FIG. 1 is a perspective view of the combined debris collection and dump container, showing the front wall, the right side wall, and a portion of the interior of the container.

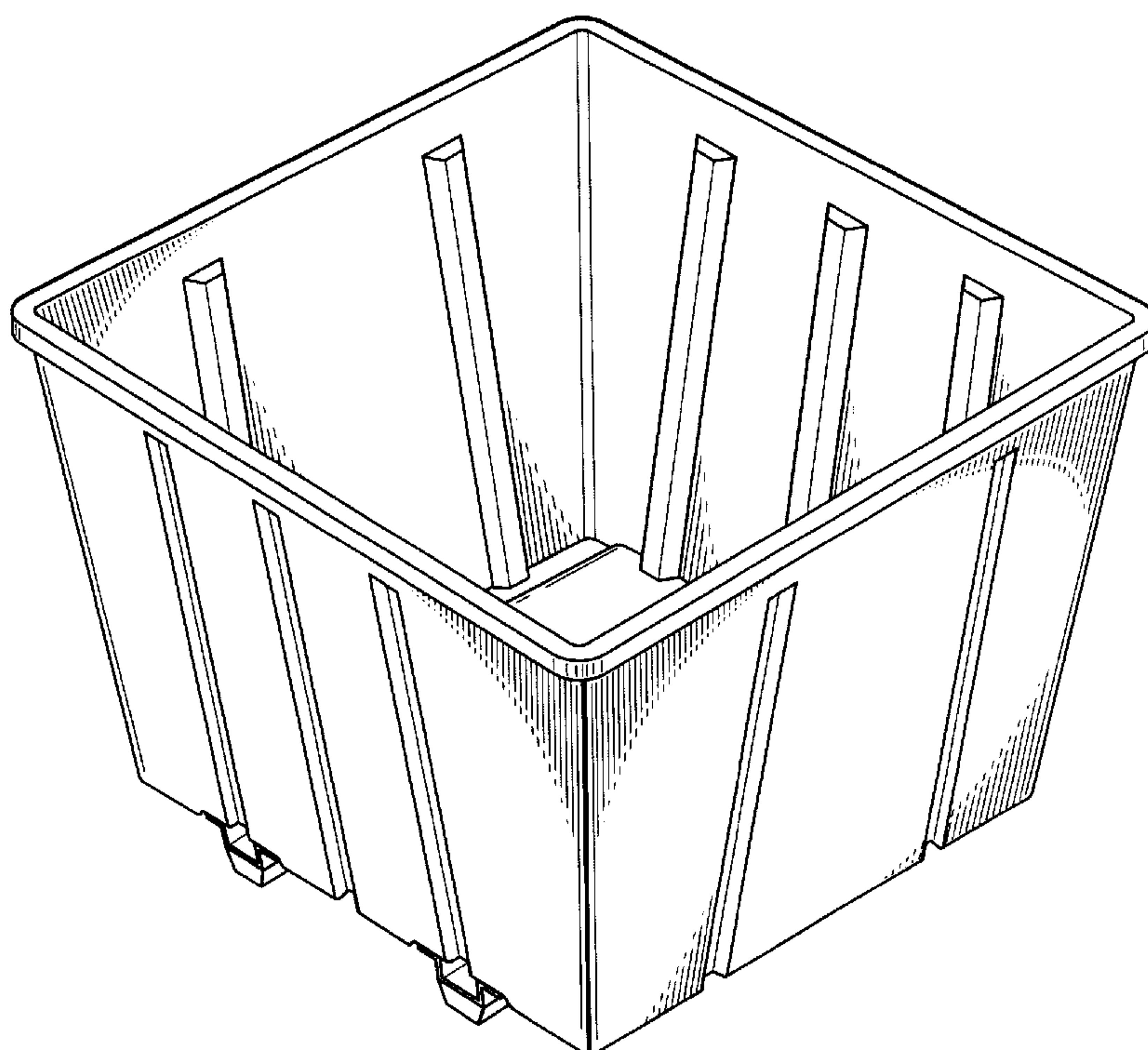
FIG. 2 is a front elevational view of the