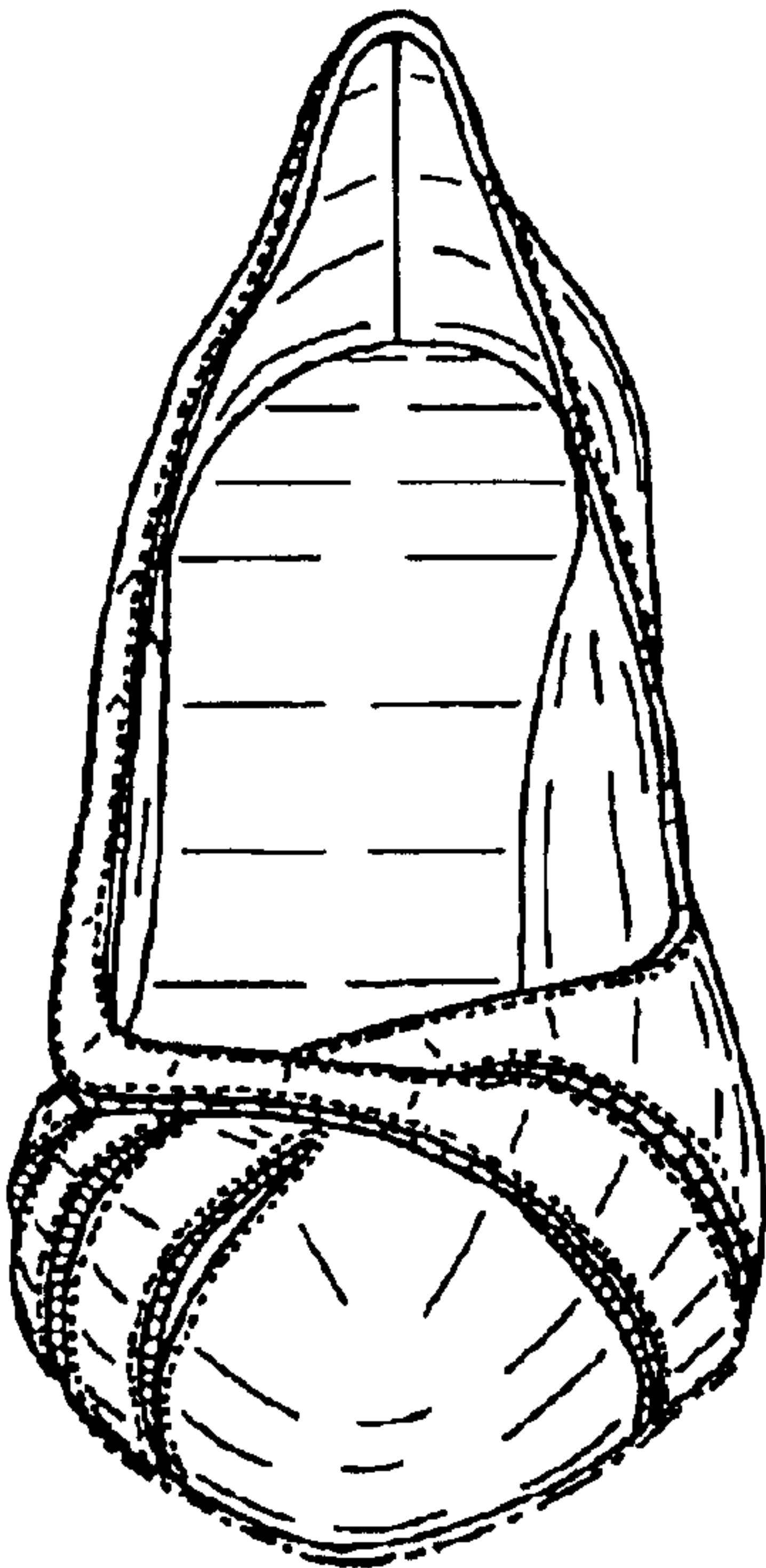
