The ornamental design for a brassiere having a permanent transparent breathable plastic back, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of my present invention; a brassiere having a permanent transparent breathable plastic back;

FIG. 9 is a perspective alternative of my present invention; two sets of eyelets for the front closure thereof;

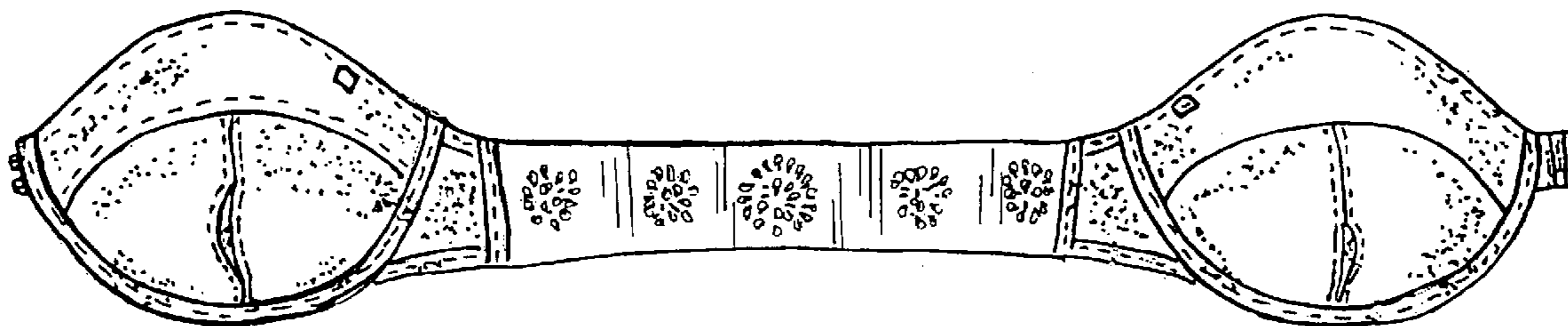
FIG. 10 is a view of the permanent transparent breathable plastic back of my present invention thereof;

