FIG. 2 is a rear perspective view thereof;

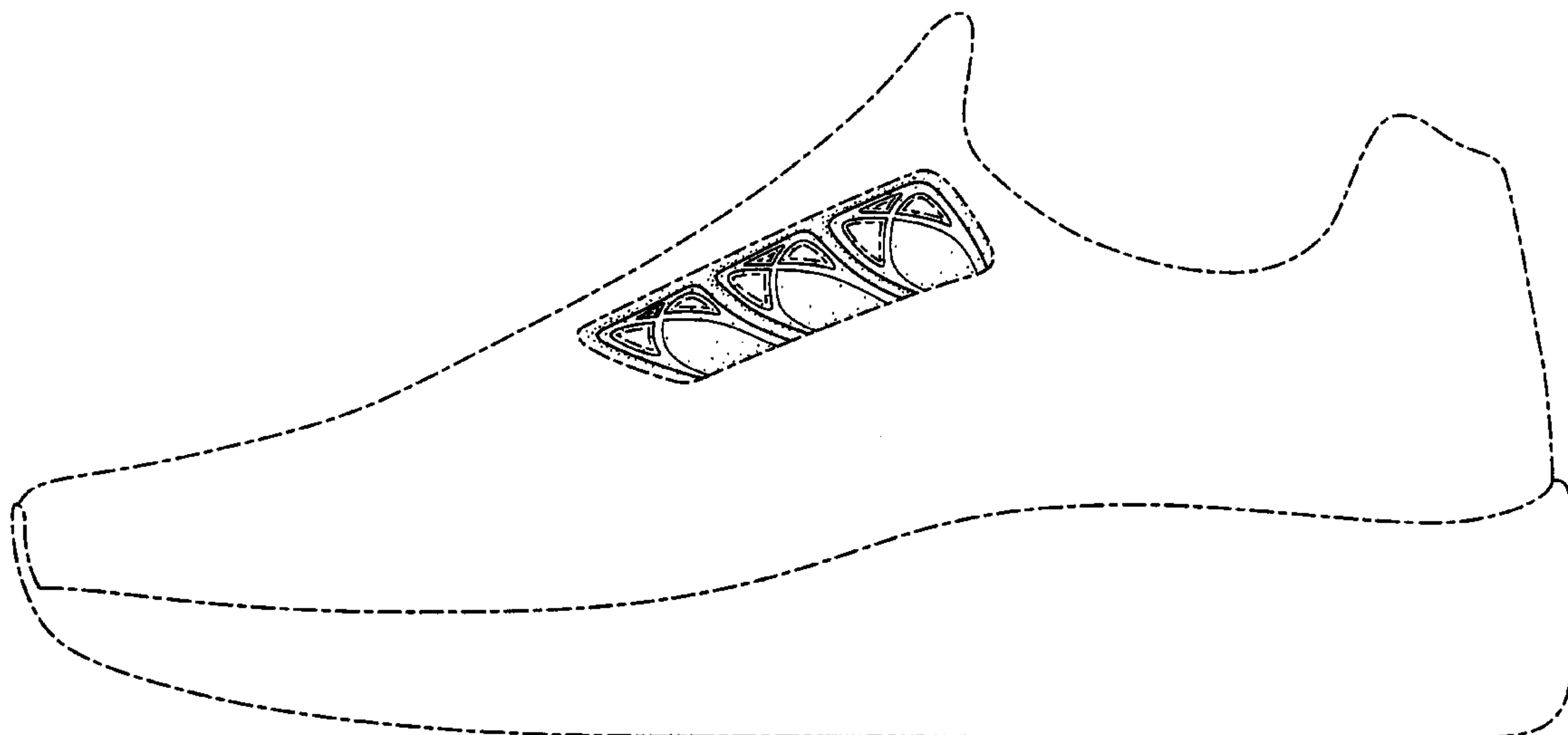
