**DESCRIPTION**

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of an oval-shaped, stackable  
marker in accordance with the first embodiment of the  
invention;

FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of a second embodiment  
of my design of FIG. 1, the rear view being identical thereto;  
FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of FIG. 2, the opposite side  
being identical thereto;

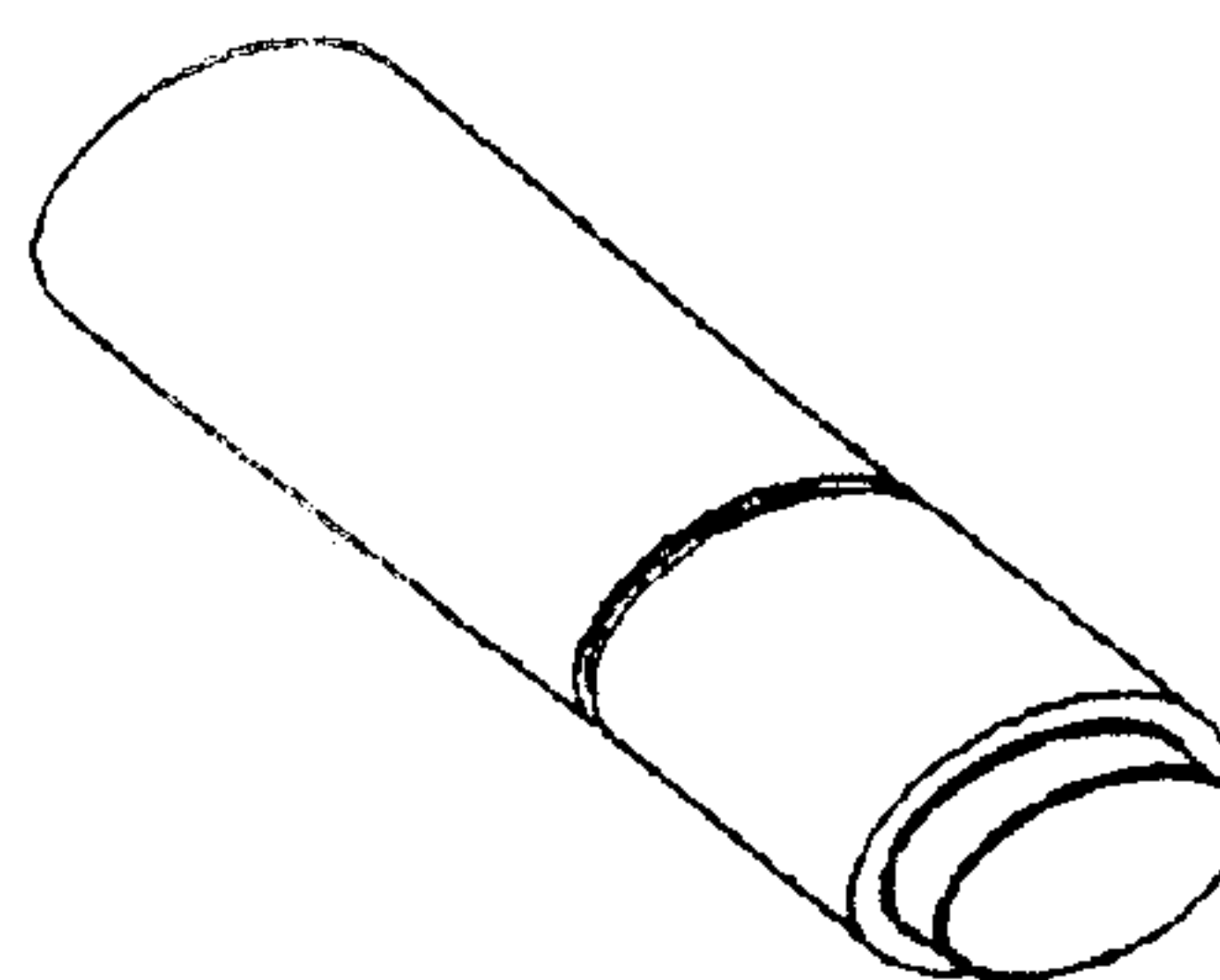

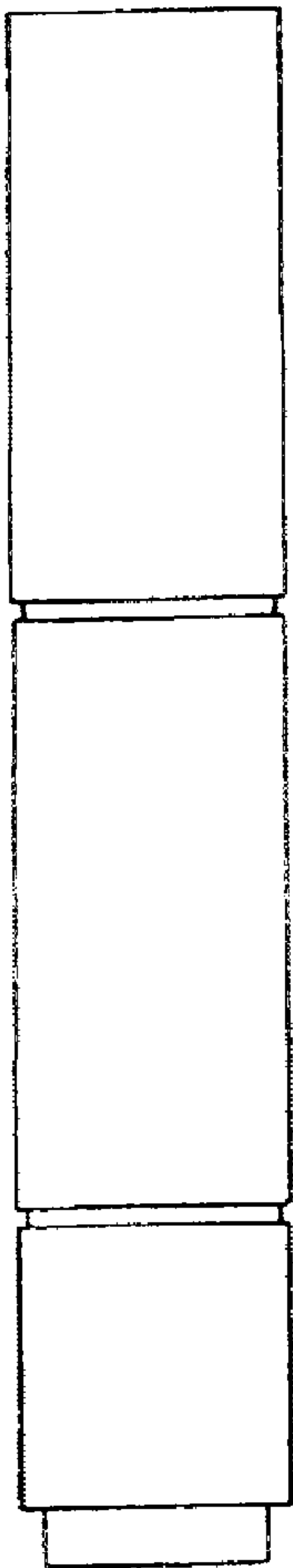

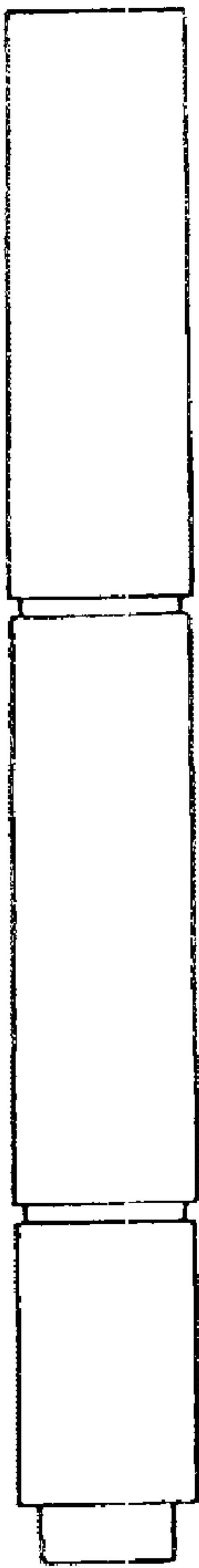

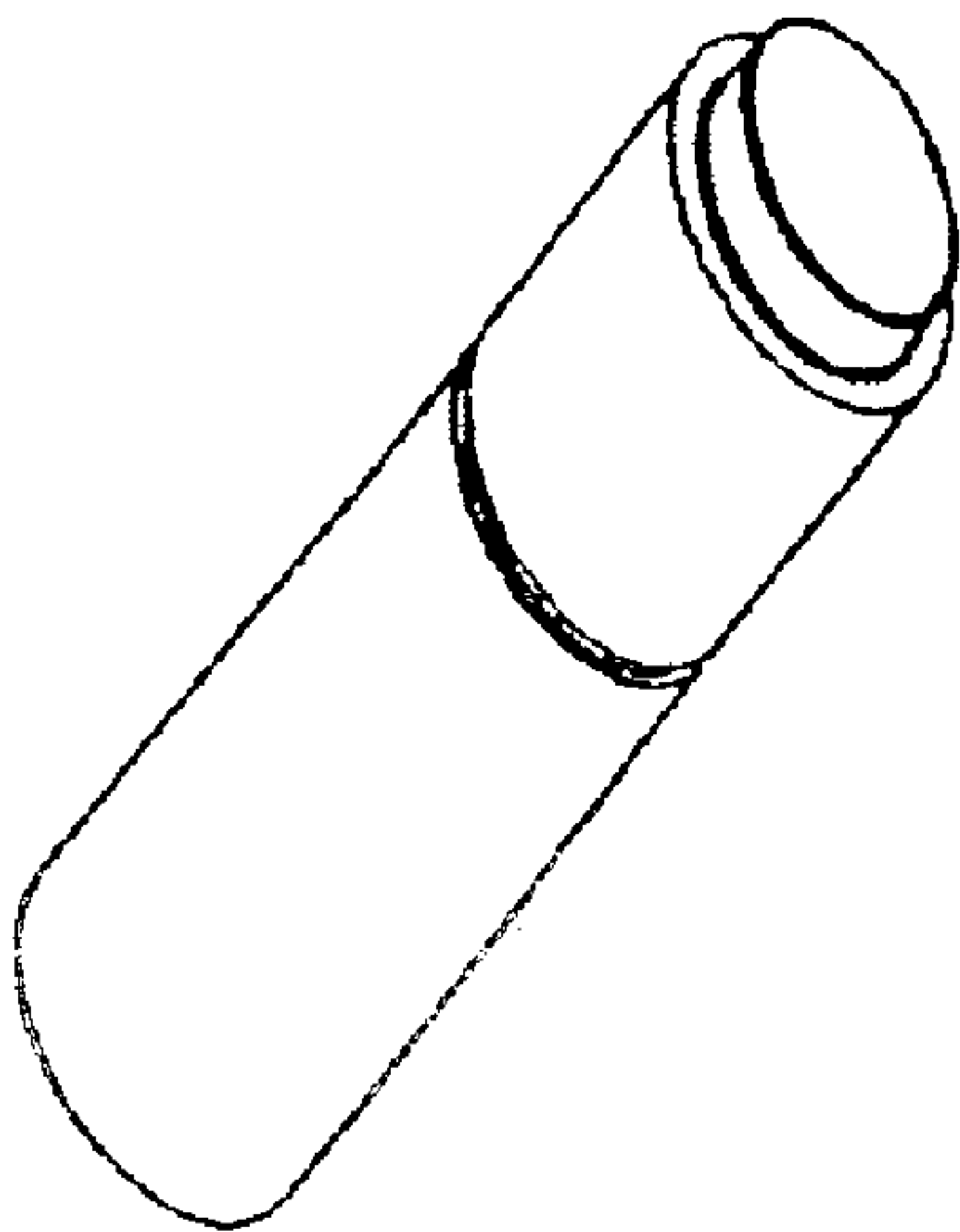
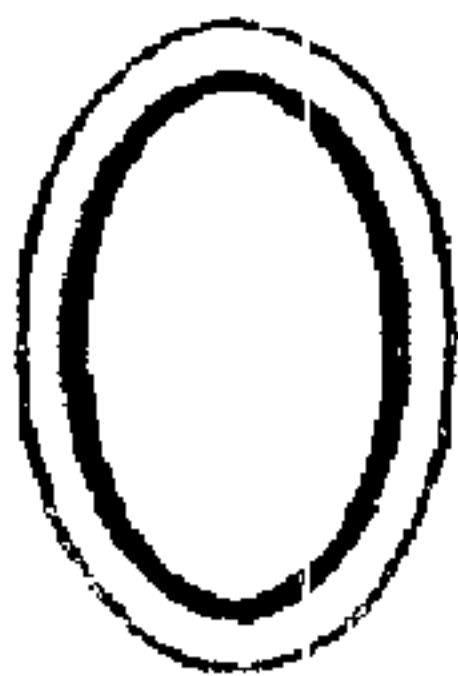