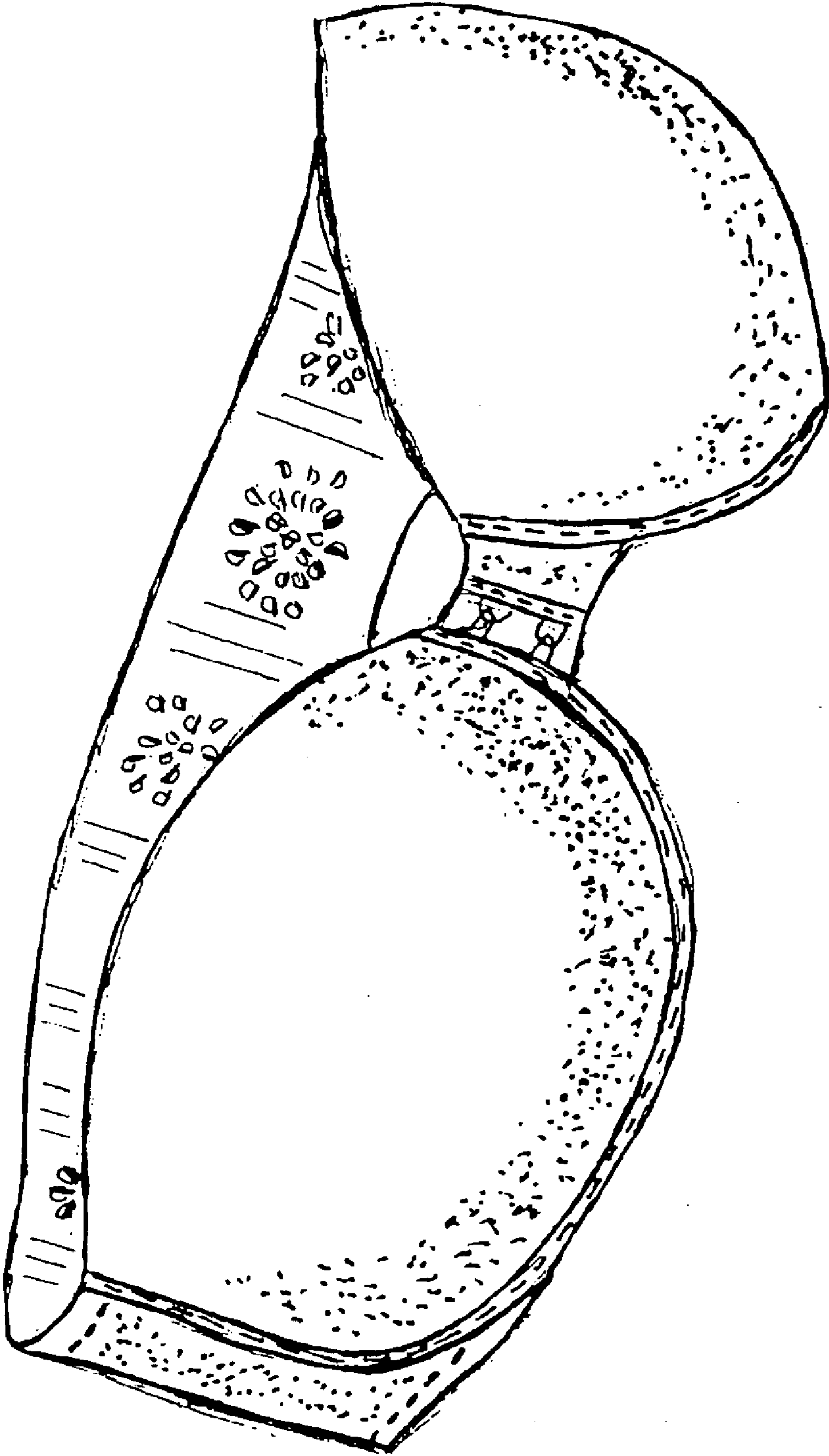

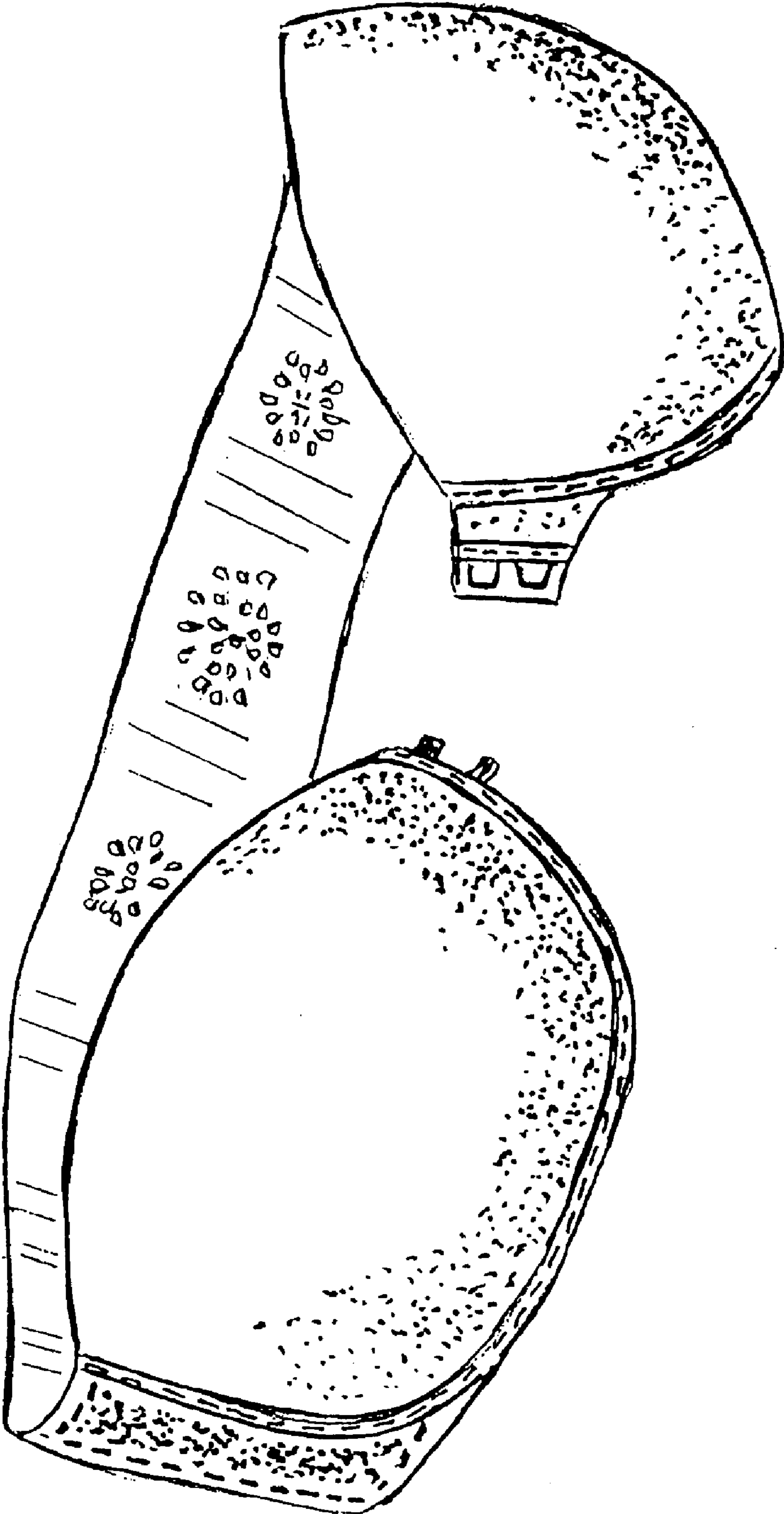

