DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a front view of an apron combined with hooks,
showing my new design, with parts of the straps shown
broken away for convenience of illustration.

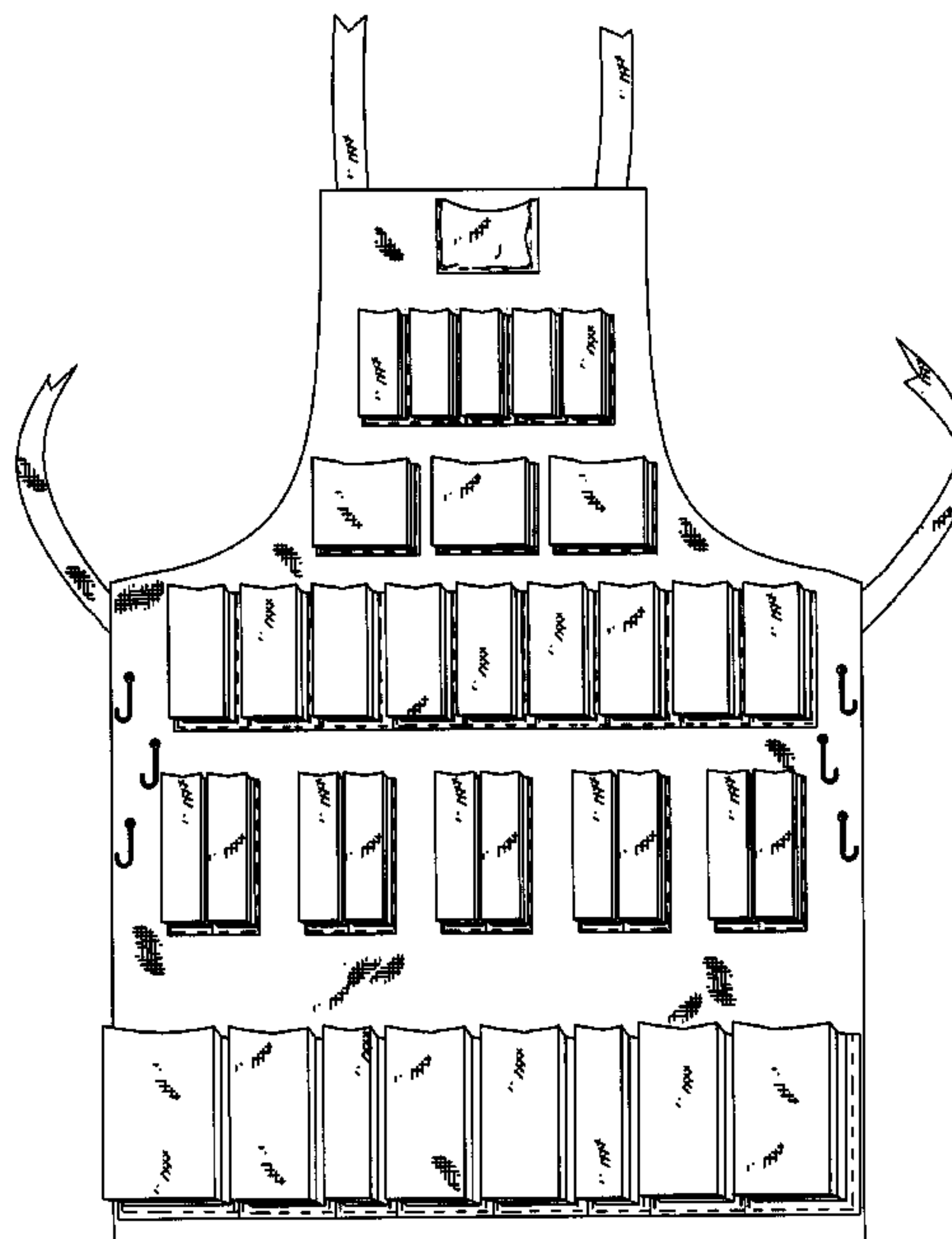
FIG. 2 is a left side view thereof; and,

