The ornamental design for a shoe sole, as shown and described.

DESCRIPTION

FIG. 1 is a bottom plan view of a shoe sole showing our new design.

FIG. 2 is a right side elevational view thereof.

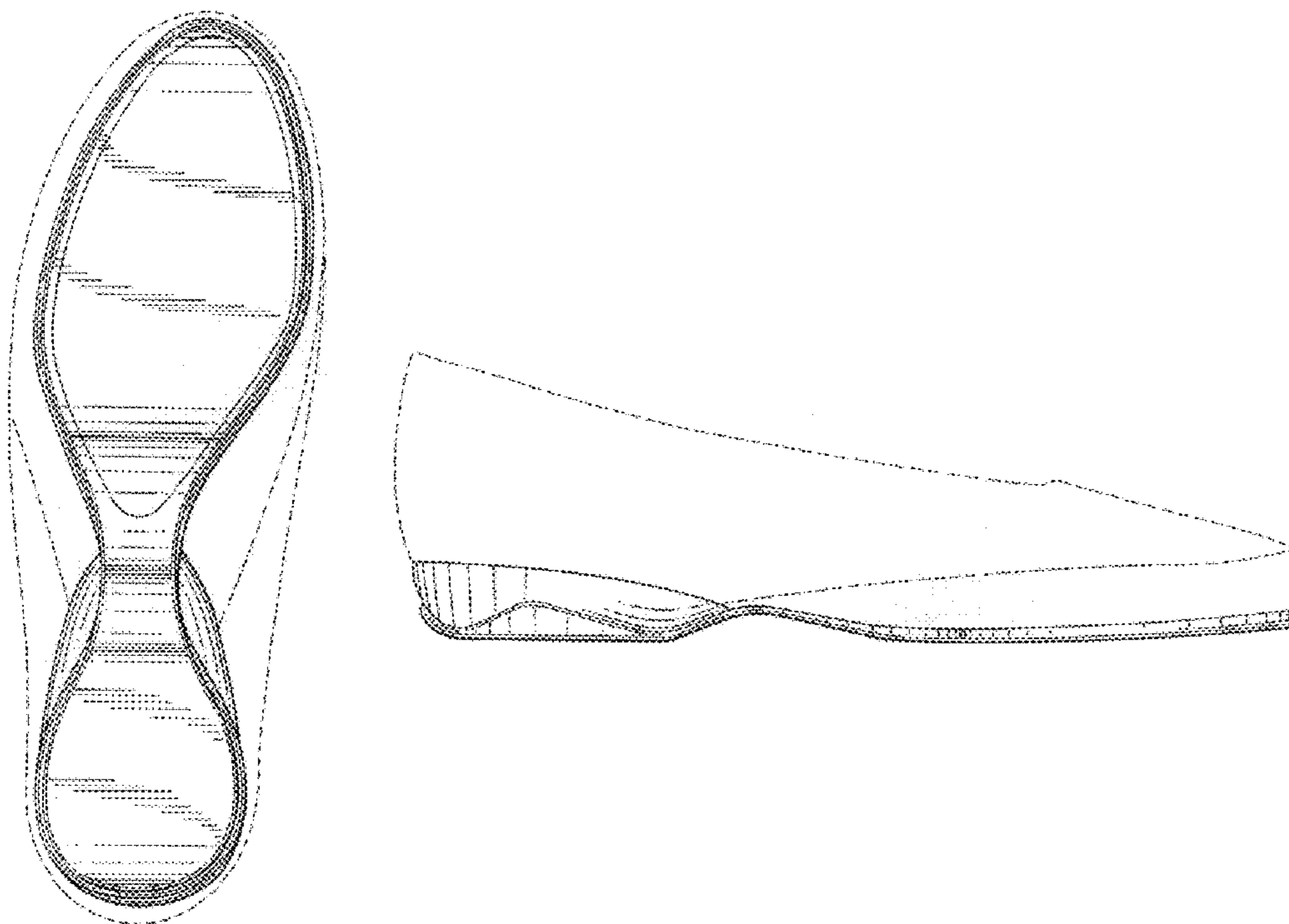
FIG. 3 is a left side elevational view thereof.