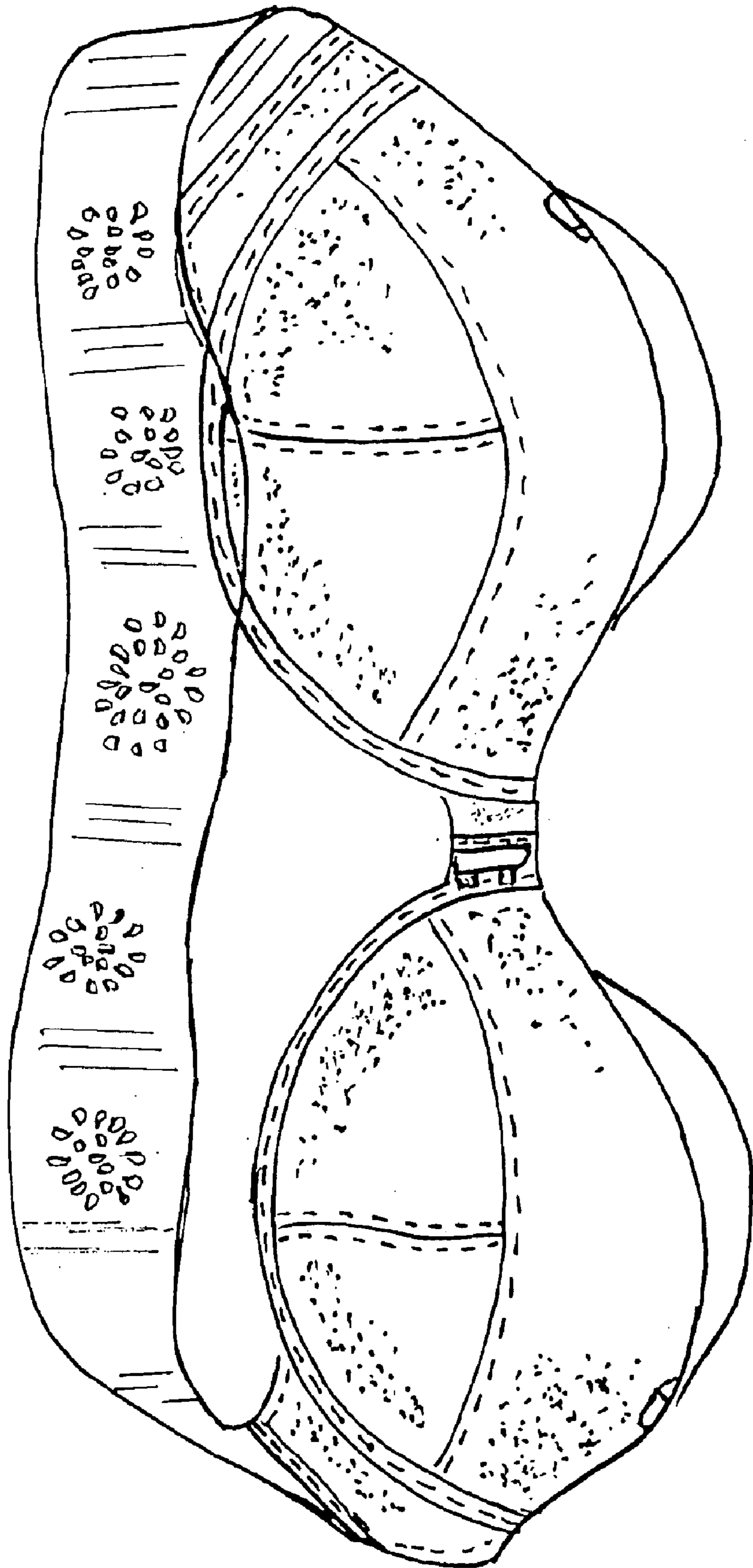

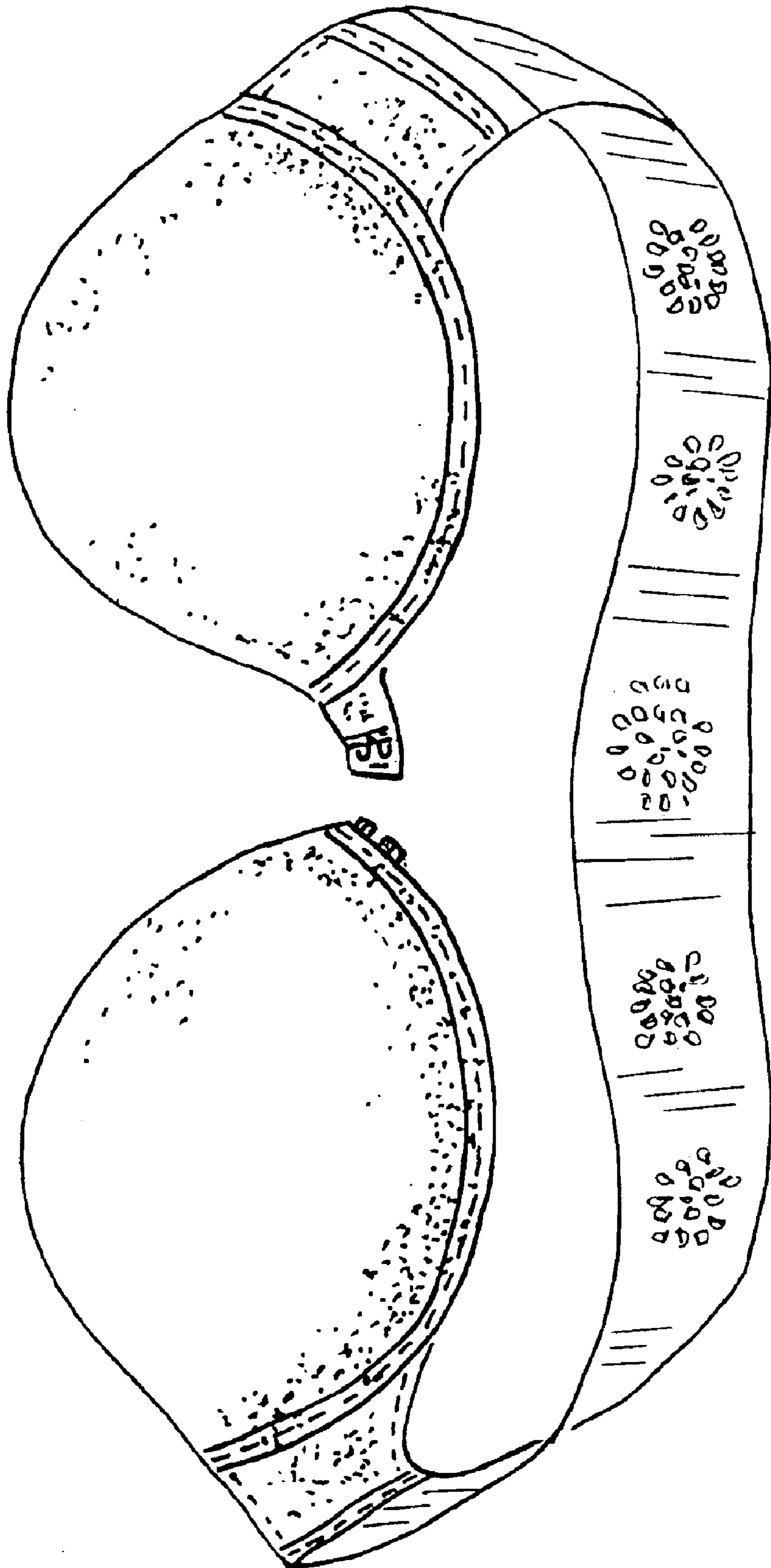