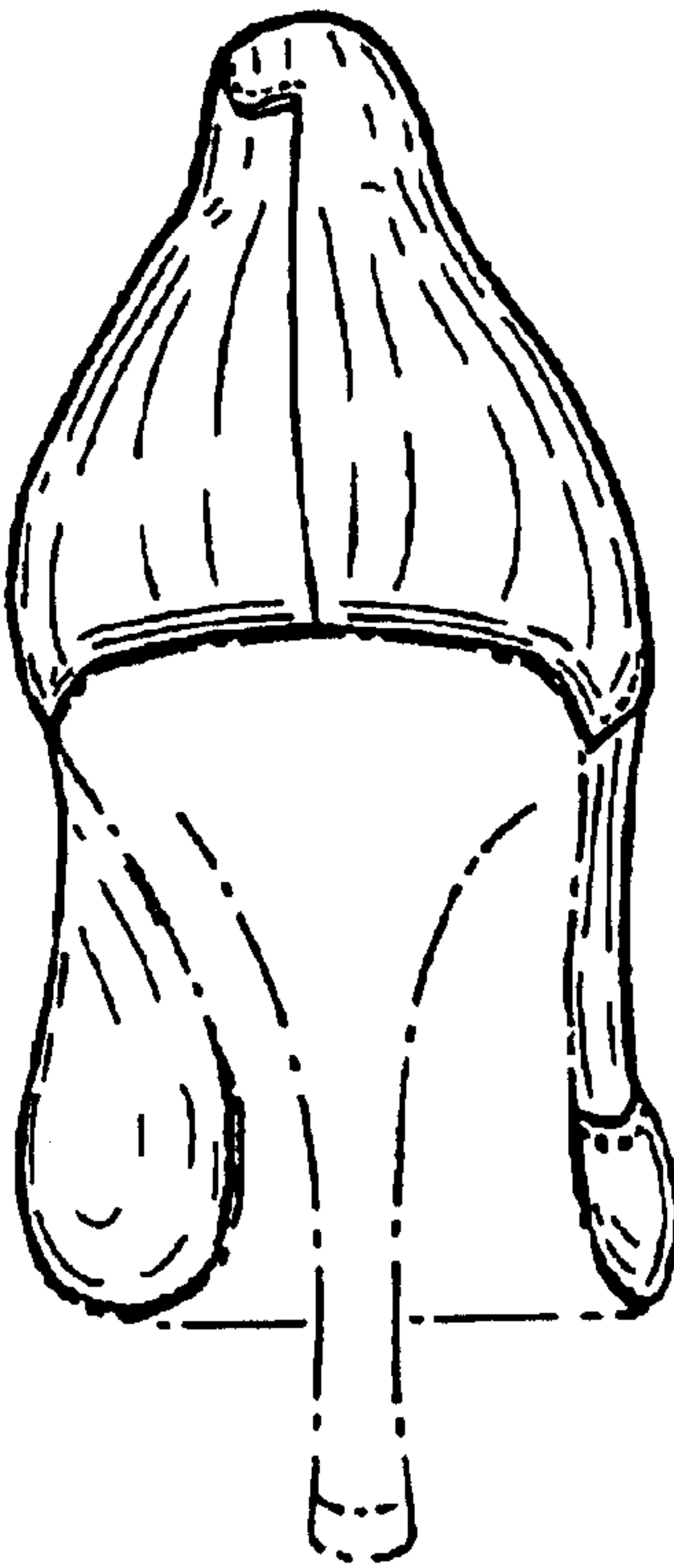

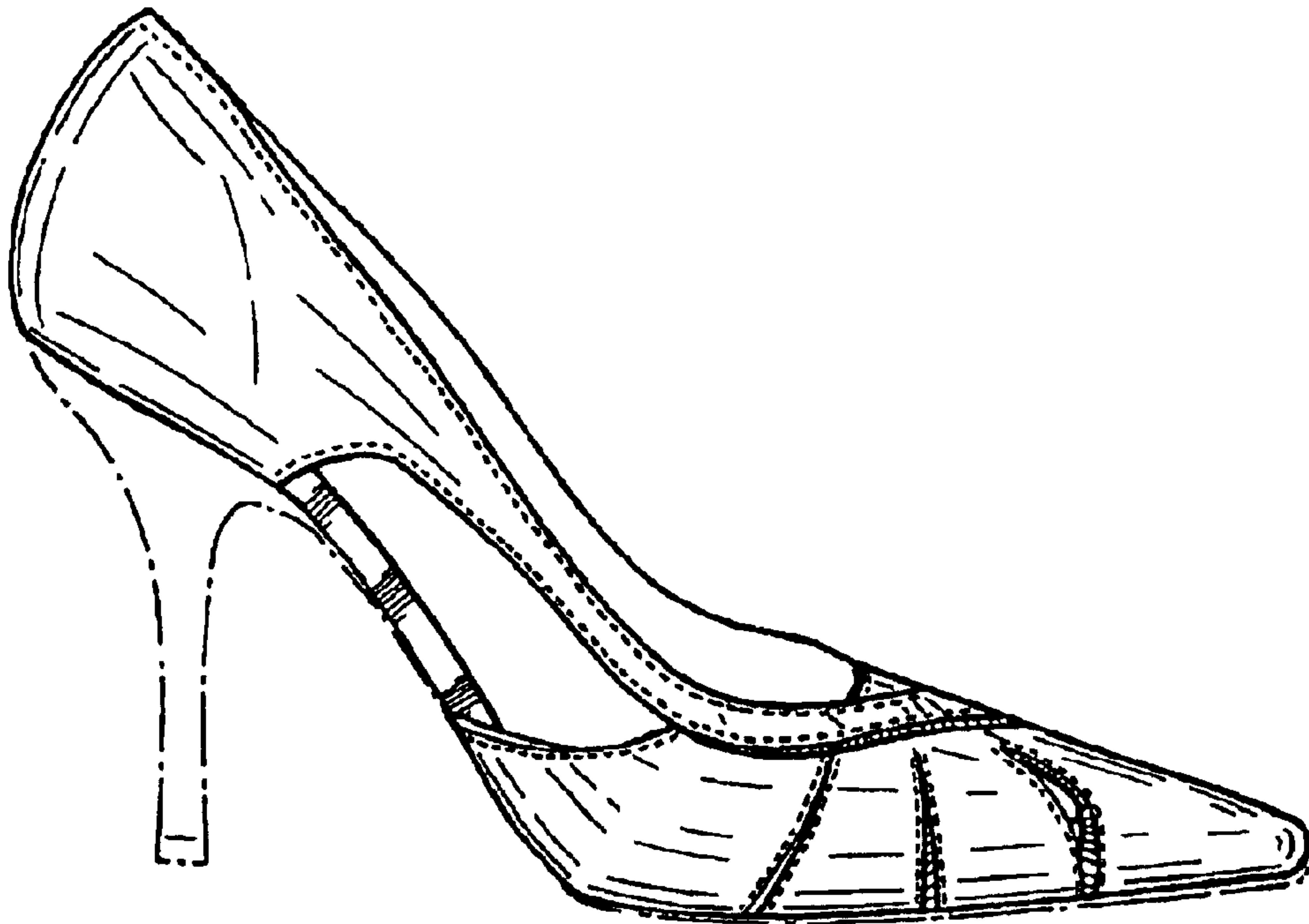

