(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a lavatory, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

In a preferred embodiment, the nature of this product is as a plumbing fixture in the form of a receptor for receiving water and is primarily useful for washing various objects. FIG. 1 is a left, top, front perspective view of a lavatory embodying my new design; FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof; FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof; and, FIG. 4 is a left side elevational view thereof.

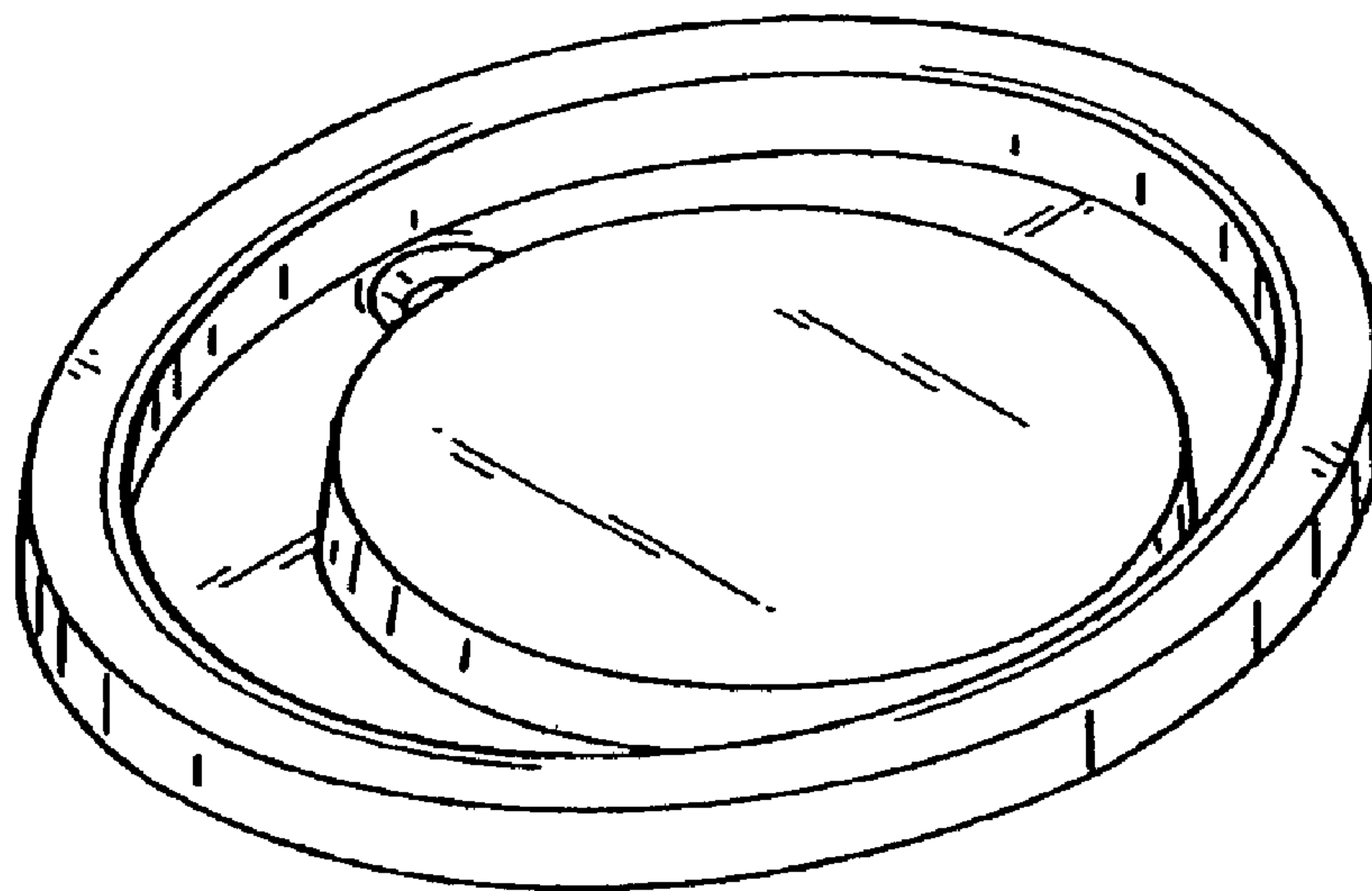

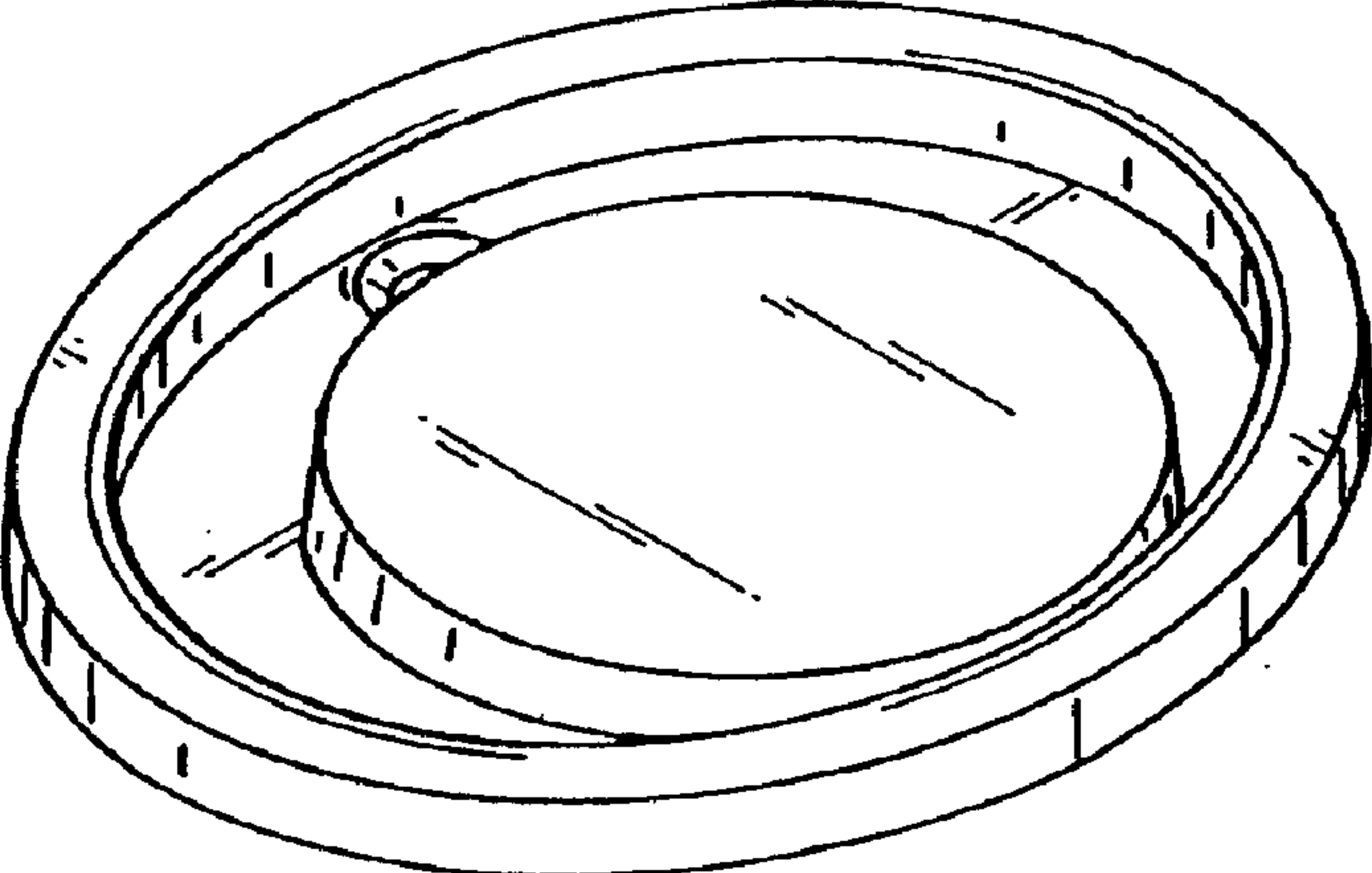

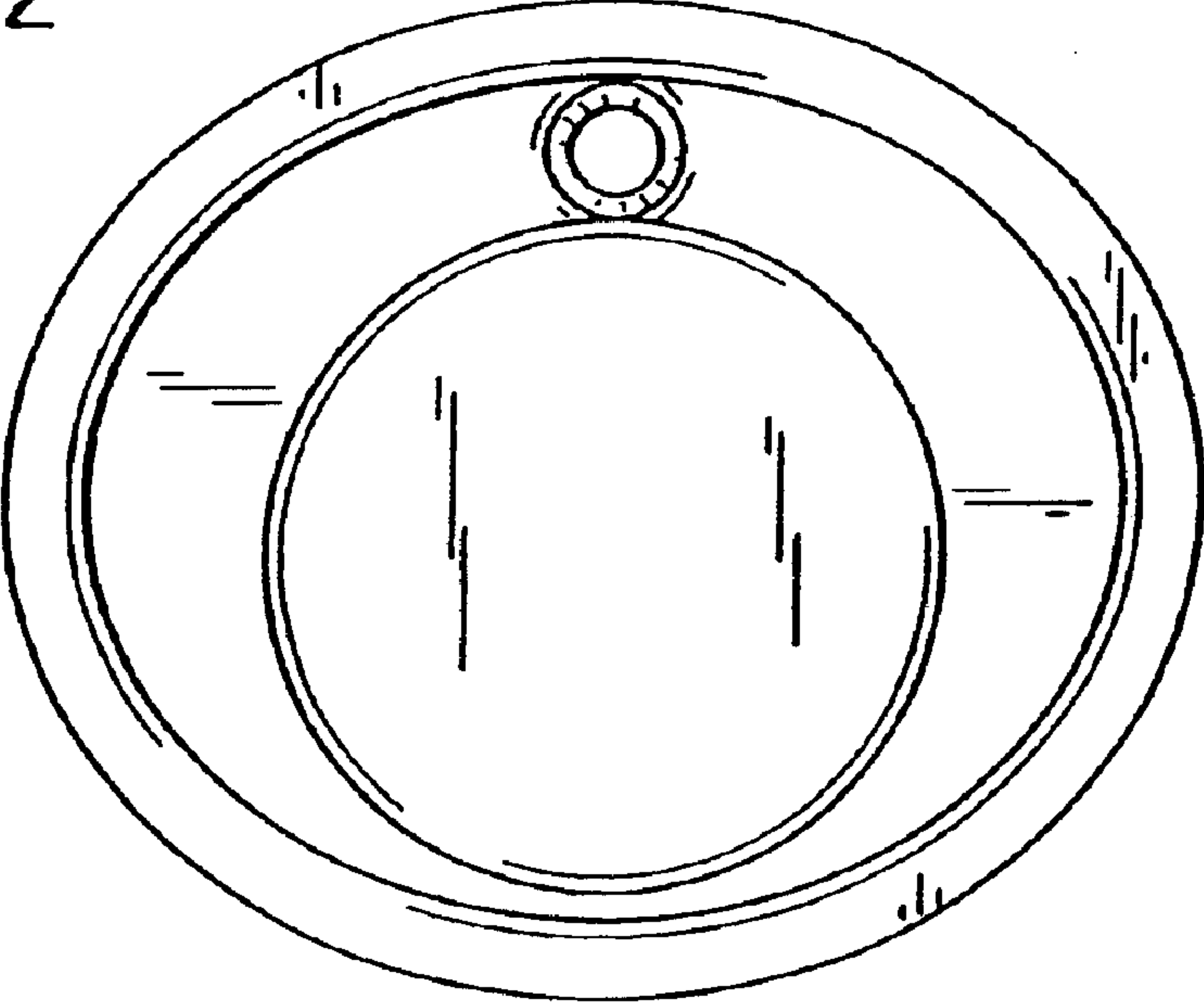