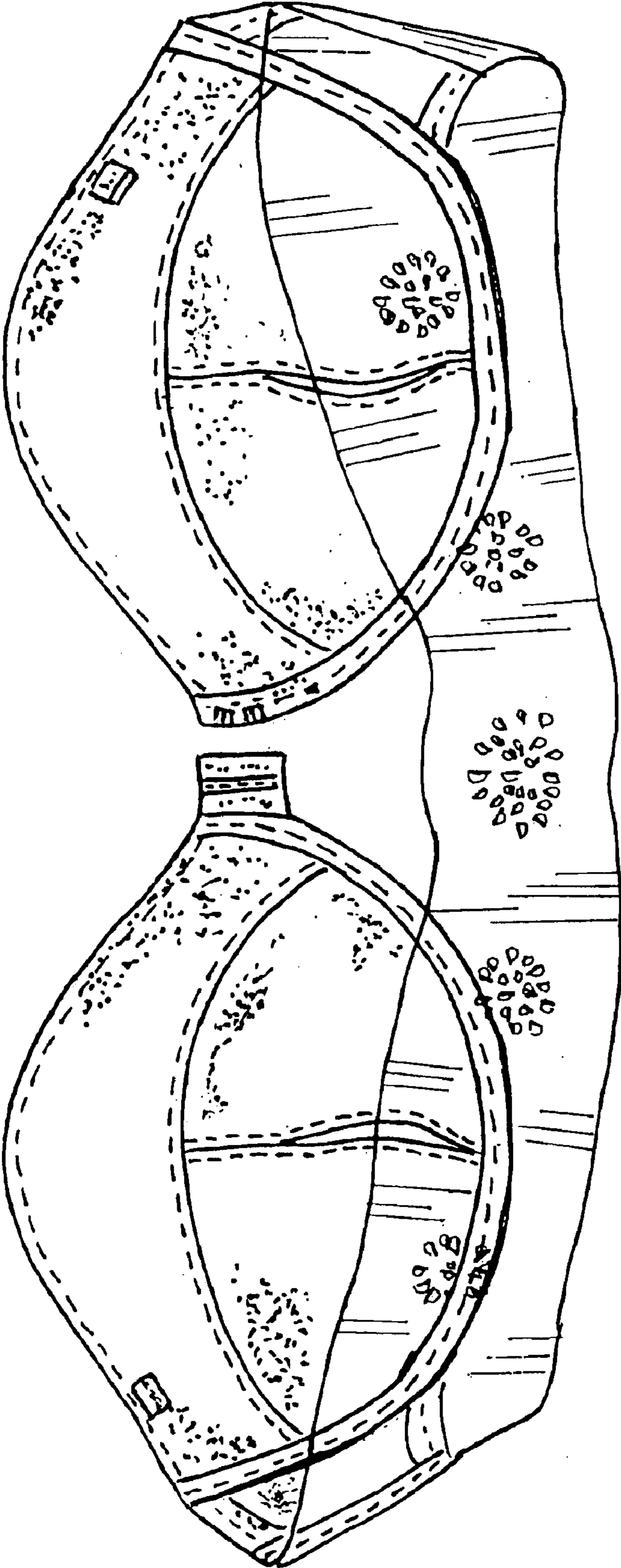

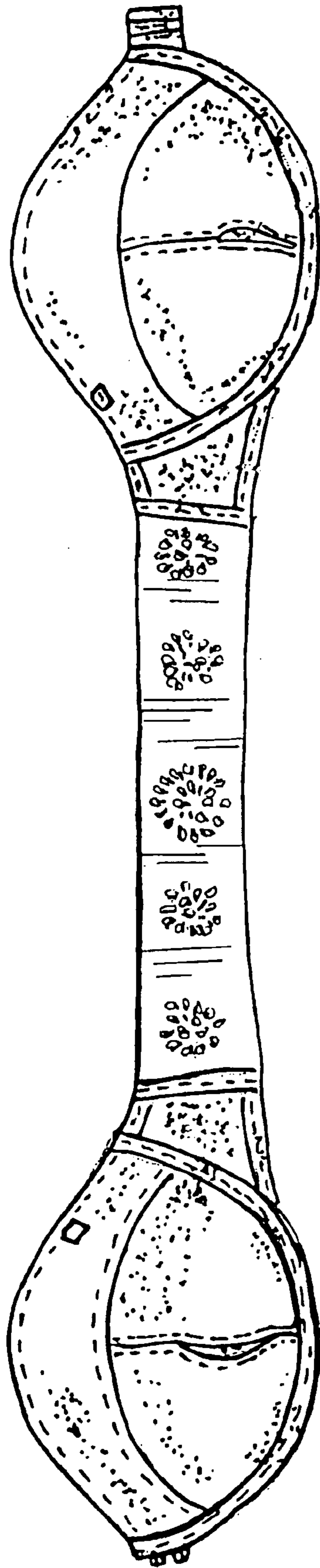

