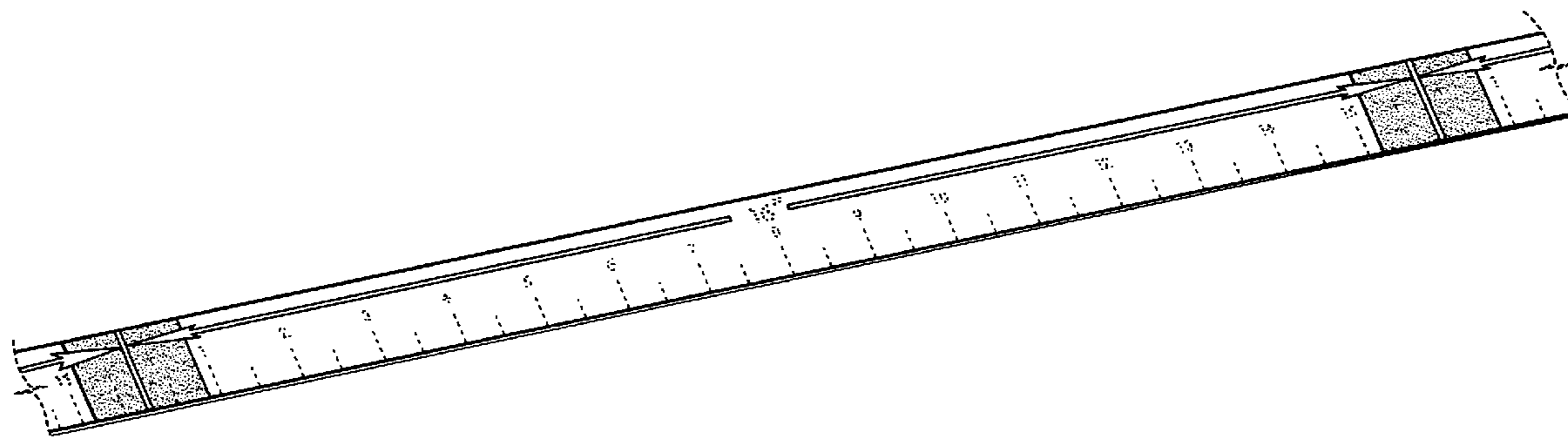
The rear and the side edges of the single-spacing stud tape

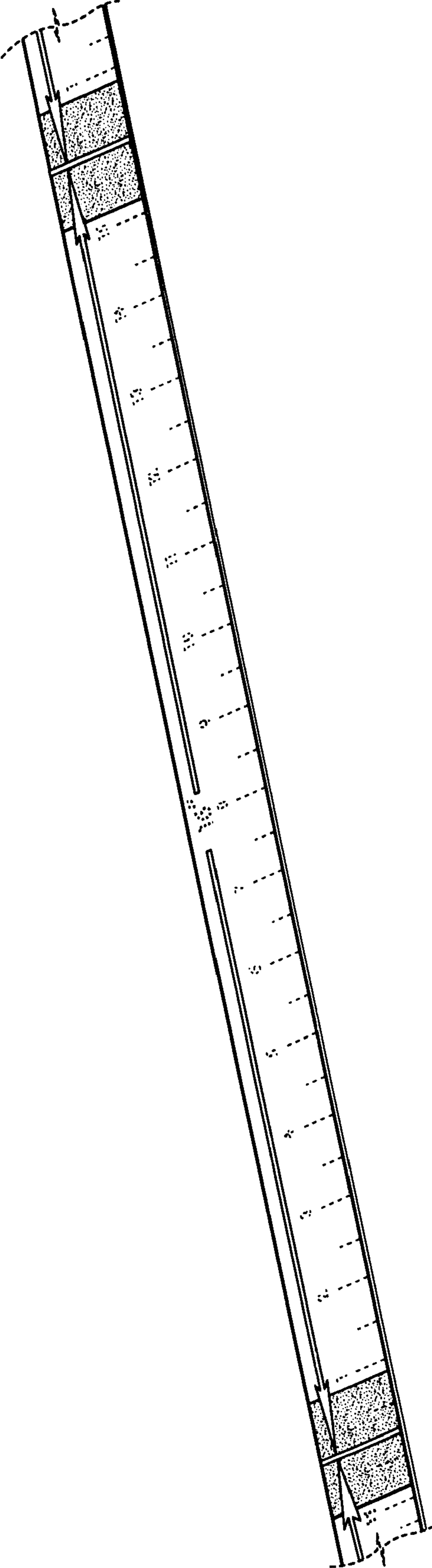

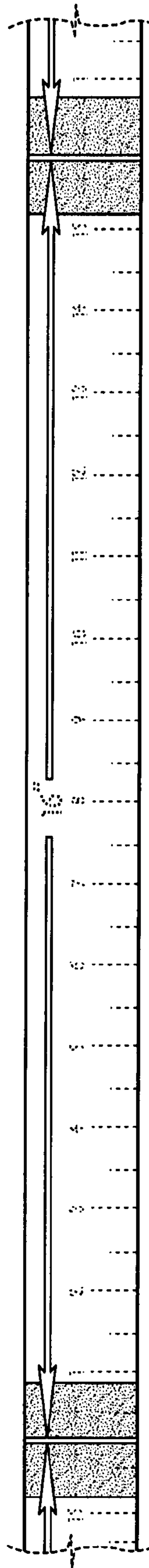
