The ornamental design for a footwear outsole, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a bottom plan view of a footwear outsole showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a right side elevational view thereof;

FIG. 5 is a front elevational view thereof;

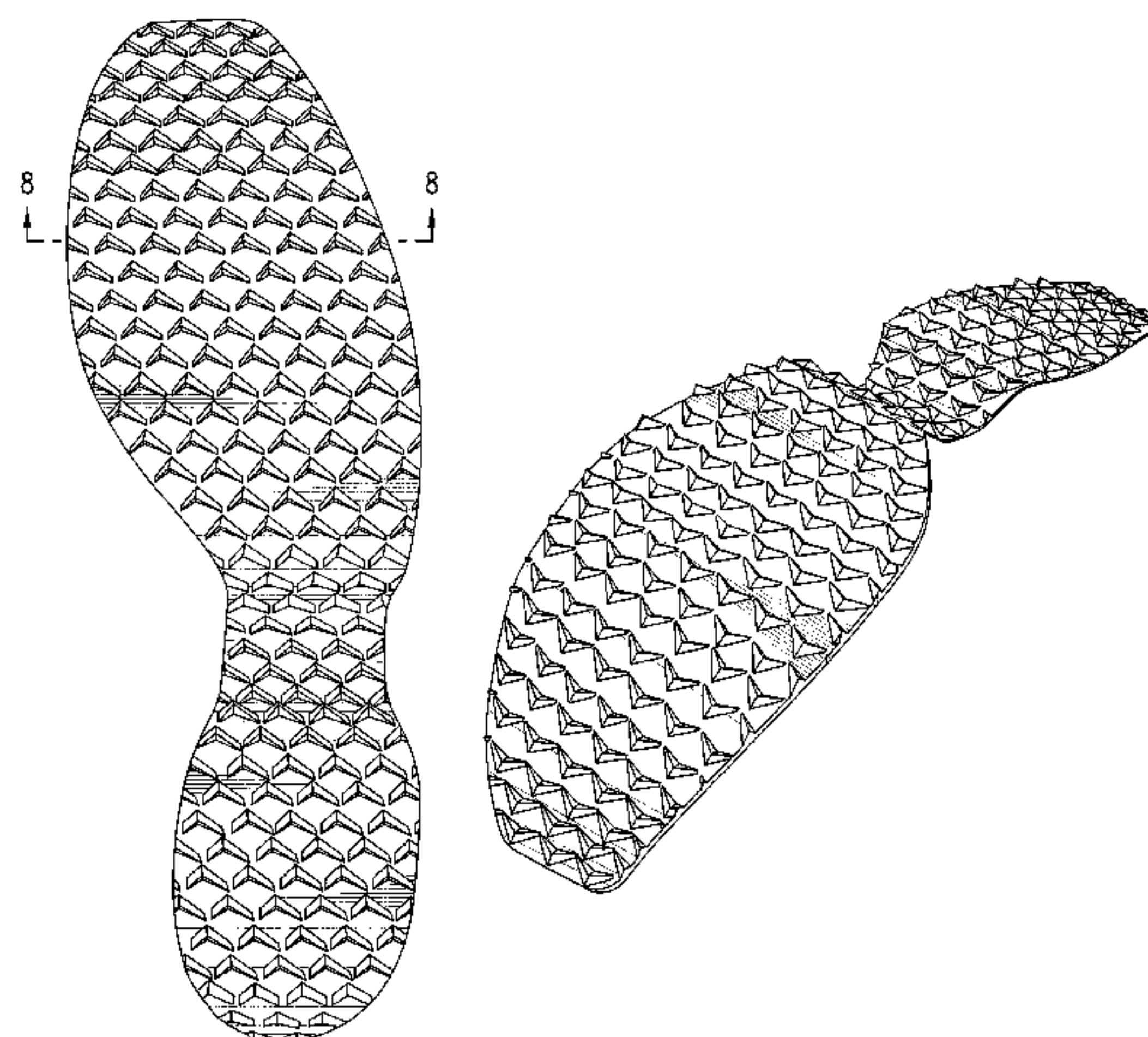
FIG. 6 is a rear elevational view thereof;

The broken lines in FIG. 8 form no part of the claimed design and are provided only to indicate that the cross-sectional surface of the outsole forms no part of the claimed design.