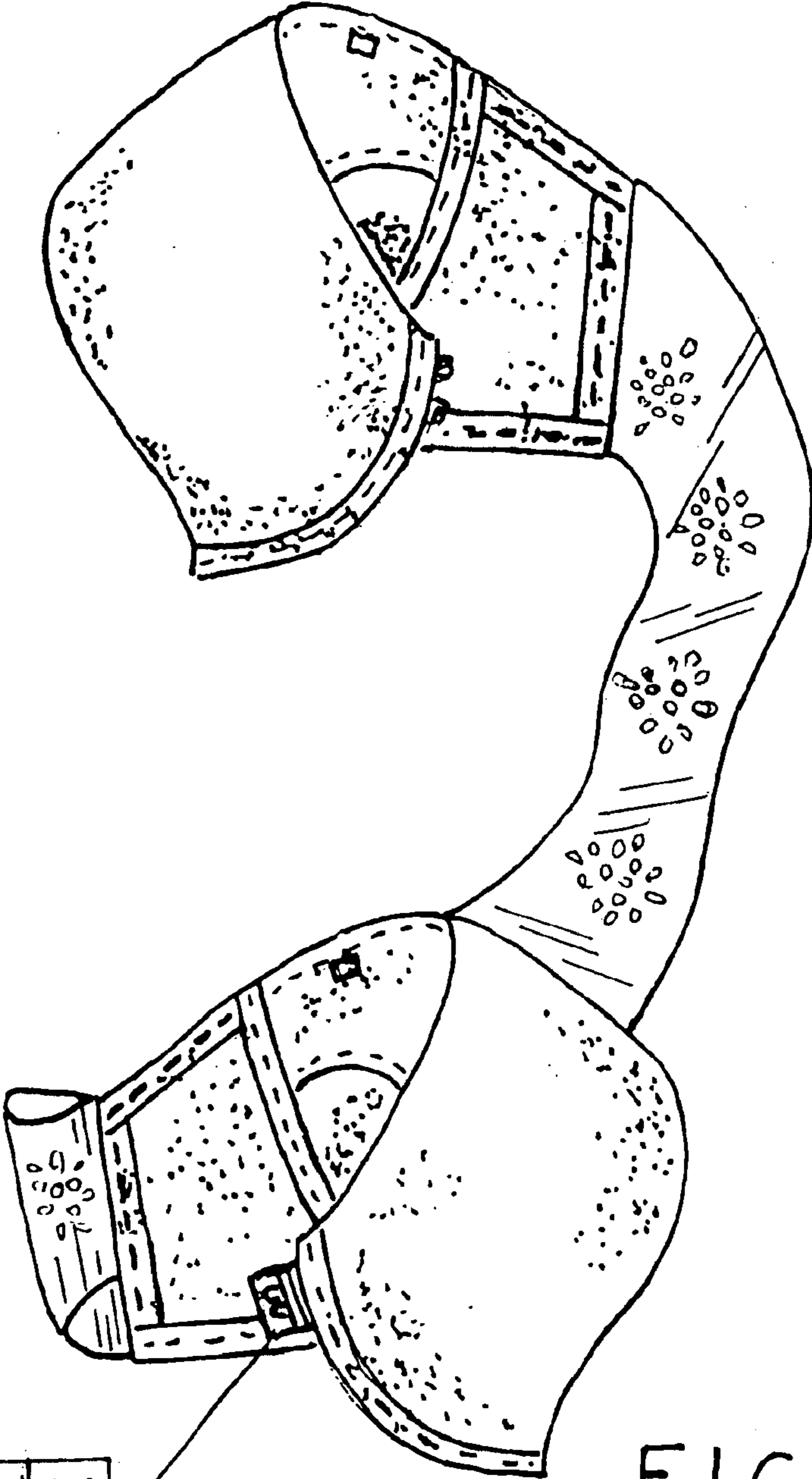

