FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a wine glass showing our new design;

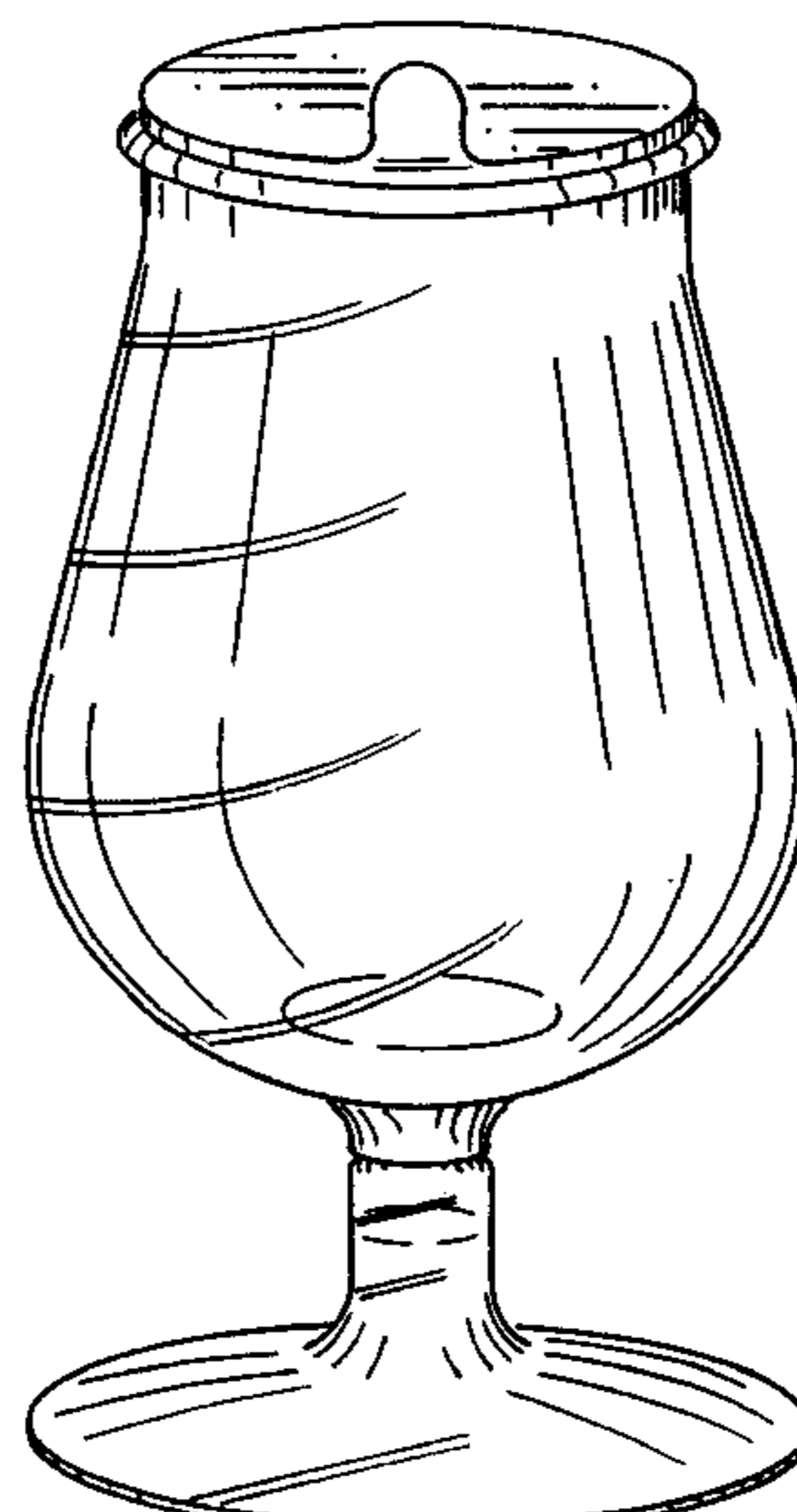
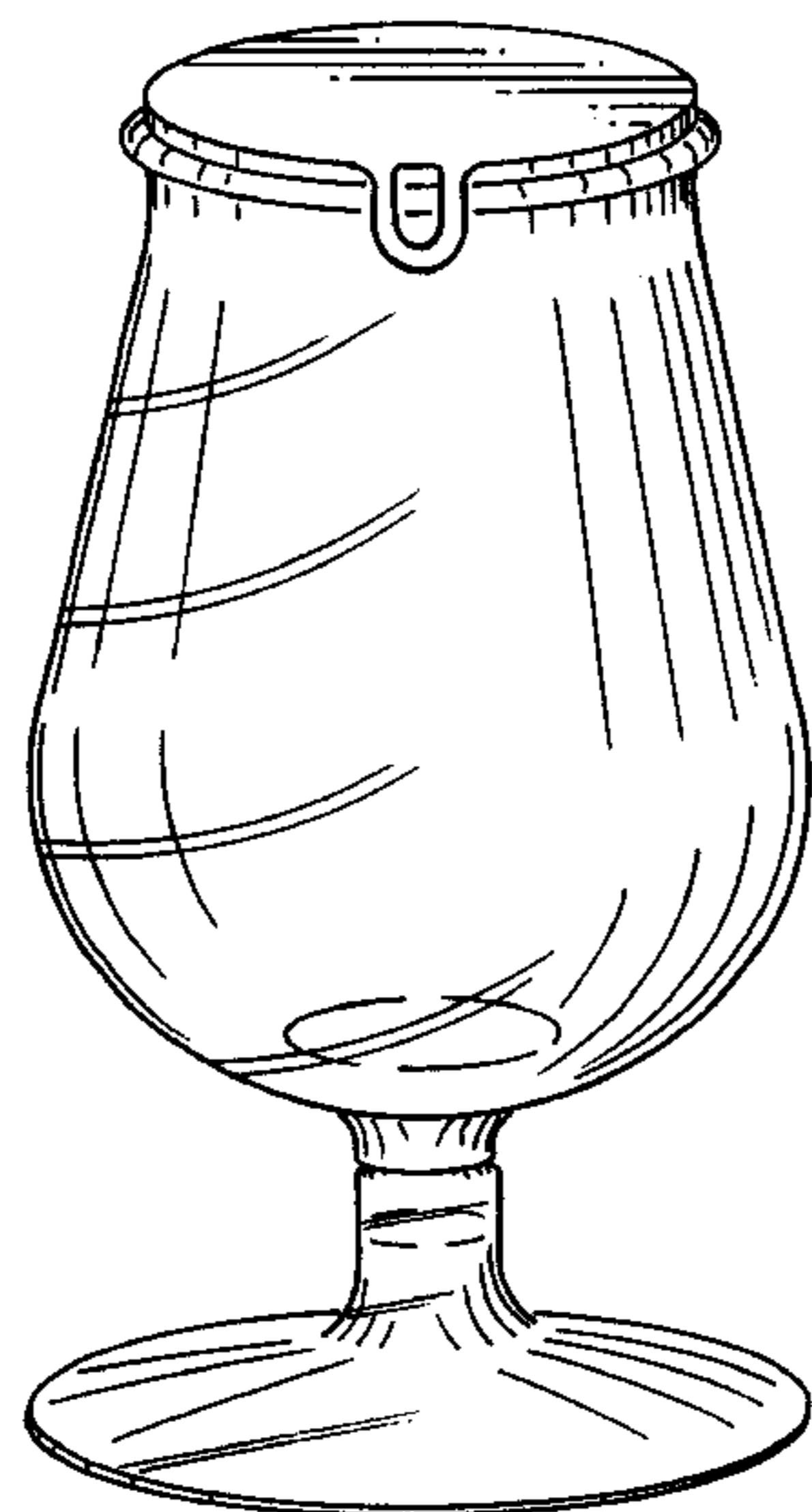