container, with the opposite side being a mirror image thereof;

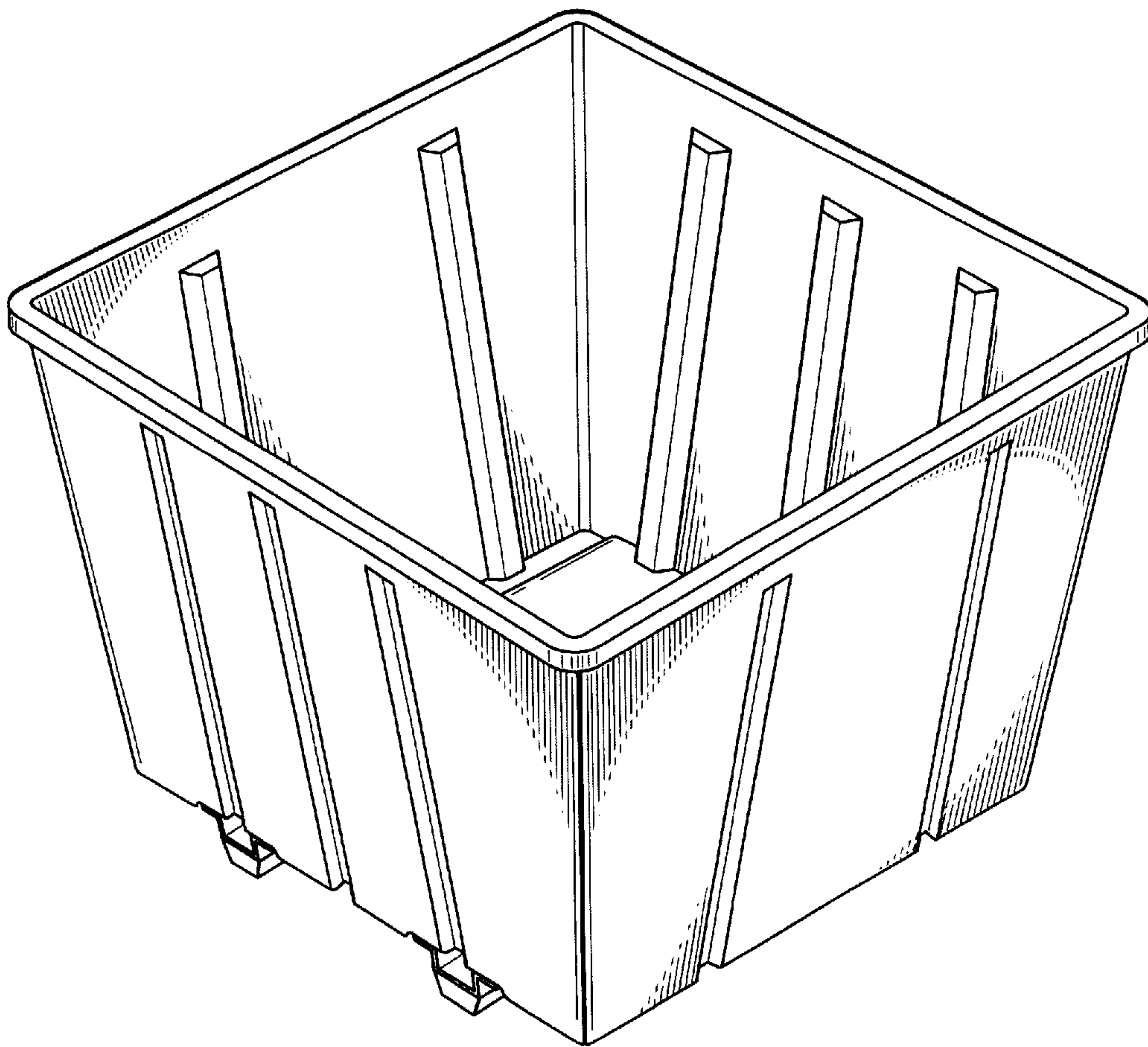

