DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a perspective view of a gaming machine door in accordance with a first embodiment of the present invention. The gaming machine housing, buttons, coin acceptor, bumper and media reader shown in broken lines illustrate an environment of the claimed design and do not form a portion of the claimed design.

FIG. 2 is a top view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 1.

FIG. 3 is a side view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 1.

FIG. 4 is a front view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 1.

FIG. 5 is a bottom view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 1.

FIG. 6 is a perspective view of a gaming machine door in accordance with a second embodiment of the present invention, the gaming machine door including a coin tray. The gaming machine housing, buttons, coin acceptor, media reader and speakers shown in broken lines illustrate an environment of the claimed design and do not form a portion of the claimed design.

FIG. 7 is a top view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 6.

FIG. 8 is a side view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 6.

FIG. 9 is a front view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 6; and,

FIG. 10 is a bottom view of the gaming machine door illustrated in FIG. 6.