FIG. 2 is a perspective view showing a second embodiment of our new design;

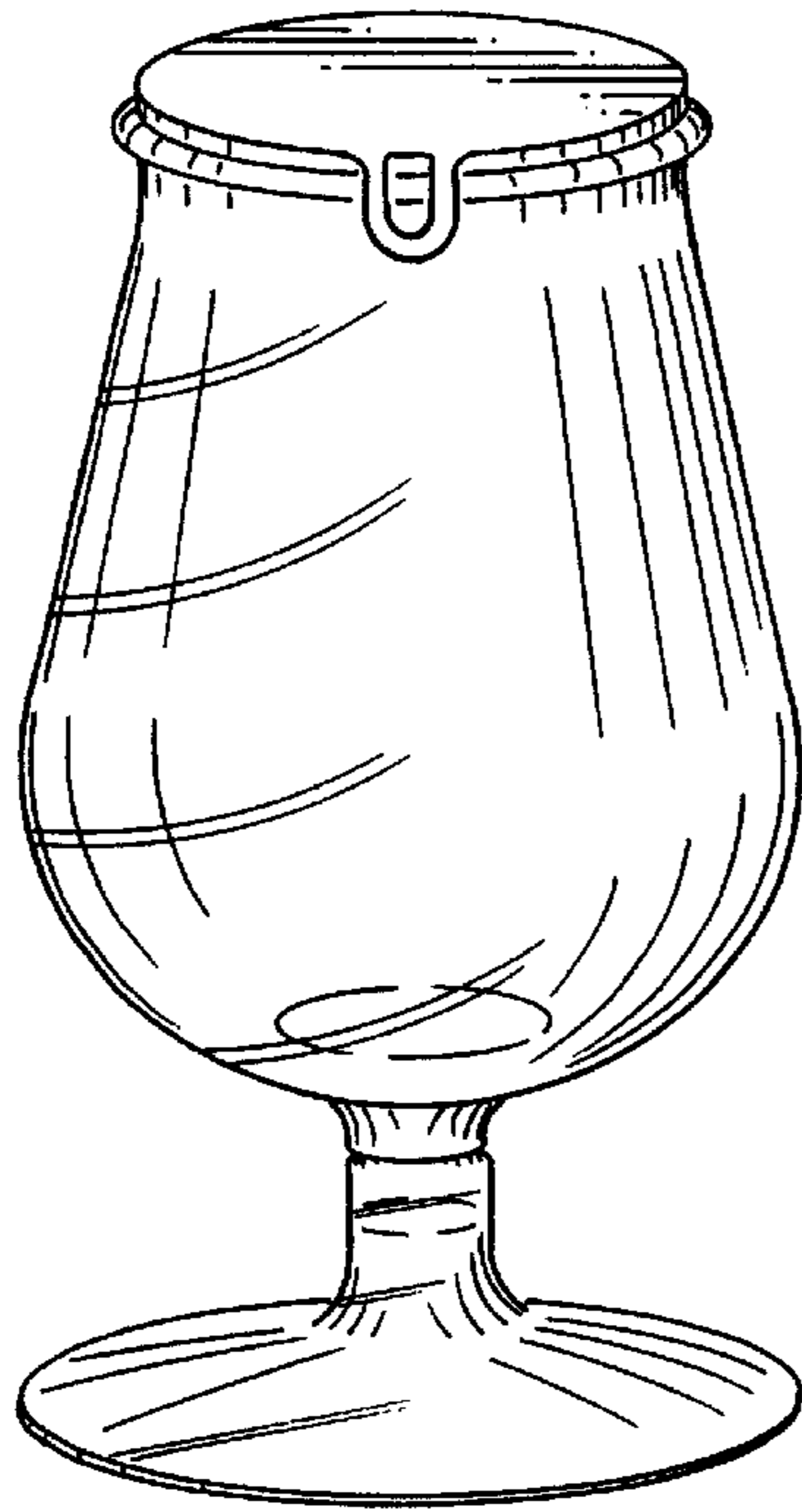