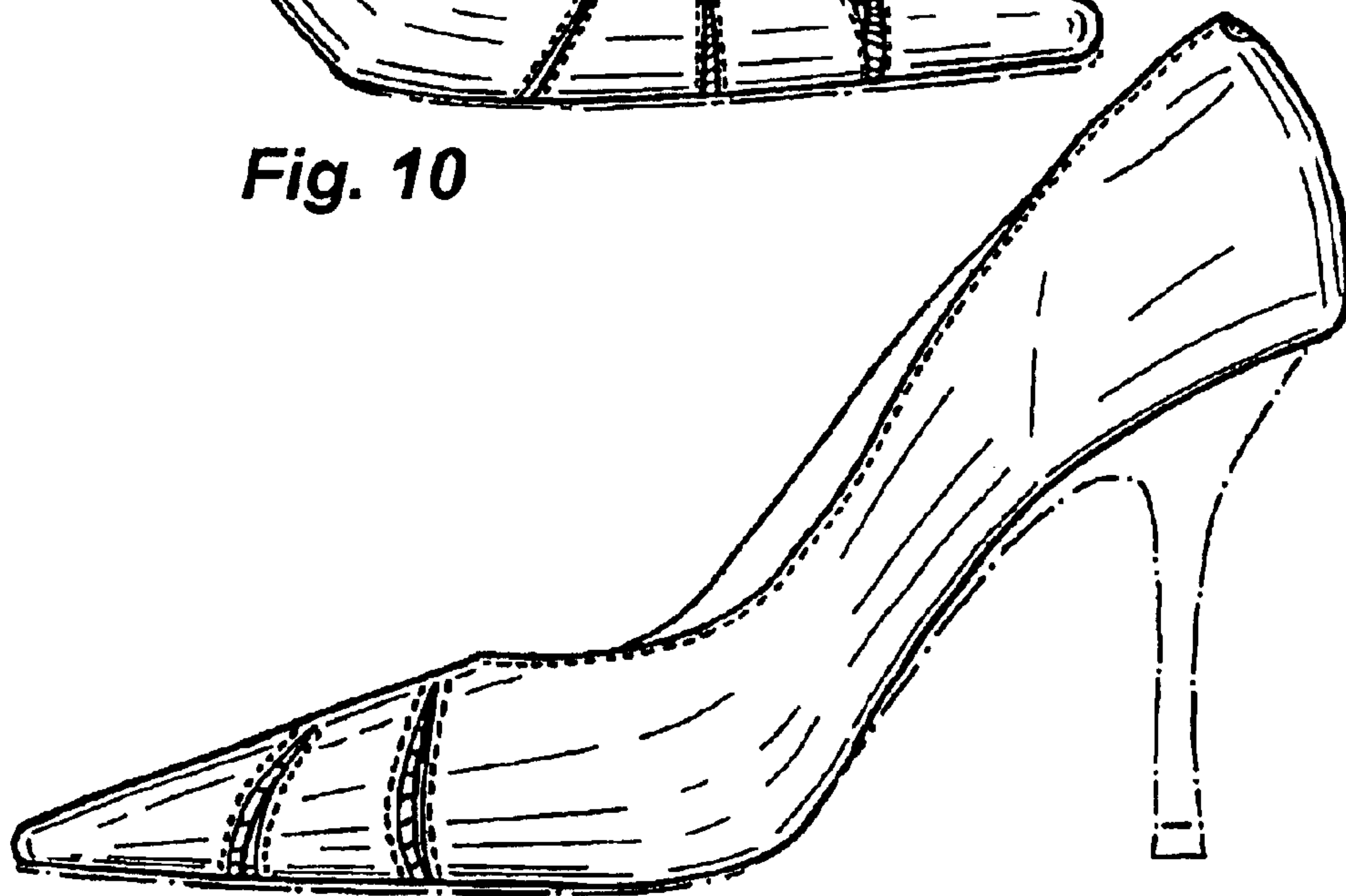

