The ornamental design for a seat, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a left front perspective view of a seat showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side view, the opposite side being a mirror image thereof;

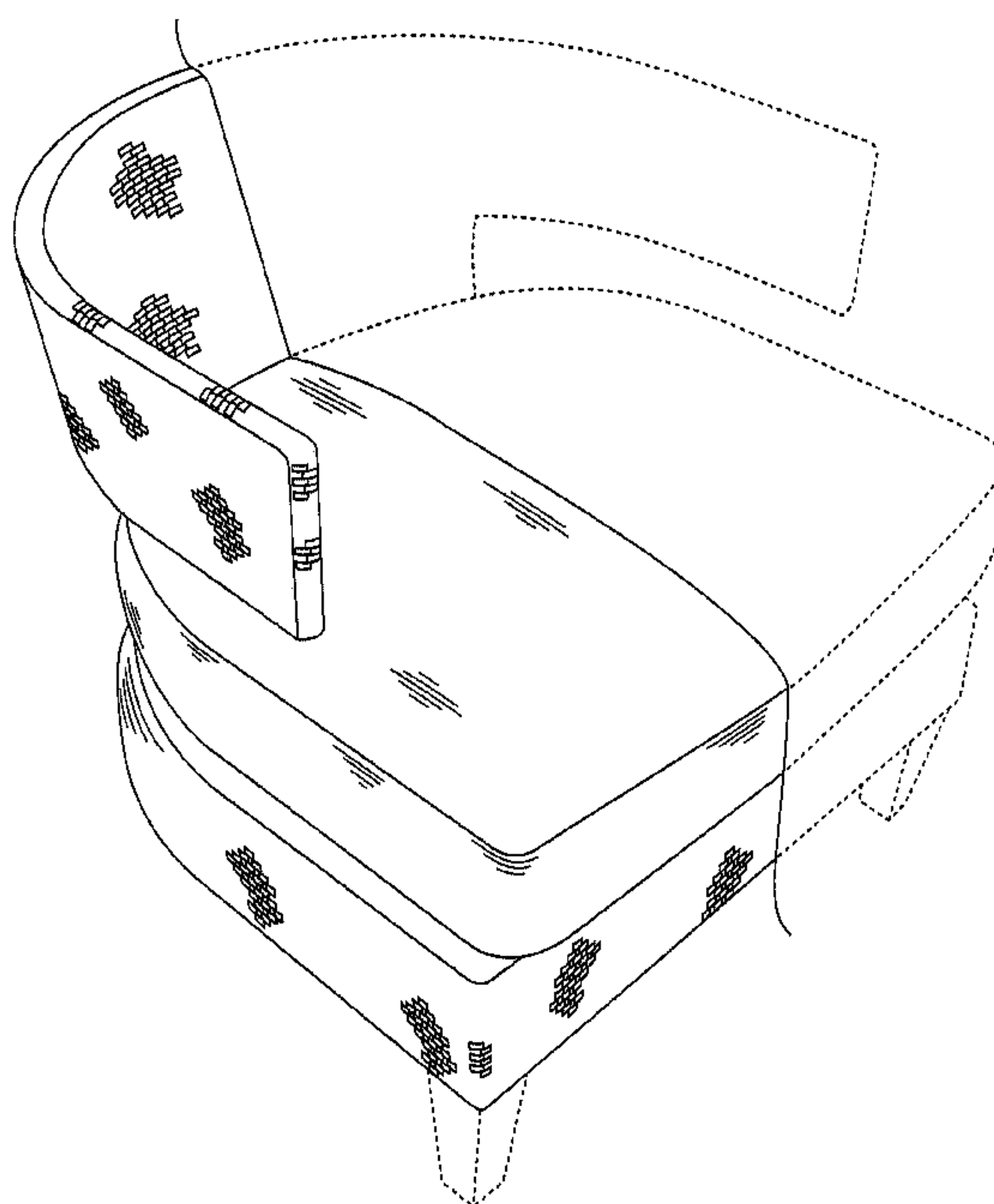
FIG. 3 is a front elevational view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a rear elevational view thereof; and,

FIG. 5 is a top view thereof.