FIG. 3 is a perspective view of a third embodiment of our new design;

FIG. 4 is a perspective view of a fourth embodiment of our new design;

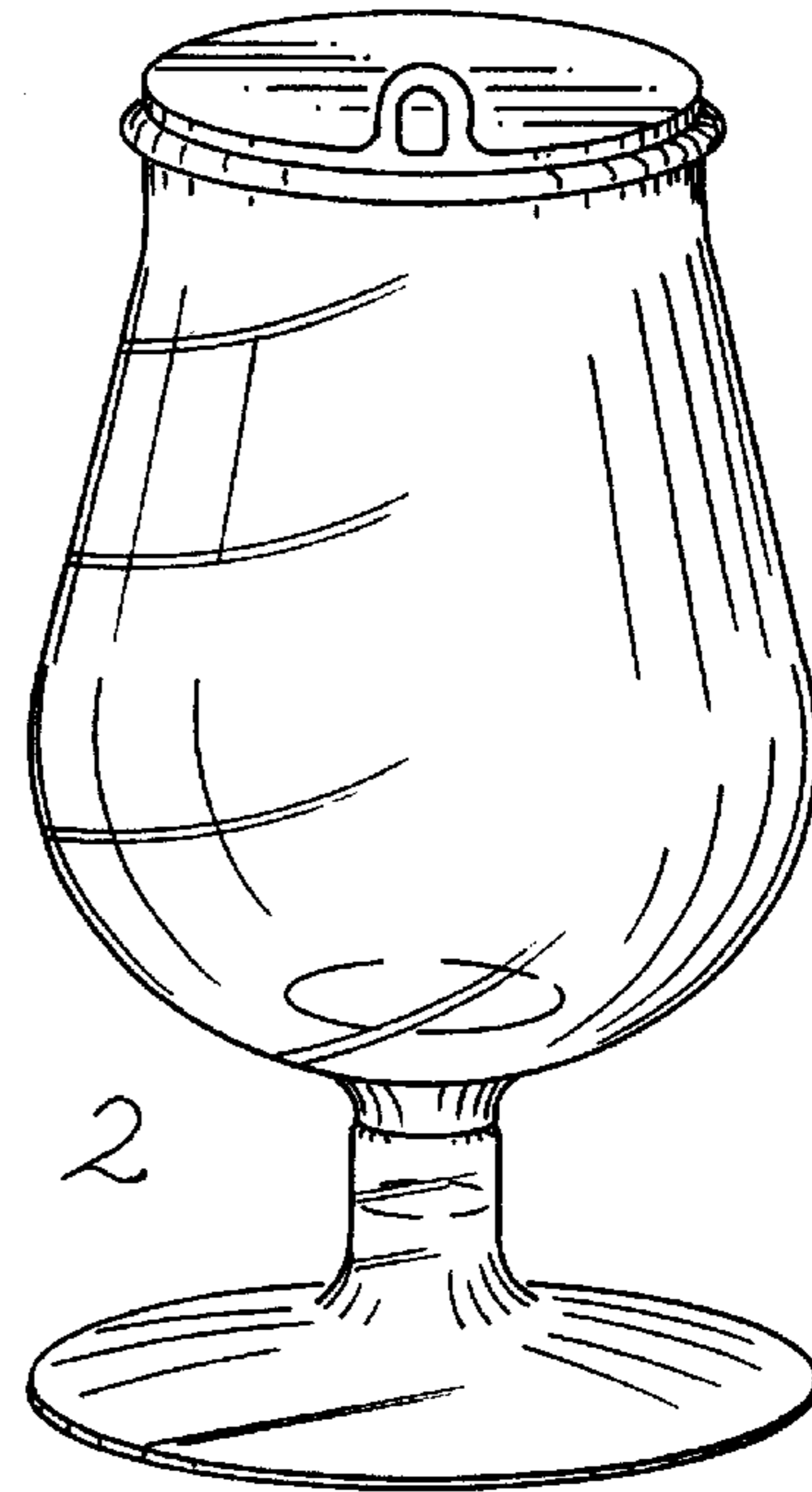
FIG. 5 is a top plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 2; and, FIG. 6 is a top plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 4.

