The cross-hatched pattern shown in the drawings represents a textured, fabric surface.

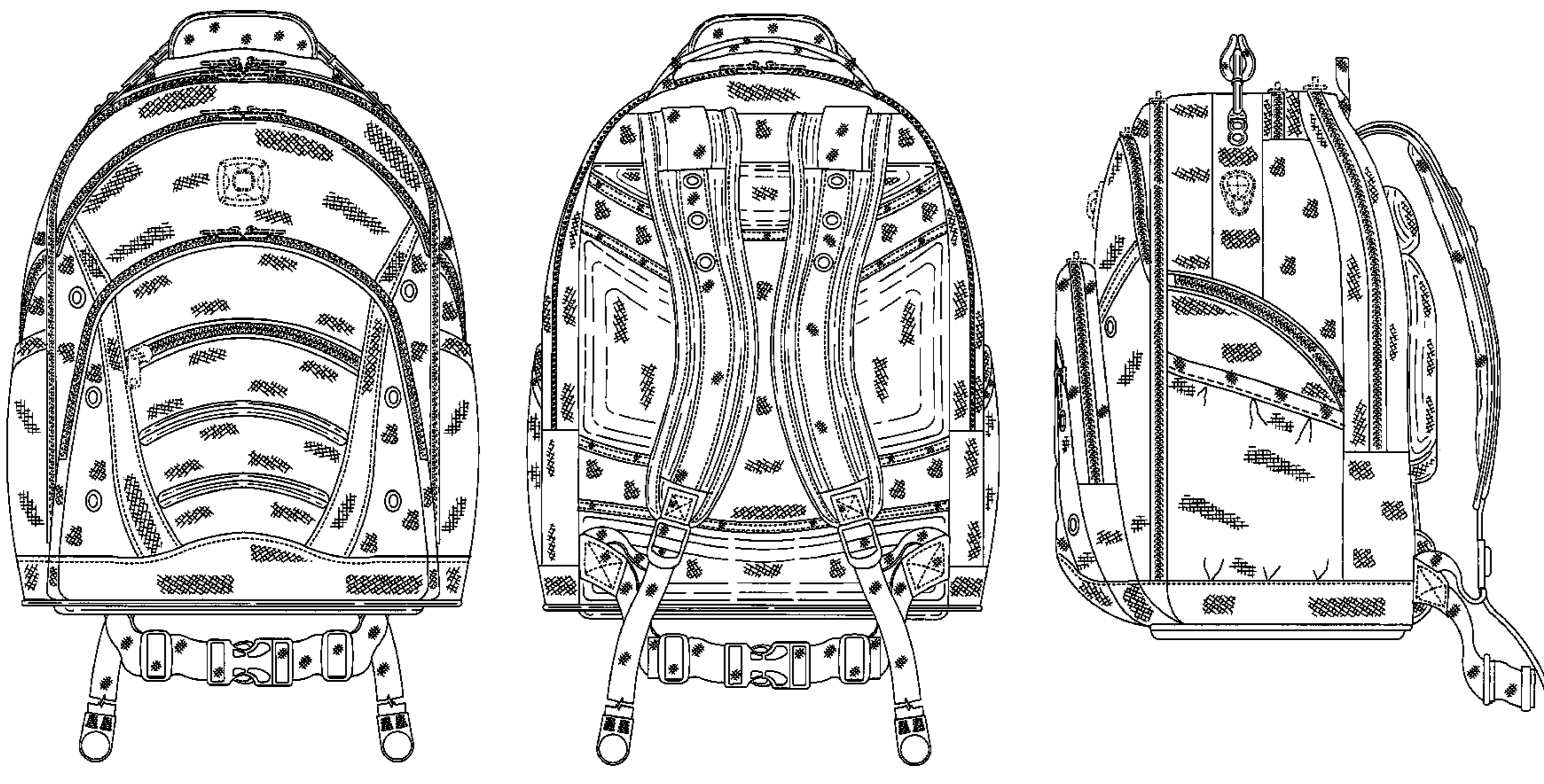
The breaking away of straps represents indeterminate length.

