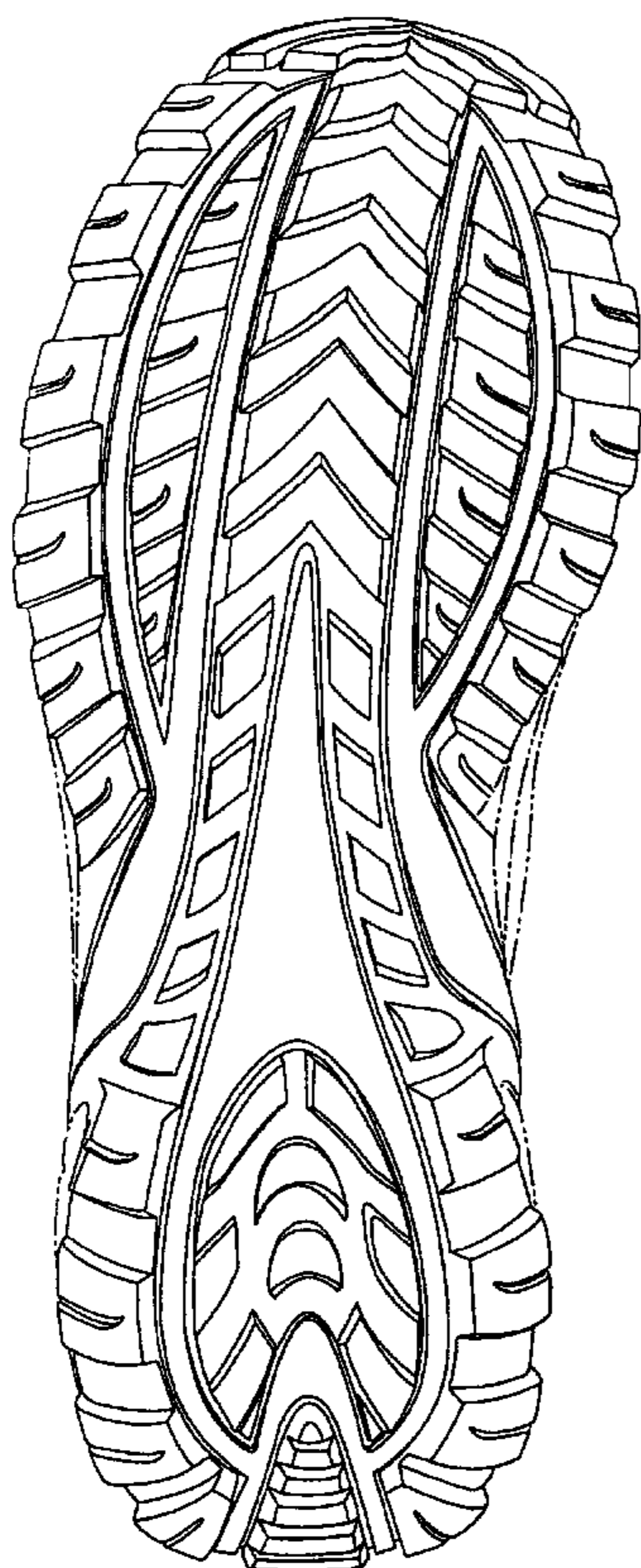

FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof.

FIGS. 1–6 show an upper and portions of the sole in broken lines. The upper and portions of the sole in broken lines are shown for environmental purposes and do not form any part of the claimed design.

The broken lines immediately adjacent to the solid lines throughout the views, define the boundary of the design. The broken lines themselves form no part of the claim.