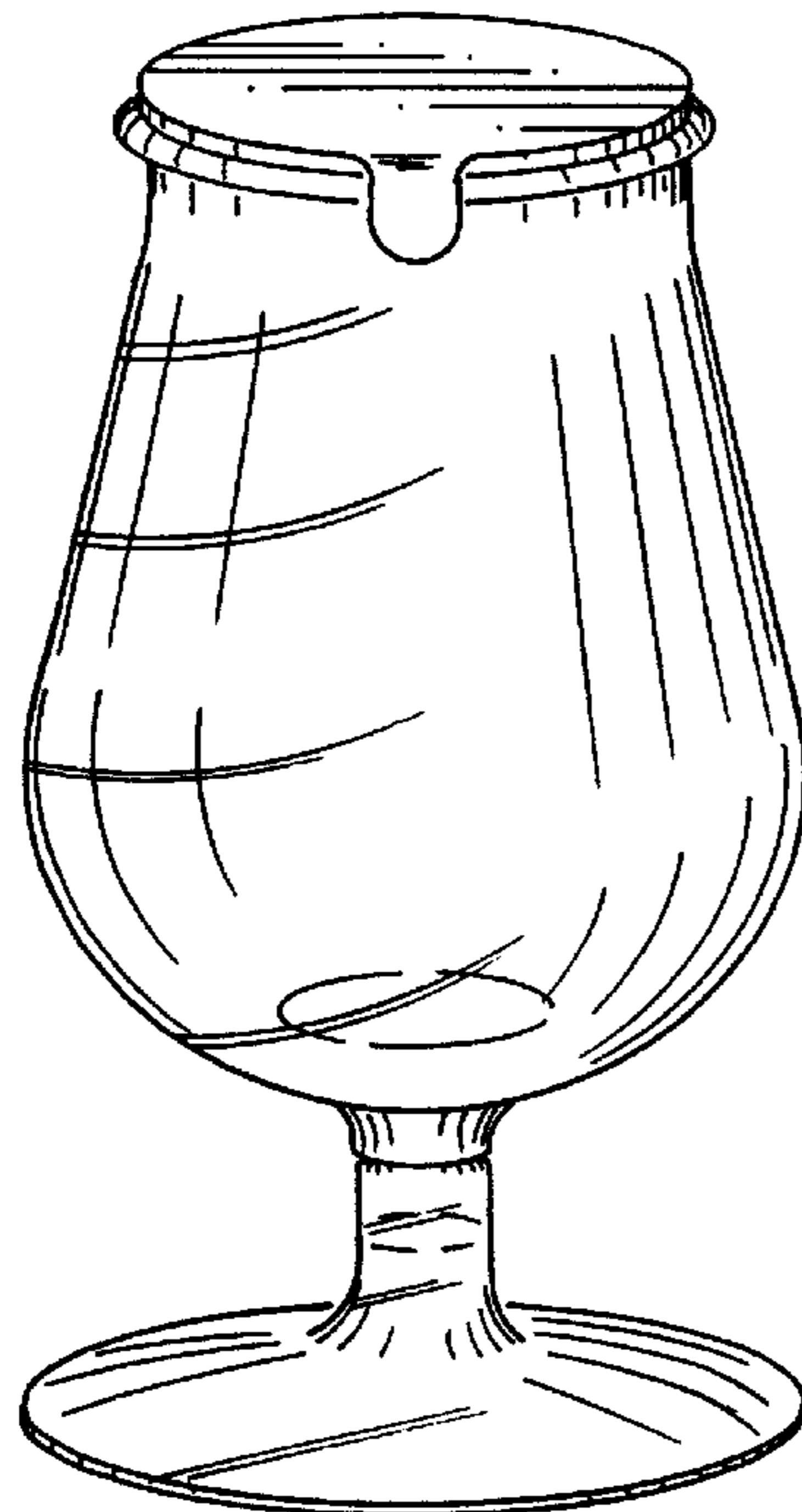




