The ornamental design for a board for practicing chip tricks, as shown and described.


DESCRIPTION


FIG. 1 is a front elevational perspective view of the board for practicing chip tricks, shown holding numerous poker chips thereon;

- FIG. 2 is a top plan view of the board for practicing chip tricks;
- FIG. 3 is a side elevational view of the board for practicing chip tricks, the opposite side view being identical to this side view;
- FIG. 4 is front elevational view of the board for practicing chip tricks, the rear view being identical to this front view;
- FIG. 5 is a bottom view of the board for practicing chip tricks;
- FIG. 6 is a top plan view of a second embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks;
- FIG. 7 is a side elevational view of a second embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks, the opposite side view being identical to this side view;
- FIG. 8 is front elevational view of a second embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks, the rear view being identical to this front view;
- FIG. 9 is a bottom view of a second embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks;
- FIG. 10 is a top plan view of a third embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks;
- FIG. 11 is a side elevational view of a third embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks, the opposite side view being identical to this side view;
- FIG. 12 is front elevational view of a third embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks, the rear view being identical to this front view; and,
- FIG. 13 is a bottom view of a third embodiment of the board for practicing chip tricks.

The broken line showing of numerous poker chips in FIG. 1, is for illustrative purposes only and forms no part of the claimed design.


