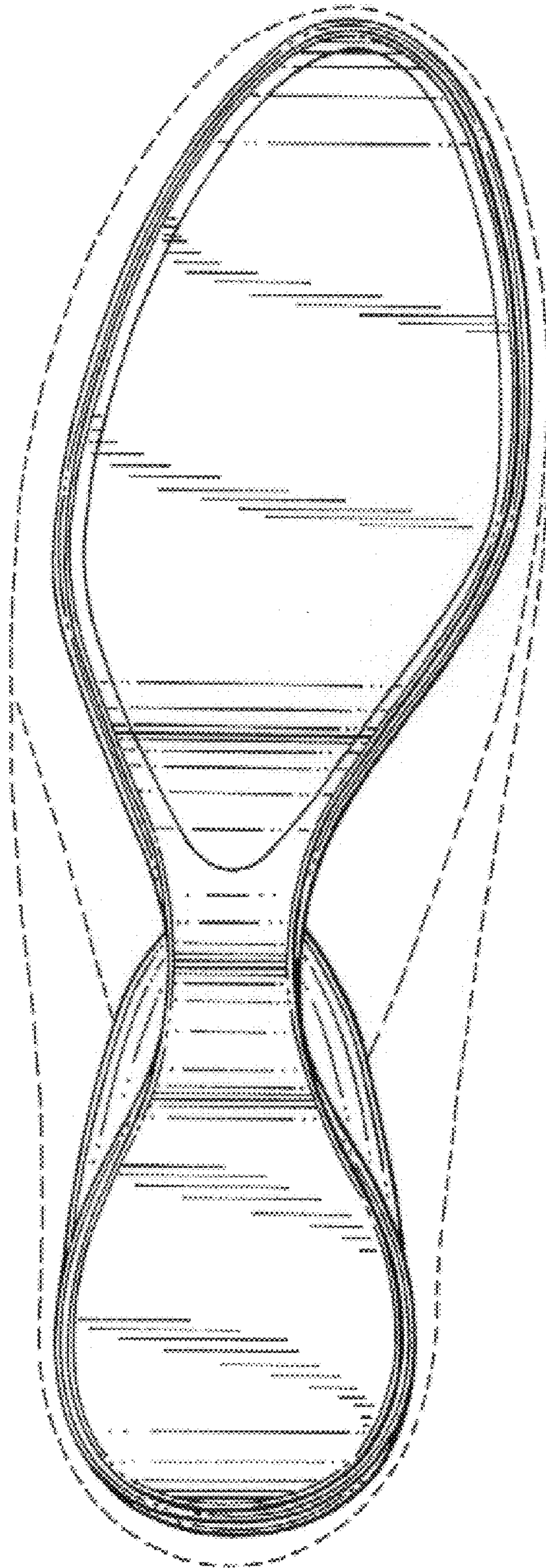

