FIG. 1 is a right side elevational view of the design of this invention.

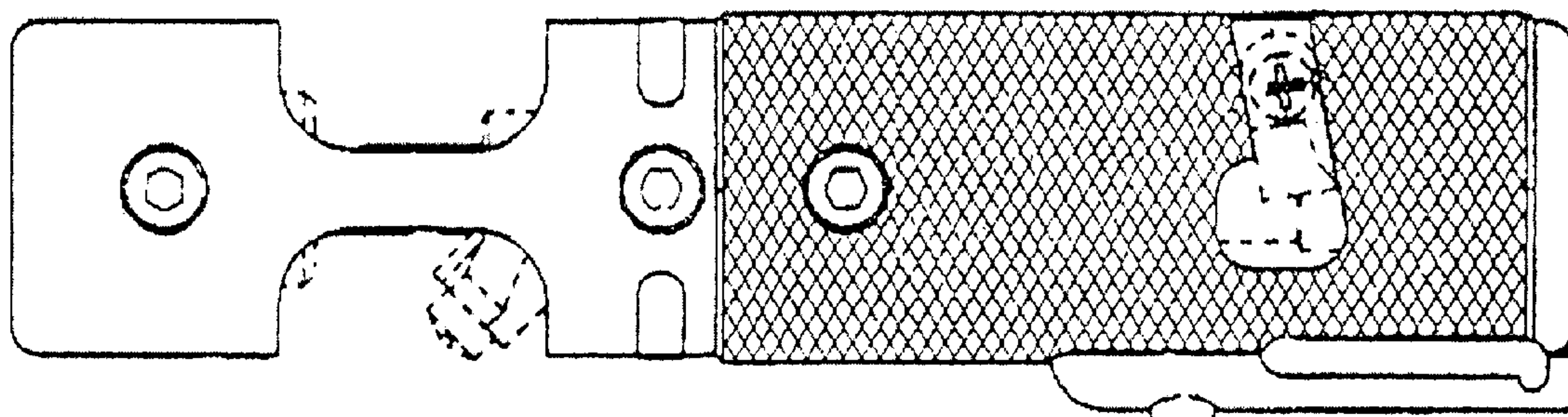
FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the design of this invention; FIG. 3 is a rear elevational view of the design of this invention