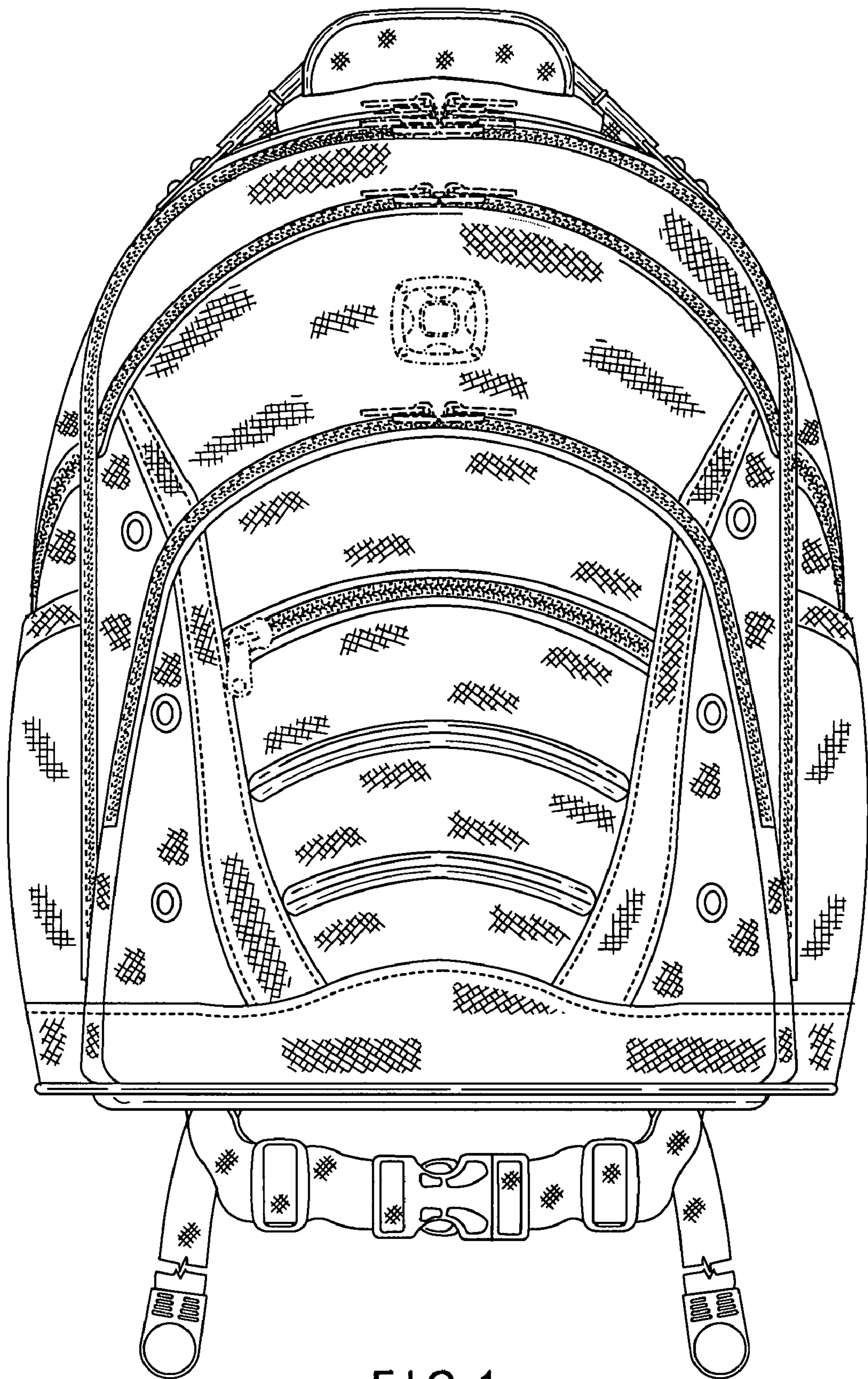