FIG. 3 is a side view thereof;

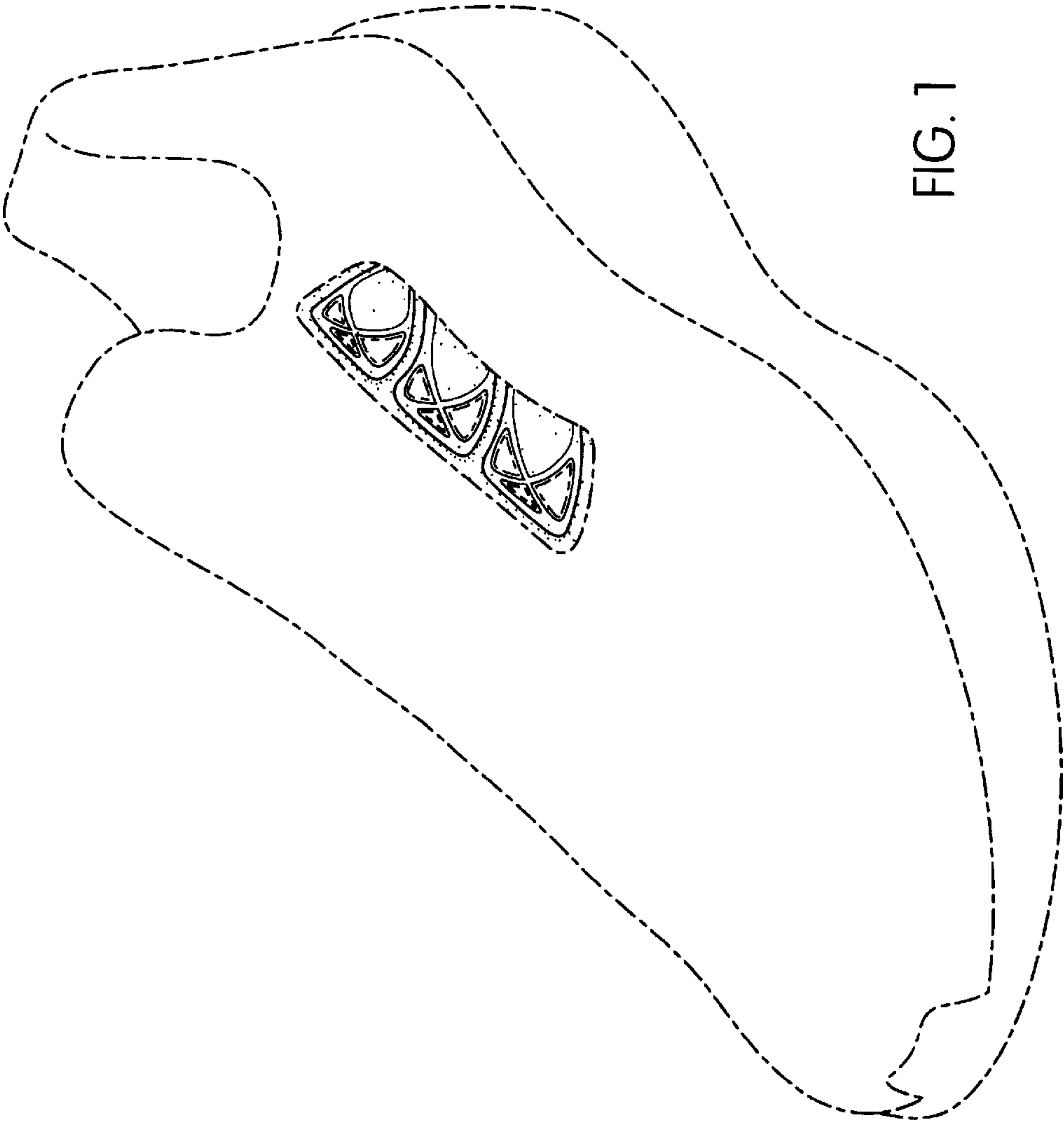

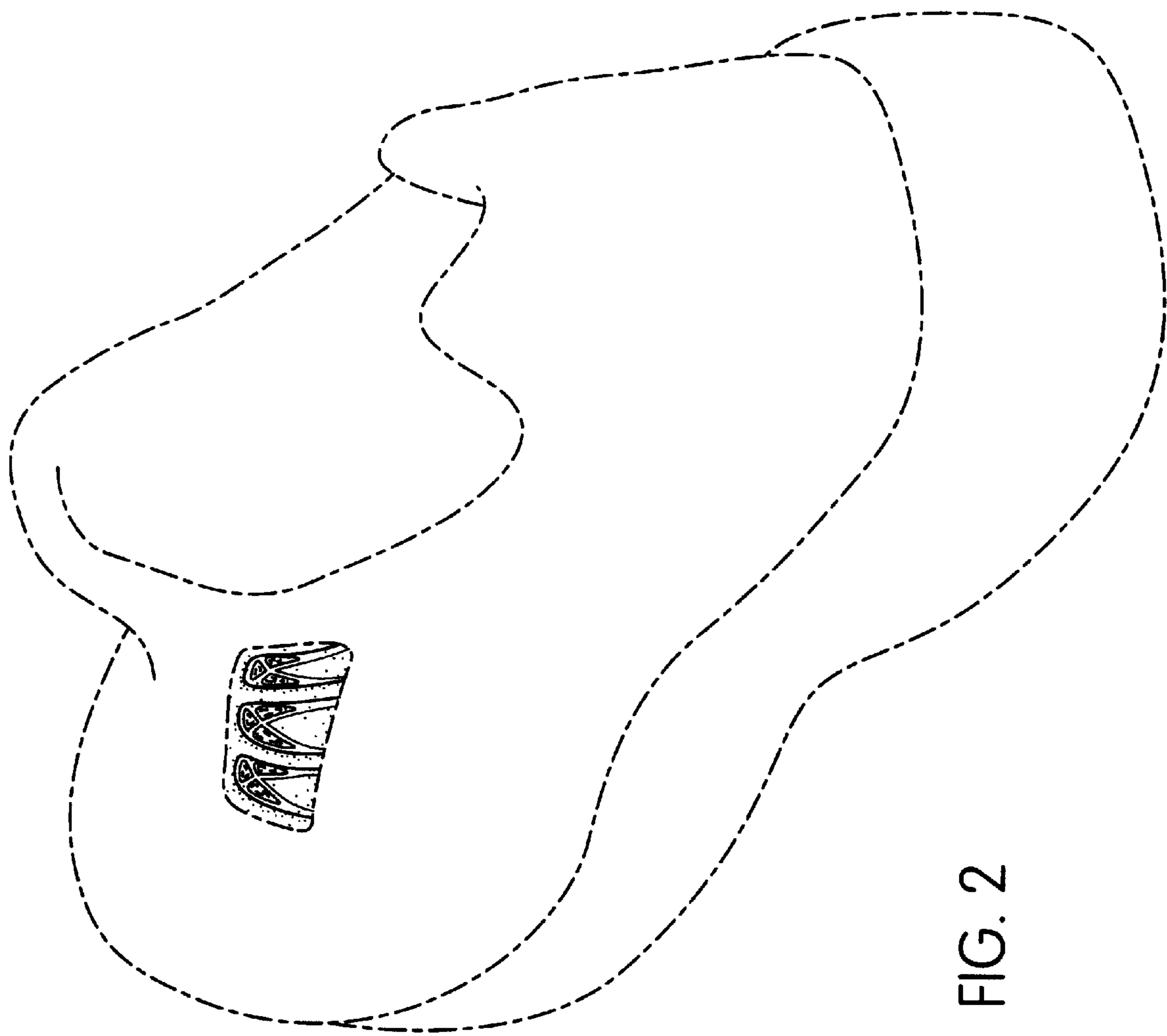