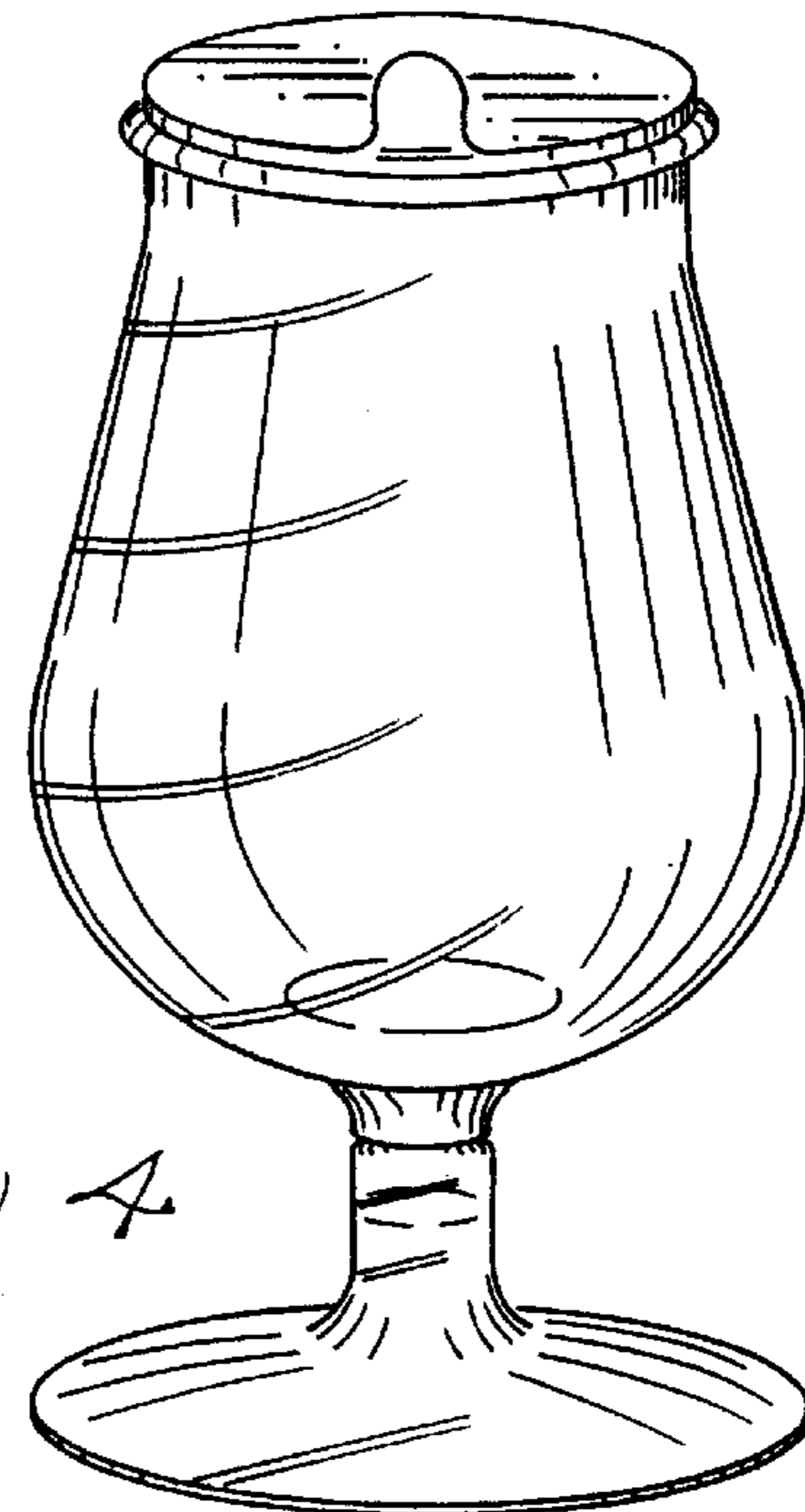