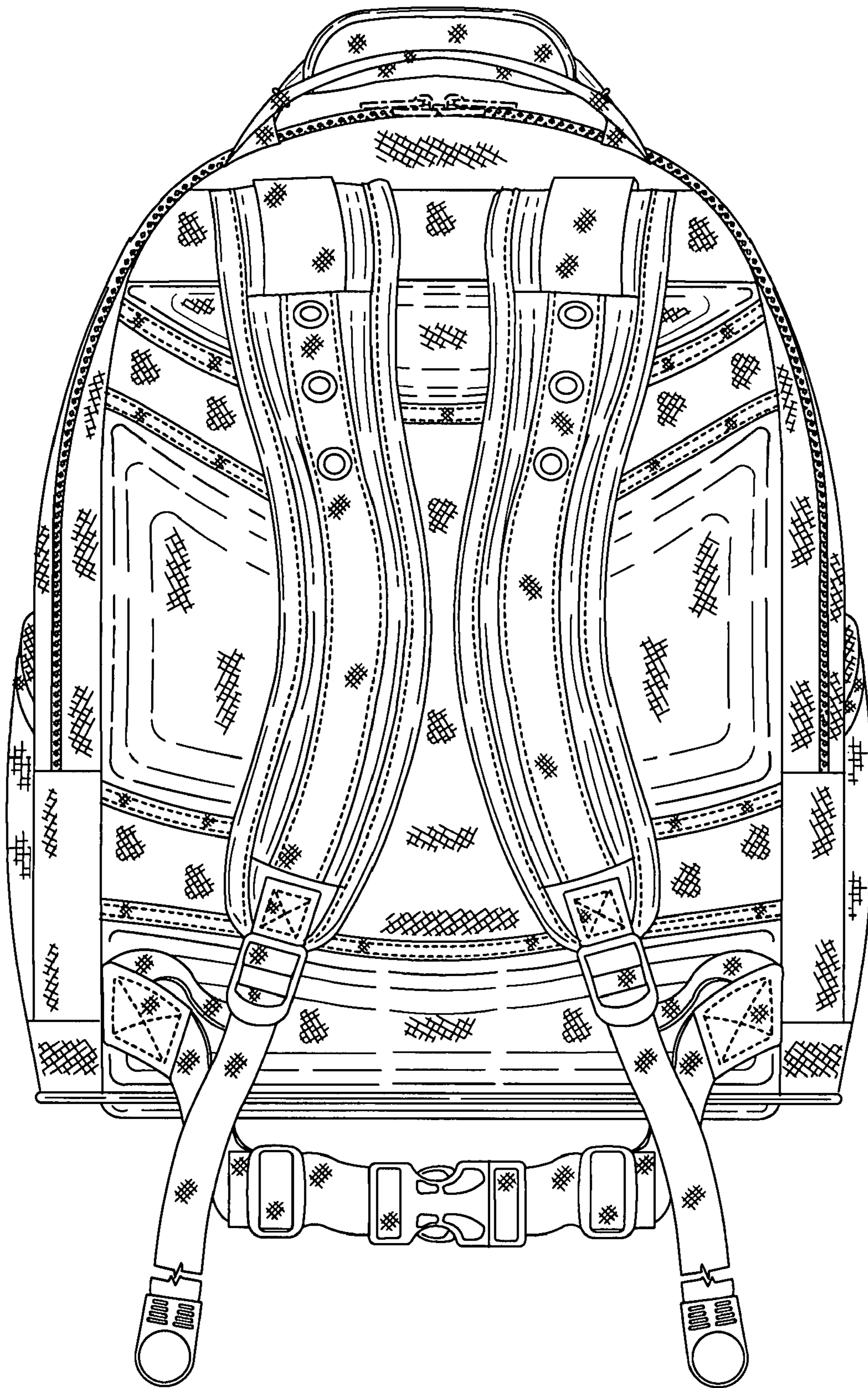

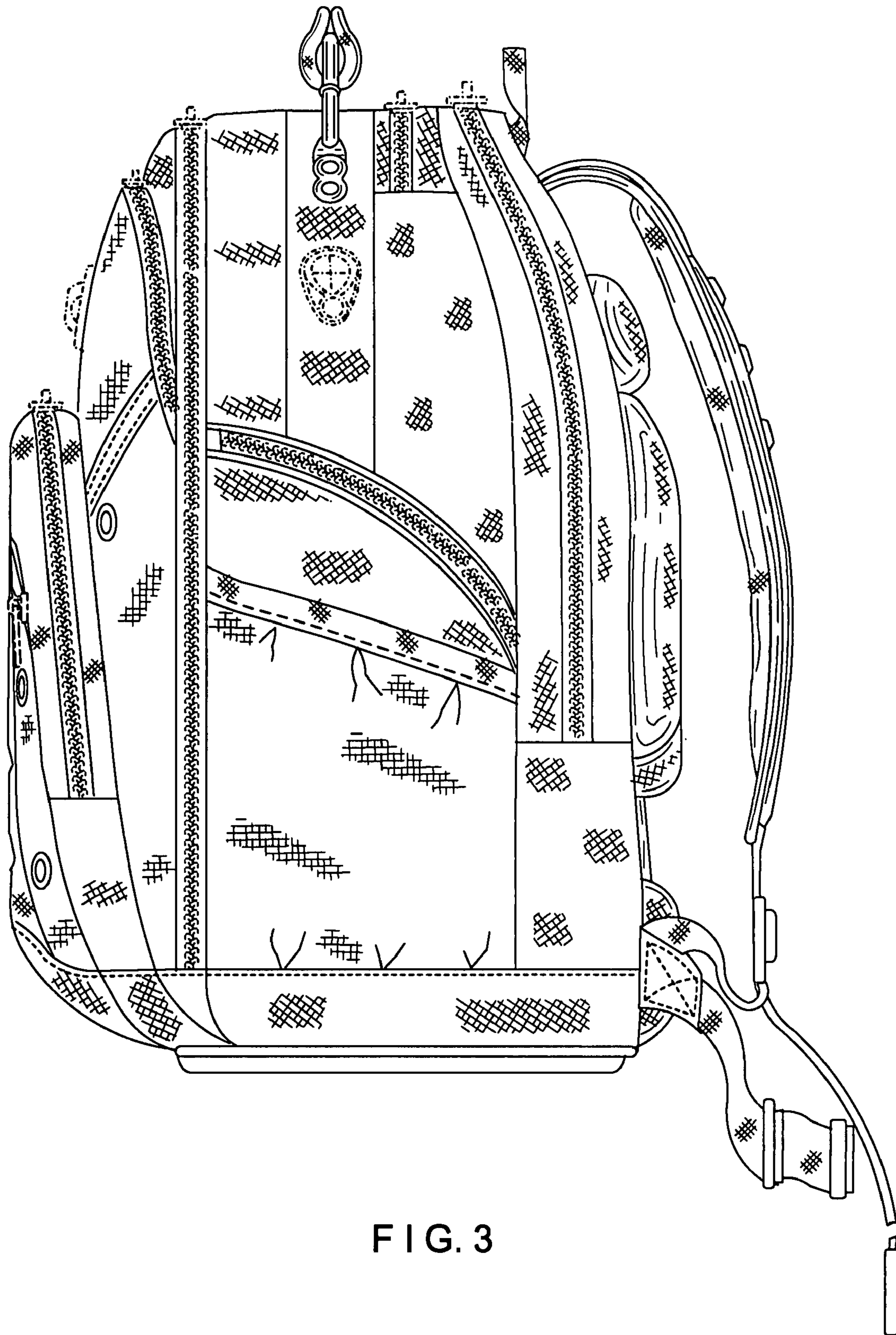