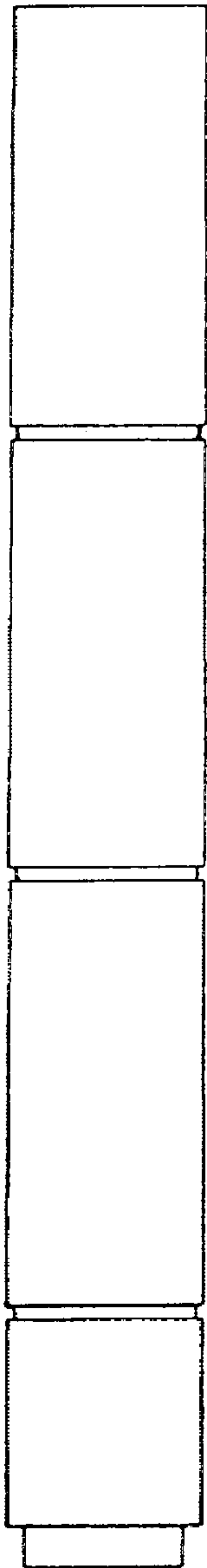

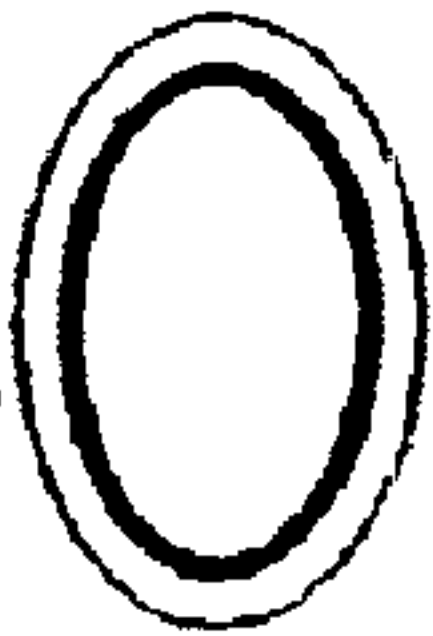

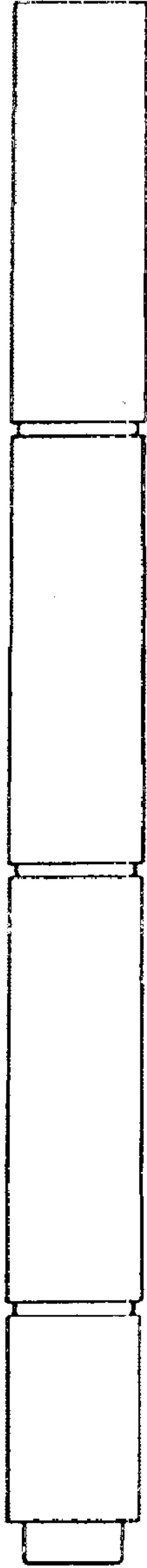

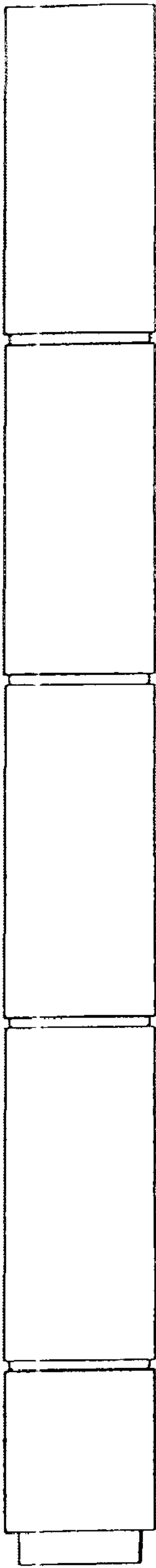

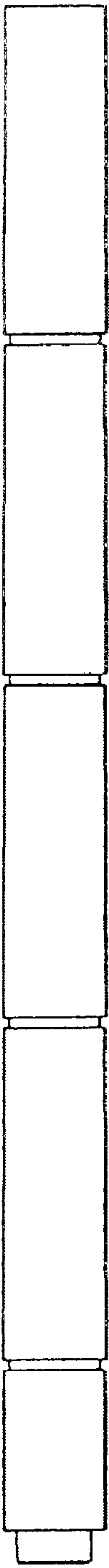

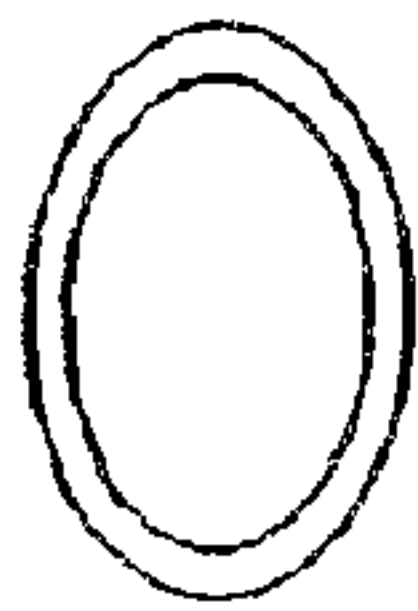