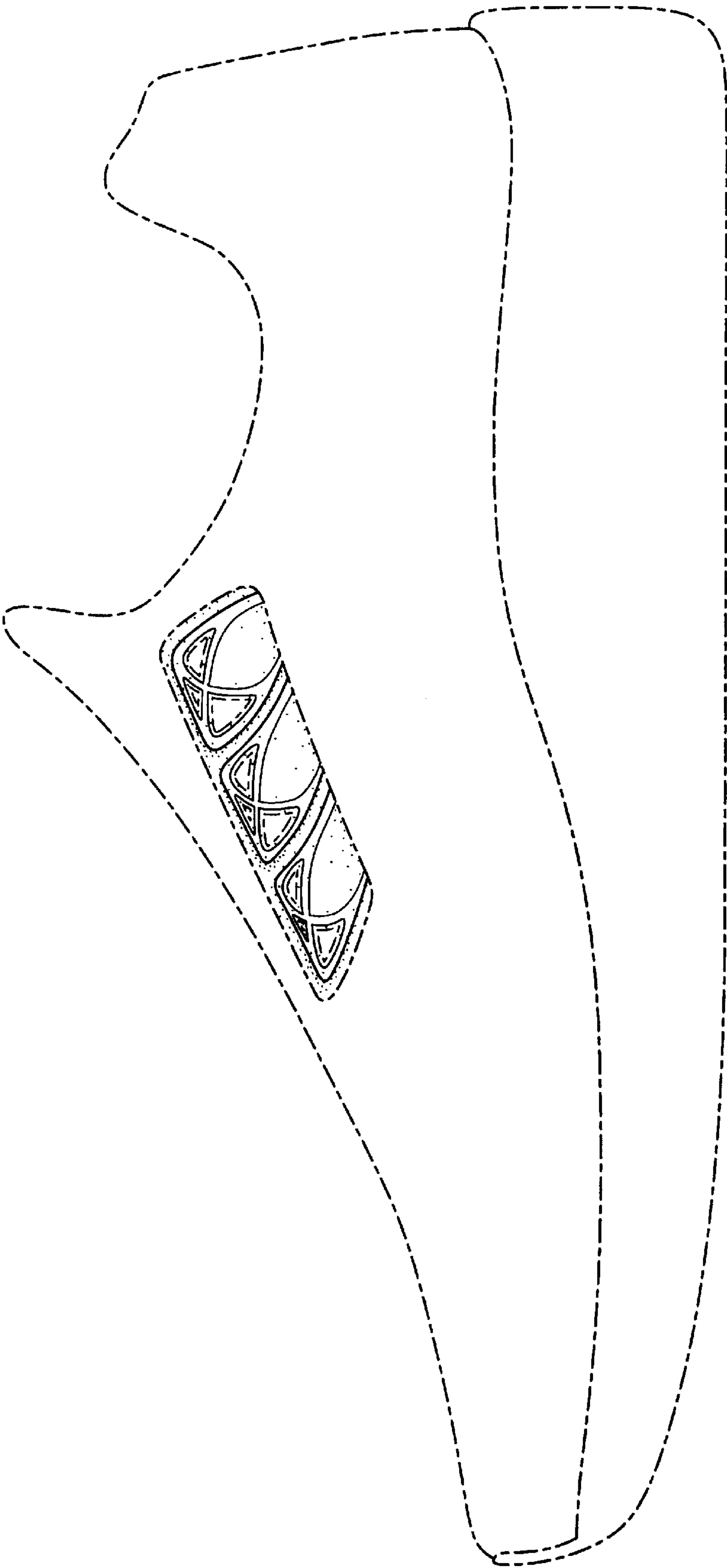