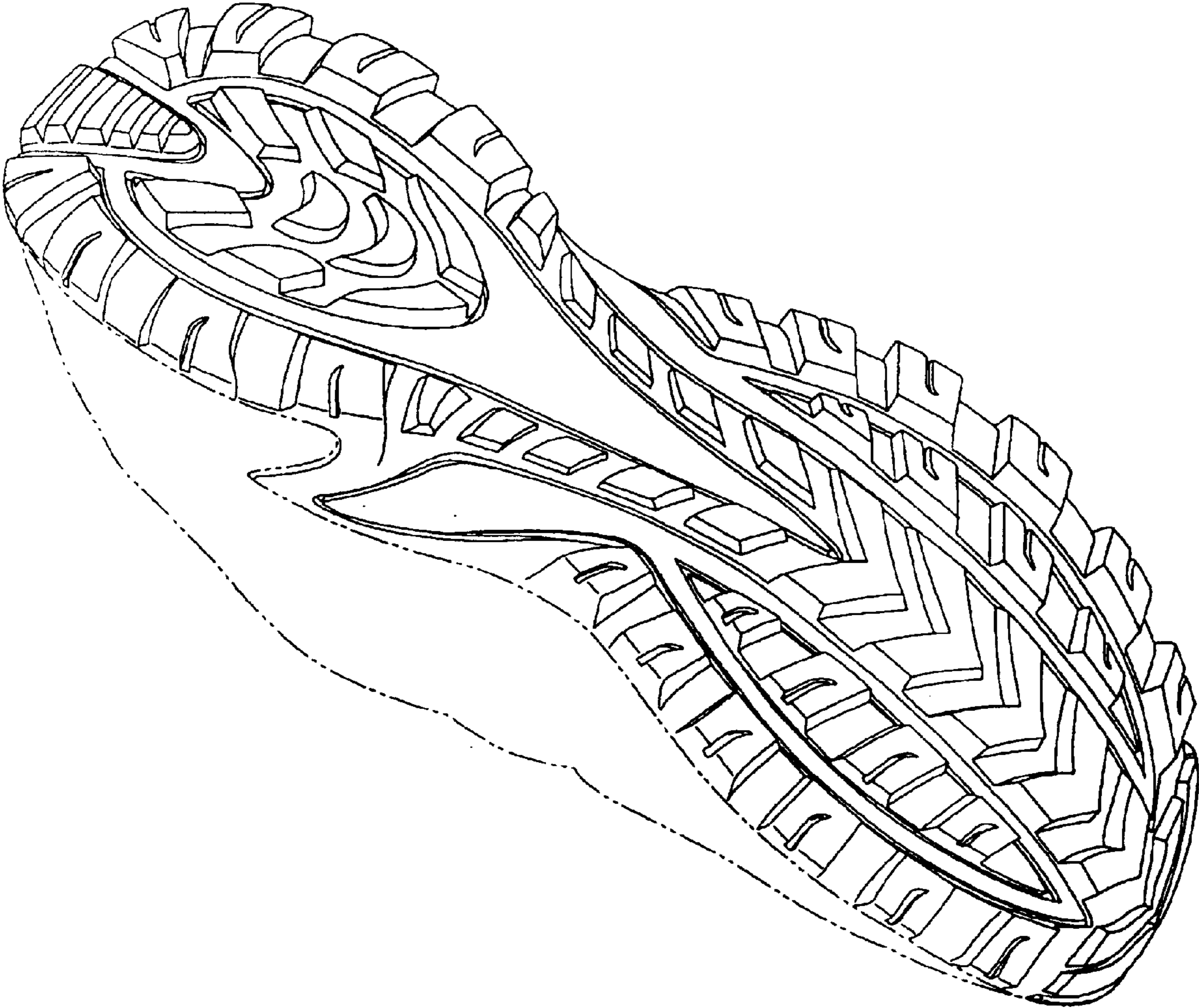