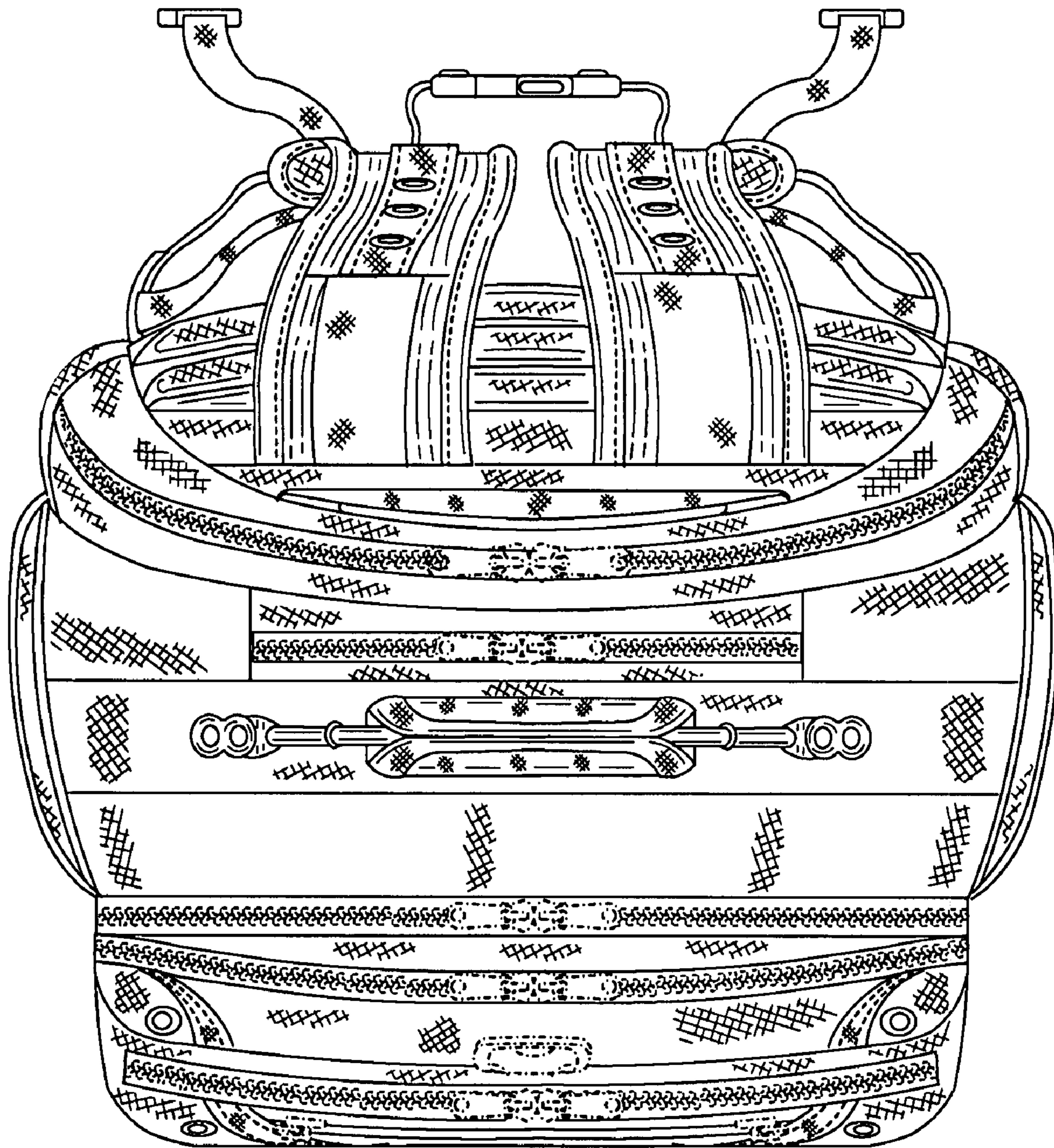