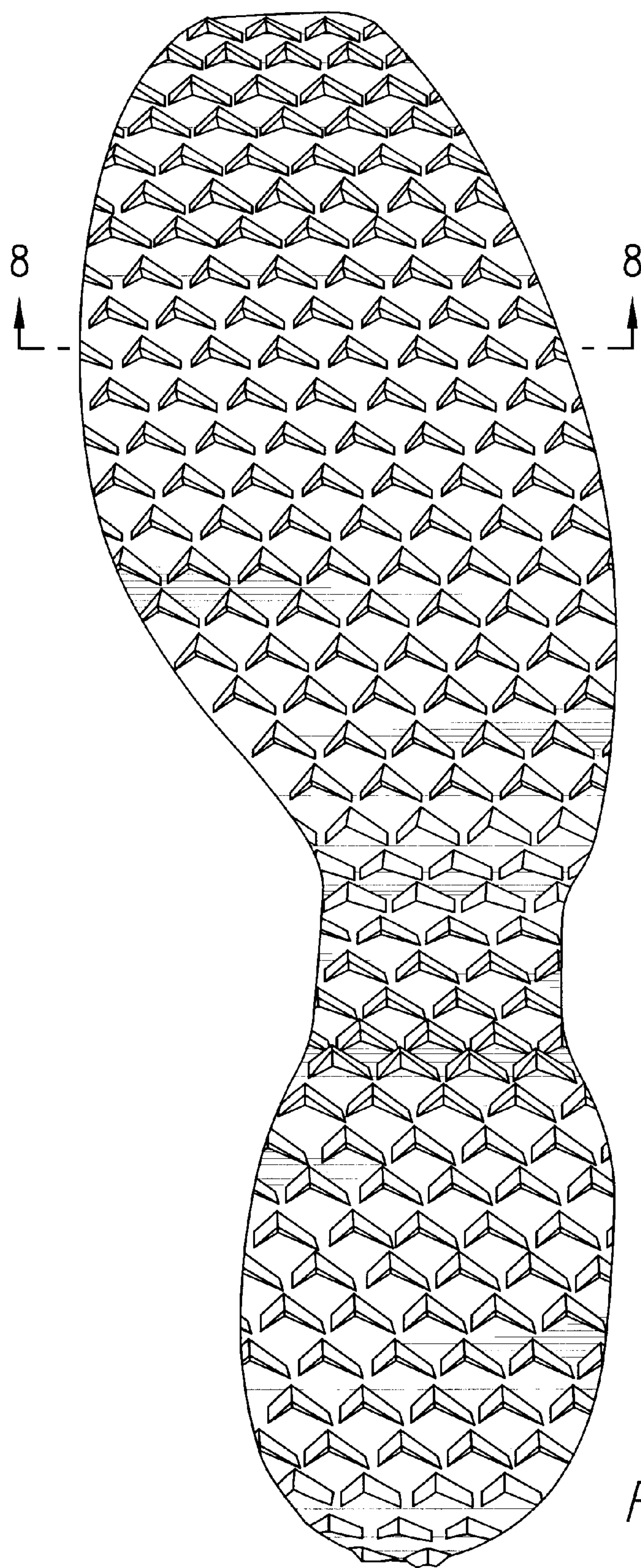

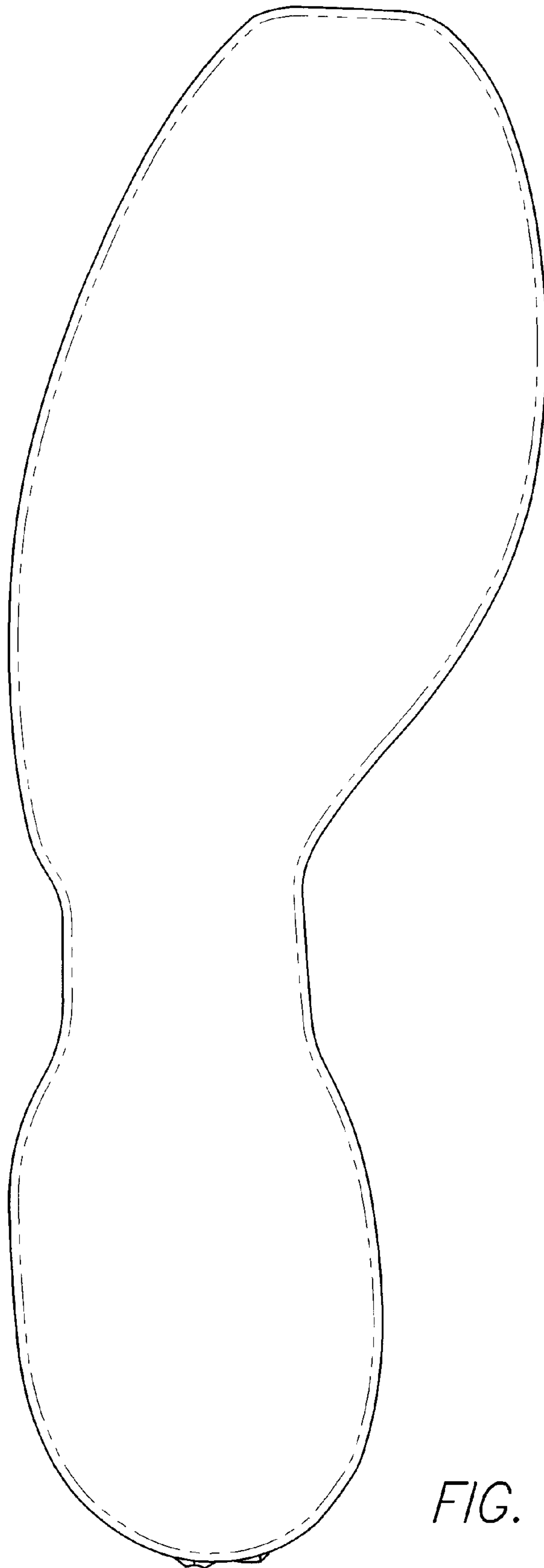