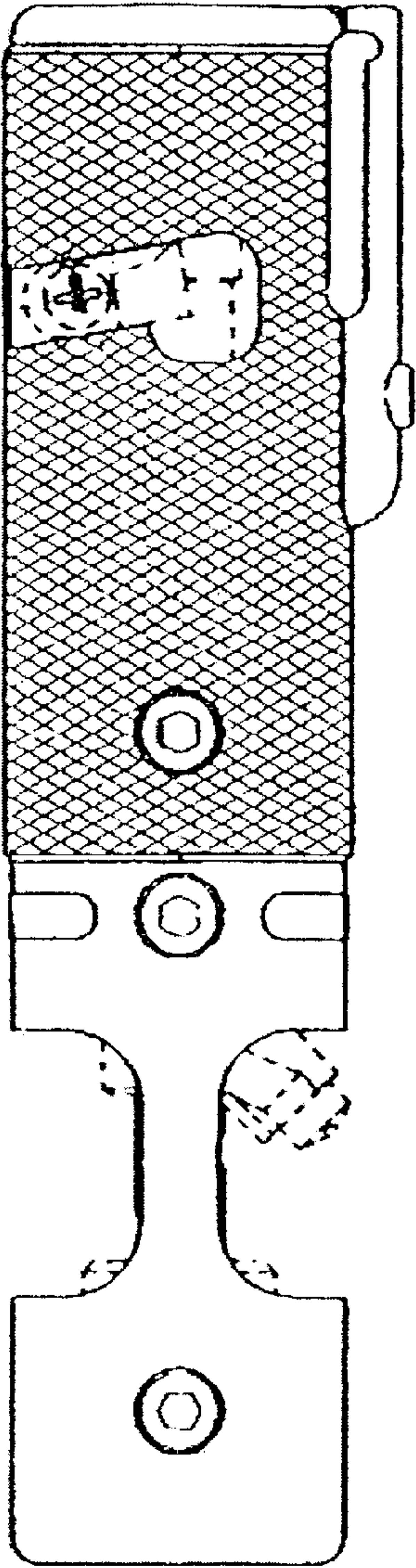

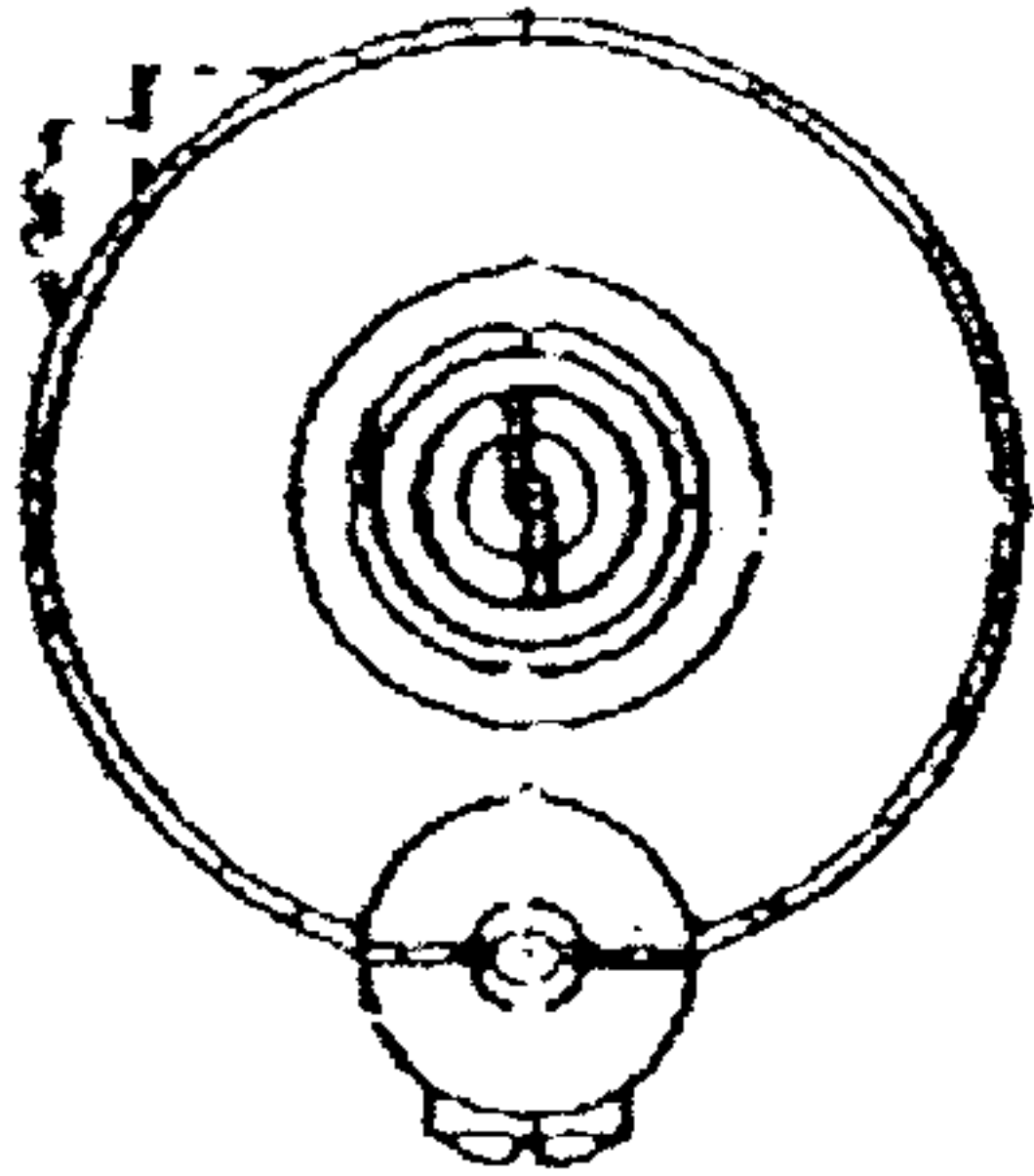