The views of the seat not shown form no part of the claimed design. The fragmented depiction of surface ornamentation shown in FIGS. 1-5 is understood to exist uniformly across those surfaces. The broken lines depicting additional furniture portions (e.g. feet) represent environmental elements only and form no part of the claimed design.

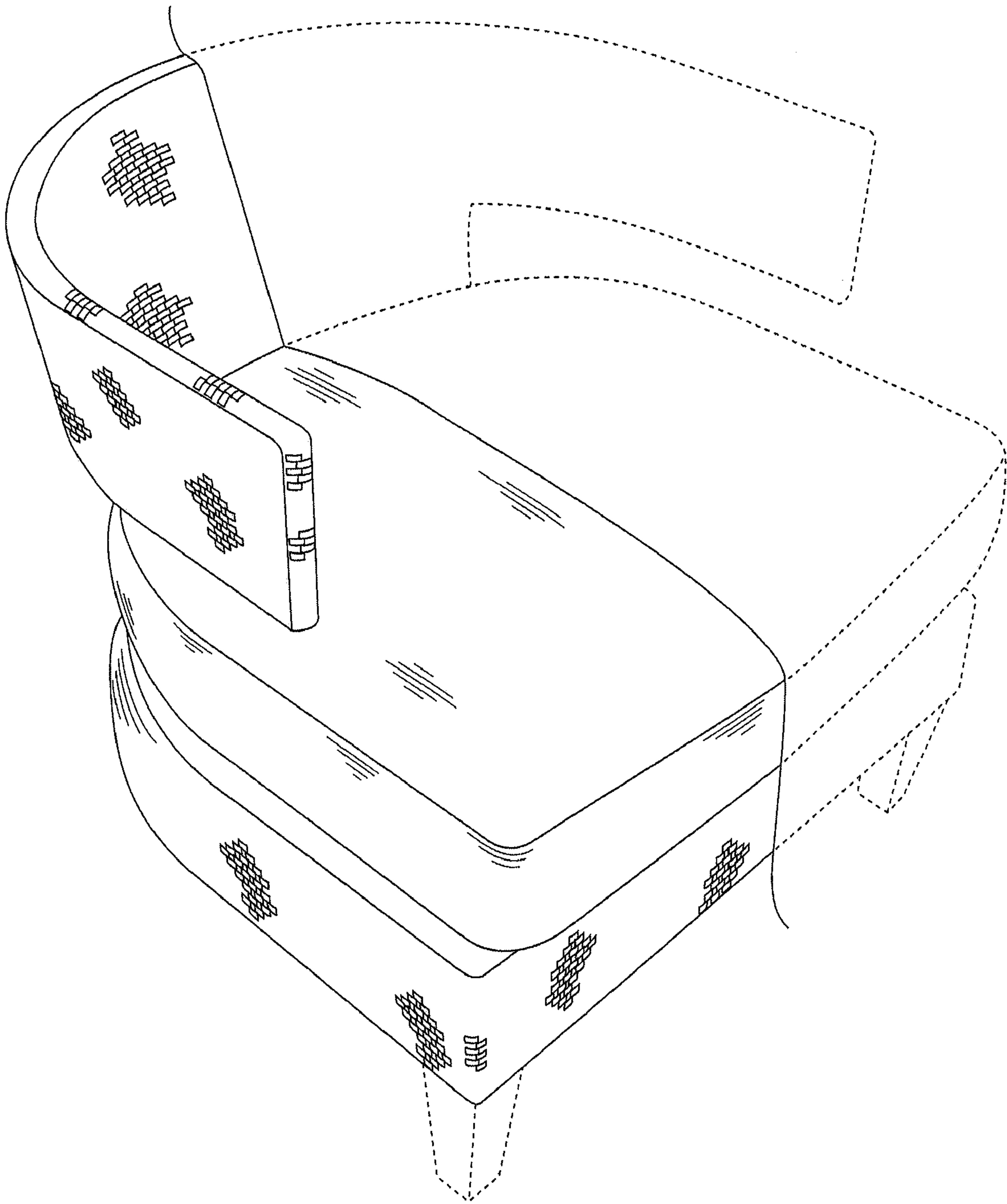

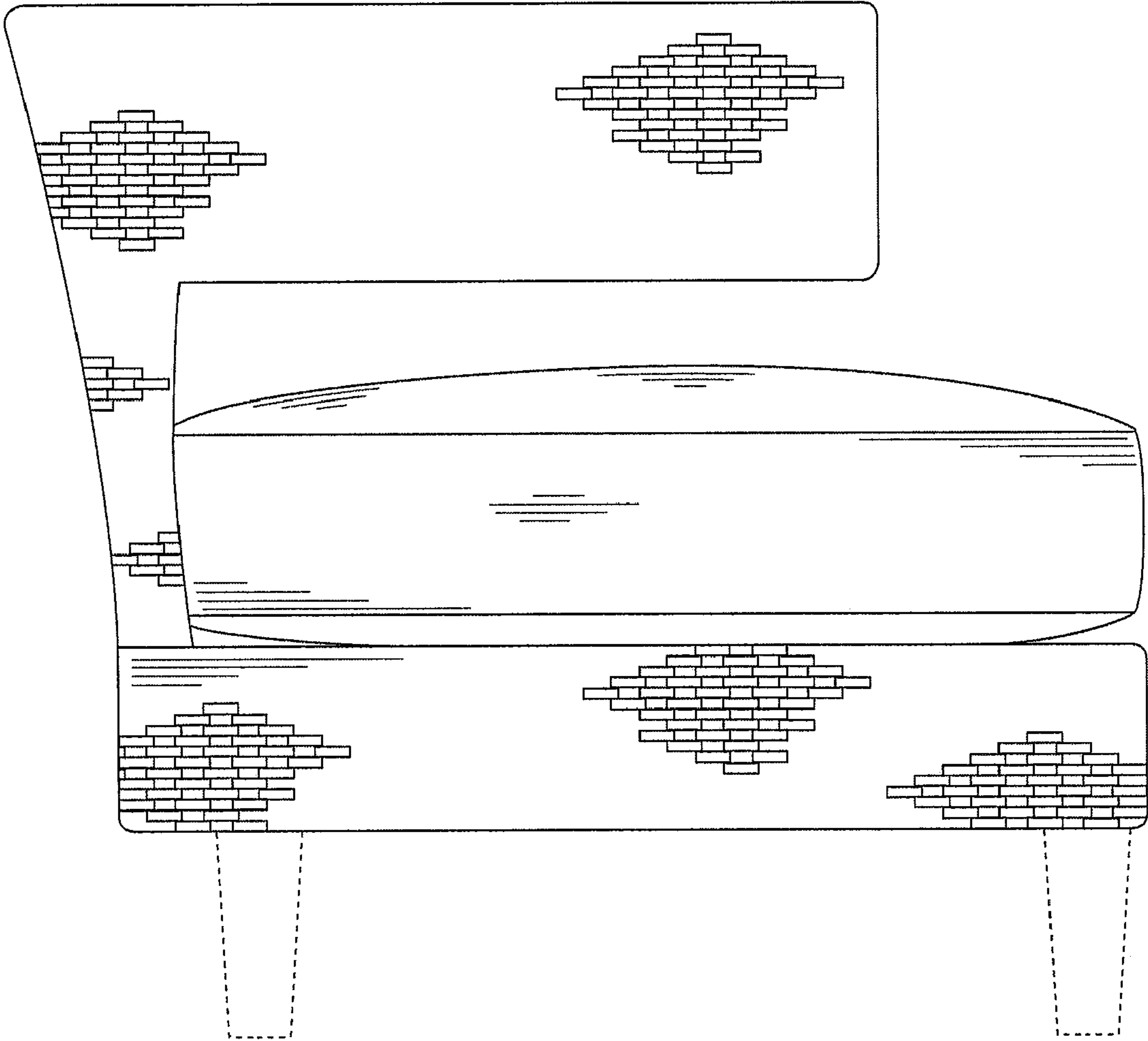

