The ornamental design for a portable computer housing, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front view of the design for the portable computer housing in accordance with the present design;

FIG. 2 is a rear view of the design for the portable computer housing in accordance with the present design;

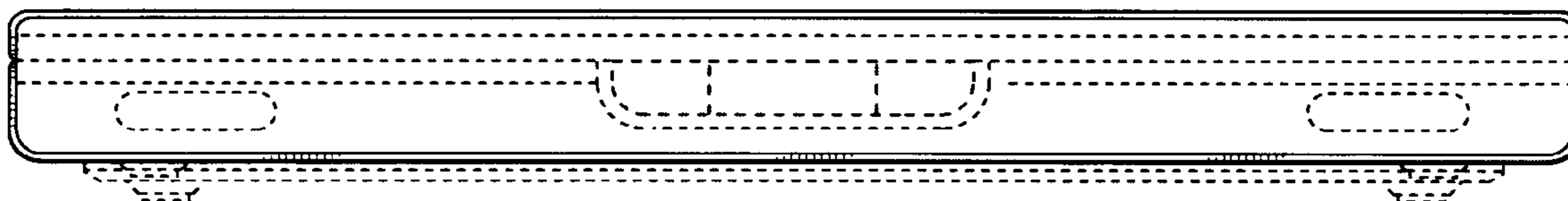
FIG. 3 is a top view of the design for the portable computer housing in accordance with the present design;