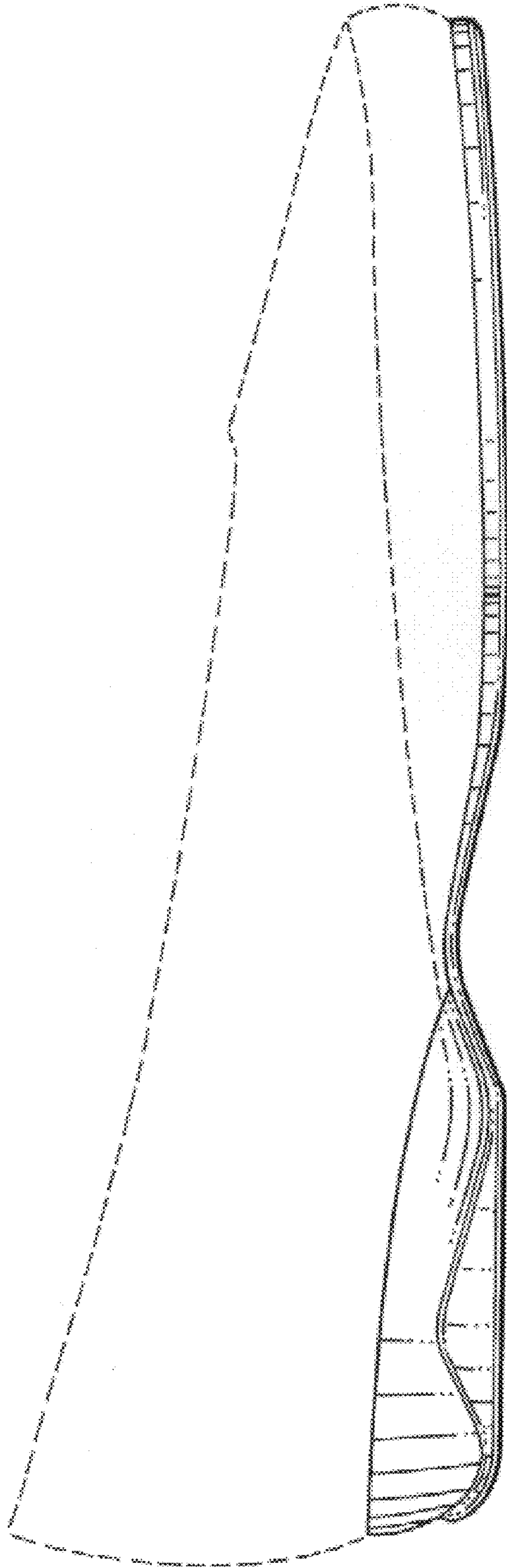