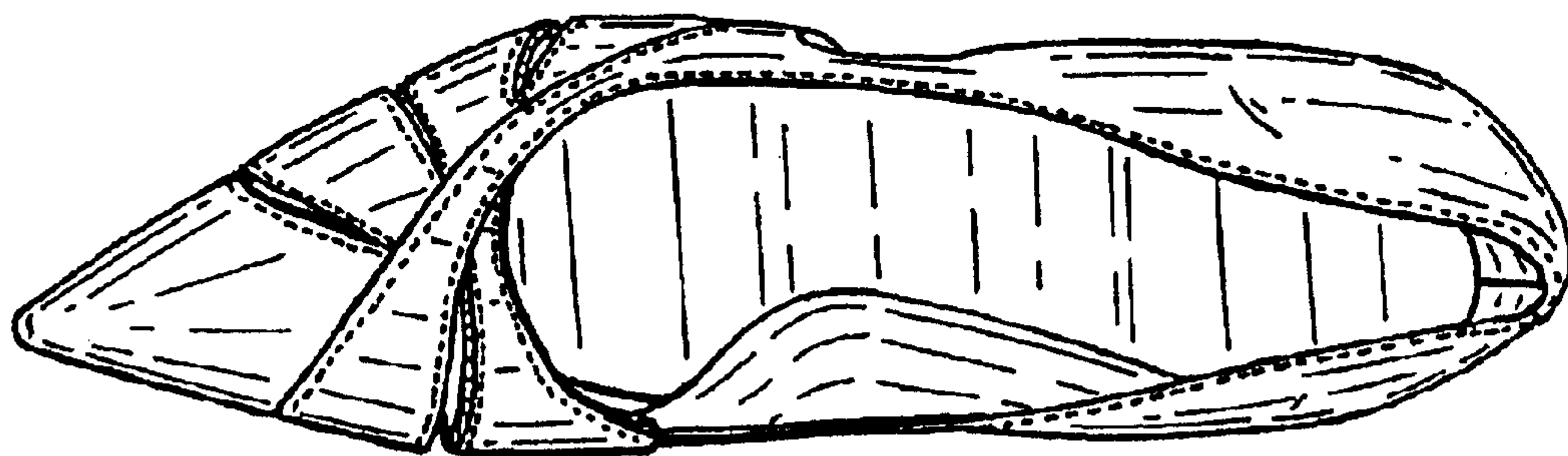