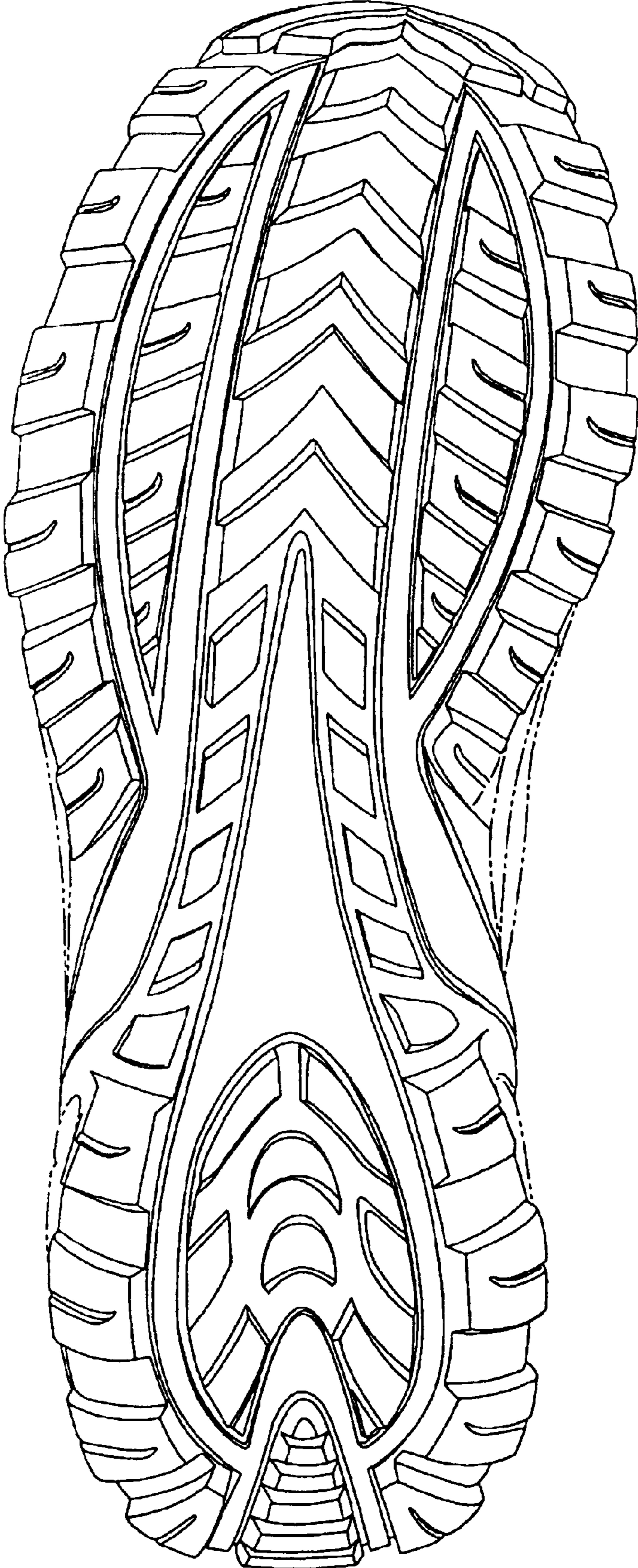