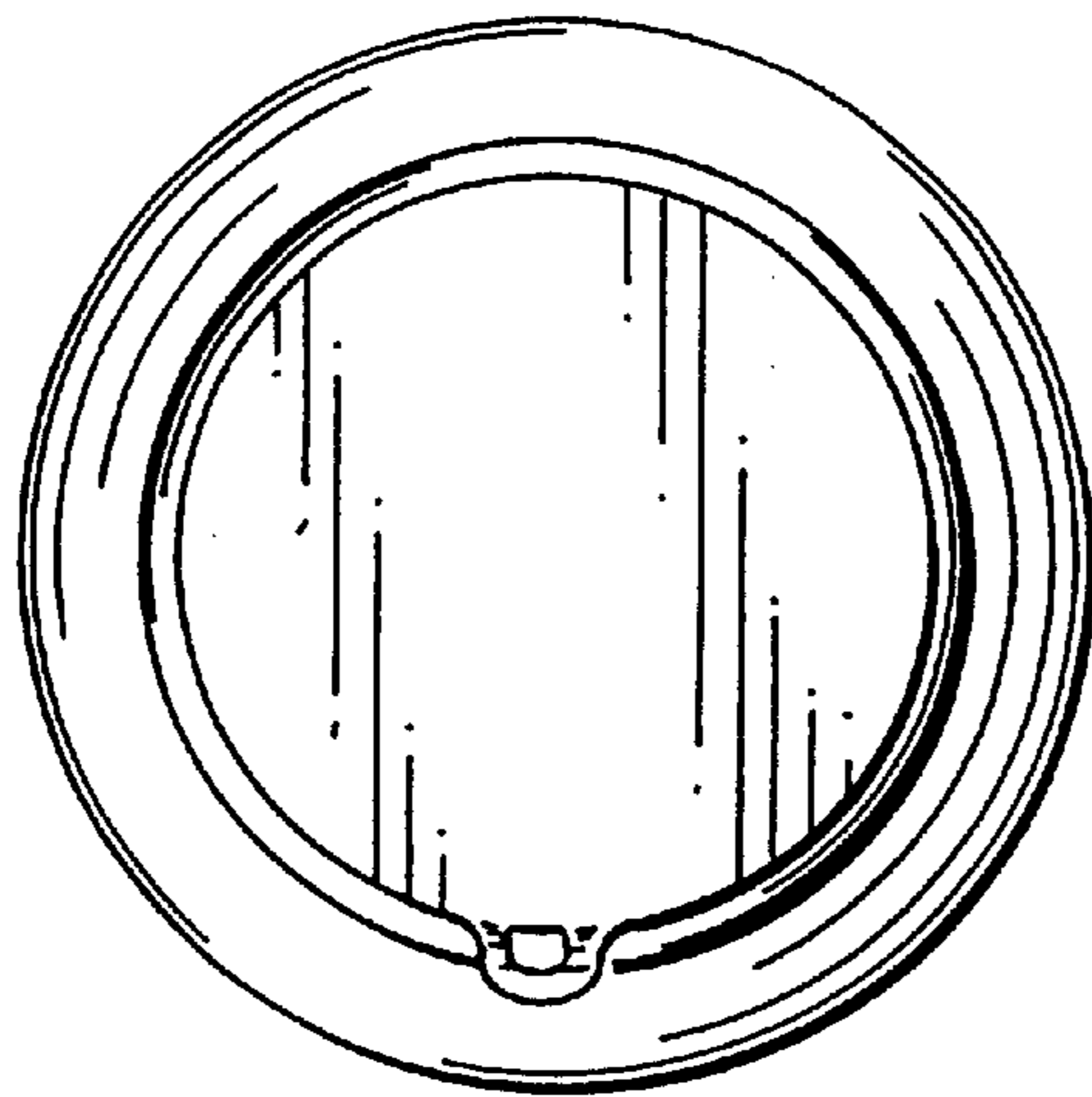