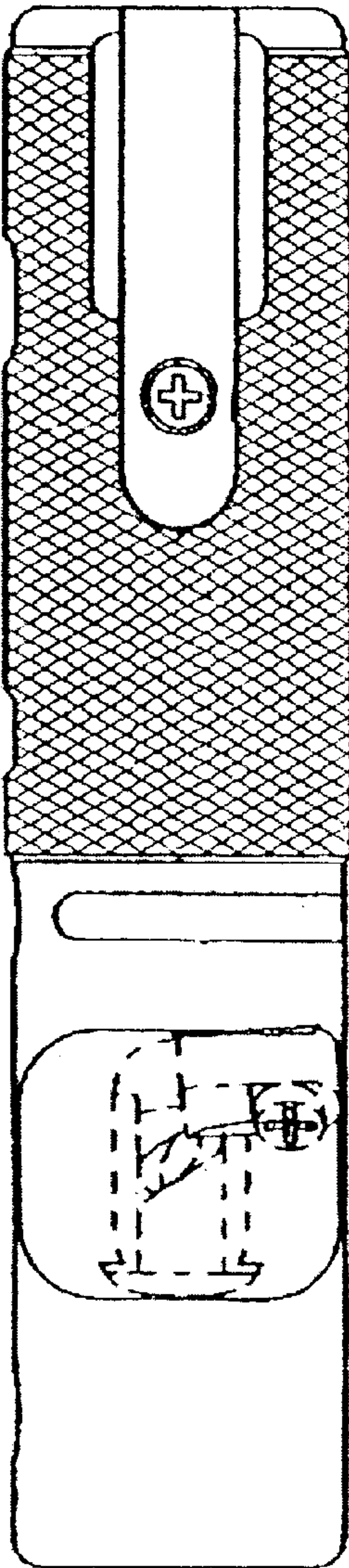

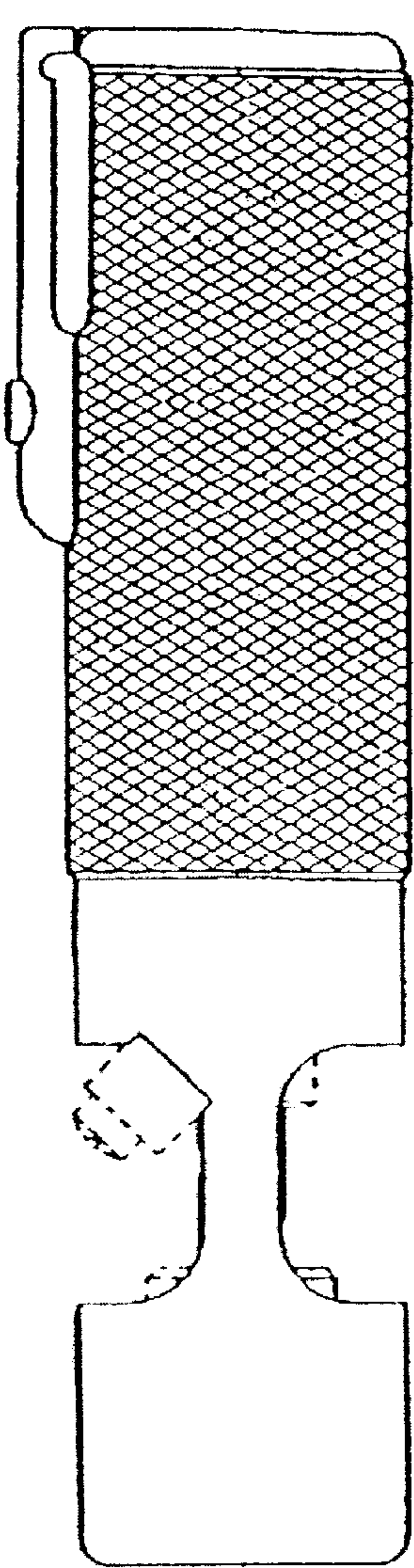

