(57)**CLAIM**

The ornamental design for a carousel saddle rack, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a top plan view of the carousel saddle rack of FIG.

FIG. 2 is a side elevational view of a carousel saddle rack illustrating one embodiment of the new design in which the saddle holders of the carousel saddle rack do not include pad bars;

FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the carousel saddle rack of FIG. 2 in which the carousel saddle rack has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 2;

FIG. 4 is a top plan view of the carousel saddle rack of FIG. **5**;

FIG. 5 is a side elevational view of a carousel saddle rack illustrating another embodiment of the new design in which the saddle holders of the carousel saddle rack include pad bars;

FIG. 6 is a side elevational view of the carousel saddle rack of FIG. 5 in which the carousel saddle rack has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 5;

FIG. 7 is a top plan view of the base of the carousel saddle racks of FIGS. 1–3 and FIGS. 4–6;

FIG. 8 is a side elevational view of the base of the carousel saddle racks of FIGS. 1–3 and FIGS. 4–6;

FIG. 9 is a side elevational view of the base of the carousel saddle racks of FIGS. 1–3 and FIGS. 4–6 in which the base has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 8;

FIG. 10 is a top plan view of one saddle holder of the carousel saddle rack of FIGS. 1–3, in which the saddle holder does not include pad bars;

FIG. 11 is a side elevational view of the saddle holder of FIG. **10**;

FIG. 12 is a side elevational view of the saddle holder of FIG. 10 in which the saddle holder has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 11;

FIG. 13 is a top plan view of one saddle holder of the carousel saddle rack of FIGS. 4–6, in which the saddle holder includes pad bars;

FIG. 14 is a side elevational view of the saddle holder of FIG. **13**;


FIG. 15 is a side elevational view of the saddle holder of FIG. 13 in which the saddle holder has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 14;

FIG. 16 is a side elevational view of a carousel saddle rack illustrating another embodiment of the new design, in which an adapter has been used to increase the number of saddle holders on the carousel saddle rack; and,

FIG. 17 is a side elevational view of the carousel saddle rack of FIG. 16, in which the carousel saddle rack has been rotated 90° in relation to FIG. 16.


The top plan view of the embodiment of FIG. 16 is the same as the top view shown in FIGS. 1 and 4.







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
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













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