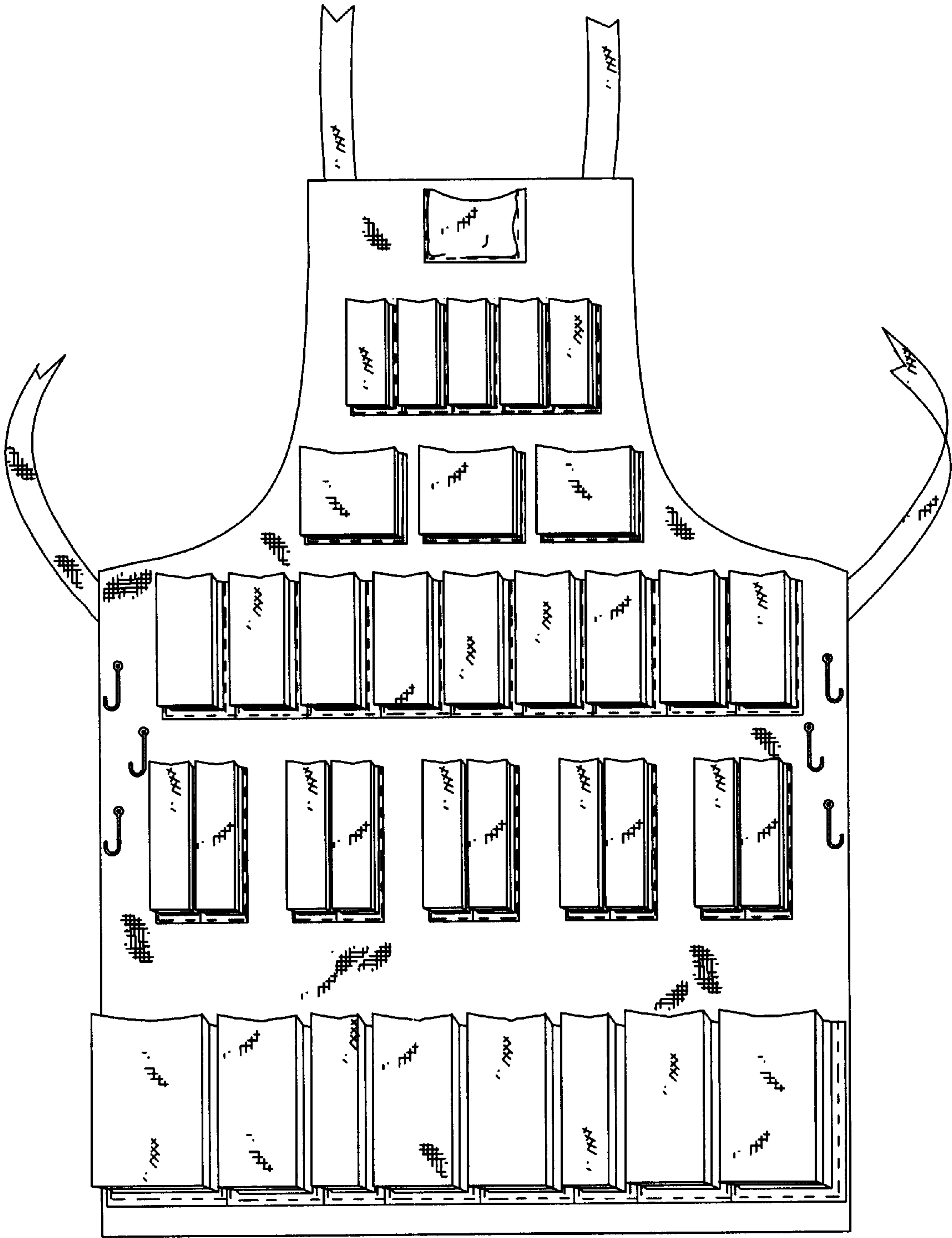

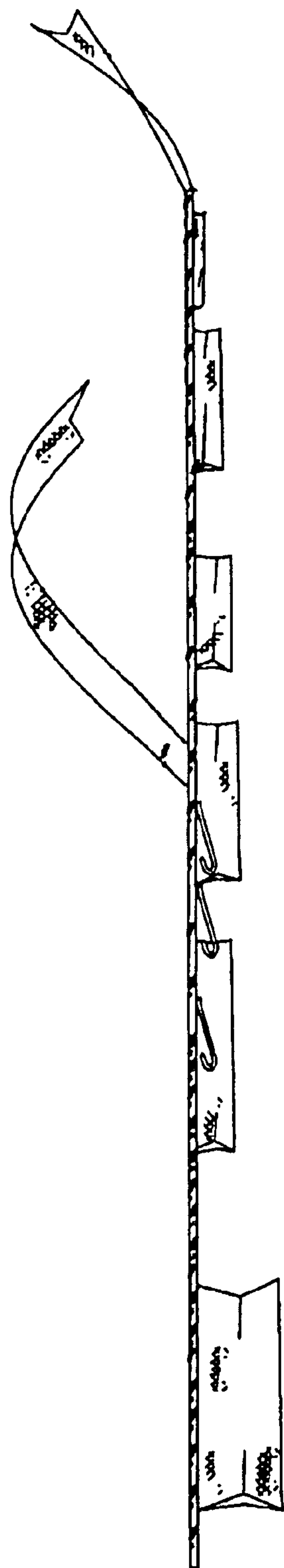

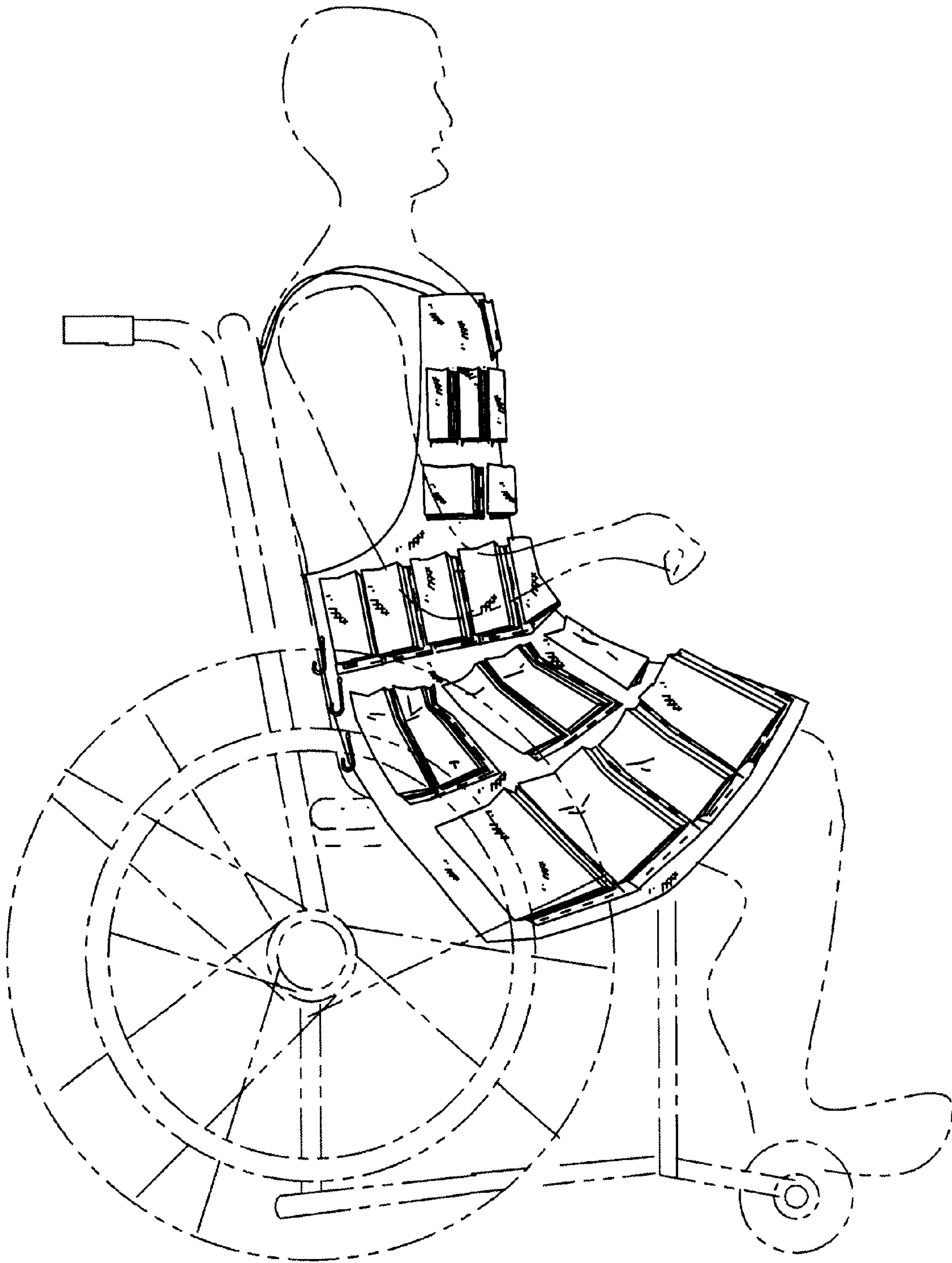