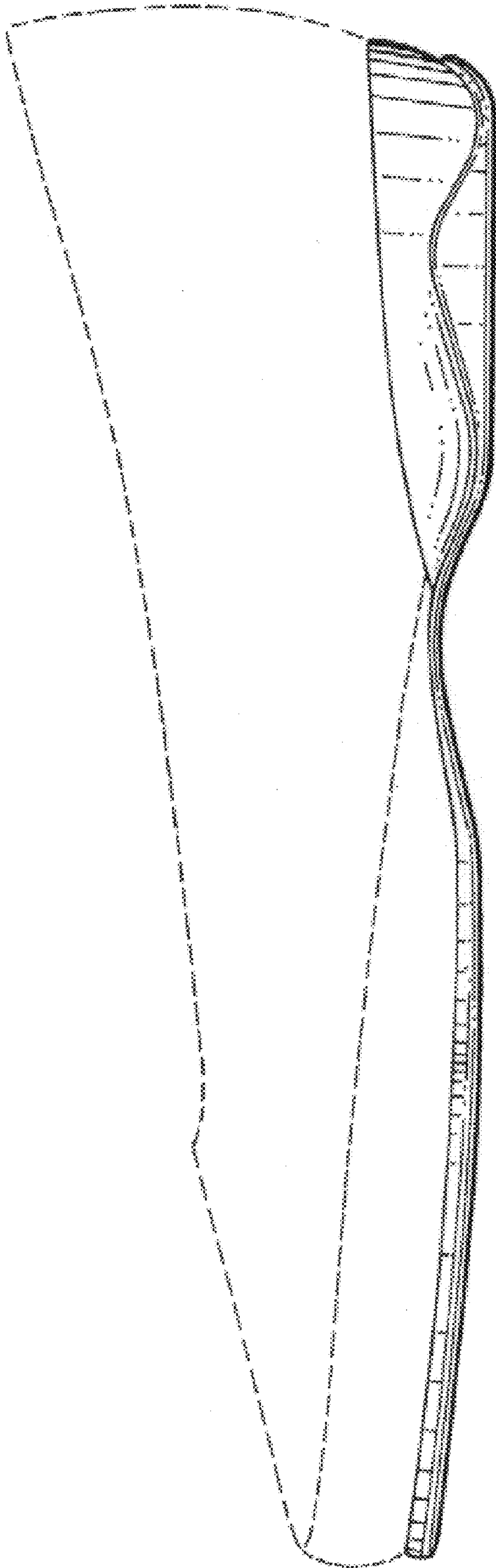

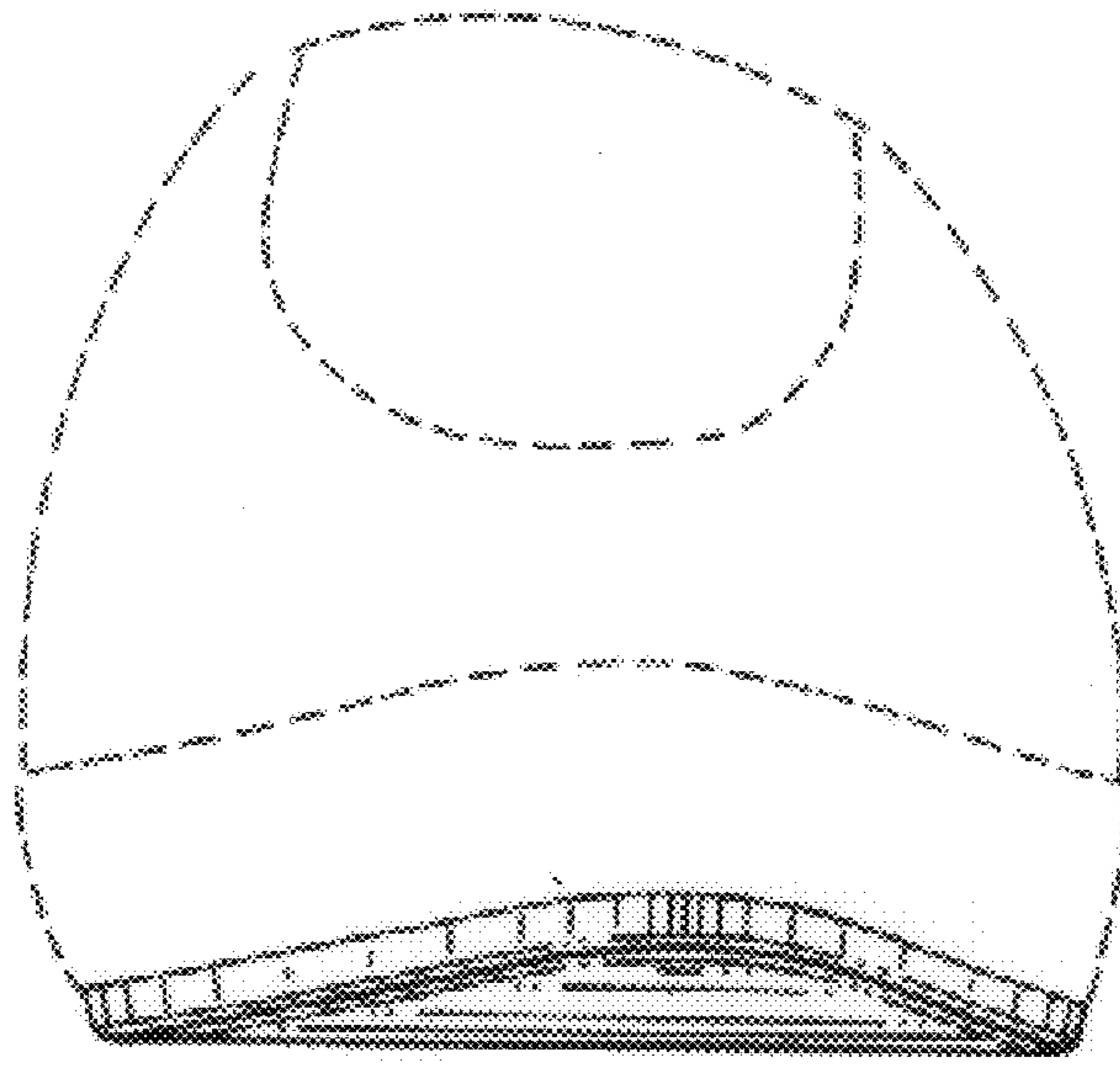