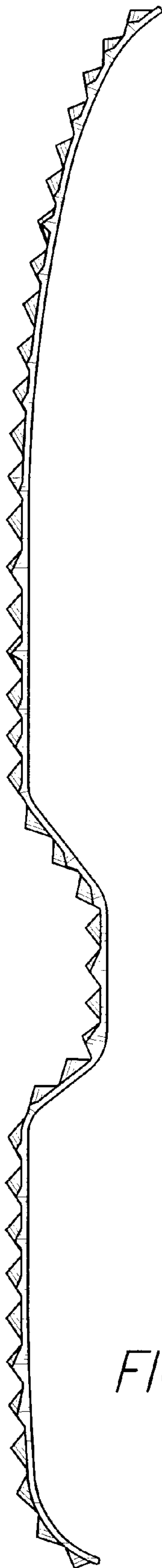

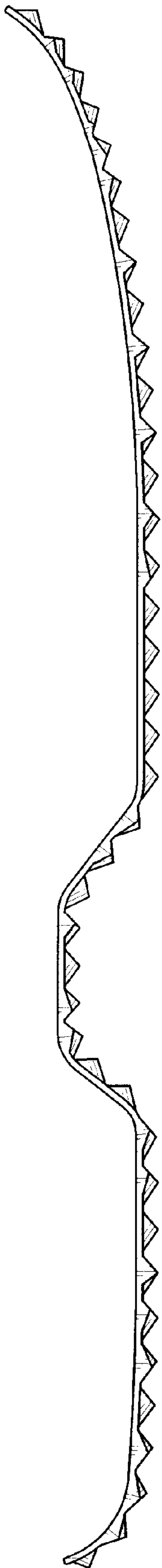