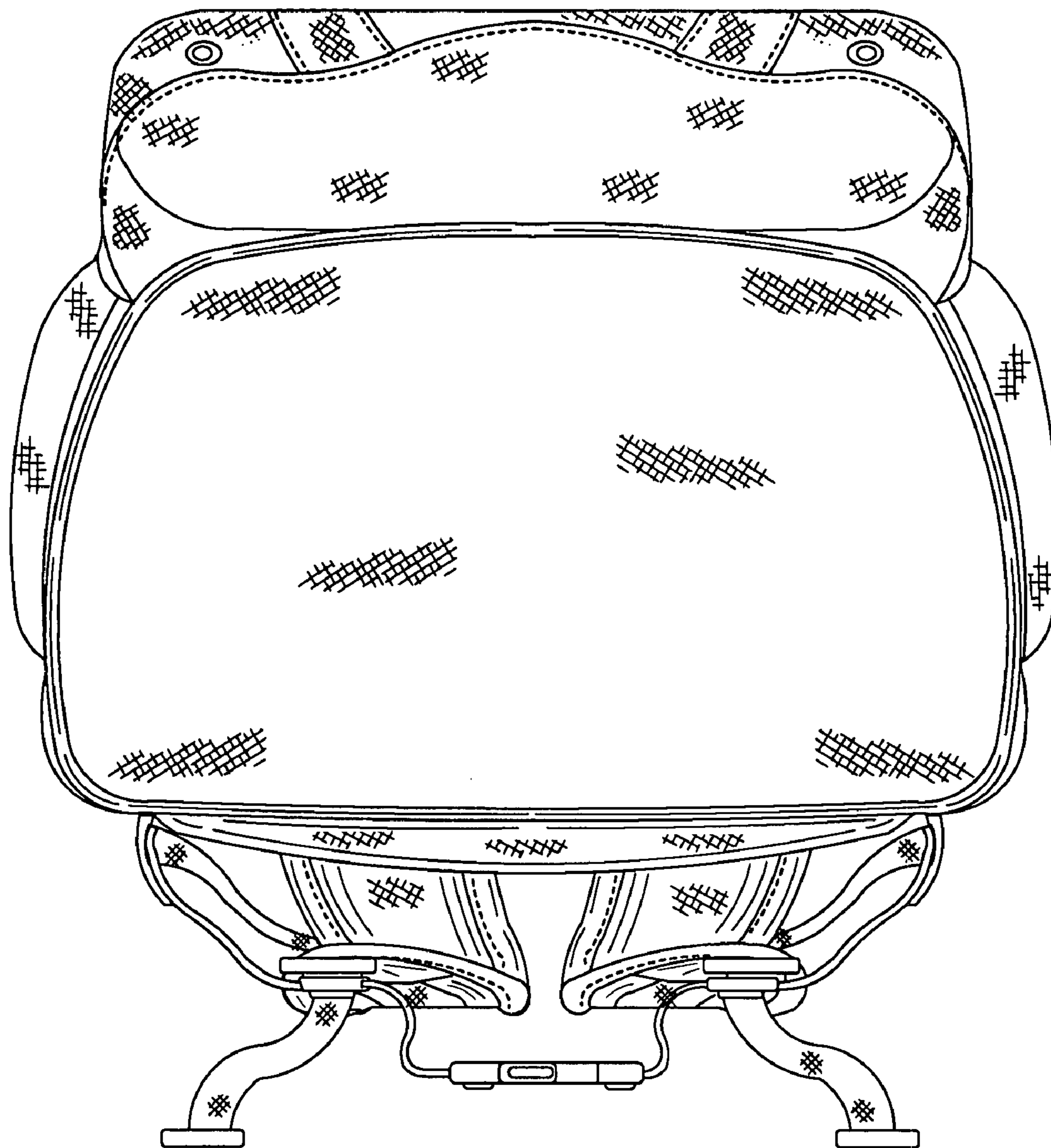

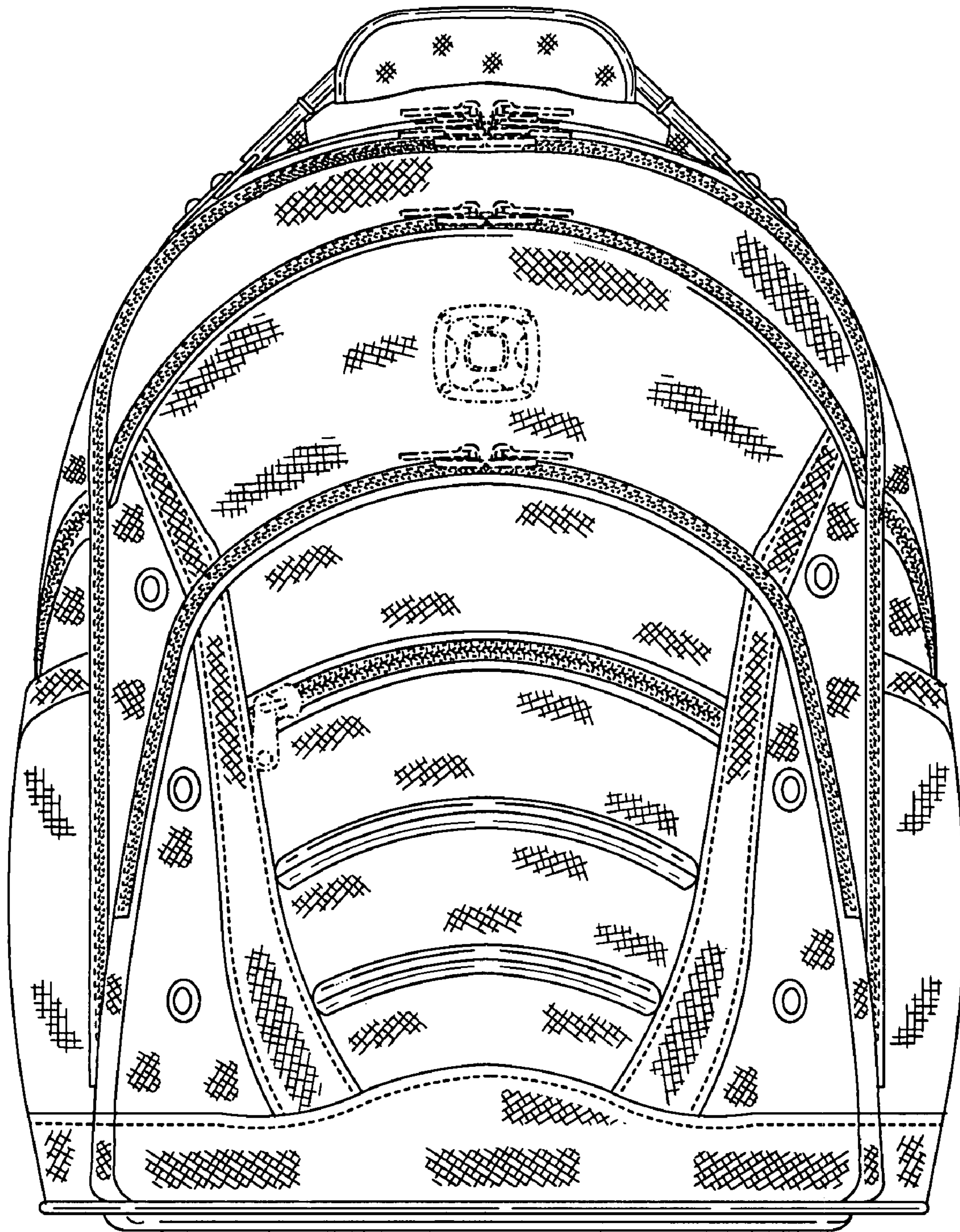