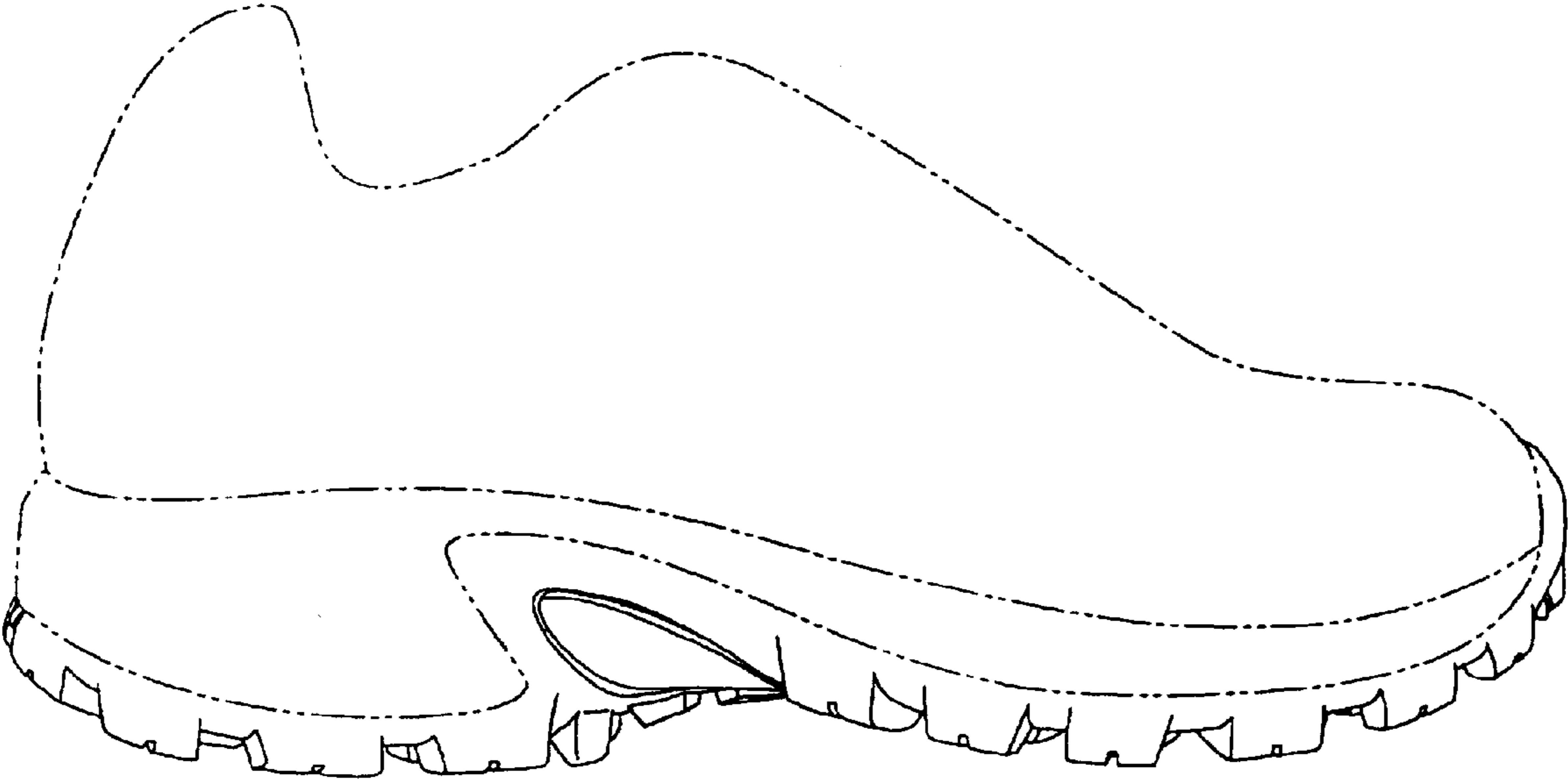

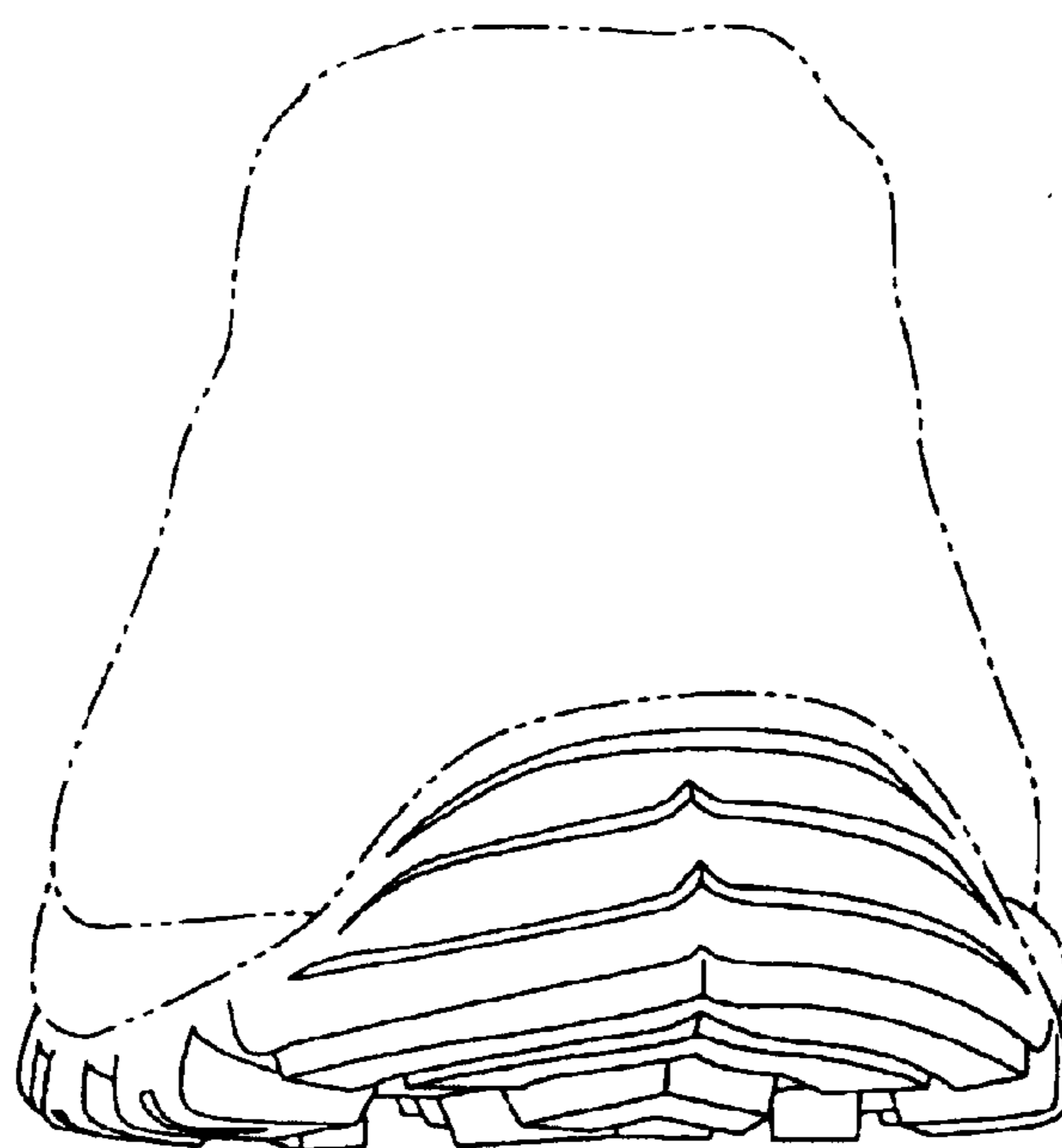