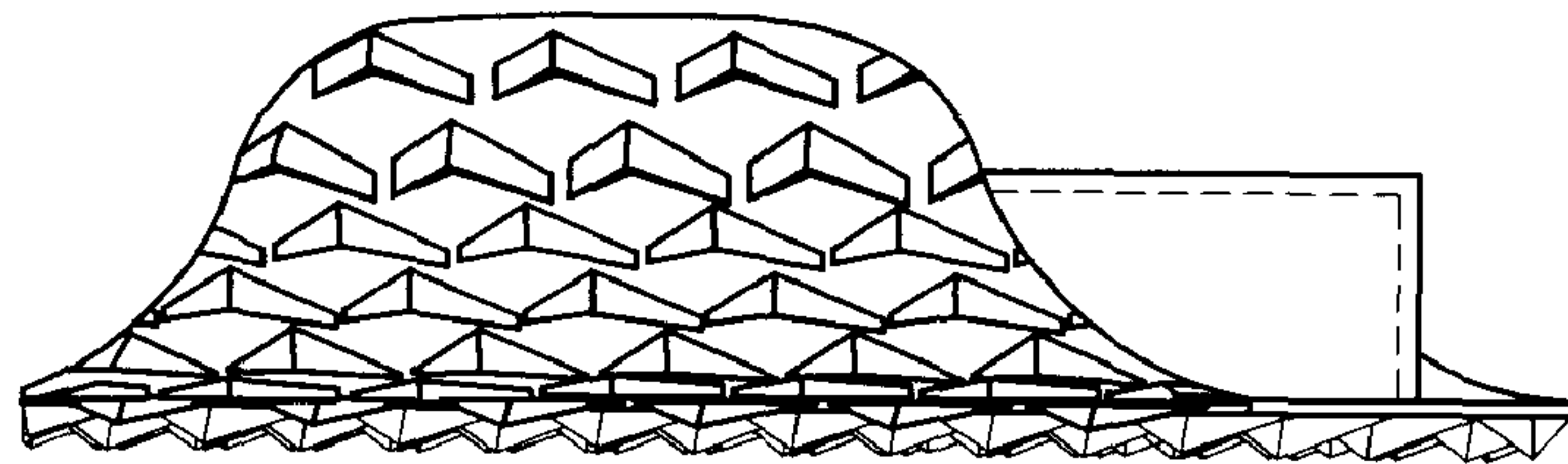

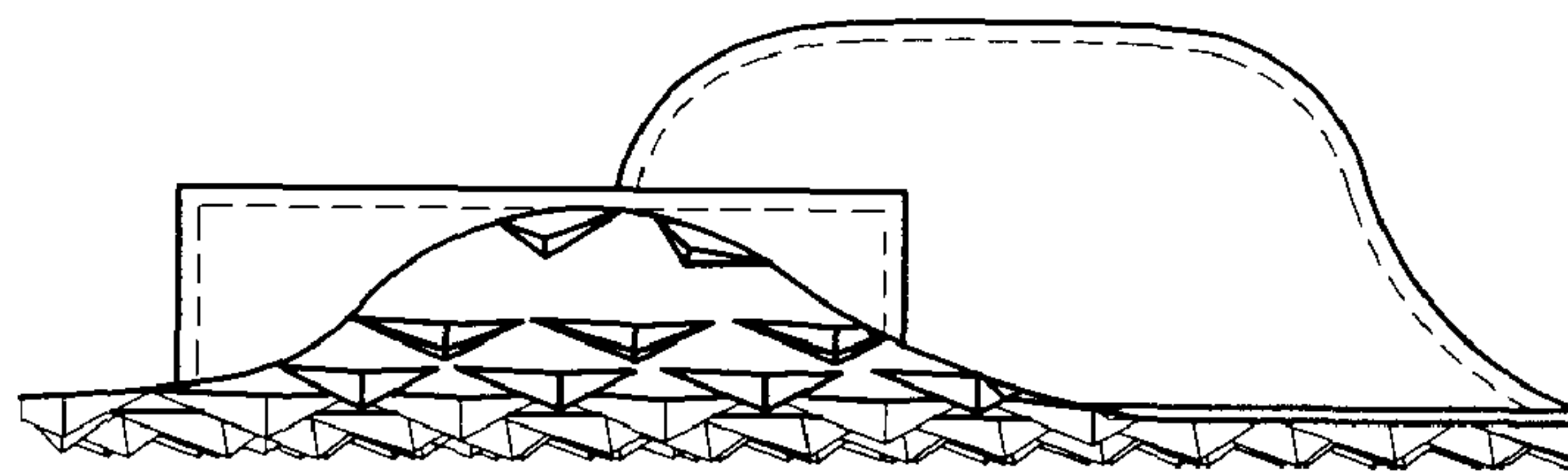