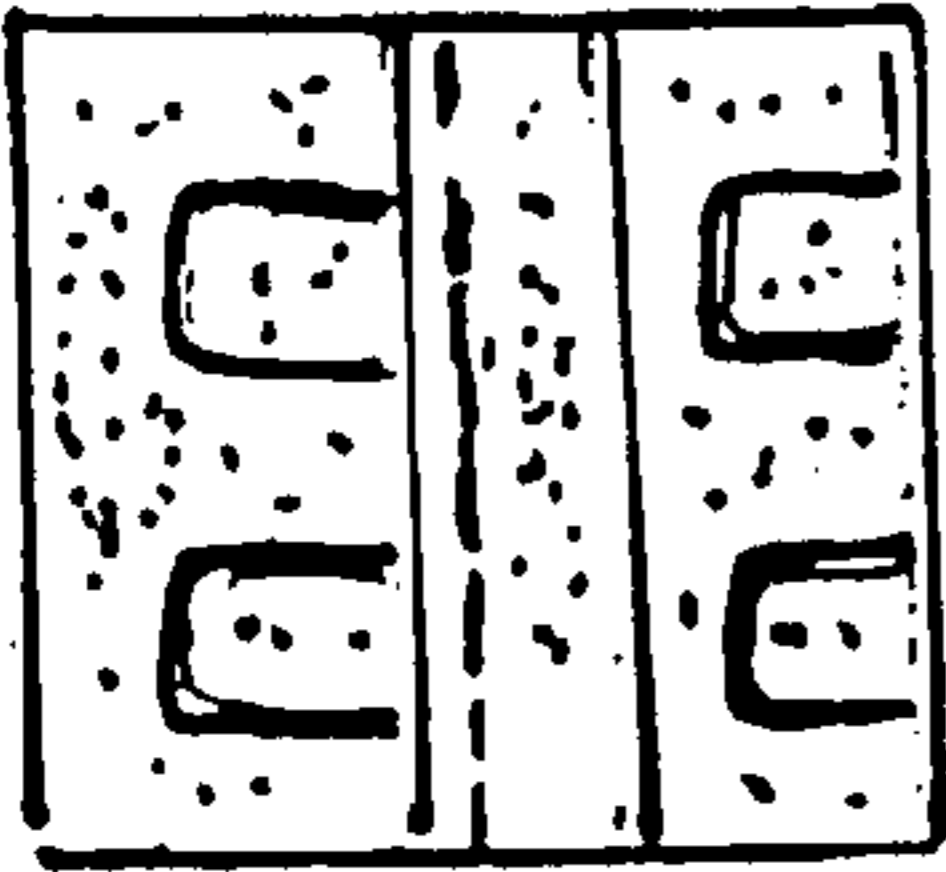

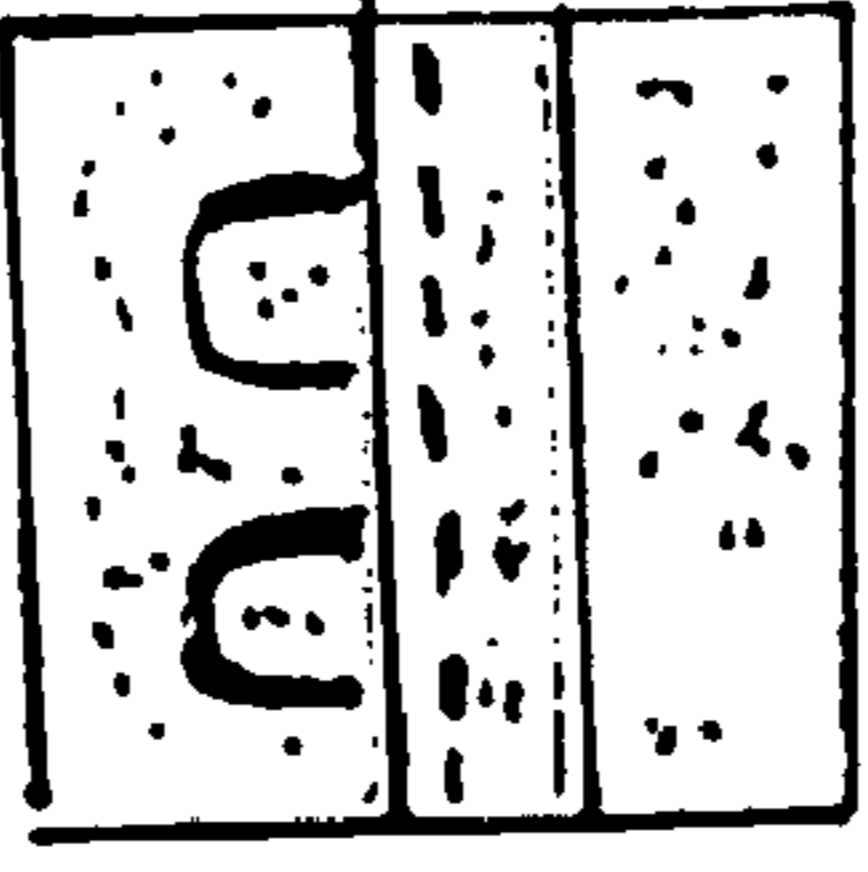