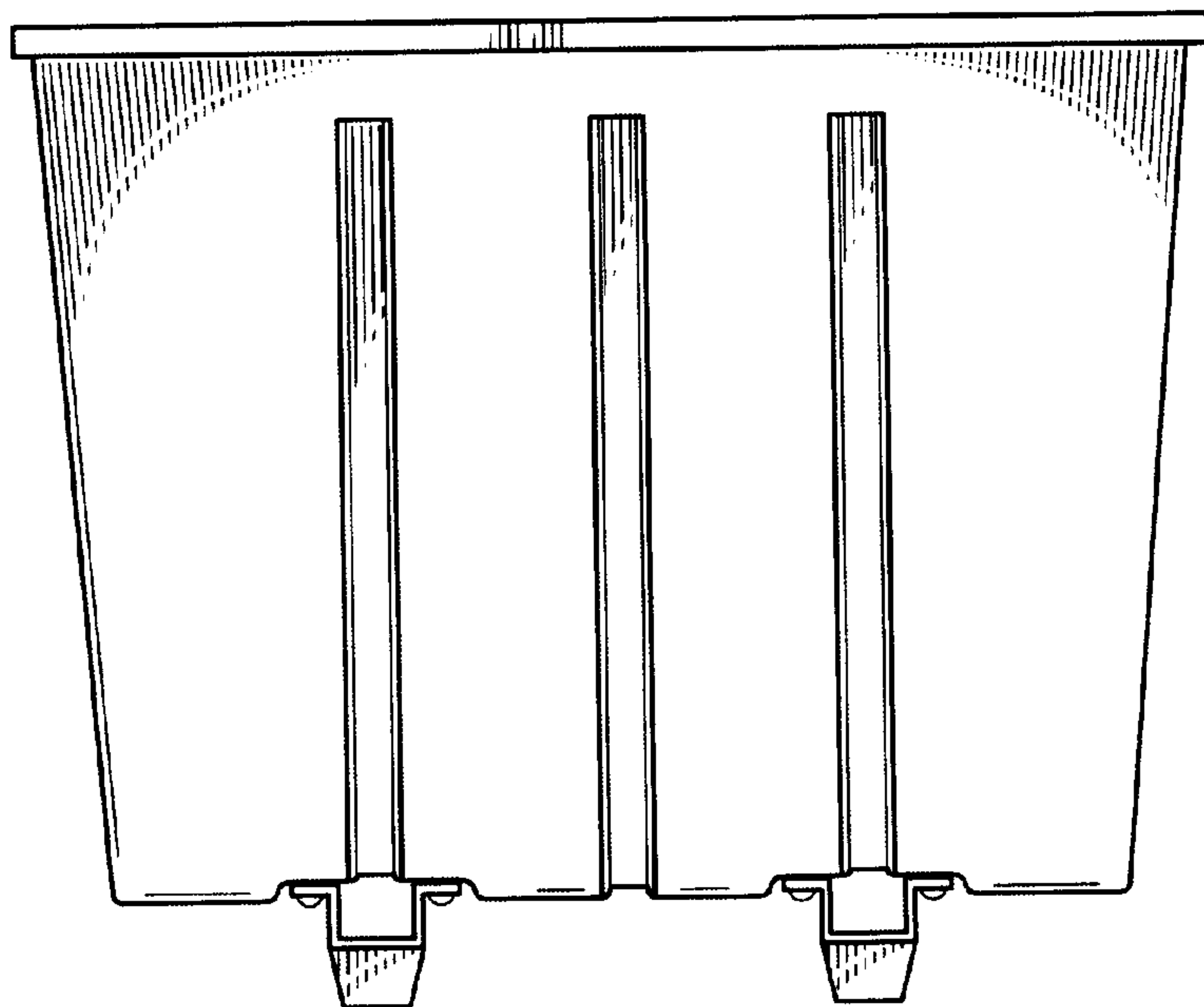

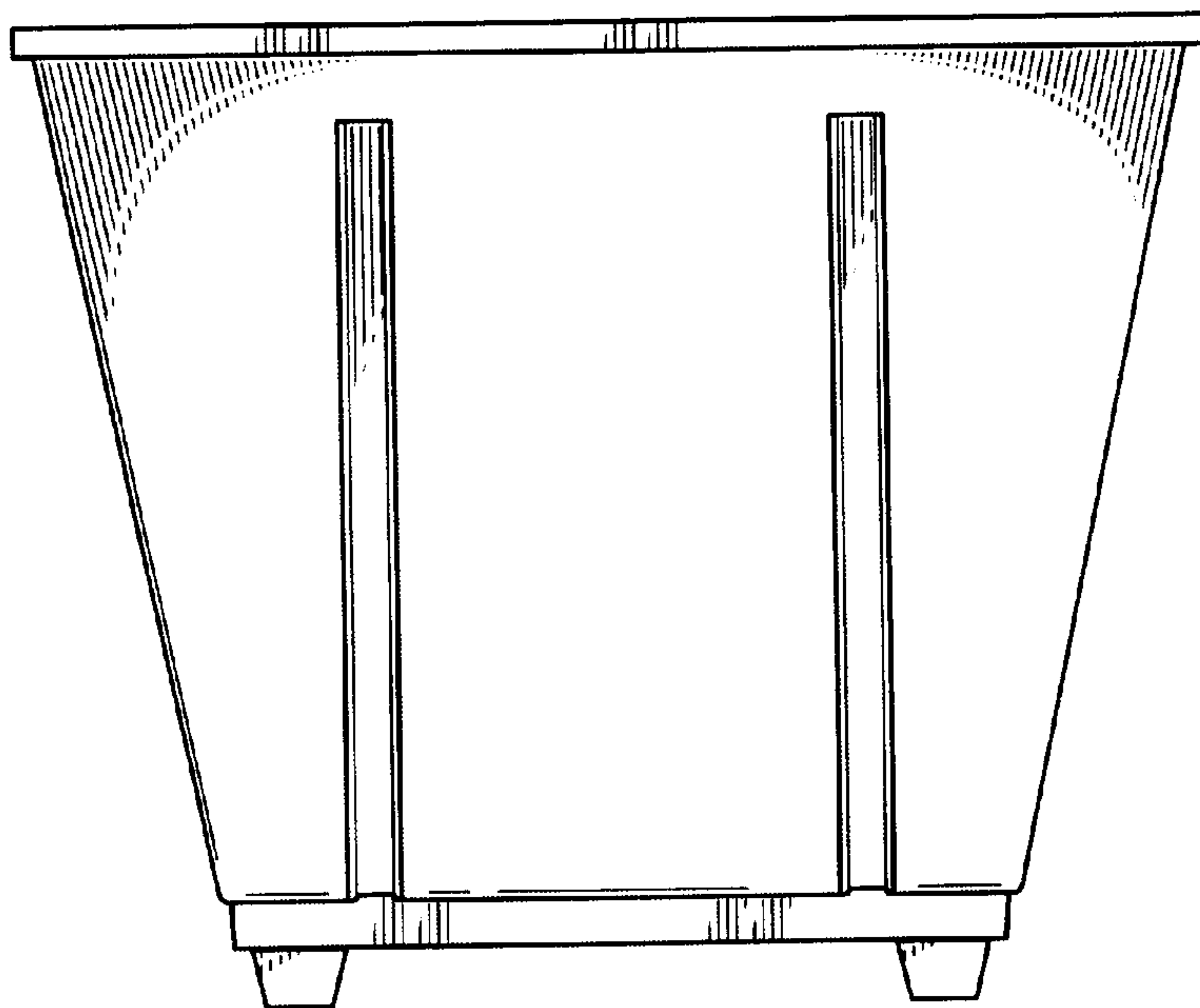