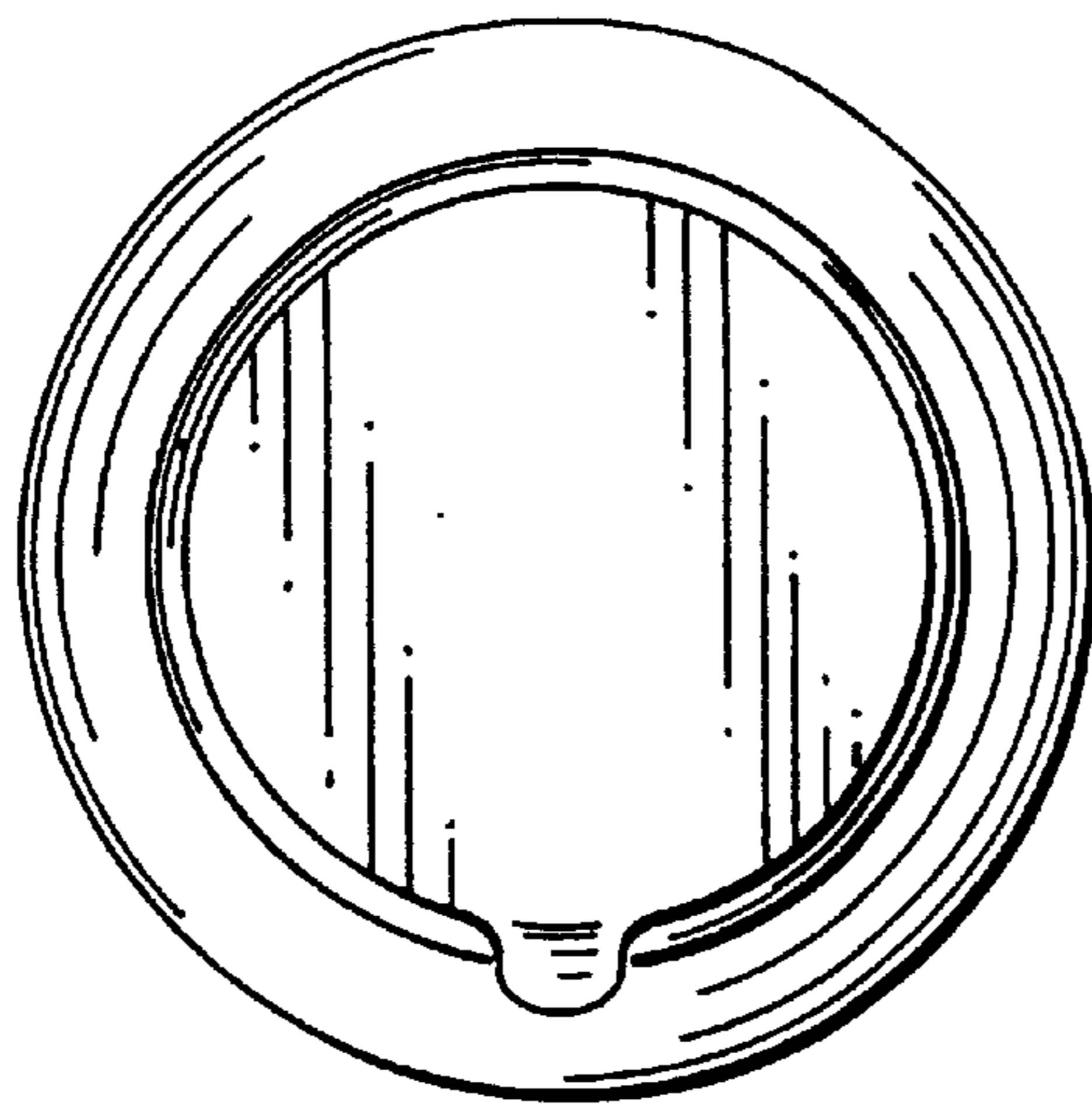