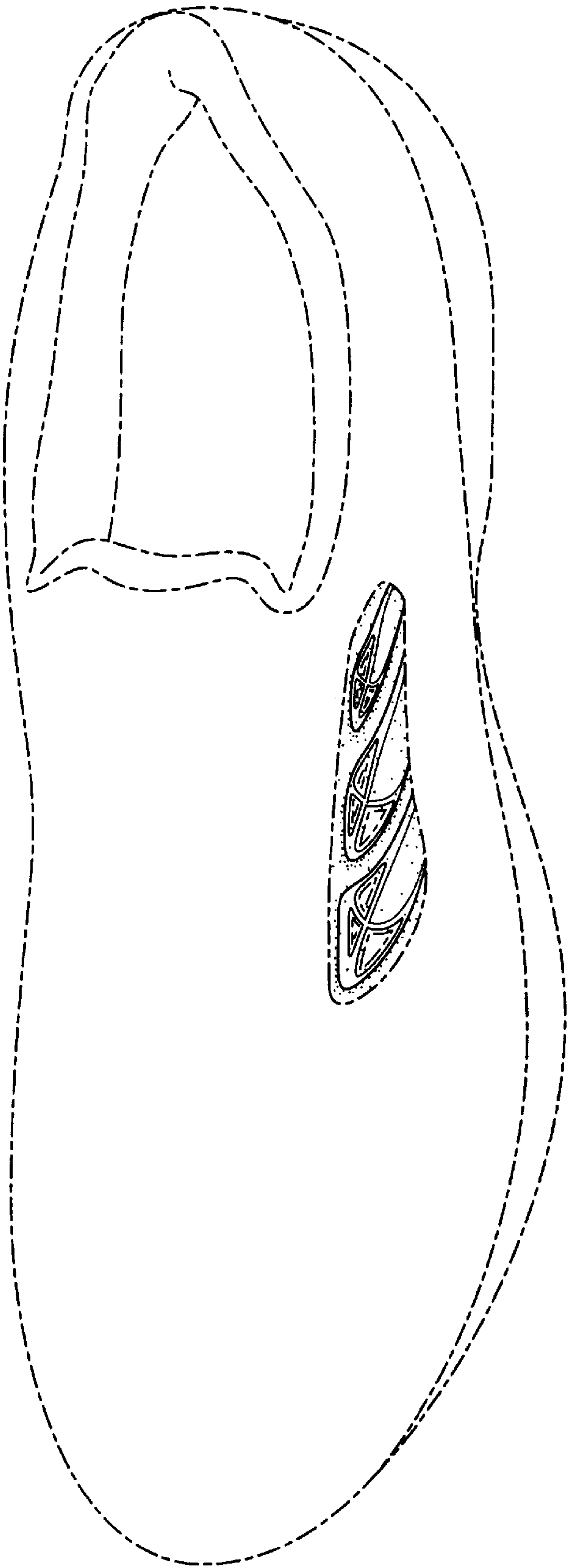

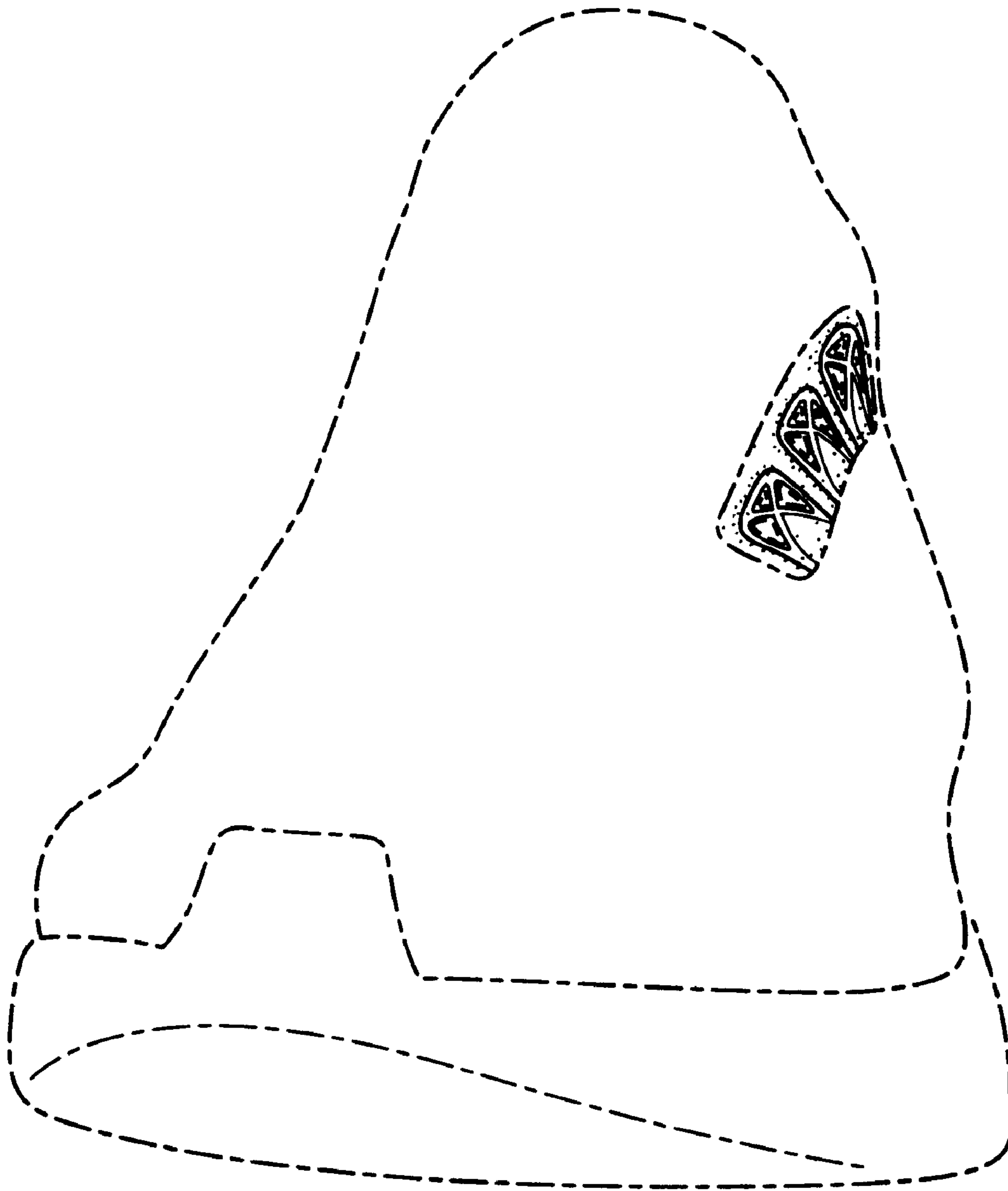