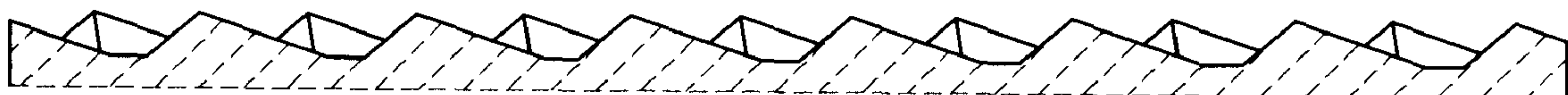

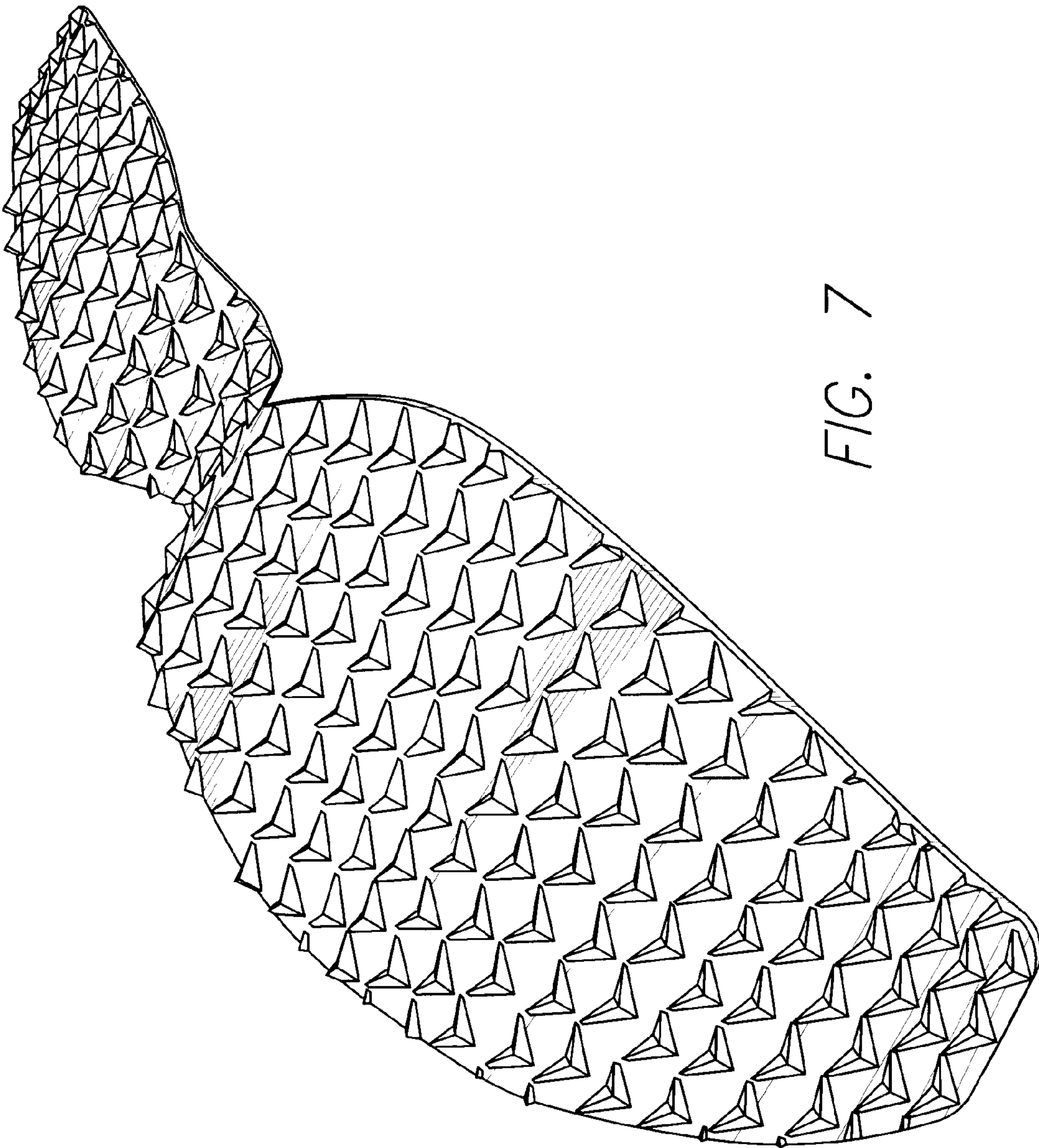