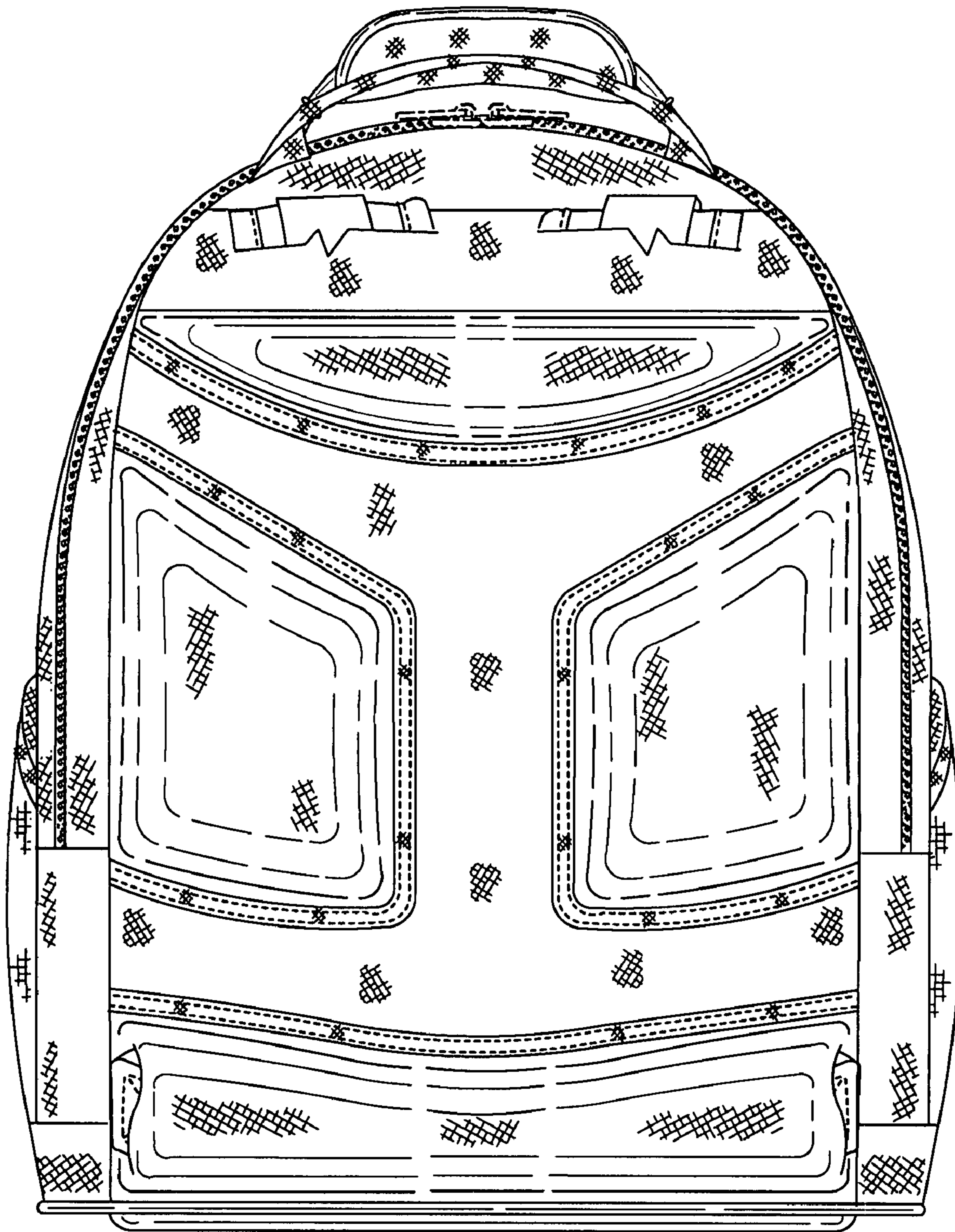

