The ornamental design for a baster, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the baster;
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the baster, the rear view of which is identical;
FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the baster, the opposite side of which is identical;
FIG. 4 is a top plan view of the baster;
FIG. 5 is a bottom plan view of the baster;
FIG. 6 is a perspective view of the baster illustrating a first attachment; and,
FIG. 7 is a perspective view of the baster illustrating a second attachment.