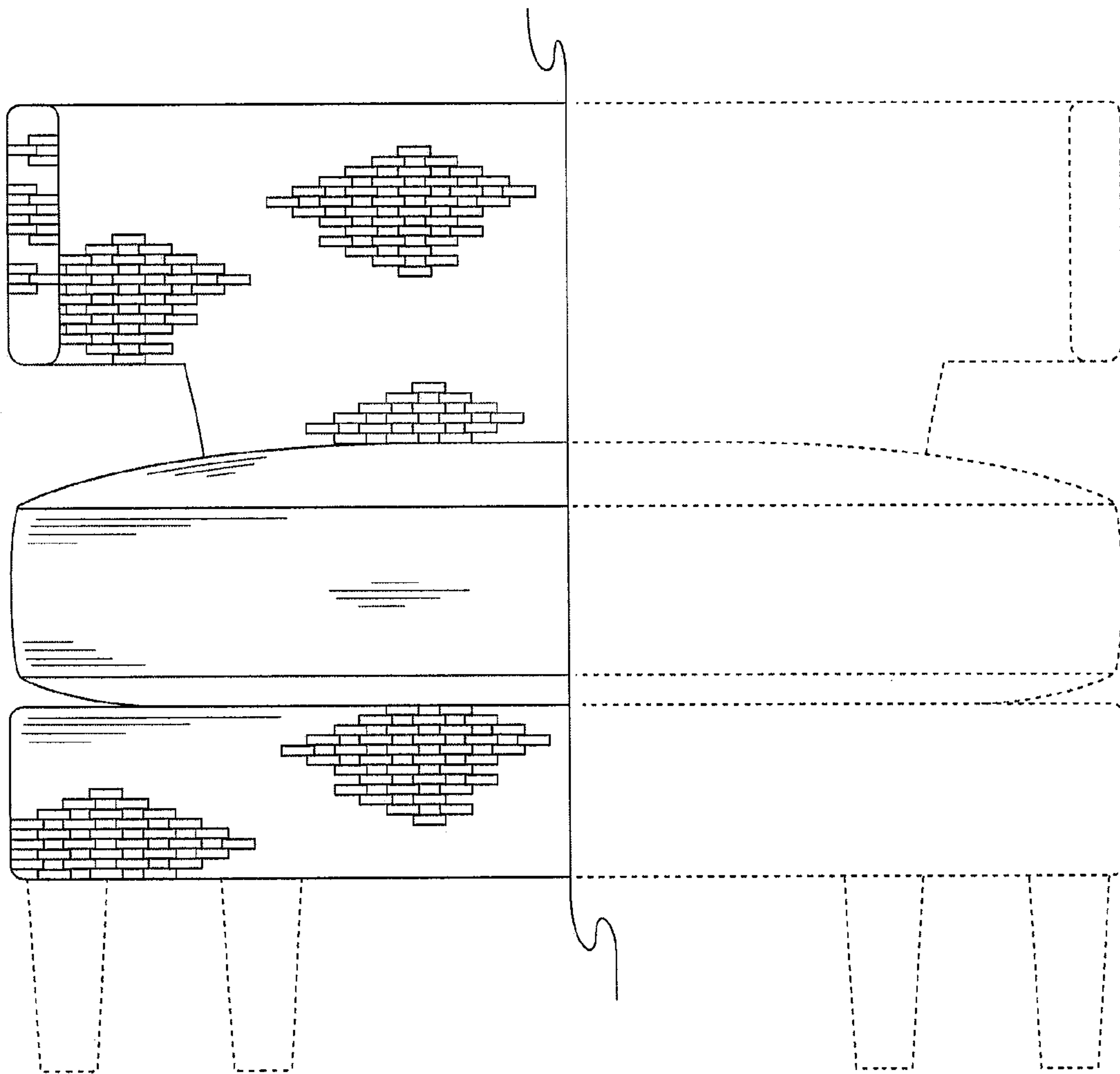

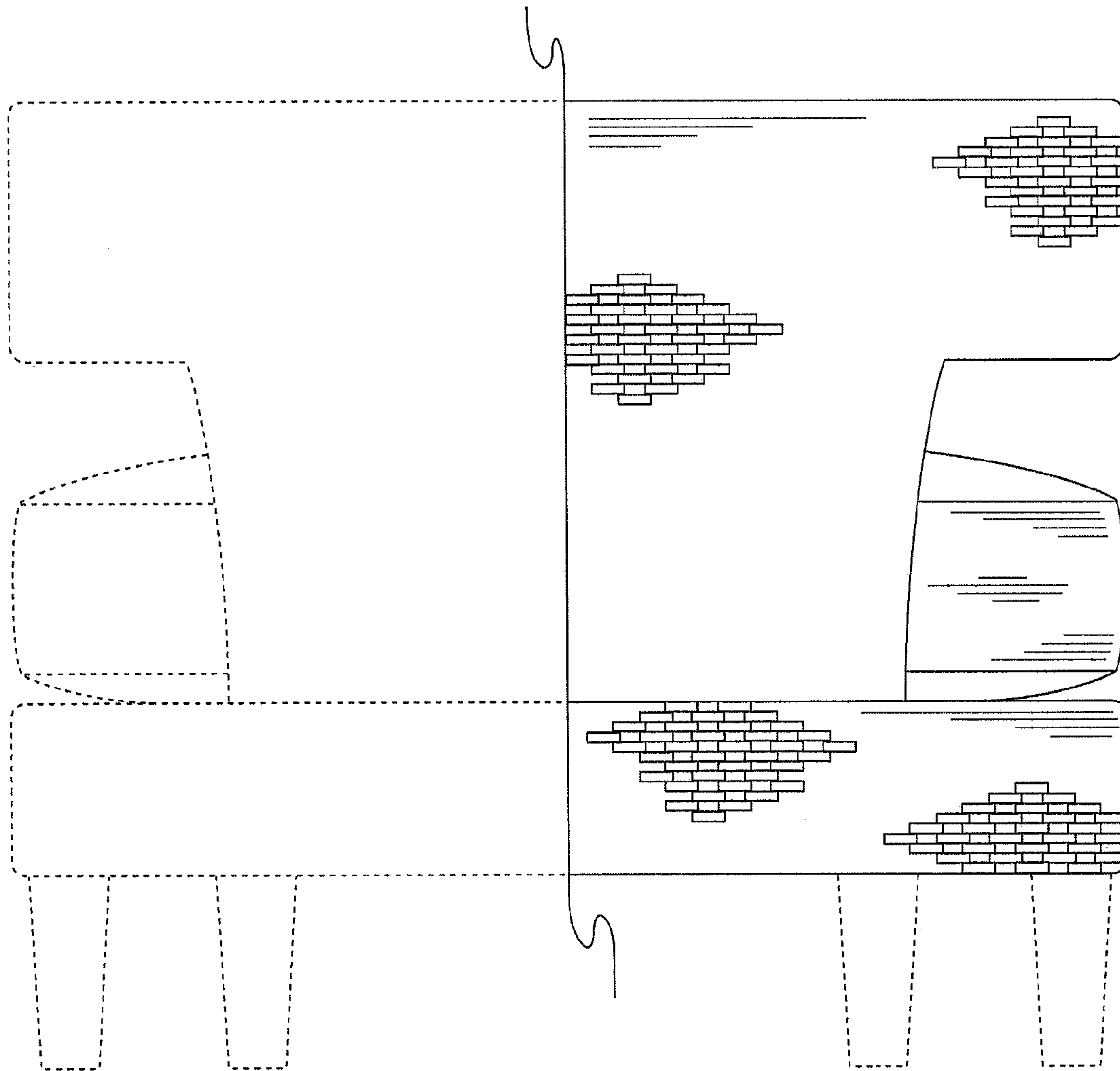

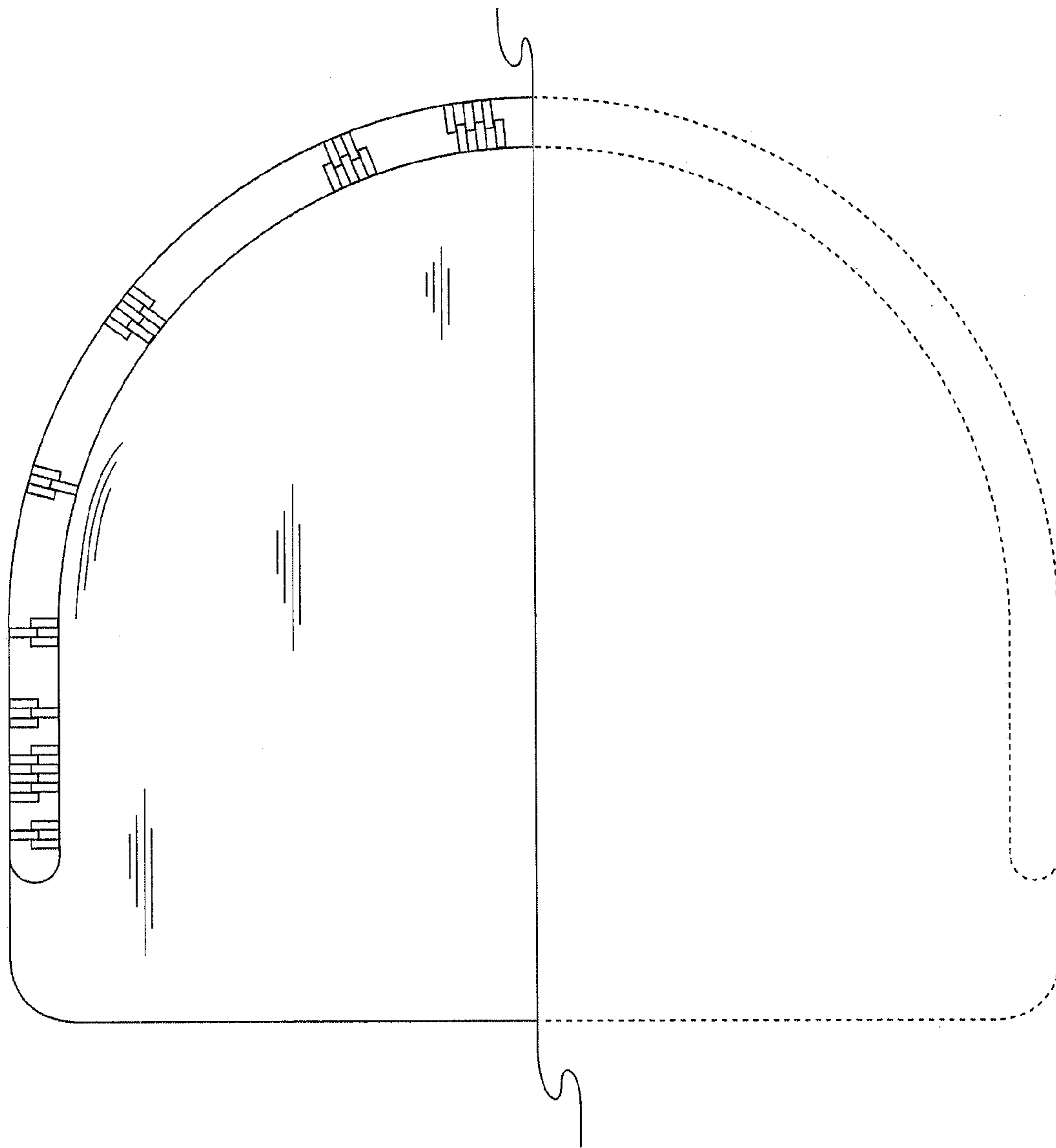