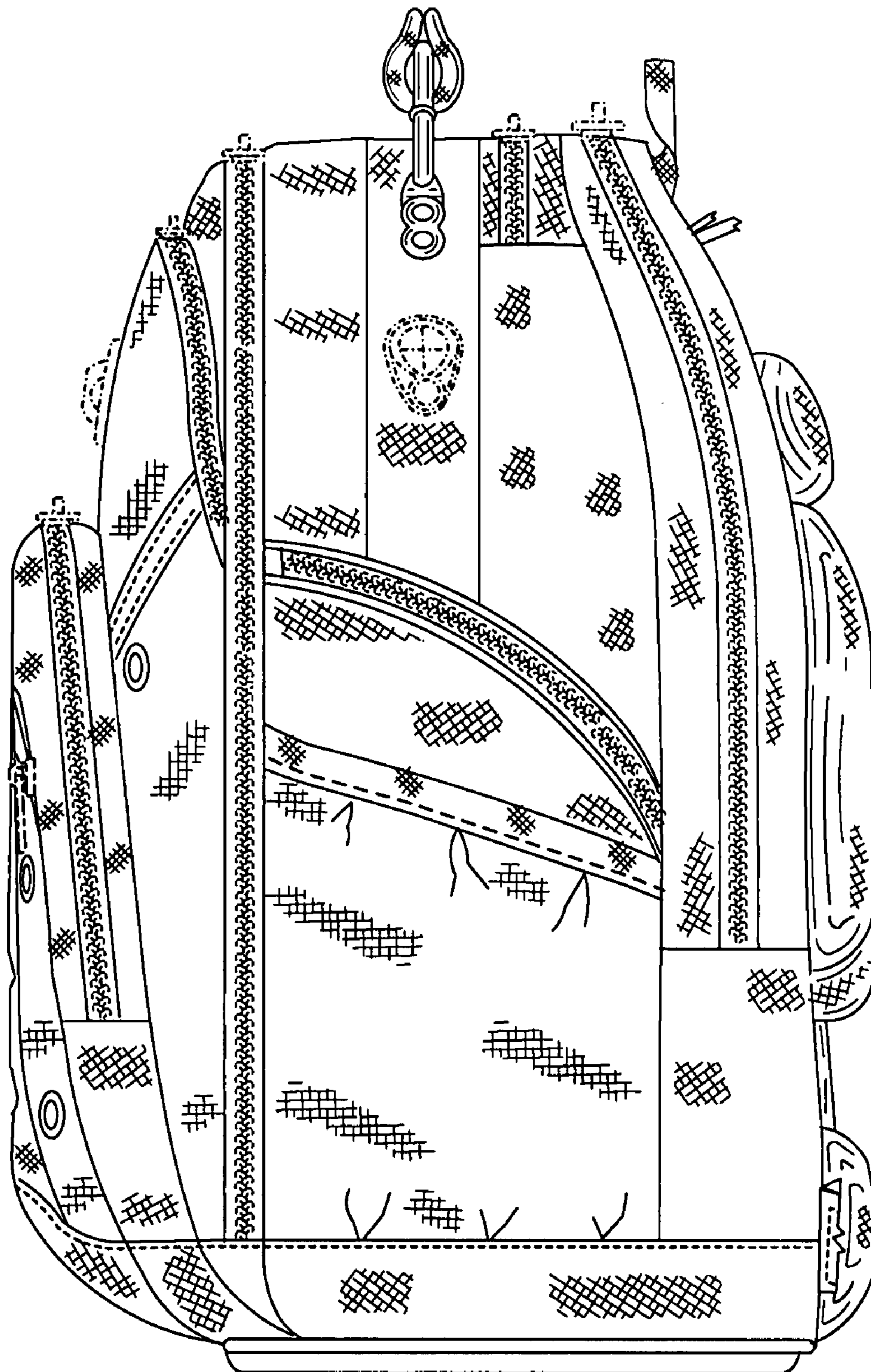

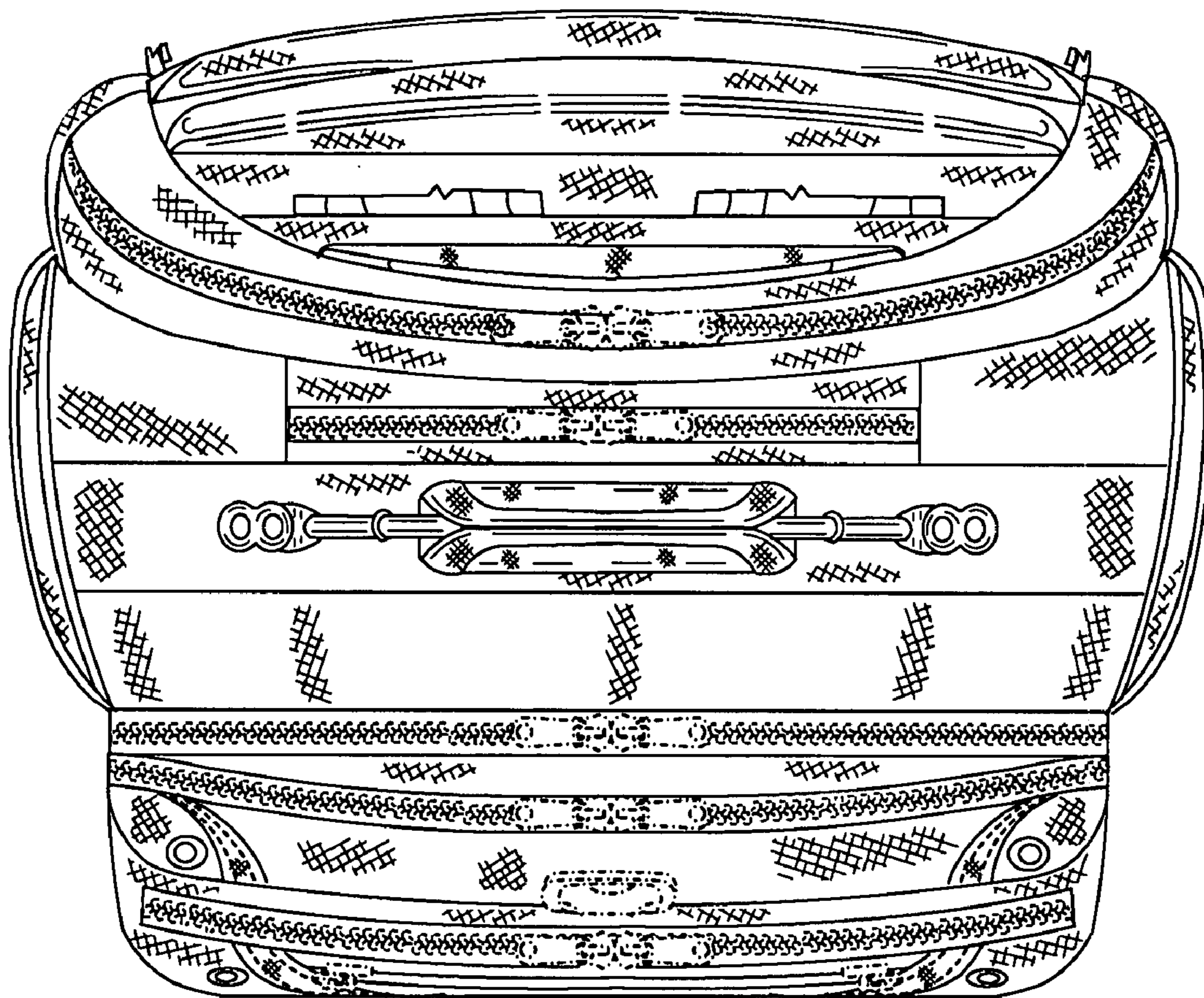