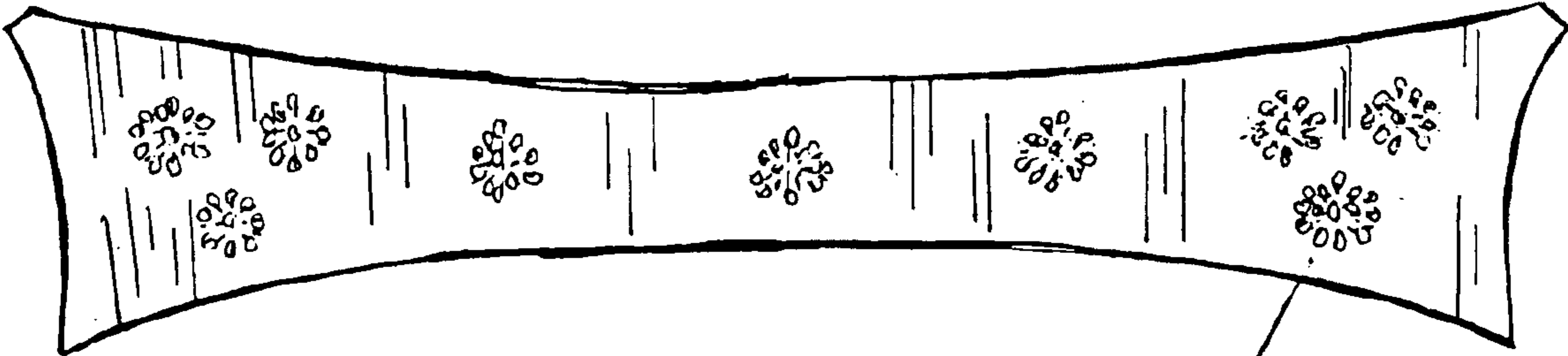

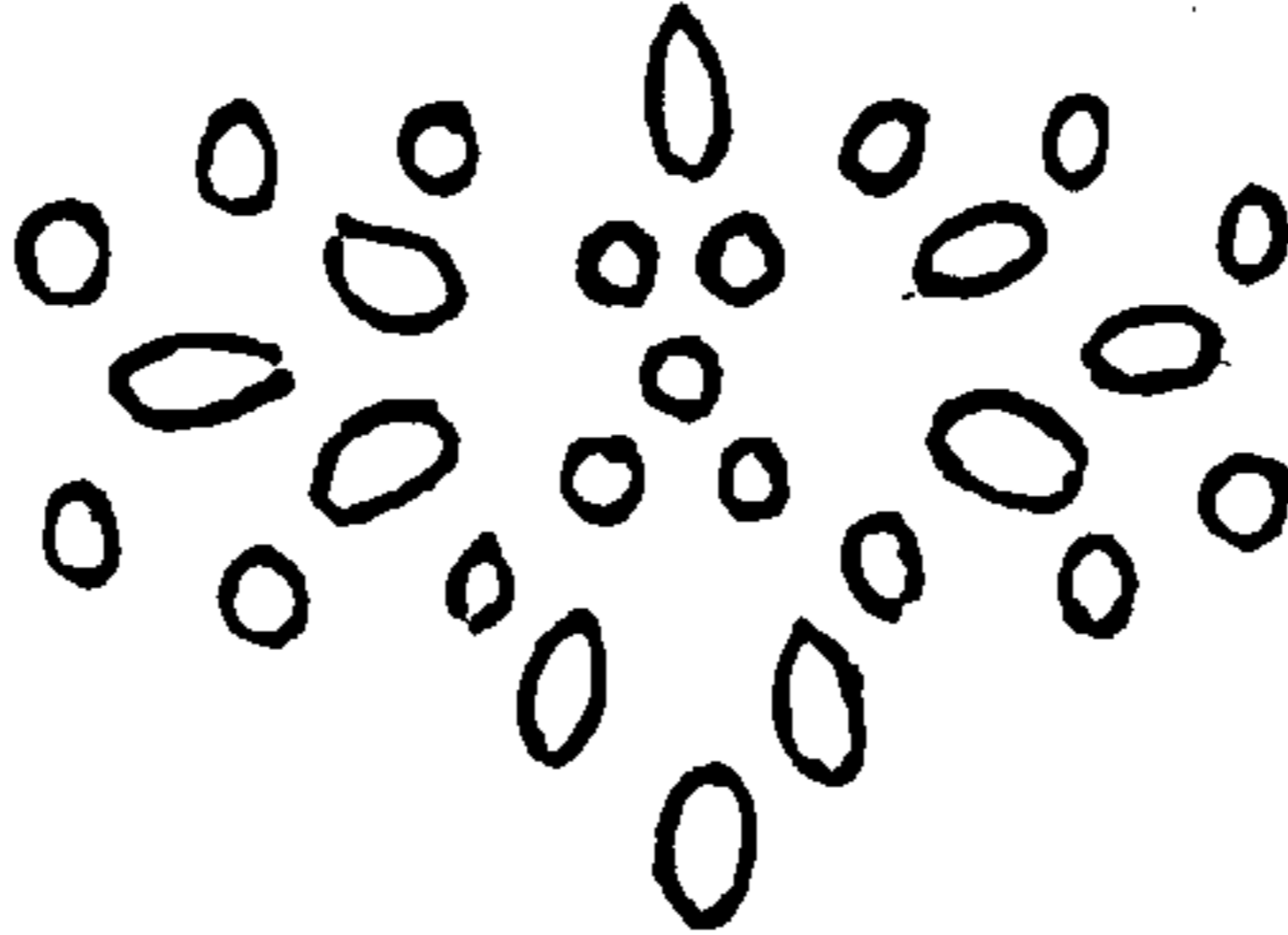