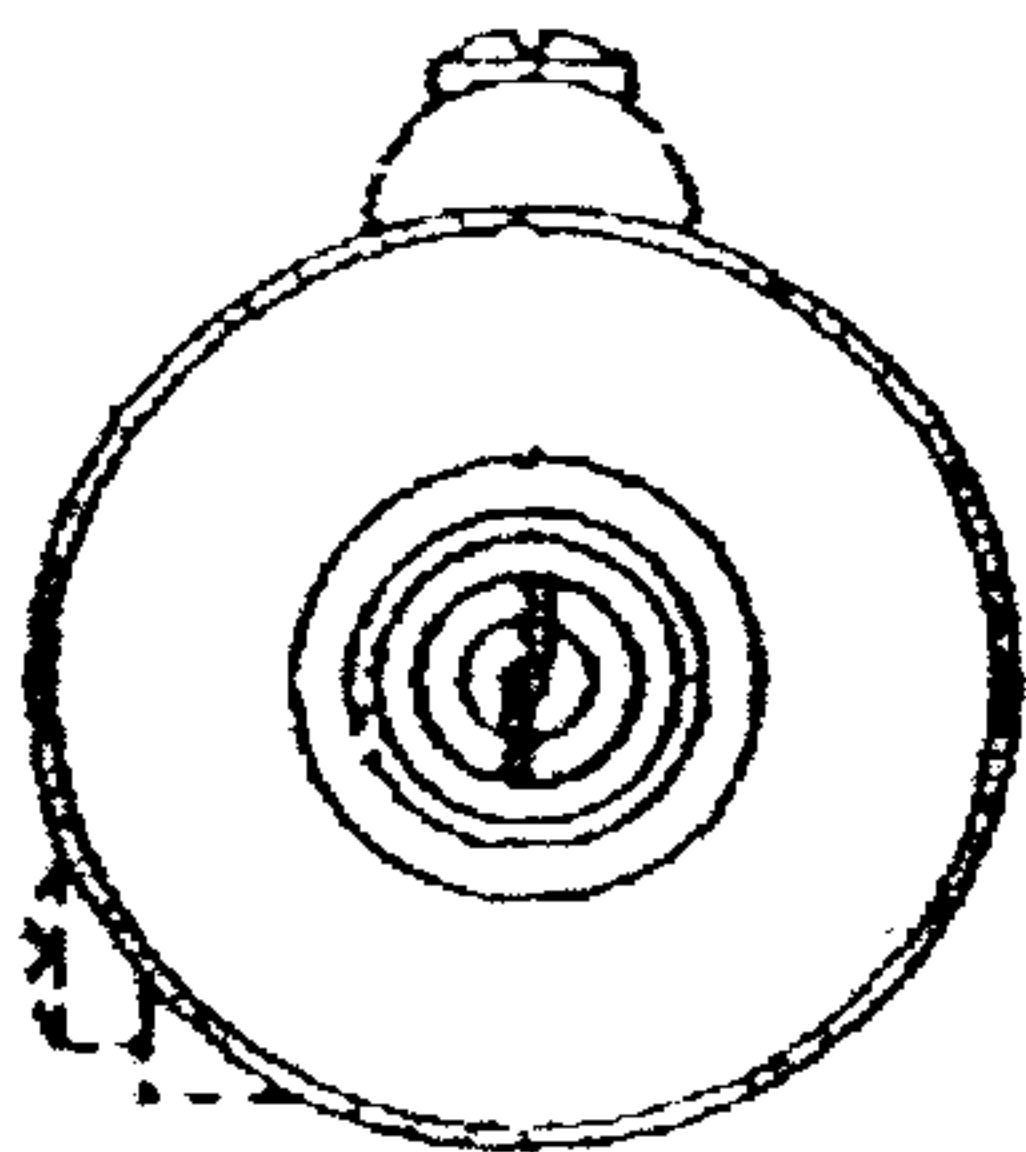

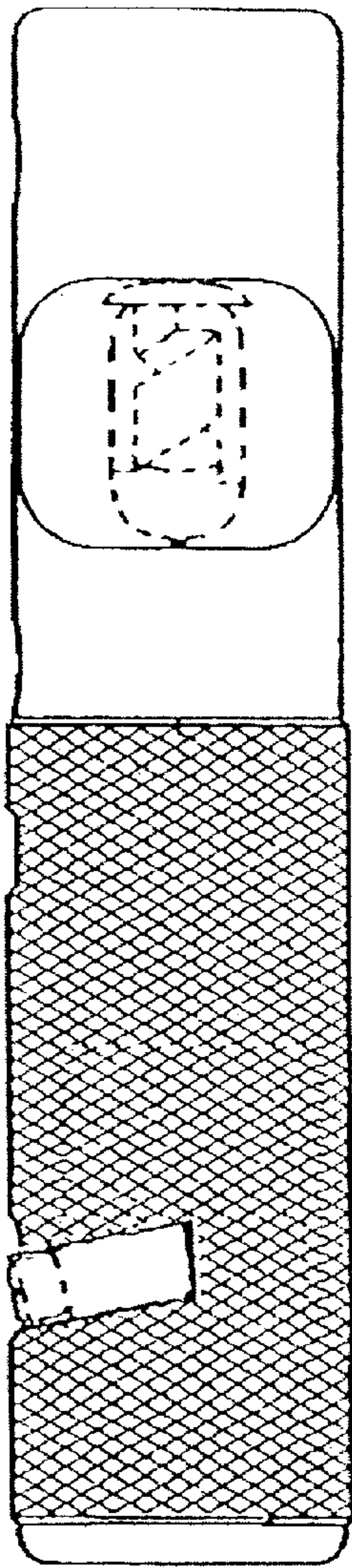