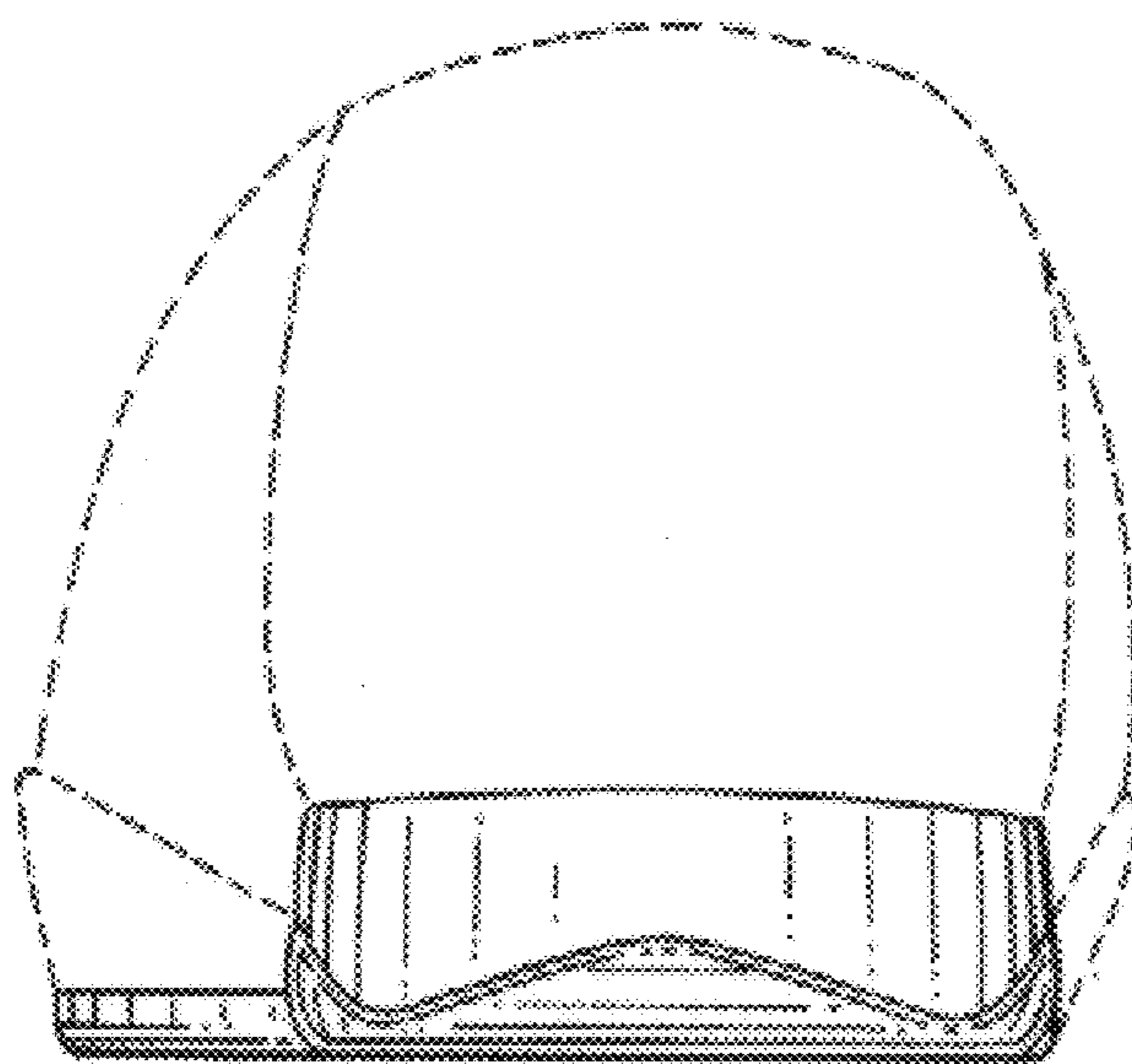