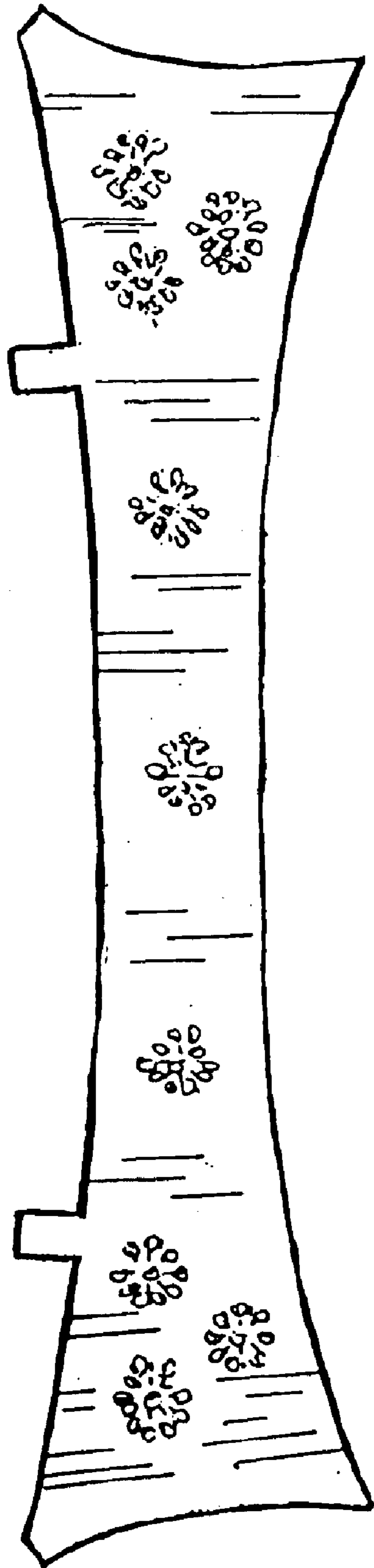

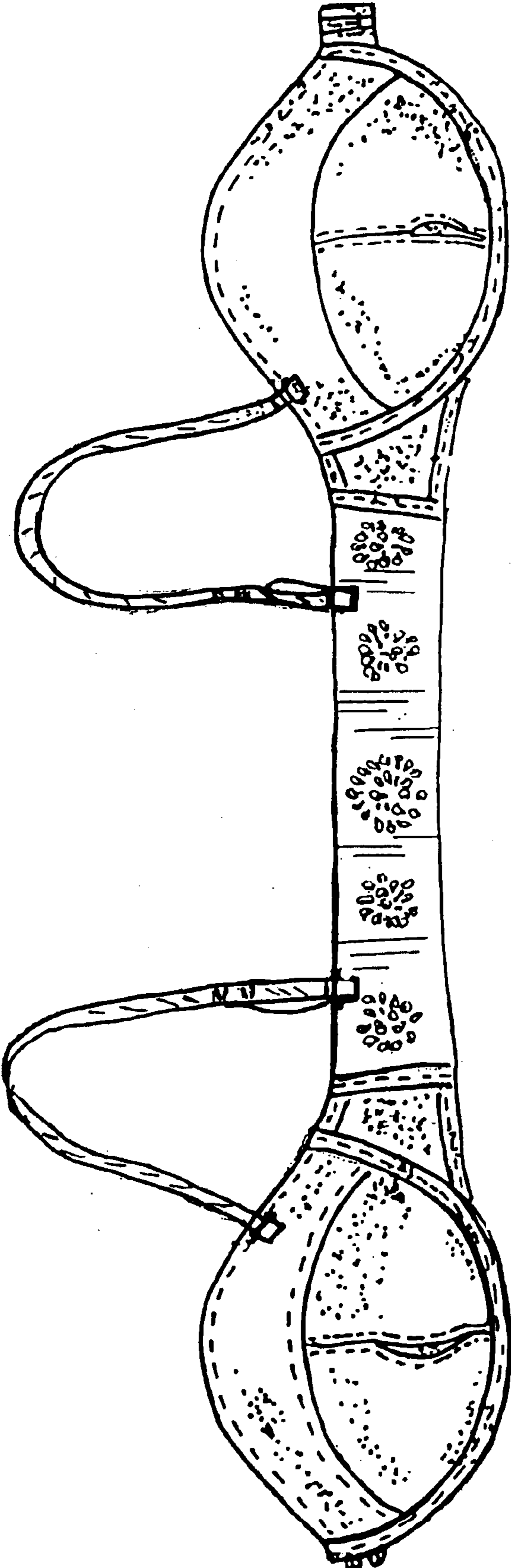
