(57) CLAIM

The ornamental design for a display china deck, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a left front perspective view of a display china deck showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof; and,

FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof.

The views of the display china deck not shown form no part of the claimed design. The broken lines depicting hardware and nail heads represent environmental elements only and form no part of the claimed design.