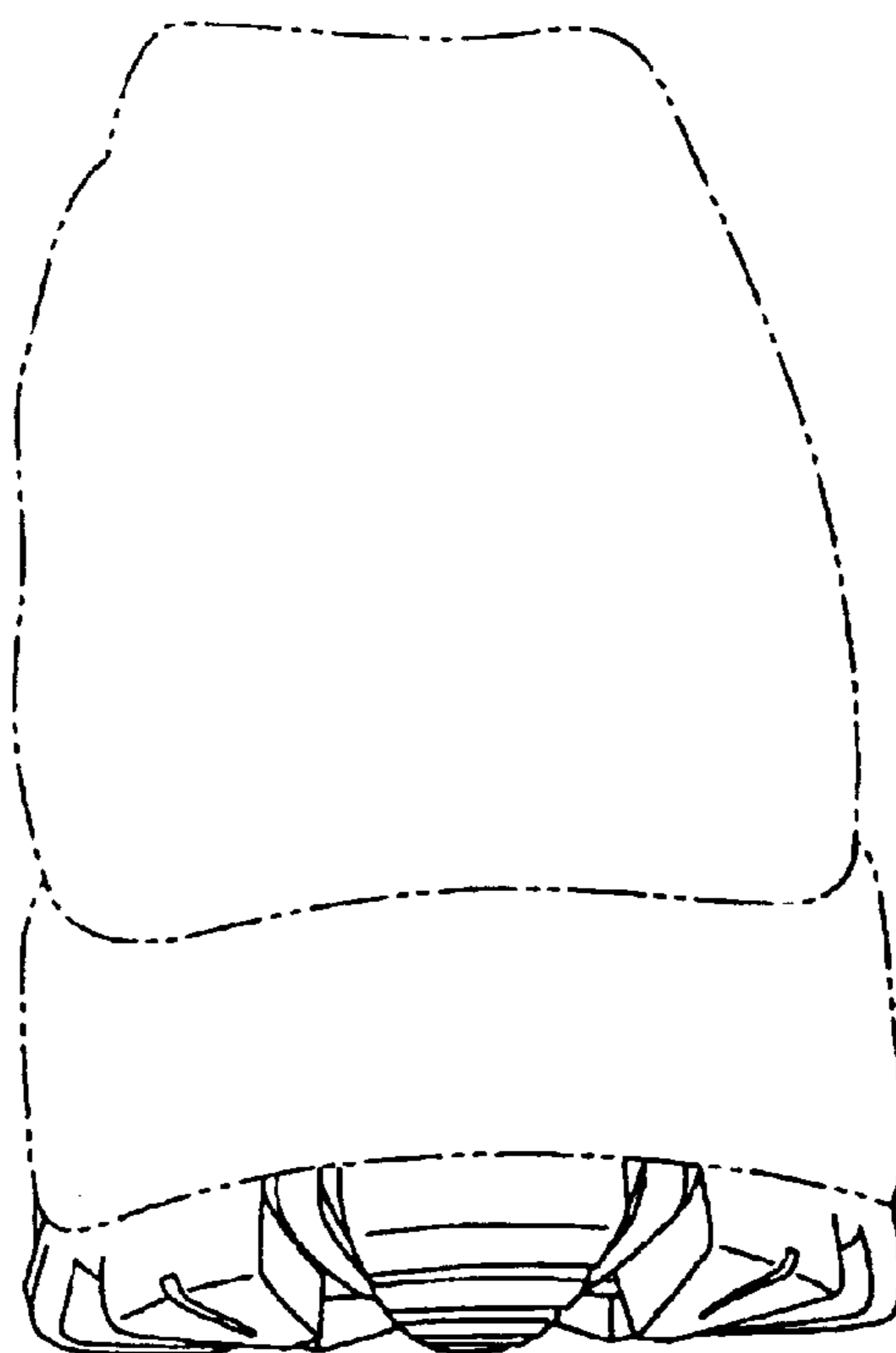
