(57) **CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a wooden furniture surface  
ornamentation, as shown and described.

**DESCRIPTION**

The ornamentation is characterized in that the several sec-  
tion patterns are made distinctive from one another by the  
use of woods having different grain appearances. While the  
ornamentation is applied to a bed, it should be realized that  
it could be used on doors, drawers, and the like.

The single view is illustrative of a surface ornamentation  
according to the present invention as applied to a bed.

The broken lines are for environmental purposes only and  
form no part of the claimed design.