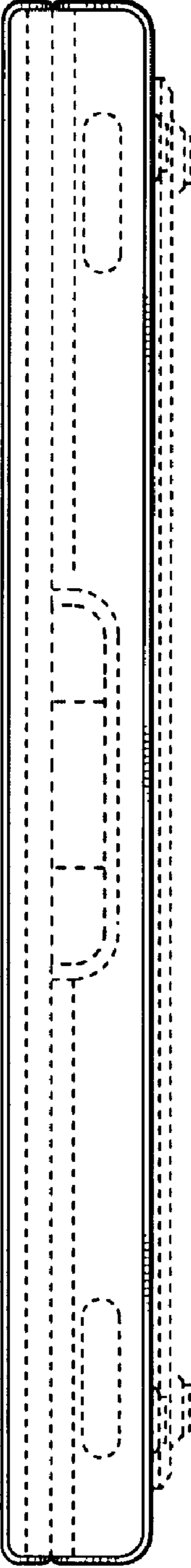

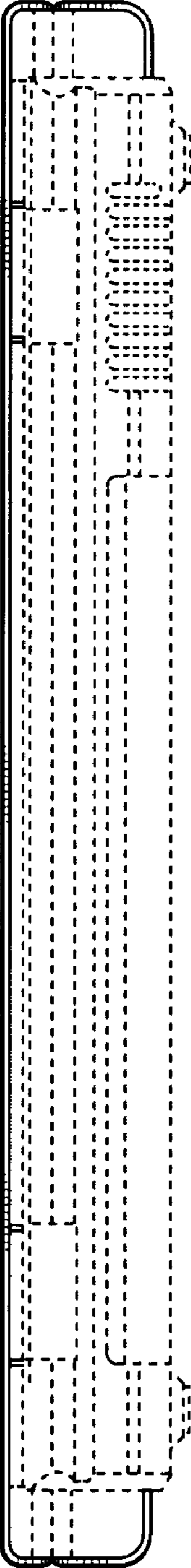

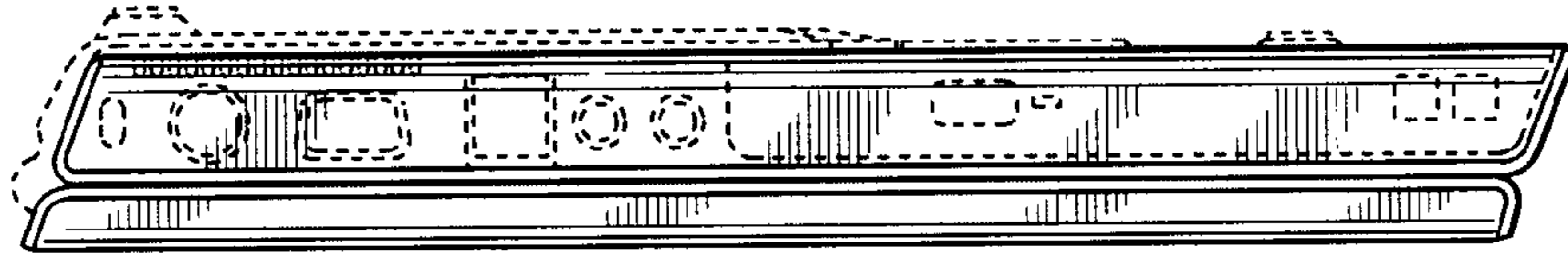
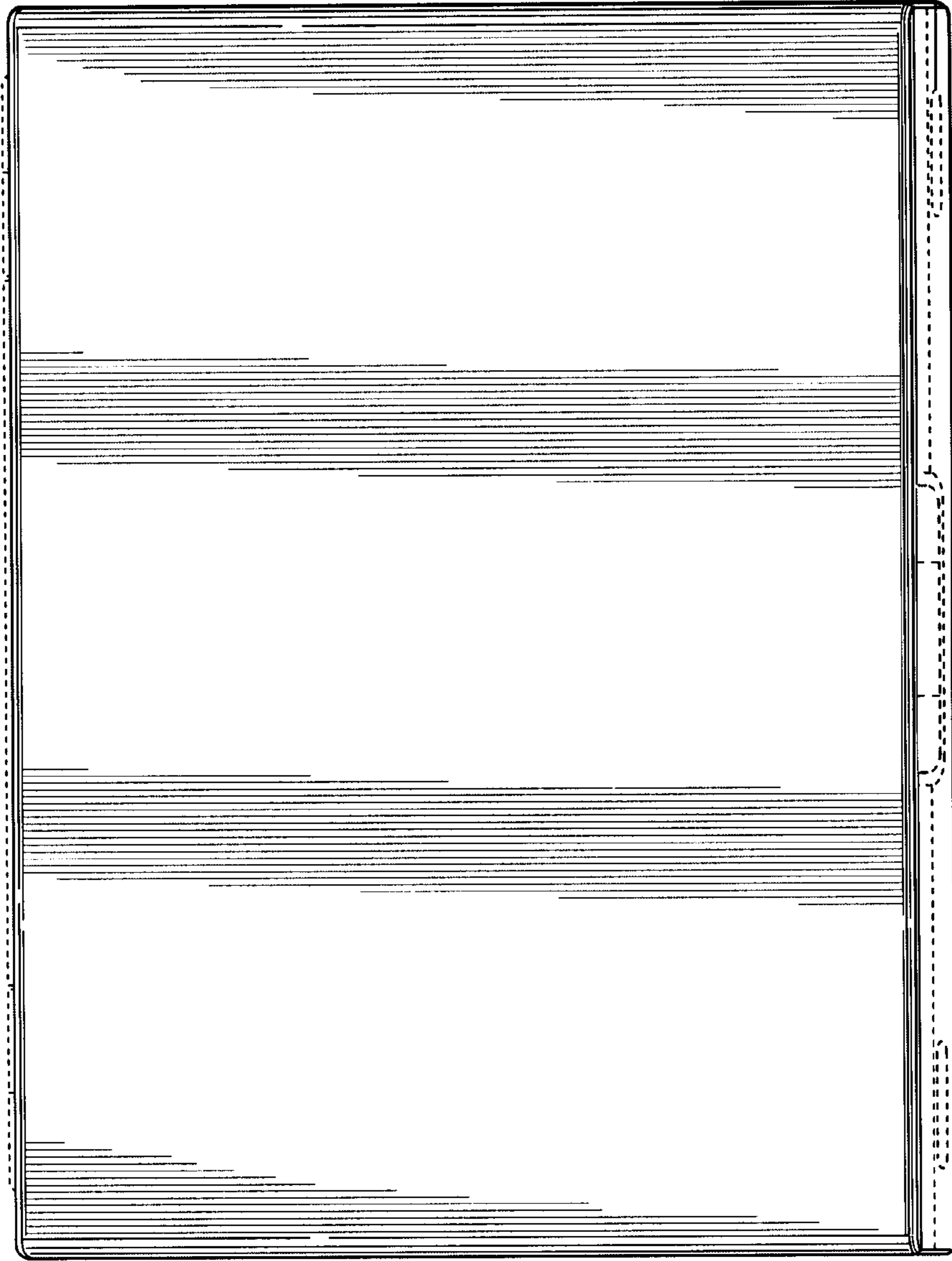

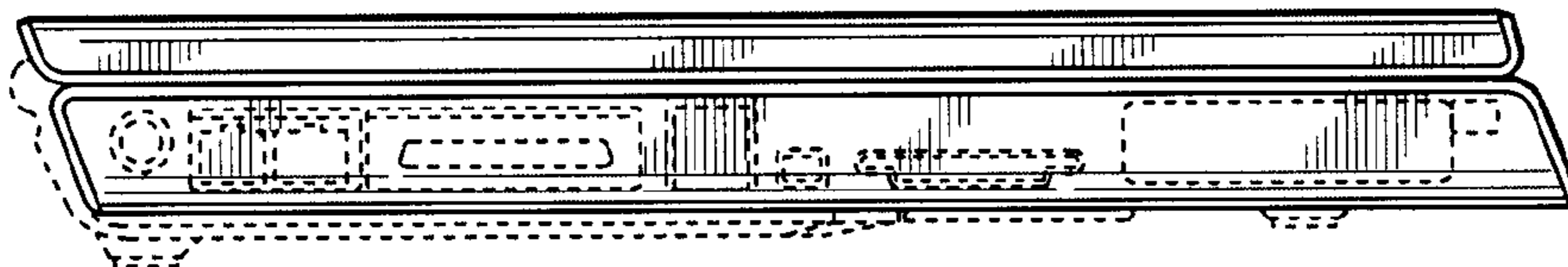