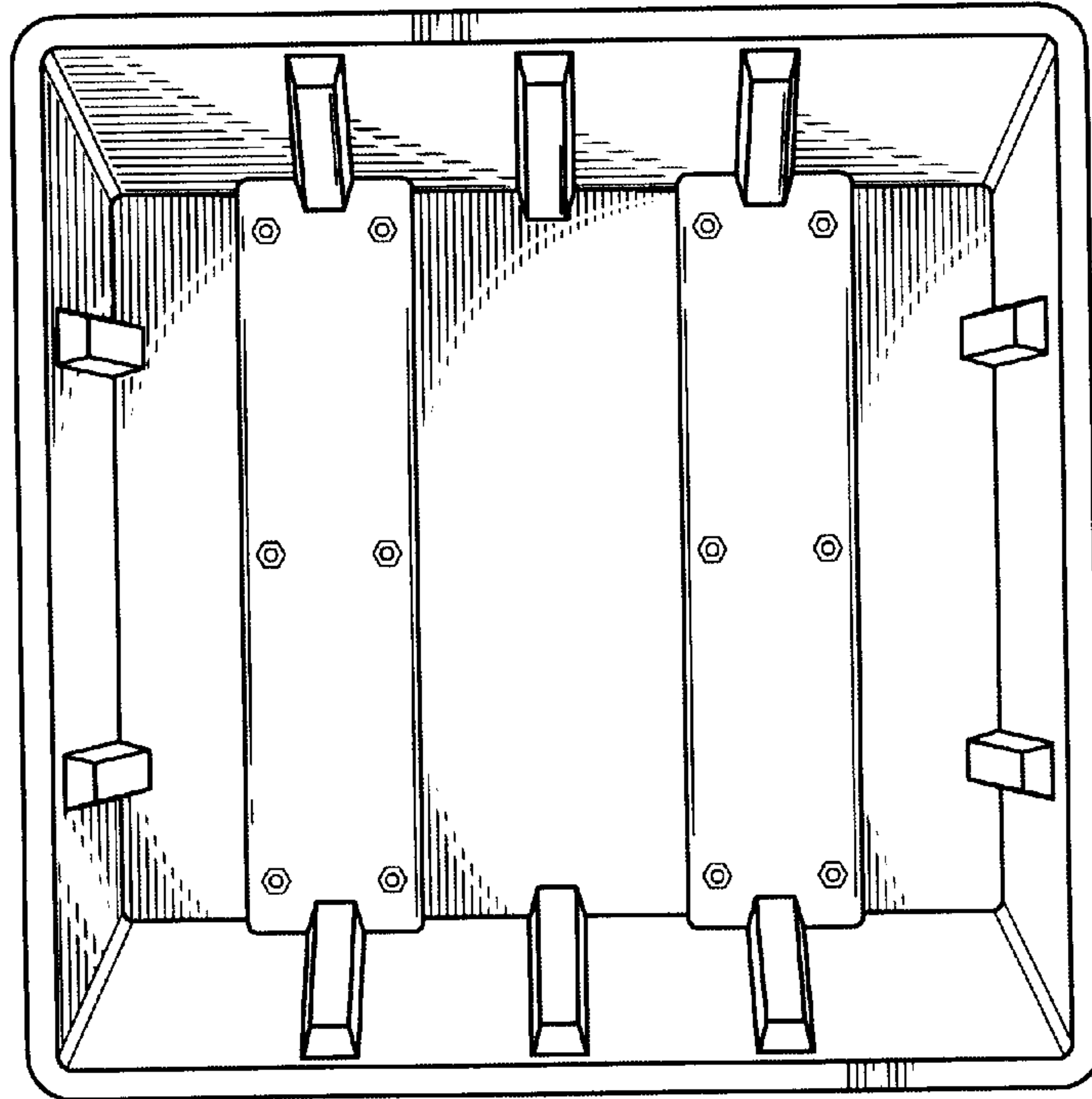

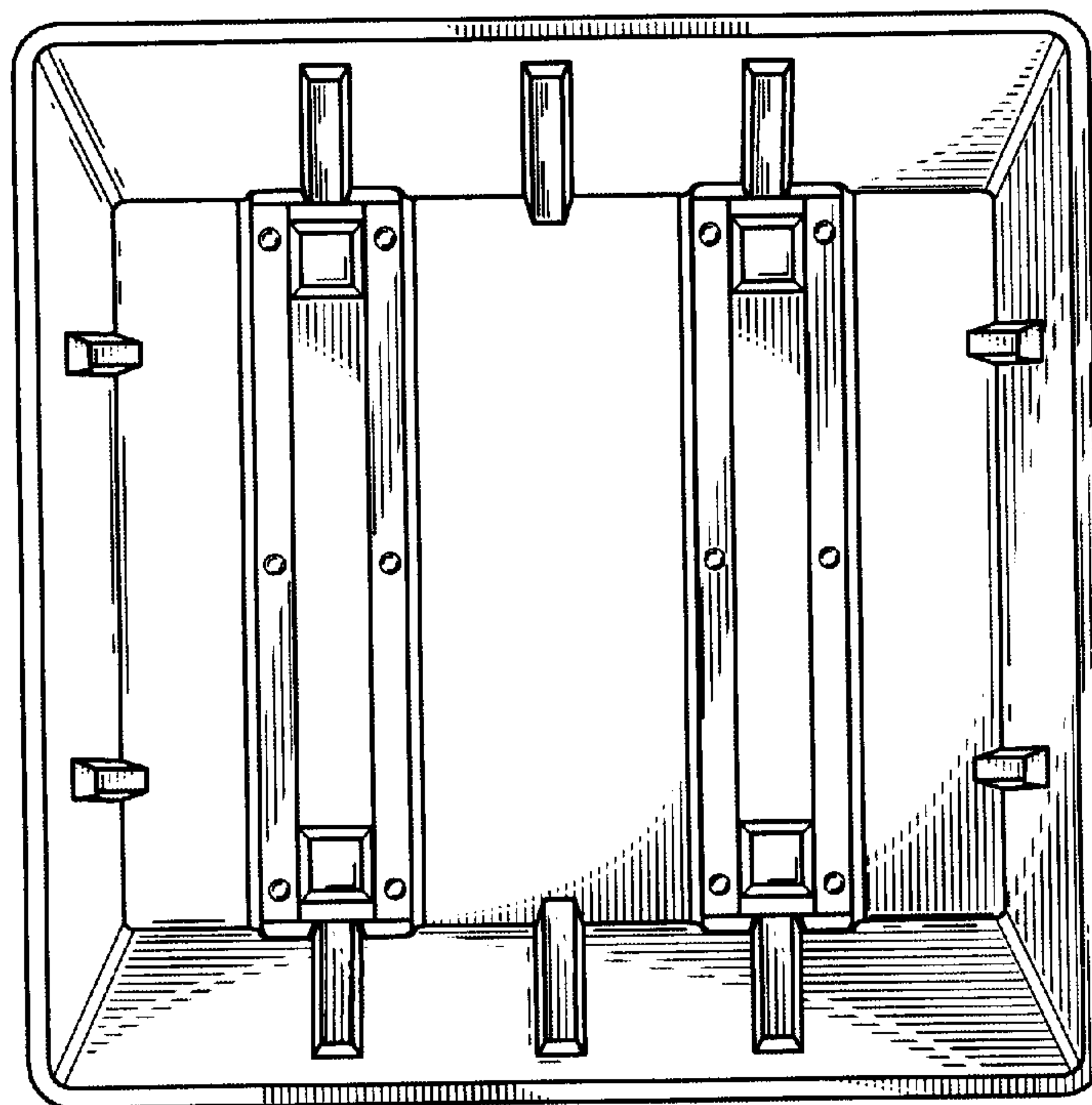