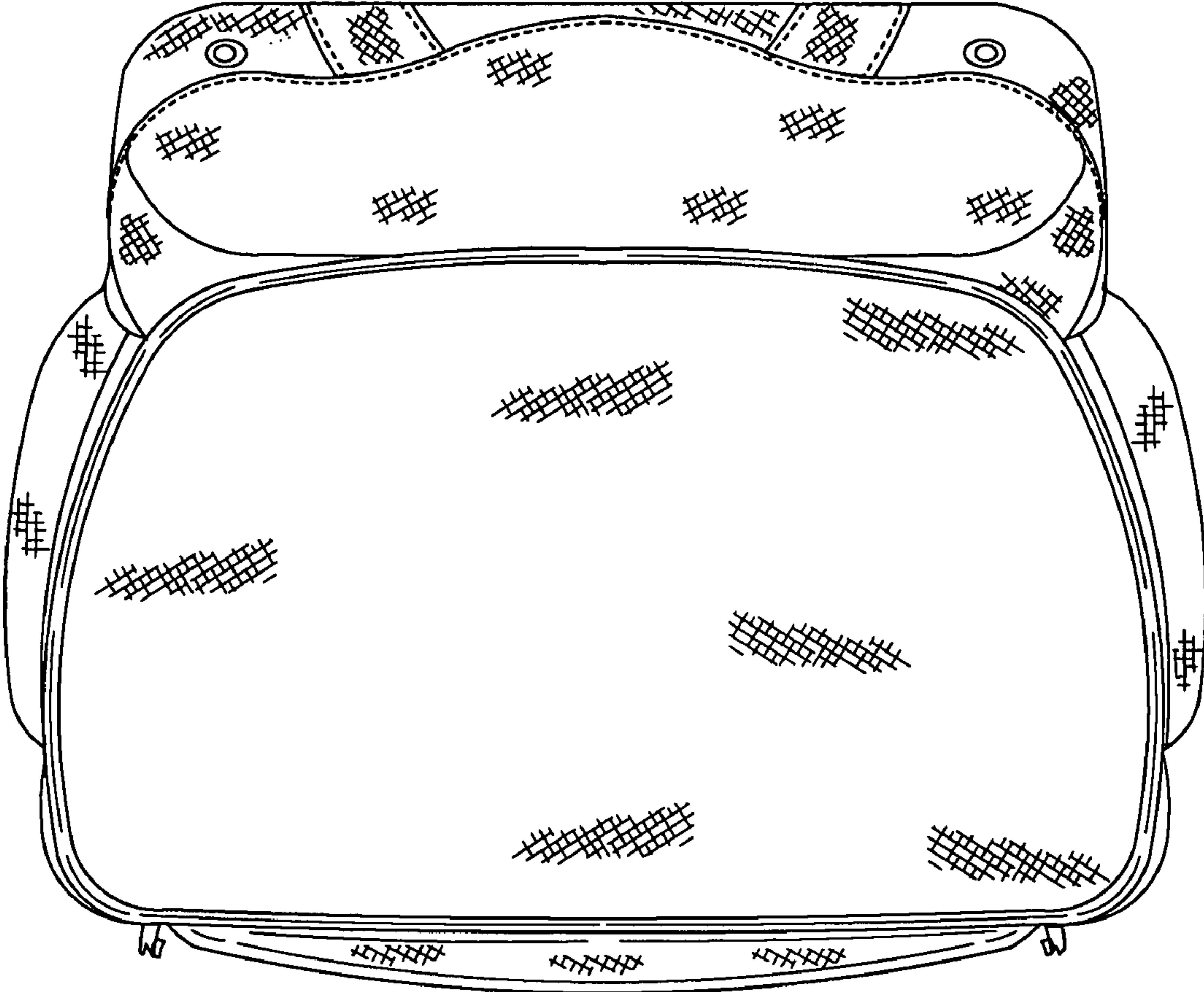
